69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members.

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. If the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 73, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Members shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

Vote explanations regarding passage of H.847, An Act relating to Civil Unions, 3/16/2000

Rep. DePoy of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: What are we doing Mr. Speaker? Are we this arrogant? We've declared ourselves omniscient. We've told the people of this state, "elect us and be quiet, we'll do what's best." We've declared ourselves a puppet of an activist Supreme Court. The Supreme Court didn't have the guts to make a decisive ruling on this issue. We didn't have the guts to call their bluff and make them. The Supreme Court has the Constitution to interpret, we have the people to interpret. My interpretation of the people is contrary to this bill. Some would call this legislation "LANDMARK", I would call this legislation a 'LANDMINE."

Rep. Hathaway of Barton explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Continuously throughout this debate the term civil rights has been used as the main argument for this legislation. Civil rights are defined as personal liberties guaranteed to all citizens of this country as outlined in the 14th and 15th amendments of the U.S. Constitution. Personal liberties are extended to and cannot be denied citizens because of race. Religion, creed or color. Marriage or any other type of union between two people is not referenced. The community of individuals asking for their civil rights already have them and I would be the last person to attempt to deny anyone those rights."

Rep. Hoag of Woodford explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voice strong opposition to this bill based on moral, religious and ethical beliefs in conjunction with the overwhelming opposition of my constituents to both the same sex and civil union proposals. Furthermore, I am concerned about the social divisiveness this legislation could create. How can a voluntary action be perceived as a civil right?"

Mr. Kinsey of Craftsbury explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My grandmother could have told me much about my Indian ancestry but 65 years ago it was not popular to be an Indian. So she said nothing. My grandmother could have told me much about my Irish Catholic ancestry but that was not popular to half of our community back 65 years ago so she said nothing. Tomorrow I'm going to wear the Green in honor of my great-grandmother, an Irish Catholic. Tomorrow I'll carry my Abenaki nation card in honor of my great-great-grandmother. I wish my grandmother had felt that she could have told me about her mother and grandmother. This is the reason I have joined this fight. I now am ready to join any campaign to reduce discrimination found among my neighbors here in Vermont."

Rep. Metzger of Milton explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Yesterday we voted against a broader application of benefits. Today, we voted against a stronger defense of marriage. Therefore, Mr. Speaker, I cannot support this bill."

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Vermont's motto is freedom and unity. I hope we can all work in unity to go back to our communities and explain what this bill does. And I hope we will explain to the majority of our constituents, who this does not impact, why they should not be afraid and why this is the right thing to do. Many members have indicated they support this in concept, but it is too soon. I believe being a representative and a leader means going back to our people and to calm their fear and explain the law rather than to fuel anger and misperception."

Rep. Corren of Burlington explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: Separate and unequal. This bill meets neither the Constitutional test of the Common Benefits Clause, nor the highest moral test of the Golden Rule on which that clause is based. It is painful to need to vote in favor of a codification of unequal treatment when we could so easily provide the equal right for all to marry. Any discomfort of legislators is insignificant compared to that of Vermonters denied equal rights by our laws. When we look back from some future date, be it five, ten or twenty years from now, when government no longer interferes with or even inquires about the sex or gender of an individual's choice of a marriage partner, at that time, or a few years later, we will look back in puzzlement at this vote. Only in the context of the absolute discrimination of the existing law, can the present bill be seen as a step forward. And so it is. Let it be but the first."

Rep. Mackinnon of Sharon explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: A step - in my view, just a step - and I promise that I, for one, will remain ever vigilant to any discrimination that may continue to exist here in Vermont. Thank you Mr. Speaker."

Rep. Neiman of Georgia explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I believe that our actions this afternoon have finally shown the true agenda of this legislature to the people of Vermont. We have, despite their overwhelming opposition, passed a poorly written bill that we have not even begun to consider the ramifications of. What we have done is to display to the people of Vermont the arrogance of power. No compromising, no thoughtful review, - just ramming a bad bill down the throats of Vermonters. I sincerely hope that the people of the state will remember this arrogance of power!"

***Vote explanations for S.300, motion not to accept report of Committee of Conference
and appoint a second Committee of Conference, 5/15/00***

Rep. Anderson of Woodstock, explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I hope that the committee of conference will indeed meet and bring back a bill that will address the concerns of the members of the House. We owe it to Vermonters to give this one more try. The need is too great.”

Rep. Deen of Westminster, explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: With this vote we have not chosen to lower the cost of prescription drugs. We have chosen another cost shift from the people who need prescription drugs to the taxpayers of Vermont.”

Rep. Kinsey of Craftsbury, explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I recall in 1936 the nation did not go the same as Vermont and Maine and Alf Landon.”

Rep. Rusten of Halifax, explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I have never before explained my vote. We need to relieve the pharmaceutical price burden on our constituents. I believe the strongest message needs to be sent to the pharmaceutical companies that their price policies are a DISGRACE. I have proposed compromise language options that, if agreed to by a new conference committee, would result in both a warning to the drug companies and I believe in an overwhelmingly positive vote for a new S. 300 that an overwhelming vote in support of a modified S. 300 will send the strongest and best message to the pharmaceutical companies that their prices must come down.”

Rep. Towne of Berlin, explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I would like to be able to vote for this prescription drug bill. My college education did not include a course in economics 101. However, with 50 years of experience in “barnyard economics” and post graduate course delivered at kitchen table seminars by my late father-in-law, I have learned a few basic truths that have withstood the test of time.

1. You cannot repeal the law of supply and demand. Not this body – not the other body, and no, not even the Congress!
2. You can trig the wheels of progress for a while but the wheels of progress will grind on and inevitably will overcome the obstacles. I voted yes in hopes another conference report will bring back a bill without price controls.”

Rep. Vincent of Waterbury, explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I cannot support any bill with national pharmaceutical price regulations because I fear that Vermonters will have less access to prescription drugs. If national drug companies decide not to sell their product to Vermont pharmacies because of these price regulations, I fear Vermont residents will have less access to drugs, which might prove to be life sustaining drugs. I cannot support price regulations in this bill at this time because I fear the limitation of access to certain life saving drugs...could impact the health and safety of some Vermonters. Let’s design a better way to impact the greedy national pharmaceutical companies.”
