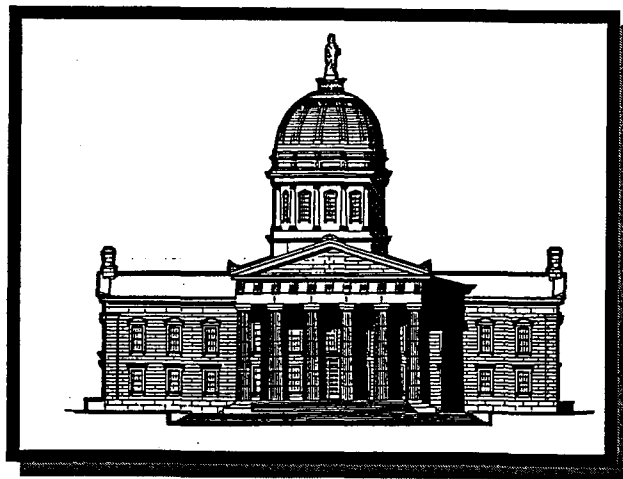

## THE FOLLOWING ARE THE HOUSE RULES REGARDING VOTING

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members.

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. If the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 73, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Members shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

Rep. Babcock of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

This was not an easy vote for me, but in this life many times we have to take an unpopular stand. I feel this legislation does not have a stable funding source and will need new taxes just a short time down the line, and I think the taxpayers of this state deserve better than this."

Rep. Madkour of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted "no" because I feel before jumping into another black hole we should crawl out of the one we already are in! Also, never count your chickens before they hatch!"

Rep. Hill of Milton explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I believe we need a good health care program. The problem with this bill is that there are too many 'don't knows':

1. we don't know how much it is going to cost;
2. we don't know how many people will be on the program;
3. we don't know how much money will be raised;
4. we don't know if we will get the waiver;
5. we don't know what the federal government is going to do about Medicaid funding.

We do know this funding source will not raise the amounts needed to make it a successful program. We will be back in a few years trying to fund a deficit."

Rep. Rose of Williston explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I believe we have done the right thing. Taxation policy should be consistent with other policy objectives. The cigarette tax, therefore, is desirable for the same reasons that we should be fully funding our current use program if we want Vermont's forests to be well managed: and the gasoline tax increased so that people begin to pay the true cost of the miles they drive alone in their cars. Smoking is more expensive than the current cost of a pack of cigarettes. This is a small step in a healthy direction.

Rep. Baker of Randolph explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

In all due respect to those who worked sincerely to craft this bill, I must vote no on H. 351 because I have consistently, for seven campaigns, promised my proponency for strengthening local control, not weakening it. Voting for this bill would compromise my principles and my constituents."

Rep. Blanchard of Essex explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I cannot support this bill for the following reasons:

1. This bill has devastating economic impacts on my community, to both the residential and commercial sectors.
2. This bill strips the local governments of this state of their last remaining taxing authority, namely the property tax.
3. Lastly, I feel that the bill is a non-incentive/non-growth bill, which sends the message that Vermont is anti-business."

Rep. Gray of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I vote no because my lineage in Vermont goes back 200 years and I am the last of that lineage. My children have gone where our economy and jobs have gone - to the South. I cannot vote for something which I believe will sell Vermont down the river."

"Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes hesitantly and with great concern for possible secondary and tertiary impacts both economic and social."

Rep. Little of Shelburne explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

While I am to a degree sympathetic to and understand the attraction of, a whole new tax and distribution system to "once and for all" solve our chronic school property tax dilemmas, I do not believe this bill properly balances the likelihood of succeeding with an untested structure against the colossal risk of failure. Neither does the bill adequately address the need for cost containment. Nevertheless, because I wish to continue to reach out to all sides for a solution, and to keep alive the effort for much needed reform, I grudgingly vote to pass the bill."

Rep. Yarnell of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because H. 351 was the last train leaving the station, but I note trains should not have pilots."

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

**Rep. Brunelle of Winooski**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because we expanded state government by more than \$46 million, this year. The state deficit is paid off, and yet we failed to sunset the sales tax, as promised. We failed to reduce the state income tax as promised by the Governor. We raised several consumer taxes, fees and charges, all of which significantly impact, specifically the hardworking, taxpaying, consuming lower-middle class Vermonter, and by the way, we allowed ourselves a \$30.00 per week pay raise to take effect next year."

**Rep. Casavant of Winooski**, explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

My "no" vote is a protest vote. Pilot is not property tax reform and there is no guarantee here that the Senate will do the right thing about property tax reform next year. They didn't do it this year or the year before that."

