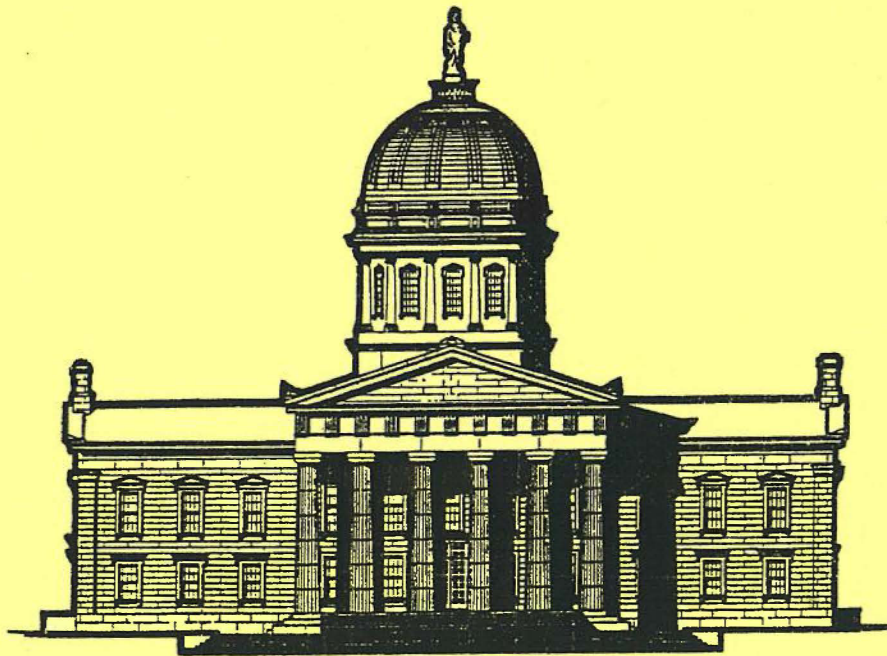

The following are the House Rules governing voting in the House

**XI
OF VOTING**

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. Of the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 3, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Member shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

Appendix

Page 1

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I object to using this body’s precious time to struggle over resolutions that are controversial and don’t change the law. I’m voting against the amendment and against the resolution as votes against spending our time this way.”

Page 2

Rep. Metzger of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no on both the amendment and the resolution because this debate and these votes will have no impact on the thirty plus year divisive debate on the issue of abortion. No ground has been gained, no minds have been changed. Instead we have started this biennium with a fruitless debate which does little to address our Medicaid crisis or other more pressing problems.”

Rep. Bostic of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

While I consider myself a pro-choice supporter of parental notification, I voted no on both questions because I feel this process to be a waste of time.”

Page 4

Rep. Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Since health care is already promised to retired teachers and since the Representative from Windsor has hit my target date of retirement at 2032, I see no reason to abstain from the vote. This amendment simply is a funding mechanism, not a special project.”

Page 6

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Vermont’s Commissioner of Health is probably not equipped to decide that a Canadian drug is equivalent to another drug approved by the Federal Food and Drug Administration.

Whether or not a faulty ruling by Vermont’s Commissioner would lead to liability of the state for damages, I am not willing to impose this responsibility upon him.”

Page 7

Rep. DePoy of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote for this bill at this time in hopes that my concerns about safety and oversight can be resolved by third reading. At this time it is still difficult for me to believe that safety in this program won’t be compromised. Trying to save money should not come before people’s health.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Reluctantly I vote yes. Yes, to give more choice. Yes, to possibly reduce costs to our most vulnerable population. My reluctance comes from my conviction that our most vulnerable consumers are being stripped of all meaningful consumer rights and remedies, which once again reduces them to second or third class status. Without equivalent rights and remedies, any dollar savings will be a cruel illusion for those who become victims of error, omission, misrepresentation and deceit.

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I cannot vote in favor of a plan which might jeopardize a key business in my district – especially when there is no evidence that it would benefit a significant number of people statewide.

If we loose our pharmacies we may find that they cannot be easily replaced. Instead of benefiting our constituents we may actually have harmed them.”

Rep. Shaw of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

However, not perfect, It is a start. I do worry about the impact that it may have on Vermont pharmacies!”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote not. This legislation as far as I am concerned intends to lead Vermonters down a poorly defined road. They are to deal with a single P.B.M. chosen by another state to buy prescriptions from Canada, Europe and wherever trusting, for the most part, a safety inspection done by someone else. All this while exempting practically all from liability, knowing it violates Federal law, and the program won’t last long enough to save much money or make anyone feel better except politicians.”

Page 8

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Although I feel we could have approved a much better bill, I vote yes to give the neediest Vermonters the opportunity for lower prices on prescription drugs. I look forward to moving from this bill that will benefit few, to a much greater discussion of our health insurance system that will benefit many, many more.”

Page 10

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Democracy is the reason we are here. How can we in good conscience limit the members on a Board and thereby limit the representation of those who depend on them for a voice?”

Rep. Dunsmore of Georgia explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This is a question on the basic principle of democracy and that 1 voice 1 vote. This should not be eenie, meanie, miney, no democracy where every eenie, meanie, or minie gets to vote but if you are mo, you don’t get a vote.”

Page 11

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes – at the suggestion of my chair. I apologize to the members of this body. I do not enjoy being in the position in which I have been thrust. On the other hand, after serving 13 years in this body and 13 years on Commerce committee, 11 of those respecting and supporting a Democratic chair, I truly believe I deserved more respect that I received Tuesday from all those who were involved.”

Page 12

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no because this bill minimizes transparency and accountability and maximizes secrecy and unfair competitive advantages at taxpayers expense. I wish no ill for credit union members. In fact, I am voting “no” in large part because they will be deprived of important information by which to hold accountable their officers and directors. This House has ignored its Constitutional duty to all of the stakeholders; the members; the borrowers; the citizens and the taxpayers who subsidize credit union activity.”

