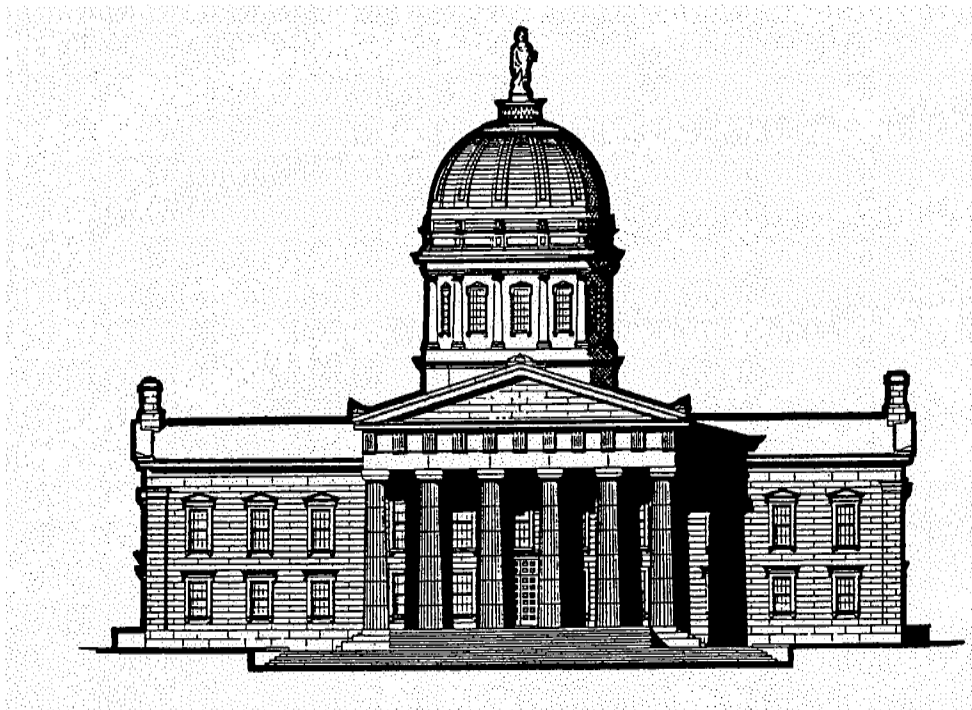

## **Appendix**

**Vote explanations (at back of book)**

*The following are the House Rules governing voting in the House*

**XI  
OF VOTING**

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. Of the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in come other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall cote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 3, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Member shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. Incase of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

# VOTE EXPLANATIONS

## Page 4.

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: In the end how many property tax payers will understand or care about this vote? Until we move our education funding away from the residential property tax, we will continue to have these debates about shuffling money while making almost no change for the taxpayers of the state.”

## Page 5

**Rep. Anderson of Woodstock** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: We need to target property tax relief to all farmers, not just to those in the current use program.”

**Rep. Otterman of Topsham** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted “no” on section 2 of the amendment proposed by Representative Gervais and others because section 2 extends tax relief only to farmers enrolled in the Land Use Program. I prefer to vote for the bill presently in the Agriculture Committee which I trust will provide relief for all farmers, whether or not enrolled in the Land Use Program.”

**Rep. Young of Orwell** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I vote no with no fear. My farmers, friends, neighbors and constituents know I support agriculture in Vermont not just say I do. Let’s take time and do the job right!”

## Page 6

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: My opposition to Powerball on principled grounds is well known in this chamber. It is a regressive tax. It falls upon those who can least afford it. It is an extremely poor example of legislative action to those to whom it supposedly benefits: our youth who are already bombarded with the wrong messages. However, I vote for the Budget Adjustment Act because overall it is an excellent piece of work that needs passage to benefit the people of Vermont, to be fiscally responsible and to give relief to our beleaguered taxpayers.”

## Page 7

**Rep. Koch of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: Prior to this motion being made, I had already asked our committee assistant to schedule time tomorrow afternoon to work on this resolution. This is an important issue, and I intend to give it our highest priority. We should, however, check out the facts and be sure the resolution properly addresses the problem before rushing to a vote.”

**Rep. Brown of Walden** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted no because my constituents know I work hard for them on all health care issues! I will not play party political trickery with their health. They are too important to me.”

**Rep. Atkins of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I vote yes on the amendment in hopes that when the budget adjustment is taken up, the money for troopers would be allocated to the Defender General, the prosecutors and the judges so a balance of that three-legged stool might be attained.”

## Page 21

**Rep. Bolduc of Barton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: At a time we’re preaching accountability, what better way do we have to send a message to a organization with questionable accounting practices?”



