15	PROHIBITED
16	(a) Definition Definitions. As used in this section, "hands-free:
17	(1) "Hands-free use" means the use of a portable electronic device
18	without use of either hand by employing an internal feature of, or an
19	attachment to, the device.

1	(2) "Non-hands-free use" means the use of a portable electronic device
2	in any way that is not a hands-free use, including an operator of a motor
3	vehicle holding a portable electronic device in the operator's hand or hands
4	while operating a motor vehicle.
5	(3) "Operating" means operating a motor vehicle on a public highway,
6	including while temporarily stationary because of traffic, a traffic control
7	device, or other temporary delays. "Operating" does not include operating a
8	motor vehicle with or without the motor running when the operator has moved
9	the vehicle to the side of or off the public highway and has halted in a location
10	where the vehicle can safely and lawfully remain stationary.
11	(4) "Public highway" means a State or municipal highway as defined in
12	19 V.S.A. § 1(12).
13	(5) "Securely mounted" means the portable electronic device is placed
14	in an accessory or location in the vehicle, other than the operator's hand or
15	hands, where the device will remain stationary under typical driving
16	conditions.
17	(b) Use of handheld portable electronic device <u>in a non-hands-free use is</u>
18	prohibited.
19	(1) An individual shall not use a portable electronic device in a non-
20	hands-free use while operating a moving motor vehicle in a place open
21	temporarily or permanently to public or general circulation of vehicles.

4	(D) To to use of an ignition interlock device, as defined in section
5	1200 of this title-; or
6	(E) To to use of a global positioning or navigation system if it is
7	installed by the manufacturer or securely mounted in the vehicle in a manner
8	that does not violate section 1125 of this title. As used in this subdivision
9	(b)(3)(E), "securely mounted" means the device is placed in an accessory or
10	location in the vehicle, other than the operator's hands, where the device will
11	remain stationary under typical driving conditions.