Page 13

Rep. Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

It is out of respect for the freedom of all Vermonters to make some of their own decisions without government interference, even if the decision is a poor one, that I vote no on bill 243.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We cannot prevent every tragedy by law, and we should not enact law every time we have a tragedy. Heartache can produce bad policy.”

Rep. Endres explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Although I recognize the tragic consequences of carbon monoxide poisoning, extend my sympathy to the victims of the UVM tragedy, and support a requirement that detectors be placed in all rental housing to protect tenants. I voted no because I am reluctant to direct the state to reach into private citizen’s homes and tell them yet again how to live their lives.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

While I have reservations about applying this well-intentioned bill to single family residences, I vote no because the deletion of section 2882(e) imposes new legal obligations and liabilities on homeowners and insurers without adequate consideration of the consequences of that change, a change that is bound to be poorly understood.”

Rep. Perry of Richford explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I agree with the need for increased safety measures in some Vermont residences and places of lodging. However, my concern about this proposed legislation is that it will give the appearance of greater safety, but not much actual improvement. We already have too many laws that are poorly or inconsistently enforced.”

Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Although I understand the need for people to install carbon monoxide units in residences, this bill is just one more instance of government intrusion in the privacy of Vermont citizens.”

Rep. Shaw of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Most of us with our own homes can make a decision of our own, but the tenants of this state haven’t that choice. A simple carbon monoxide detector can save their lives! I will vote for a bill like this every time.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

For the tiny burden and small cost of a carbon monoxide detector, we can save lives that are needlessly lost. Carbon monoxide is odorless, silent and invisible. This bill is not about freedom, it is about the safety of unsuspecting citizens who sometimes go to sleep and don’t wake up.”

Page 21

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote “no” because this bill will do the opposite of what is claimed for it. It will increase taxes; it will cause business closings; it will victimize the marginal employees who are supposed to be helped. It is supported by those who can afford champagne, to compel those who cannot afford beer for themselves to buy premium beer for their employees. There is an “economic reality” disconnect in this bill. Its passage is bad public policy!”

Rep. Minter of Waterbury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am voting yes on this bill because I believe we need to do all we can to support the working poor, and to strive to achieve a liveable wage. And yet I am concerned about its potential impact upon our small business. I recognize small business is the backbone of Vermont’s economy and that many small businesses operate at the margins. The most important thing we in this chamber can do to redress the challenges to our small businesses is to address the spiraling costs of health care.

Health care reform will more than redress the potential burden that this minimum wage may impose on the employers of this state and we must proceed with efforts to reduce these significant health care costs for employers.”

Rep. Myers Essex explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no, not because I am insensitive to the needs of Vermont workers, but because I am acutely sensitive to the needs of Vermont’s small business.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Here in this building we care about the "bottom line" for state government. It appears that we do not have the same concern for the bottom line of our small businesses. Tonight, we hope our Vermont Catamounts can say "we're number 1! With the passage of this bill I fear we are on our way to becoming number 1 in creating legislation that hurts small business."

Page 22

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

During our floor debate this bill has been completely mischaracterized for the sake of a few press lines in the newspapers. The bill does not change one thing you can or cannot burn in your wood stove. This bill changes Title 24 and empowers your local selectboard to enforce local ordinances."

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

No. This bill contains "over inclusive" language which takes the "environmental cap" into my home and office basement at -30 degrees F when the furnace "kicks off" and makes me a violator for using some type of starter fuel to save life, valuable equipment, and the plumbing system. Once again, because of poor thinking and poor drafting, we elevate form over function and common sense."

Page 23

Rep. Louras of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Though this amendment is far from perfect, I support it in light of the fact that the Health Care committee, has as part of its health care reform draft, a provision that provides for a new payroll tax and an increase to the income tax to shore up Medicaid that I find much more offensive than this amendment."

Page 24

Rep. Green of Berlin explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

1. We had powerful testimony in the Human Services committee;
2. Not worried that we won't be able to continue this in future years;
3. Personal knowledge of the role of counselors in Rutland area.

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

It is with great reluctance that I vote against this amendment. We do need more substance abuse counselors in our schools, but this budget does make significant progress in providing increased resources in our fight against substance abuse. We need sustained progress, and we cannot do it all in one year. The appropriations committee has made genuine effort to improve services in this area in a year of tight money, and I vote to support that effort."

Page 26

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote yes. As I look around this chamber and see the boxes of low phosphorus dishwasher detergent and think of all the phosphorus reduction plans that my constituent town of Shoreham struggles to maintain. It would appear that once again this is a classic case of do as I say, not as I do."

Page 27

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

While I wish that I could express confidence that this body will pass health care reform that empowers individual Vermonters, increases choice, lowers costs and does not raise taxes on working Vermonters, I cannot. Therefore, I must vote no on this amendment and thereby maintain funding for the retiree medical benefits reserve."

Page 28

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This amendment dealt only with allowing unspent, unneeded remainder money to be returned to the general fund to support known unmet human service needs. I cannot support such an unwise appropriation of our desperately limited resources.”

Page 31

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There are many good items in this bill. I appreciate the hard work that went into its preparation. However, without knowing how Medicaid will be dealt with, I cannot support this bill. In a year where money is tight, this information is vital for an appropriate, informed decision on how best to spend our scarce dollars.

I fear we may have just voted in a budget that, once Medicaid is added in, we won't be able to afford.”

Rep. Green of Berlin explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted “yes”, but I'd like to address a comment to the conferees who will be finishing the appropriations committee's work on this bill. Only in the past few weeks and days has it become clear just how onerous will be the burden of getting critical information to Vermont's senior citizens regarding the decisions they must make to continue to receive their current Medicaid drug benefits under Medicare part d. The time is short. Then decisions will be final. Additional resources may well be necessary for the Human Services Department and the area offices on aging.”