**Page 28**

**Rep. Atkins of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: It’s difficult when you have to go against principles just to be on the winning side once in this process. It’s easier when the bill creates many jobs for our citizens.”

**Page 35**

**Rep. Audette of South Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: This bill has many good points to it, but I cannot vote for the one judge e-court.”

**Rep. Kiss of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: The process that brought us to a vote on H. 175 was incomplete. The recommendation for an expanded environmental court as the venue for consolidated environmental appeals over a professional board model similar to the Public Service Board is not based on a full analysis of the issue or its merits.

The inclusion today of S. 92 – the so-called Chapter 117 reform bill – as an amendment to H. 175, compromised the legislative process and documents our failure to put quality before politics.”

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: This bill has been supported by the many organizations that have a good idea what needs to be done to improve our economic climate. From the Lake Champlain Chamber of Commerce to the Vermont Home Builders, and the greater Burlington Industrial Corp, as well as the League of Cities and Towns. By passing this bill we help the Governor fulfill a campaign promise that he and many of us ran on last year. Let’s hope the Senate has gotten the message: Act 250 reform and local permit reform are equally important.”

**Page 40**

**Rep. Sharpe of Bristol** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: This remains my greatest frustration. If the President of the United States can call for health care for all citizens of IRAQ, the least we can do is make health care available to all Vermonters.”

**Page 45**

**Rep. Bolduc of Barton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: Unintended as it may be, we have just put more pressure to survive on the smallest of the small and the poorest of the poor in our business communities.”

**Rep. Bohi of Hartford** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: In the pay act that we have yet to vote on, the most common wage increase is \$6,000 to \$7,000. This 50 cent increase equals an increase of \$1,040 a year. Interesting contrast.”

**Rep. Deen of Westminster** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I vote yes reluctantly for H. 461. Yesterday, when I voted gladly for this bill it was a full meal with an appetizer being the 50 cent increase and a main course, the 5% COLA. Today, those who seemingly care little for the lowest wage earners in our state have removed the main course. The 5% COLA has been taken off the table to the detriment of us all.”

**Rep. Hass of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: Minimum wage jobs, remain minimum wage jobs. It is the workforce that changes. This is normal and productive as workers move on to higher paying jobs. The minimum wage should not be confused with a livable wage. According to the D.E.T. in 2001, only 2332 jobs paid less than \$6.49 an hour. These jobs are primarily entry level positions and account for less than 166 jobs per county on average. First-time workers depend on these jobs for job training and experience. Raising the minimum wage can only reduce opportunities for entry-level workers and harm the business climate in Vermont.”

**Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted no on this bill because of the negative effect it will have on the small mom and pop stores in my district. They are already raising concerns about losing business because of a possible increase in their sales tax. To impose a 50 cent increase on minimum wages is just another burden for these businesses to bear.”

**Rep. Kirker of Essex** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: In these strained economic times in this small state, we have lost thousands of jobs and many businesses.

This is not the time to be increasing the high financial burden on Vermont’s small business owners by increasing the minimum wage to \$6.75 when thirty-seven states have a minimum wage of \$5.15.”

**Rep. Miller of Elmore** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted to give 50 cents in our committee, but over 2 years, not in one shot. This would help everyone involved.”

**Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: Vermont is a small state with economic problems. We need to be doing everything possible to make our state more attractive to potential employers. Our citizens first and foremost need jobs. This bill will weaken our ability to provide economic opportunity for the hardworking people of Vermont and I therefore voted no.”

#### Page 47

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: While I abhor increasing the sales tax, especially because its negative impact will be so disproportionate to the Northeast Kingdom, I vote “no” on this amendment for several reasons: first, to obtain property tax relief; second, to avoid an increase in the income tax; third, to advance the hard work of the House to third reading.”

#### Page 48

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: While I personally dislike paying a tax on soda, my wife has persuaded me that it is in the best interests of all. She properly attributes my weight gain to my increased soda consumption here in Montpelier. She and other teachers have also commented on the negative impact of high sugar consumption on students in the classroom. So part of my justification for this “no” vote, is a rough paraphrase of “West Side Story”, Mr. Speaker, my wife made me do it.”

#### Page 49

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: It is interesting to me that our mom and pop stores cannot afford to raise their prices due to increasing the minimum wage, but it sure is ok to raise their prices with a tax. Sometimes I just don’t understand.”

#### Page 50

**Rep. Atkins of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted “yes” on everything today in an attempt to get something to take the pressure off the property tax. Nothing passed. I voted yes for third reading for the same reason.”

