
Current STARS system

Process

- All regulated programs at 1 star
- Application by programs
- Scored by STARS staff
- External assessments at higher STARS levels

Benefits

- Small financial bonus when earn/renew STARS
- Currently tied to CCFAP reimbursement rates
- 3 STARS or higher to be a Specialized Child Care Provider
- 4 or 5 STARS to be a UPK program



Criteria for STARS Revision

Promote child wellbeing, learning, and development


- Promote developmentally appropriate practice
- Be inclusive and demonstrate cultural competence

Support a program's continuous quality improvement

- Build upon Vermont's existing program standards. Standards include licensing regulations, VELS, Core competencies, EE, AS, etc.
- Be either researched-based or evidence-informed

Have the following characteristics:

- Work across all settings while accounting for differences in program type.
- Be written in language that is clear to programs and families.
- Benefit outweighs the burden of implementation
- Be observable, documentable



STARS CQI

The STARS process for program quality is ongoing. At each STARS level, programs engage in a process of continuous quality improvement (CQI) with a STARS CQI Plan

identify

improvement needed

test

solicit feedback to improve or validate what you implemented

research

doing the homework on the improvement needed, context and solutions

implement

implementing a practice in order to make improvement

develop

generating possibilities

STARS Level Progressions

The five STARS levels build from a self-study stage that prepares programs to make quality improvements.

Each subsequent level builds upon the previous level, implements strategies for improvement and utilizes evidence-based practices and a Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) Plan.


System for Program Access to Resources for Quality Supports

New Quality Supports program launching in July 2023

- Evidence-based and research-informed quality coaching and support services to VT regulated early childhood and afterschool programs, with subject matter experts offering virtual and in-person services across the state
- Assessment system within Vermont STARS to ensure confidential, timely, valid, and reliable unscored and scored assessments for regulated programs.
- Administration of Vermont Early Childhood Networks (VECN), including coaching and technical assistance for Network leaders

STARS Administrative Rule Promulgation Process

Public Comment Period Ends March 22, 2023



Proposal to eliminate tiered reimbursement in CCFAP

- Research shows that tiered reimbursement does not improve child outcomes.
- Changes in the STARS Administrative Rule include removing language for tiered reimbursement.
- Supports the Child Care Expansion Initiative to until CCFAP payments from STARS ratings to ensure that the state is paying the same rate on behalf of a family regardless of the number of STARS their child's program has earned.