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes for this budget. At a time when the federal government has cut every meaningful program for our most vulnerable citizens. This budget reflects Vermont's commitment to protecting our most vulnerable citizens while keeping a further commitment to live within our means.”

Rep. Schiavone of Shelburne explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no because the bill is incomplete in that it makes no provisions for our large Medicaid deficit.”

Rep. Shaw of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I also want to echo the comments of my colleagues regarding the excellent work of the Appropriations Committee, and the funding priorities that the committee has established. I am particularly pleased to note the proposed increase of \$630,000.00 included in the budget for Vermont's five area agencies on aging, but hold deep concerns that this amount is insufficient to prevent additional cuts in services to older Vermonters.

As a proud board member of the Area Agency on Aging for Northeastern Vermont and having operated “Meals on Wheels” program in the Newport area. I've had the privilege of learning about the extraordinary challenges that many of our oldest citizens face. Beyond the usual troubles associated with aging, many of our seniors today face uncommon hardships related to poverty, malnutrition, and isolation. It is unconscionable that those whose efforts have made possible the quality of life we enjoy today should be forced to endure these conditions. Our seniors deserve better. We can do better.

During this past year, Vermont's Agency on Aging were forced to begin the process of dismantling the network of programs and services that have developed over the past 30 years that serve older Vermonters and their families. Even with the proposed funding increase of \$360,000.00, additional cuts in services will be necessary; all at a time when the population of older adults is growing rapidly, and we are seeking every possible avenue to reduce long term care expenditures in the Medicaid program.

All of us in this Chamber, and the world beyond these doors, owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to the generations that have come before us. That debt has come due today in the form of our support for the agencies that serve older adults. Our sacred obligation to honor, respect and value our elders requires nothing less. Thank you.

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

While I understand the difficult budgeting constraints that forced some of the direction of this bill, I cannot support this budget due to the unwise decisions made in several areas. The “clean and clear” program is the single most important water quality program of our time and the reduction of funding in this area is shortsighted and dangerous. The removal of funding for additional substance abuse counselors in our schools redirects Vermont's focus from prevention of drug abuse among our kids to treatment of them after they are addicted. I cannot support this imbalance in strategy as it puts children, those being

targeted by many drug dealers, in danger. Finally, I cannot support a budget that separates the Medicaid portion with no Medicaid bill in sight, no plan or strategy to craft a solution, and no assurance that any eventual solution will not involve tax increases on working Vermonters.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes despite my concerns about attempts to blame the tough decisions all on the federal government. This would be like finding an excuse for the sinking of the Titanic that ignored the ice berg.”

Page 32

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There is no reason to postpone this vote. The only purpose for postponement is to give some people more time to twist arms.

The unfortunate thing is that we all agree on what this bill seeks to do – unitize the three retirement funds. The Governor’s objection is a technical point that can easily be fixed in a new bill, if his veto is sustained. The sooner we get on with it, the better.”

Rep. Miller of Elmore explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I got bombarded with calls saying don’t play partisan politics and be fiscally responsible. Your postponement is not fiscally responsible and very partisan. I am responsible.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no. My constituents expect that I will make an effort to understand relatively simple issues here and be prepared to vote on those issues in a timely manner.”

Page 33

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We have certainly redefined today what is meant by “one person one vote”. I guess what is democratic or not depends on whether you spell it v-o-t-e or v-e-t-o.”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

It is a shame that politics got in the way...all the way around.

The fact is, under current law the boards have representatives from their respective groups and from elected government like the Governor and Treasurer. Under the proposed law that principle would continue on the consolidated board. The Governor wants a say in who represents the people of Vermont and who the respective groups have as their representative. That is not one person, one vote, that is one person many votes. What the Governor wants is a consolidation of power, that is not Democracy. This vote was not about compromise.”

Page 34

Rep. LaVoie of Swanton explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Either smoking is truly a health care risk that affects all Vermonters, no matter where they are, or it is not. How serious are we about this discussion.”

Page 35

Rep. Atkins of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I prefer that this issue remain local. However, as State Representative, it has to be for everyone, not just a few.”

Rep. Dowland of Holland explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

In all the testimony we’ve taken in committee, we haven’t heard from the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Elks or other private clubs against this bill, so I’m voting against this amendment.”

Page 36

Rep. Seibert of Norwich explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The club member who came from Brattleboro was invited by a committee member to a 9:00 a.m. meeting which was not a hearing but a meeting of committees to hear amendments to H. 241. Three club members in attendance never asked to speak, and the committee member who invited the man from Brattleboro never asked permission for his guest to speak. The bells for the floor were ringing when the Chair adjourned the gathering. There appears to have been an unfortunate lack of communication among the interested parties.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes to send this back to committee because I believe this is a sea change for bars and clubs and deserves more testimony and consideration. What would have been the harm on allowing for more people to be heard?”

Page 37

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes. I support the bill and I have thus far voted that way. My concern is this.... Why would a committee not call those it knows that would be interested in a certain bill? That has always been the practice in Commerce committee and I am proud of that fact.”

Page 38

Rep. Brennan of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no today on H.341 because I feel it is just another attack on free enterprise, as well as, an infringement on personal choice.

Rep. Darrow of Dummerston explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Some things are so addictive and dangerous that we ban or regulate them, drugs, tobacco, alcohol. We ban drugs because they are so addictive and debilitating and destructive to society. We tried banning alcohol for the same reasons. Prohibition – it didn’t work. So we regulate it – age, availability, when and where it’s sold, purchased and used.

And we regulate tobacco because it is so addictive and so destructive to health. If this bill is about anyone’s rights, it is about the rights of those who choose not to smoke not to inhale smoke.