**Rep. Peterson of Williston** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: There are shortcomings in this bill, and there is a better approach that made more fundamental changes to a badly flawed system. I vote for this bill to provide property tax relief and hopefully to be the basis of more comprehensive and sustainable reform.”

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: This bill is far from perfect. There was an opportunity to do more. But the Legislature is about compromise and this compromise achieves several things, notably ending the divisive sharing pool and more importantly, reducing property taxes. This year we begin to “cook” Act. 60, hopefully in the near future we can put a fork in it; and do away with the statewide property tax.”

**Page 51**

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I do not believe that the Legislative branch should vote based upon what the Executive branch says it will do. I voted against this amendment because I believe in the merits of H. 480 as the better measure, at this point, to begin the work of education funding reform in ways which meet the best interests of our citizens.”

**Page 52**

**Rep. Young of Orwell** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I vote yes because we gave others the same soft landing six years ago. How soon they forget! It also doesn't seem fair in my mind to eliminate one shark pool by creating another.”

**Page 53**

**Rep. Cross of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted no on this intrusion into local control for many reasons. The main one is: Vermont's collective bargaining laws provide for a multi step process

- a) The parties are authorized to negotiate on matters of salary, related economic conditions of employment, procedures for processing complaints and grievances and other mutually agreed upon matters;
- b) Mediation by a neutral third party;
- c) Fact-finding including the fact that if there is no agreement after fact-finding, the fact-finders report must be made public;
- d) Finality which allows the school board to make the final decision on all matters which remain in dispute.

There are obvious clearly established public safeguards in this process. Once the Legislature establishes a clearly defined process which it mandates on localities, it should get out of the way and let the process work!”

**Page 54**

**Rep. Hingtgen of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: Some voted for this bill because it preserves fairness in funding our schools. But that fairness to schools comes at the price of being unfair to some taxpayers. This bill makes our low-income and working poor taxpayers swallow a larger tax increase for schools than everyone else.”

**Rep. Johnson of Canaan** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: The people I represent asked me to reform Act 60. This bill does not do that. They also asked for tax relief. This bill does not do that either, it simply raises consumption taxes to give moderate property tax relief. They asked for cost controls on the spiraling increase in education spending. H. 480 does not do that. Until we look at the underlying problem, an education system we can afford, any “solution” will be doomed to failure.”

**Rep. Kiss of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: H. 480 increases and shifts taxes on Vermonters without an opportunity to decide how new revenues might best be applied to provide common benefits. H. 480 commits funding to education while we cut benefits for healthcare. And we do this with a regressive sales tax. I'm also concerned about the effect H. 480 will have on rents for the 58% of Burlington residents which are tenants and as rental properties are taxed at the commercial rate of \$1.59/\$100.”

**Rep. Klein of East Montpelier** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted for H. 480 because unfortunately, it was the only game left in town that promised to offer some level of property tax relief. I am disappointed we didn't do better. My biggest fear is that a few years from now when taxpayers open their tax bills, they will once again be shocked, disappointed and angry.”

**Rep. Pillsbury of Brattleboro** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted no, because in my view H. 480 is not good for the Brattleboro business community.”

**Rep. Reese of Pomfret** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I am deeply troubled by the negative impact on the Connecticut River Valley of the shift of the tax burden from the property tax to the sales tax. However, I am determined to stem the tide of dramatic property tax increases in a time of decreasing incomes. That is why I worked so hard on our earlier House Ways and Means bill, (H. 462). Under H. 462, taxpayers would pay the great majority of their education tax based upon their income, without the need of income sensitivity, and therefore saving close to a tenth of our one billion dollar state education budget. Significantly, H. 462 would reconnect voters with their property tax in a way that is more in keeping with local custom and control. Instead, we are left with H. 480, which is an acceptable compromise for now, but I look forward to continuing efforts on this work in progress.”

**Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: H.480 does deliver much needed property tax relief and it does eliminate the sharing pool. However, this bill does not deal with the problematic common level of appraisal and it does not get far enough away from the property tax. While I support this bill and welcome its relief for property tax payers, I remain hopeful that much more work on educational funding will take place in the very near future.”

**Page 55**

**Rep. Dunsmore of Georgia** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I do not believe that government should be infringing further on the rights of adults of the State of Vermont.”

**Page 56**

**Rep. Hall of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: What are we doing to our state?”

**Page 57**

**Rep. Young of Orwell** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I vote no. If anyone feels a bit confused it is because you are being asked to raise what I believe amounts to a tax and then appropriate that tax in the midst of a judiciary bill.”

**Page 59**

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I am glad for those in our state who can afford multiple car seats and large cars. I vote no on behalf of our many citizens who cannot.”

