## H. 101

- -Transportation Affordability act
- -Carbon reduction plan in place
- -Want to put money into MTI grants
  - -Puts money into rideshare
- -Incentives for Electric Vehicles
- -Milage Smart Program
  - -Help people get into lower-class transportation
  - -Opportunity for low-income people to get used vehicles
- -Require AOT to update the Vermont State transportation standards
- -Rural transit will continue to be funded
  - -Fair free
- -Figuring out what to do with Urban Transit
- -Complete Streets Section
  - -Being pushed by AARP
  - -Reduce the # and length of 'drive alone' trips
  - -Affordability, Accessibility, Environment
  - -Aging populations
    - -Are our communities ready to accommodate the needs of the aging population
  - -Surveys find that older adults want to stay in their communities
    - -If they are going to stay in communities they need mobility options
  - -Complete Streets Statute
    - -Roadways should be designed for all users
      - -Pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists
  - -Benefits
    - -Climate Change
    - Land use
      - -Effects on the housing conversation
    - -Public Health
    - -Economic vitality
  - -H. 101 is a light update to the statute

- -Way to look at bills through a rural lens when they come off the wall
- -Think about the ways that bills will have an impact on rural communities

## SNAP

- -Suplimental Nutrition Assitance Program
- -During COVID Feds upped the benefit for everybody
  - -Emergency Allotment
  - -Ending

- -In Vermont, there are 72,000 people receiving SNAP benefits
- -The majority of households in VT will lose \$100-200 a month
- -Asking for support on three requests
  - -Vermont Foodbank
  - -Universal School meals made permanent
  - -Additional funding for the Older Vermonters Nutrition Program