Rep. Dunsmore of Georgia explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There has been too many question marks about who got to testify on this bill. It is our duty as elected officials of the people to try and hear everyone that wants to be heard. This is to important an issue to play push through agenda politics.”

Rep. Houston of Ferrisburgh explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Again, this, year Madam Speaker, the public has not been given their “right” to be heard.

Rep. Howard of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes. I vote yes on behalf of Vermont’s waitstaff, Vermont’s bartenders and their families. I vote yes in defense of the right of Vermonter’s to breathe clean air and their right to health and happiness.”

Rep. Minter of Waterbury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker

I vote yes today because this is not about taking away individuals’ rights. This is about protecting the public health. Lung cancer is the leading cause of death. Cigarette smoke is the most important risk factor for lung cancer. Second hand smoke is

the third leading cause of preventable death. When the decisions of the individual severely affect the public health of others, I say it is our duty to protect the public health.”

Rep. Myers of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no on this bill for my husband Marty who was a member of this assembly three years, 8 months and five days ago when he died of lung cancer. Marty knew the risks of smoking and chose to accept them. But he would have been appalled at this infringement of individual rights and the rights of Vermont towns to choose their own path.”

Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I cannot support a bill that breezed through two house committees without any input from the organizations that will be most hurt by this law.

We spend all afternoon on an issue we could have allowed towns to decide for themselves. Democracy was sadly missing in the State House today.

I pray the people we represent drive carefully as they drive across the river to live free or die.

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My constituents are capable of making decisions about smoking for themselves without direction from Montpelier.”

Rep. Smith of New Haven explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

By defeating the amendment to bar the sale and use of tobacco products, it became very clear to me that this issue has more to do with tax revenues than public health. This bill has the potential to force increased smoking into private homes exposing our most vulnerable young people to increased exposure to second hand smoke for these reasons I voted no.”

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I applaud the actions of the local governing bodies in Vermont that have chosen to prohibit smoking in their communities. I regret that, because of our action on this bill today, other local governing bodies will not be able to decide for themselves what is best for their communities. Once again this Legislative body has chosen to stick the noses of this Golden Dome into issues best handled on a local level.

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Because of failed attempts on the House floor at compromise and failed attempts to allow for more testimony, my committee vote of “yes” changes to a “no”. I will continue to support efforts to keep our youth from ever taking up smoking.”

Page 40

Rep. Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Don't ask Vermont citizens what you can do for Vermont, ask instead what your citizen legislature has done to you.”

Rep. Endres of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no because this is yet another example of state government overstepping its bounds and reaching into our private lives and private decisions. When do we stop dictating personal behavior? Where do we draw the line? What happened to local choices and local decisions?”

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I can't support a bill that restricts a legal activity in private establishments, without assurances that those affected were given a full opportunity to have their concerns heard.

With a little compromise, I might have been able to support this bill. Unfortunately, this year compromise appears to be impossible.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote no because:

1. This bill invades private choices with which we have no right to interfere;
2. It forbids action, but provides no penalty or sanctions, which is unconstitutional;
3. It discriminates against private assembly and associations and places them in a lower status than those commercial businesses routinely open to the public;
4. It masquerades as law when it is nothing more than a toothless resolution and therefore it is a fraud on the citizens;
5. By passing this "resolution" we deceive ourselves, deceive the citizens, violate our oath, and boastfully don "The Emperor's new clothes."

Rep. Miller of Shaftsbury explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

The Attorney General won his law suit against the tobacco companies proving that Medicaid spending is attributable to smoking. Vermont spends 3.2 billion dollars on health care each year, 100 million of which may be attributable to smoking. If for no other reason, we should pass this bill for economic reasons."

Rep. Niquette of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted no even though I am a non-smoker and choose not to frequent smoke filled bars. I am a strong proponent of individual rights, personal responsibility and local control."

Rep. Schiavone of Shelburne explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote no because of this bill's blatant intrusion into private property and the attempt to unnecessarily regulate a person's behavior while on that property."

Page 41

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

As a Board of Director for a hospice organization in Bennington, I vote in favor of H. 115, an act relating to advance directives for health care, in the true spirit of information and education for Vermont citizens. It is my hope that the Legislature will allow the continuation of another important discussion that is presently going on in this building in regards to end of life directives known as Death With Dignity or physician assisted suicide. It is with further hope that within the legislative process that these two initiatives not be blended so that they can be decided, based upon their own merits."

Page 43

Rep. Dunsmore of Georgia explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I feel that the taxpayers of this state have much to high a burden to bear and that if government has to tighten it's belt to help the overburdened taxpayers of this state, then so be it."

Page 44

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

We've shown that adjusting Act 60 isn't working. We keep adding fuel to the fire of school spending at the expense of our heavily burdened taxpayers. It's time to blow up Act 60 and start over."

Rep. Livingston of Manchester explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

It is past the time we should plan for a new form of education funding. The flaws of Act 60/68 have revealed the flaws in Act 60/68 have over time exacerbated the inequities that burden our taxpayers unfairly. Let's be serious with our intent to study and redesign our system."

Page 47

Rep. Cross of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I am pleased to have joined the majority in making the wise choice of having the state continue its commitment to local school districts. Our vote today has prevented the state from shifting 3% of special education costs onto the backs of the homestead taxpayers across these green mountains."

Page 49

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

It is irresponsible to tell Vermonters today that we have free care for all, and then after the 2006 elections to present them with the tax bill for this free care."

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote no because commitment to the Ways and Means committee at this time is as premature as some of the other actions this bill proposes. When we know what it is we are paying for and how much it will cost, it will be appropriate to consider how to pay for it."

Rep. Lorber of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Let's not tie up the bill in committee. Let's move forward the discussion on how to control costs and fix health care."