**Rep. Young of Orwell** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I have a clean low mileage eight passenger Chevrolet Suburban that will soon be coming off lease. Is anyone interested?”

**Page 60**

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: It has been said that there is never a good time to vote for a legislative pay raise, but in a slow economy, this is clearly the wrong time.”

**Page 61**

**Rep. Clark of Vergennes** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I could vote in favor of this amendment only after I felt satisfied that we'd worked toward solving the healthcare issues for the Vermonters we serve.”

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I strongly support ensuring that all members of the General Assembly have access to health insurance. However, in light of yesterday’s vote on member salaries, I cannot support a double budget hit at a time of economic uncertainty.”

**Rep. Dunsmore of Georgia** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: If voting for this in some way opens the door for regular working people to get involved in their government, then what I have done has helped to elevate this body to a better place in the eyes of its constituents.”

**Rep. Marron of Stowe** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted yes, yesterday, for increasing the pay for legislators. I did that because legislative pay has not been increased since 1997.

It is not the time to expand paid benefits for legislators. It would be the first step towards a full-time legislature.”

## Page 62

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I realize the sacrifice that many make to be here, including myself. For most of my constituents a “state job” is dying and going to heaven. To paraphrase Mother Teresa, my constituents are the “poorest of the poor”. I refuse to feather our nest while we continue to increase their burdens. Jesus criticized the lawyers and lawmakers for adding to the burdens of the poor while doing nothing to lift their burdens.”

**Rep. Seibert of Norwich** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: After considering a “no” vote, I decided to vote “yes” realizing that in some small way passage of this amendment could help our part-time staff in the Clerk’s office to become vested. Many of them have been here for years and are not even able to buy into the retirement plan. That is the true injustice that should be corrected.”

## Page 63

**Rep. Branagan of Georgia** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I fully support our hardworking Vermont state employees. However, in these hard economic times I cannot support increasing pay and benefits for legislators.”

**Rep. Deen of Westminster** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: The issue in this bill is the state employee contract. We have to respect the negotiations between the executive branch and our valued state employees. We also need to respect ourselves. For those of you who do not want the pay increase, don’t take it.”

**Rep. DePoy of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted in favor of subsidizing insurance for members who would lose their employer based insurance when here in Montpelier. I think this is important because most people cannot afford to have to pay one-half of their salary here to keep their insurance coverage for themselves and their family. However I cannot ask the taxpayers to also pay us more in such poor economic times. In the end, the bad in this bill outweighs the good.”

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: We are destroying the private sector and their ability to sustain the growth of government. Pay increases are not an entitlement. As in the private sector they should be measured by productivity increases. Instead we do the opposite. We reward decreases, especially in the courts. We reward failed management and create great incentives to continue this practice. I was not sent here to condone and reward with my constituents money the management failures of the last 18 years. I was not sent here to perpetuate this malpractice of representative government.”

**Rep. Mazur of South Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: We have too many high sounding words on cost containment and too few actions. We added provisions in this bill, to go with them.”

**Rep. Morrissey of Bennington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I had planned, as I did in the Appropriations committee, to vote in favor of H. 482 to support our state employees and their state negotiated contract. But as the discussion and debate of yesterday and today have unfolded with a majority of legislators in this body voting in a legislative pay increase and medical insurance provisions, I cannot vote for H. 482 for two reasons. First, the finance committees of this body never reviewed these amendments to know the true financial impact in the

short and long term to the state. Second, my constituents have had to tighten their belts in these tough economic times, and so must we until a full legislative pay discussion can take place.”

**Rep. Pillsbury of Brattleboro** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted yes because I believe in a citizen legislature and I believe this bill opens the door for many others to serve in the Vermont Legislature.”

**Rep. Rodgers of Glover** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I vote yes because I am one of the people who has a hard time making ends meet on current pay. I would be happy to tighten my belt and not get a pay increase if everyone in state government was willing to do the same. The legislative pay increase makes it possible for young working people to serve in this citizens legislature.”

**Rep. Smith of New Haven** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted yes today to support the approximately 7500 state workers whose contracts have been negotiated in good faith. I want to be clear, I do not support the lavish increase in pay and benefits we gave ourselves while my constituents are struggling in these uncertain times.”

**Rep. Young of Orwell** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: As Chair of House Commerce committee, I vote no. As yet, I have not been provided a punch timecard system for my committee room. I guess I will also have to cease using T.B.A. in scheduling.”

#### **Page 67**

**Rep. Haas of Rutland** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted no on H. 171 because while many Vermont families scrimp and save to save money for their children’s college education, we now ask them once again to reach in their pockets to provide assistance to a newly perceived class of disadvantaged students. While other disadvantaged students enlist in the armed service to earn education funds, we reward those who simply spend six months in SRS custody.”

**Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted yes because I believe in the Legislative process and in the case of the U.S.A. Patriot Act, there was no committee time, no conference committee nor was there time for the Congress to read the 131 pages of the document before voting. We are only asking that the congress revisit the rushed through document to be certain that civil liberties are not being jeopardized.”

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I vote no. The most egregious and offensive provisions of the Patriot Act were approved by the senior U.S. Senator from Vermont and the then Democratic Majority leader, I assume for good reason. In this respect I trust their judgment and their disregard of the UCLU and the Republican House of Representative which initially declined to approve these provisions.

I could not go into any public library in an Islamic country and use their internet facilities to plan or communicate about terrorism. Five alleged terrorists used American public library facilities to accomplish their aims and goals. I cannot countenance this resolution which would require our freedoms to be used as weapons of terror and give aid and comfort to our enemies.”

**Rep. Sheltra of Derby** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: National security is of the utmost importance in our nation today. There are sunsets in the U.S. Patriot Act to protect our civil liberties. The sections I do not agree with in the Patriot Act did not come from the Republican Congressmen and Senators in Washington. President Bush should be commended for his courage to act.”

**Rep. Cross of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I supported 480 as it is the ingenious marriage of the Shumlin Education finance plan and the Douglas sales tax. A union continues the tradition of taxpayer equity and equal education opportunity for all Vermont students. Our Ways and Means committee and the Senate counterparts have done a good job.”

**Rep. Darrow of Dummerston** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: With yet another increase in the sales tax the Connecticut Valley continues to be an economic sacrifice zone for the rest of Vermont.”

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: This is not reform – it exacerbates the worst of Act 60 and creates new problems. It adds burdens to the already overburdened Kingdom and Connecticut Valley. It adds to the Vermont hostility to preserving the existing jobs and creating new ones. It does not address the #1 problems of public education – cost containment, it promises 3 studies which are the hat tricks of politicians entering an election cycle. It claims that our youth are our most precious resource, while increasing their export as finished products. We invest our tax dollars so that others benefit from our investments. The losses: our families; our children, our entrepreneurs who grow jobs. We are fools if we believe that the voters cannot see this transparent shell game. I for one, do not wish to be seen in that light.”

**Rep. Kirker of Essex** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: H. 480 is a start in the direction of providing property tax relief to Vermonters by a tax shift. In the next year of this biennium, we must have the courage to ensure cost containment in education. I supported H. 480, but reluctantly, because it leaves much to be desired.”

**Rep. Miller of Shaftsbury** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I support H. 480, the education finance bill. I would have preferred a different funding mechanism but this is the mechanism our Governor has chosen.

I have staunchly supported Act 60, the equal educational opportunity act, because of the benefit it has provided to my community. But now it's time to move on. H. 480 preserves the equity and fairness of Act 60 for children, protects income sensitivity and puts an end to the divisiveness of the sharing pool. Moreover, it simplifies how we fund our schools. My community continues to benefit and I believe the bill is in the best interest of the State of Vermont as a whole.”

**Rep. Molloy of Arlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I voted against this bill, even though it will reduce property taxes in my district for many people. I am concerned about future additional cost and the sources of funding that we will be using to finance education.”

**Rep. Pelham of Calais** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: The balance sheet of H. 480 tells the story of property tax relief in the bill. In FY 2003, the property tax burden is \$607.5 million, in fiscal year 2004, \$672 million, in FY 2005, they drop a smidgeon to \$650 million, then they rise right back up to \$690.7 million in fiscal year 2006. This small, one year level of property tax relief is not what the voters of my district are seeking.”

**Rep. Perry of Richford** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I support this bill because it makes major improvements on current law while preserving the care principles of equity in Act 60. I know how difficult it has been to develop this legislation and I salute all who helped make it happen including in particular our Ways and Means committee, House leadership and the conference committee.”

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I do not believe bills pertaining to appropriations of funds should include tampering with fundamental issues of rights which have never been evaluated by their committees of jurisdiction. We can say that's how it's done – or we can say we don't want to do it this way anymore. This bill contains a significant change in one of the most cherished of our rights as citizens – the right of open access to our government. For the first time ever, it is the government itself which is empowered to judge whether or not it is appropriate to release a document in a section of the open public records law. The conference committee removed the sunset provision which would have ensured that proper review and public debate would occur next year. By slipping this clause into the capital bill, we are blindly passing our own little Patriot Act. For this reason, I cannot support this bill.”
