11	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to extend the
12	issuance of Department of Motor Vehicles credentials and number plates with
13	a veteran designation to individuals disabled during active duty for training.
14 15	An act relating to Department of Motor Vehicles credentials and number plates with veteran designations
16	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
17	Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 7(b) is amended to read:
18	(b) In addition to any other requirement of law or rule, before an enhanced
19	license may be issued to a person an individual, the person individual shall
20	present for inspection and copying satisfactory documentary evidence to

1	determine identity and U.S. citizenship. An application shall be accompanied
2	by: a photo identity document, documentation showing the person's
3	<u>individual's</u> date and place of birth, proof of the person's <u>individual's</u> Social
4	Security number, and documentation showing the person's individual's
5	principal residence address. New and renewal application forms shall include
6	a space for the applicant to request that a "veteran" designation be placed on
7	the enhanced license. If a veteran, as defined in 38 U.S.C. § 101(2) and
8	including an individual disabled during active military, naval, air, or space
9	service, as defined in 38 U.S.C. § 101(24), requests a veteran designation and
10	provides a Department of Defense Form 214 or other proof of veteran status
11	specified by the Commissioner, and the Office of Veterans Veterans' Affairs
12	confirms his or her the individual's status as an honorably discharged veteran

§ 115. NONDRIVER IDENTIFICATION CARDS

(a) Any Vermont resident may make application to the Commissioner and be issued an identification card that is attested by the Commissioner as to true name, correct age, residential address unless the listing of another address is requested by the applicant or is otherwise authorized by law, and any other identifying data as the Commissioner may require that shall include, in the case of minor applicants, the written consent of the applicant's parent, guardian, or other person standing in loco parentis. Every application for an identification card shall be signed by the applicant and shall contain such evidence of age and identity as the Commissioner may require, consistent with subsection (1) of this section. New and renewal application forms shall include a space for the applicant to request that a "veteran" designation be placed on the applicant's identification card. 15	issue special plates to Vermont veterans, as defined in 38 U.S.C. § 101(2) and
16	including an individual disabled during active military, naval, air, or space
17	service, as defined in 38 U.S.C. § 101(24), and to members of the U.S. Armed
18	Forces, as defined in 38 U.S.C. § 101(10), for use on vehicles registered at the

The plates shall be reissued only 9 to the original holder of the plates or the surviving spouse. The Commissioner 10 may adopt rules to implement the provisions of this subsection. Except for 11 new or renewed registrations, applications for the issuance of plates under this 12 subsection shall be processed in the order received by the Department subject 13 to normal workflow considerations. The costs associated with developing new 14 emblems shall be borne by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

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(a) The Commissioner shall assign a distinguishing number to each licensee and shall furnish the licensee with a license certificate that shows the number and the licensee's full name, date of birth, and residential address, except that at the request of the licensee, the licensee's mailing address may be listed, or an alternative address may be listed if otherwise authorized by law.