Page 50

Rep. Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

This bill is like eating bites of granola with no liquid to wash it down. It's got great flavor but one could choke before the flakes hit your stomach."

Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

We cannot allow this debate to digress into scare tactics. Vermonters know our health care system is unsustainable. We must keep an open mind as we study the current system. We will only find answers if we continue this conversation."

Rep. Dunsmore of Georgia explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

The debate that we just listened to on H. 524 though very interesting comes down to one thing, a big huge question mark, we don't know who it is going to cover, what will be covered, how it will be funded, who will pay for it. Putting forth legislation in this way is an appalling disservice to all of our constituents. There have been members in this body that have been crying health care crisis. Well I say if this unthoughtout question mark legislation becomes law, we will truly know a crisis."

Rep. Endres of Milton explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

This bill puts the cart before the horse. It will have potentially devastating effect on businesses in this state. Some will leave, some will close their doors, new ones will not come. The rest of us will face lesser coverage, rationed care, potentially higher income and property taxes. I voted no to ask the legislature to slow down, take testimony, listen to the people and then craft a well thought out proposal."

Rep. Howard of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

My constituents are hard working Vermonters who play by the rules. They may not be able to afford well connected lobbyists, they may not make large campaign contributions or write polished letters on fancy stationary, but Madam Speaker, somebody has to be on their side. Somebody needs to fight for them. I voted for H. 524 because it puts the emphasis of the health care debate squarely on their side."

Rep. Hutchinson of Randolph explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted in favor of H. 524 on behalf of my neighbors. The people of my district pay more every day for health care that is out of control. As a local official, I struggle with town budgets which are driven even higher by exploding health care costs. I cannot, in good conscience, settle for more band aids or endless long-term studies. The time for action is not now, it was yesterday. But, better late than never.”

Rep. Lorber of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I believe that we can and must fix health care – not just for the rich, and not just for the poor, but for all Vermonters.”

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes because a no vote effectively would have taken away any chance for us to work on the problem of escalating health care cost for another year. We have to have this debate now.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no, but if you all want to buy something, don't care what it costs and who is going to pay for it, or what it is, I have a bridge for sale.”

Page 52

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There was very little “conversation” about this proposal in the health care committee. Why? Because, I believe there was a determination made to go full speed ahead with a government run plan, paid for with gigantic tax increases.”

Page 53

Rep. Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The Vermont citizens spirit of cooperation ever before now, present in this House of the people of Vermont has dissipated and it may take a sorcerer to reassemble its parts. No compromise on this bill means we aren't capable of finding common ground and those who pay us and trust us to compromise have lost out once again.”

Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This amendment was a perfect opportunity for all parties to come together and move H. 524 ahead in a bi-partisan manner. Again, a golden opportunity lost.”

Page 54

Rep. Clarkson of Woodstock explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes to H. 524 as it not only sets the stage to move forward on containing the escalating costs of health care and providing universal coverage for all Vermonters, but because at its core it supports our Vermont Constitution's notion of the common benefit.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Because we share so many fundamental principles, and agree on the importance of addressing the problem, it is a sad day when politics dictate that this body chooses to make no rational progress at all. It is never rational to commit in advance to a plan before an acknowledged need for critical additional information is realized. I will not vote for an irrational plan.”

Rep. Endres of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill represents fundamental change throughout the state. It completely overturns our current system in the worthwhile effort to provide coverage to the ten percent of Vermonters who do not have health insurance. I voted no because there are too many unanswered questions. We cannot set up a new state agency and commit taxpayer dollars until these

questions are answered. I agree that we should have the discussion and make some needed changes, but I cannot support irresponsible legislation like H. 524.”

Rep. Haas of Rochester explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote in favor of this bill because it presents a blueprint for going forward to provide fair and equitable access to universal health care for all citizens of this state. I agree with the vision of this bill that the formerly separate issues of cost shifting, cost containment, quality care, preventative care and equal access will best be solved by crafting an integrated health care system.”

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This body has a rich history of courageous decisions which have led to positive changes in people’s lives.

The status quo in health care cannot be sustained. I vote yes on H. 524 because it commit us to a process, with many stops more along the way, to begin to bend the curve of cost increases which threaten to wreck our economy.

As seen in the past two days, it’s a brutally tough journey, but we will make it together as Vermonters always do in the end.”

Rep. Keenan of St. Albans City explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes on 524 in hopes the committee will take the time to work with Vermonters to identify what is working and what is not working in our current system. I hope they will explore ways to improve upon the already successful, cost saving aspects of our present high quality system provided to Vermonters in a variety of settings.”

Rep. Marcotte of Coventry explained his vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker,

As a freshman legislator, I have chosen this first year to observe, listen, and learn, to ask questions and do what I believe is right both in committee and on the floor for my constituents and all Vermonters. I came here well aware of party politics. But I am deeply saddened by what appears to me as a growing atmosphere of an unwillingness to compromise and an unwillingness to work together. As we all know, if this bill passes, the Governor has indicated that he will use his veto power and it is likely his veto will be sustained in this chamber. We then are back to step one-another year has gone by and Vermonters are again left to struggle with the rising cost of health care because of partisan politics. Stop turning the citizens of Vermont into political pawns using health care as the chess game and creating an issue for the 06 election because the stakes in this game are too high and the losers are the very Vermonters which all of us were elected to represent.”

Rep. Partridge of Windham explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I cast my vote today for the couple in Rockingham I visited with during the last campaign. Both with full time jobs, both with chronic illness, and paying \$1,000 per month out of their pockets for health insurance. At that time they told me that they did not think they could afford their health insurance and keep their house. Two weeks later there was a “for sale” sign on their lawn. This is wrong. This is not the Vermont way. It is time to get control of health care costs and help hardworking Vermonters maintain their quality of life.”