**Rep. Gray of Barre Town**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I think the Governor got what he wanted, some legislators got what they wanted, but many legislators and most Vermonters did not.

I do not believe Vermonters want the Legislature to continue the excessive spending but want spending cuts - and unnecessary program cuts.

I disagree with an agreement to put on the table state property tax. This is only an expansion of a regressive tax. The only local tax is the property tax and it is the only one the state does not now control. If Legislature passes a property tax, Vermonters can look forward to paying property tax to both local and state government."

**Rep. Holmes of Bethel**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

There are many reasons to vote against this budget but to tie passage of this budget to the passage of another bill sometime in the future, is blackmail."

**Rep. Hudson of East Montpelier**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because this budget is too high. In the future we should look into making real cuts instead of just talking about it."

**Rep. Kurt of Colchester**, explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I have voted yes but I must lodge the sincere discomfort I feel about spending million in PILOT to benefit only a few.

We have allowed a handful of towns to set a table to feast while the overwhelming majority of weary Vermonters march past, carrying the heavy burden of the property tax to fund the education of all of our children.

I find it embarrassing as a Vermont legislator that the Vermont House with all good intent, must bribe the Vermont Senate in order to keep their feet to the fire and listen to the voices of the Vermont people."

**Rep. Madkour of Bennington**, explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because I do believe that the Governor had stated he'd veto anything that had less than a \$1.6 million cut - and I do agree with him - this time."

**Rep. Mazur of South Burlington**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Our demand for services just exceeds our supply. We have to show people in this state that we can live within our means and address our property tax problems without raising taxes and by reprioritizing our spending. The only solution we saw from this General Assembly is increasing the size of government, sustaining our tax level and deficit spending, which is again balanced by raiding the Transportation fund.

The people of Vermont deserve better."

**Rep. Morrissey of Bennington**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

This budget reflects a 6 % raise over fiscal 1995. We are spending over \$1.5 billion dollars. We have 285,000 wage earners. This averages out at \$5,300 per wage earner. This does not include local or a majority of their federal taxes.

This budget is not sustainable nor responsible.

I'm glad the conferees from both bodies are happy. I'm happy the Governor is happy. I'm not happy nor are the majority of 285,000 wage earners in our state."

**Rep. Peaslee of Guildhall**, explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

The issue for me, has been and continues to be, a Transportation issue and the raiding of this fund for General Fund purposes. Therefore, Mr. Speaker, I voted no."

**Rep. Richardson of Cavendish**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

This budget contains taxes to cover the Governors "rainy day" fund. This is really a fund to evade the effects of block grants from the federal government in 1996, so Vermont won't have to face cutting spending, which is long overdue.

Let the block grants come - we can use our intelligence and imaginations to fund only the appropriate programs.

It's a shame that we can't do as so many states are doing on their own - cut spending and give Vermonters a tax break."

**Rep. Rivero of Milton**, explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I am voting yes for this budget, mainly because it is better than before, and a whole lot better than nothing. The property tax issue has been delayed again, while bailing out a few members so they don't look bad to their constituents. Meanwhile, the taxpayers continue to suffer and vote down their school budgets. At least we have a weak agreement for next year. Other issues - we do get a pay raise of \$30.00 which I support which is a 6% increase this year, after no increase since 1991. But the situation of expenses and the practice of abusing this, to the tune of \$22,000 over 6 years by some members is unforgivable. Furthermore, I don't understand why the Lt. Governor wanted a

30% raise and finally did get a 15% one.

Thank you Mr. Speaker."

**Rep. Towne of Berlin**, explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I disagree with the Conference Committee compromise on PILOT. Linking the passage of H. 351 in some form by the Senate with PILOT payments, is a precedent setting procedure. Where will this new wrinkle lead us? What bills in the future will now be linked? Statewide property tax is nothing more than a Robin Hood scheme! It is a continuing source of wonder to me how easy and comfortable people are with the notion that someone else should pay their taxes!"

**Rep. Schiavone of Shelburne**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I'm disappointed in the action of the General Assembly and Governor in presenting a large budget increase that is not responsive to the economic development needs and urgent fiscal needs of the state."

**Rep. Stafford of Georgia**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted no on this compromise tax bill.

We are spending 65 million on debt service.

We have max'ed out the sales tax.

We have max'ed out the income tax.

We have increased taxes on each hospital bed.

We have increased taxes on each nursing home bed.

We have increased taxes on cigarettes.

We have taxes on liquor.

We have used transportation taxes to fund general fund obligations.

We have increased the number of state employees.

We are talking about a state take-over on local property taxes.

This is a bad bill which takes Vermonters further along the road towards socialism and the size and power of the state at the expense of every working Vermonter.
