**\$6.1m** of ARPA – SFR funds are added for Healthy Homes (outside the budget **\$8.5m** of federal funds are directly available to VEIC Clean Heat Homes). These healthy and whole home funding streams address septic, water and energy needs of older housing stock owned and occupied by low-income Vermonters.

From March 2020 through May 2022 (2023 Budget Act 185) <b>\$398m</b> allocated to affordable housing development From CRF, ARPA – SFR and State GF. Programs funded: VHCB, VHIP and VHFA missing middle homeowner	From March 2020 through May 2022 (2023 Budget Act 185) <b>\$450m</b> allocated to emergency housing, rental assistance, and support programs. Funding from FEMA, ARPA ERAP funds, and \$15m of FY22 State GF which included HOP, emergency shelter, and other support allocations, <b>\$60m</b> for foreclosure assistance from CRF, GF and ARPA- Homeowner Assistance funds