Rep. Severance of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted for the bill because I believe there needs to be a forum for continued discussion and analysis of how Vermonters can have quality health care at an affordable price. Everyone seems to agree the present system of care is fragmented, inefficient, and costly by any measure with modest outcomes at best. The crisis in health care is the cost of care the persistent increase making it increasingly unaffordable. We need to initially concentrate on the cost of care and only secondarily on how to pay for it. The bill addresses the cost of care but it does much more. I have considerable reservations about including in this bill a restructuring of state government to plan, coordinate and direct health care for all Vermonters. In my judgment, that belongs in the bill scheduled for next January, following the studies and the work of the Health Care Committee scheduled for the summer and fall. Moreover, I believe there is a huge educational challenge as we move forward. Vermonters need to understand that in health care, as in everything else, there are tradeoffs. If we are to control the increases in the cost of health care, we cannot provide all the health care that everybody wants whenever they want it. We can provide what everybody needs. Also, no proposed program can be successful until all parties are ready to buy into the program – whatever it is. Major changes do not occur in a few short weeks or a few months. They can’t hurried, but they must be pursued. In a sense, this bill is trying to do too much too soon, yet we must address the issues without delay. Do I believe the process should go forward? Absolutely. We need to do the studies. We need to engage Vermonters of every persuasion. We need to build consensus and support. We need to develop the system that will work for all Vermonters. The bill, as presented, presumes an end result. But, in my view, just what that system will look like a year or more from now is not at all clear. Like all complicated issues, the devil is in the details. Unfortunately, this bill has become highly political.

With the passage of H.524, the train will leave the station but the track ahead is not clear. Hopefully, there is a sign ahead that will avoid disaster and ultimately serve the well-being of all Vermonters.”

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Although this bill does not move Vermont’s health care system forward quickly enough for many Vermonters it is a compromise in the spirit of cooperation. I sincerely hope that this modest effort toward significant reform of a broken system is passed into law.”

Rep. Smith of New Haven explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There has been a lot of attention given in recent years to the issues of outsourcing Vermont jobs overseas.

It is ironic that many of the same people who criticize outsourcing support this legislation, which could become one of the largest costs driving jobs out of Vermont.

By taking “bold action” today without first understanding the fiscal impacts could create a prescription for disaster in real health care reform tomorrow.

For these reasons I voted no.”

Rep Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I oppose H. 524 because despite our need for health care reform, in this case the cure is worse than the disease. The proponents complain about our concerns as “scare tactics” yet they offer no real rebuttal to them. It is a government run plan, it will cost 2 billion dollars in broad based taxes. No compromise considered, a popularly re-elected Governor’s ideas ignored and a fatally flawed bill heads down the tracks... The Act 60 of Health Care. Those are the facts.”

Page 56

Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There are several aspects of this bill I oppose such as the speed program the micro-managing of the utility providers and the fear of higher utility rates for my constituents, but in the spirit of cooperation and compromise, I offer my support to the bill.”

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I appreciate the work and cooperation of the committee on this bill. However, I can’t quite get to the point of being concerned that this is necessary and won’t result in increased costs to my constituents. I only wish I had more time to reassure myself.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Of making us a David against Goliath, it pretends we are a Goliath in the energy market. I read the Bible, I know how the story ends. Goliath loses. David wins.

I vote no because this bill is an illusion. It is a “get richer quicker” scheme for certain Vermont energy developers while defying the economic and natural recourse reality of Vermont. It increases our competitive disadvantage. It erroneously claims we have the internal resources to create energy to replace Vermont Yankee and Hydro-Quebec. It gives “The Emperor’s New Clothes”, new meaning with its irrational nonsensical and unreal definition of renewable energy resources. Above all it defies the free market and insures higher energy costs to Vermont instead.”

Morley of Barton explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no because I believe this bill will increase rates to all Vermonters. S. 52 will have an impact on every single person in the state of Vermont. I, Rep. John Morley IV, would like to apologize to all the ratepayers of the state, the businesses, commercial establishments the residential ratepayers and especially the low-income Vermonters that can’t afford higher rates. I am sorry.”

Rep. Smith of New Haven explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

As a supporter of clean renewable instate energy production I support this bill with the stated objectives of lowering our electric rates and bills, stimulate Vermont’s economy, provide direct benefits to Vermont businesses and making our air cleaner and reducing greenhouse gasses.”

Page 59

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote no again. As I have said before – I do not support a "superboard" with fewer people, less advice and more money to invest. That is a formula for a super mistake!"

Page 60

Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

When I ran for this office I promised the people I represent that I would make every decision fairly and honestly, I would weigh the options, look at both sides and always have them first in my heart and mind, and I would not put politics before them. I can sleep well tonight."

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I imagine the low income folks who need dentures and eye glasses will be happy to know we will study this issue further rather than helping them see or eat."

Page 61

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted "yes" to support the Medicaid funding proposal before us this morning, not because it contains long-term solutions for predictable, financial and deliverance of service, but quite honestly because it's the only proposal before us, late in the legislative session., I do not want my constituents, who are recipients of our state-run Medicaid program to have their lives turned upside down because of our lack of ability to find long-term solutions within our health care systems.

Our state-run Medicaid program, with this years 80 million dollar deficit is honest testimony to the very real complexities and difficulties of any government-run, state-run program. I only hope, as we look to address our health care systems and it's reform, that all of us will remember the discussions on this floor over the last two days. If you thought we weren't providing services and adequately funding our present state government-run program, hold on, wait till we have our government-run, universal health care, single payer system plan that has an underestimated 2 billion dollar price tag."

Page 62

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

While Mr. Rogers is dead, his neighborhood and the lessons we learned about cooperation live on. The House has started applying the principles of cooperation, good policy, and sharing the ball and bat. Fred is smiling at us today!"

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Ahhhh, politics. Current law, vetoed bill, and H. 117 all have the same ratios of power. Now we can all claim victory because we get along. We do this by increasing the size (and per diem costs) of the board. I thought the goal was efficiency to save dollars. Thank you Governor."

Page 64

Rep. Grad of Moretown explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

In voting no on this amendment I am not voting against civil commitment but in favor of my committee process that after months of testimony concluded this issue needs additional research and planning to design a program for all sexual predators that is safe for our communities, cost effective, and constitutional. I look forward to continuing our committee work on this issue to craft policy that will truly enhance public safety and support victims of crime."

Rep. Hosford of Waitsfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am firmly committed to supporting those measures that will enhance the safety of our communities. However, civil commitment is an enormously complex issue. I believe that we need to give our Judiciary committee time to complete summer studies that would lead to a thorough understanding of the effects of any proposed legislation. I have voted “no” on this amendment. I look forward to voting affirmatively on a bill early in the next session, a bill that will effectively protect all our communities from the most violent predators.”

Rep. Louras of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Through this body failed to institute a timely and effective civil commitment program today, in supporting this amendment I can sleep well tonight.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My yes vote today reflects my belief that public safety trumps issues of cost every time. We had an opportunity today to better protect our vulnerable citizens our most vulnerable citizens from sexually violent and violent offenders. Today, we failed at one of our most important missions as a Legislature, Protecting the public.”

Page 65

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

A consequence of the very sad reality of many aspects of today’s society is that it is terribly important to ensure maximum access to medically appropriate interventions to help prevent an unwanted pregnancy at any age.”

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I strongly support the rights of women and the rights of parents. It’s very troubling to vote on legislation where these rights collide. We must work harder to fashion more family-centered solutions.”

Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

As a supporter of Right to Life, it was not easy for me to support this amendment. However, the reality is too many times our young girls do not weigh the heavy responsibilities of their irresponsible actions and put themselves in precarious positions with great regret later. This amendment may provide just the onus needed to help these girls address their needs with their physician, and hopefully with their parents and receive the kind of help they really need.”

Rep. LaVoie of Swanton explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Some may believe me to be an idealist – that’s okay. Our society would not be civil without the protections of ideals. But, I believe that I am a realist. This amendment accepts the reality that we must protect our vulnerable young girls.”

Rep. Niquette of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes on this amendment because I believe that it is society’s responsibility to maintain systems that protect emotionally fragile and vulnerable young teens ranging in ages from 10-15 who are engaging in risky sexual behaviors. Not only are these teens risking pregnancy and sexually transmitted disease, but possible abuse and sexual manipulation. Parents have no legal rights to know what is happening to their daughter’s bodies and now another contact with a caring, nurturing adult will be eliminated – that of her doctor. An opportunity will be lost for an adult to counsel a 12 year old about the consequences of this very risky behavior; pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, sexual abuse, and the loss of self esteem especially if the teen is being manipulated into having sexual behavior. I have no objections to a woman 16 years or older going to their local drug store and obtaining this contraception, but I do strongly object to the removal of the final safety net for emotionally fragile and vulnerable young sexually active 10-15 year olds that need counseling support and guidance from a caring adult and not simply receive a standardized fact sheet – that they probably won’t read – from a busy pharmacist who stuffs the sheet into a bag along with the packet of pills.”

Page 66

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I will never cast a vote that does not uphold our responsibility as a society to protect human life from its inception to its natural end. This bill does not in any way violate that principle."

Rep. Endres of Milton explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I have long been supportive of women's reproductive rights. However, I cannot support legislation that does not provide protection to young girls under the age of sixteen."

Rep. Howard of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted in support of this legislation because I believe in a culture of freedom and personal responsibility. The debate between the supporters of an individual Vermonter's freedom to choose and those who oppose that freedom has raged on too long. It's time to reach a common ground. Vermonters ought to be able to work together to prevent unintended pregnancy and abortion without interfering in personal decisions and personal responsibilities."

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

By passing this bill, we make our daughters more vulnerable to incest, date rape, manipulation, poor choices and sexually transmitted diseases. We claim good intentions, but the consequences will not be good. We encourage deceit, manipulation, and further destruction of the parent-child relationship. Most of all we encourage irresponsibility and a lack of accountability. In this case, the House is practicing what it preaches: gross irresponsibility and lack of accountability."

Page 68

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

This was a second opportunity to support a Constitutional bill that would have provided better protection for our citizens. Those of us who supported this, and all of Vermont, will be closely watching the work of the study committee and will hold the Judiciary committee and the entire Legislature's "feet to the fire" on this issue when we return here next year."

Page 70

Rep. Darrow of Dummerston explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

This bill was gutted and rewritten behind closed doors with Entergy, but without the public. It was the worst process I've ever seen in the Vermont State House. It is a textbook example of why public policy is supposed to be made in public."

Rep. Edwards of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

It's useful to note that I voted no on the memorandum of understanding. One of my main concerns with this bill has always been about the environment. Through negotiations the environmental concerns were greatly weakened. In the end, I voted yes on this bill trying to salvage something of the clean energy fund which will be created, helping us to get further away from our addiction to nuclear power. The further we move away, the less likely it will be that we are held hostage when the issue of storage of high level nuclear waste re-emerges in 2012, just a few years from now."

Rep. Endres of Milton explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I do not believe in forced agreements where one of the parties faces an ultimatum if they do not agree. I have been fighting a similar so-called agreement in an effort to save Milton's Peterson Dam. Because I value Vermont Yankee and its clean generation of thirty per cent of the State's energy needs, and do not want to risk premature decommissioning of the plant, higher electric rates and loss of jobs, I reluctantly vote YES on H. 545."

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted yes because I worked my hardest to get what, I believe, is the best outcome for Vermont in a difficult situation. I remain totally opposed to operating this plant beyond 2012. I keep my fingers and toes crossed everyday for the safe operation of this plant until the day it closes in March 2012."

Page 71

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

If a member is absent from committee – they do not get to vote. It's the way of the Legislature. In the last days of the Legislature many votes have a number of people absent. This situation is no different than 10's nay 100's of votes that take place this time of year."

Rep. Johnson of South Hero explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

The words "S.18 – possible vote" were posted on the committee door. Leadership within the committee for all 3 parties were notified and given proposed language. The chair announced the upcoming vote in committee with a quorum representing the 3 parties present. On top of that, the chair notified every single member of the committee individually- 8 by phone calls to their homes before the week began, 2 in person that day.

This is a difficult time of the year- particularly for farmers – to juggle legislative life with outside commitments. We need to make choices. I missed a speaking engagement to stay for the vote. Every committee member had a chance to vote.

Rep. Lawrence of Lyndon explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

The remarks made by the member from New Haven partially reflect my views. I am a member of that committee and was in attendance until 6:00 p.m. on the day S. 18 was voted. Never was I informed that a vote was to be taken on S. 18."

Rep. Reese of Pomfret explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

While I may disagree with the words and sentiments being journalized, I am concerned about limiting speech."

Rep. Smith of New Haven explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted yes to journalize my earlier comments because I feel my constituents, in a large agricultural district, were robbed of their voice on our an issue very important to them. I was not notified of a vote being proposed and no notice was posted on the committee door."

Page 72

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Over two weeks late in the legislative session, \$800,000 to pay for legislators at the expense of the Vermont taxpayers and we're playing games like this. Shame on us!"

Page 73

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote no because the study will produce useless findings, create false expectations, and further ratify a flawed and ideologically biased actuarial method. It also creates a diversion of scarce resources and impairs the integrity and credibility of the House and fiscal office."

Page 76

Rep. Green of Berlin explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted to accept the conference committee report because I believe that it is quite simply the best health care reform bill that we can get at this moment. I am concerned that the bill does not contain a rigorous study of health care administration costs, particularly of providers and insurers, and a comparison of those costs with the administrative costs of existing public sector programs in the State of Vermont and abroad. I hope this can be incorporated into the program as it goes forward."

Rep. Kiss of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I'm committed to single payer universal health care. H. 524 isn't universal health care for all but in language throughout the bill I believe we are preserving the opportunity to get us there. In that spirit I'll cast my vote again to support H. 524 and toward "civilized medicine."

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote no on this conference report with great disappointment. Disappointment at political ultimatums and lack of real compromise. A payroll tax is regressive and taxes those that can least afford it. Forcing a "veto showdown" was not in the best interest of Vermonters."

Page 77

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Over two weeks late in the legislative session \$800,000 to pay for legislators at the expense of the Vermont tax payers and now we're technically giving ourselves a pay raise by means of a COLA. Shame on us again!."

Page 78

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I am disappointed that in regards to wages we did less for our working poor than in the last biennium. But I still vote yes because every penny in increased wages for our working poor helps them pull themselves up by their proverbial bootstraps."

Page 80

Rep. Fisher of Lincoln explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Healthy open debate is a basic part of our democracy. The tension between our military and civilian worlds require such open public debate even when it is difficult."

Rep. Haas of Rochester explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Two of the towns I represent voted for a version of the original resolution seeking ways to better support the Vermont National Guard.

I worry anytime this body votes to stifle a conversation with the citizens of Vermont."

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted to recommit this resolution to committee not because of my opposition to the content of the resolution, but because any risk, real or perceived, to the continued operation of the Vermont Air Guard is simply unacceptable"

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

The committee on appropriations has already reviewed this resolution. Make no mistake, this resolution will not return to the floor if this vote is affirmative. I believe we all hope our occupation of Iraq and the use of our Guard will be over by January, I doubt it. But in either case, the impact on our Guard families, our communities and our State are profound. It is a disservice to all to not have a discussion of this issue and a vote on this resolution to show our constituents our support for our guard members and their families. What are we afraid of?"

Page 81

Rep. Cross of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

I have voted yes on this budget bill notwithstanding the fact that section 178a became a part of it without thoughtful and perhaps heated debate on this floor. That void is simply one more example of the democratic process gone haywire. I do want to thank the Appropriations Committee for its very careful work developing a state expenditure. Plan.

I also want to thank the House committee on Appropriations and the House Committee on Government Operations for refusing to be drawn into the labor dispute between the full time faculty and the Vermont State College system. It is unfortunate that this wise and farsighted decision was not shared by all.

Clearly, a very limited knowledge of the collective bargaining process has today traded a short term gain for 274 full time faculty members for a long-term loss for all 2600 part-time and full-time employees of the State College System and for the 12,000 tuition paying students who attend the colleges, including over 9500 Vermonters, about 65% of whom are first generation college attendees.

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I cannot support a bill that makes more demands on the Education Fund. Our constituents, school boards and selectboards are facing a property tax crisis. This bill makes the crisis worse."

Rep. Marron of Stowe explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

As a member of the conference committee on H. 516, I think the committee did an excellent job in addressing the needs of Vermonters, including a 3.5% increase for higher education. However, I was unable to sign the conference committee report because of the legislature 'injecting' itself into the collective bargaining process at the Vermont State Colleges."

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

It's easy to find objectionable parts in a budget of over 1.2 billion dollars, but my no vote is not cast easily or without careful and principled thought.

My first objection is to Section 162b. Early Childhood Education Services. By giving exclusive jurisdiction over our children ages 3 to 5 to school districts and supervisory districts/unions, we act immorally and unconstitutionally by making the State and its political subdivisions the "super parent," and giving the school district the unbridled power to indoctrinate our most innocent, vulnerable, and impressionable minds. There is a very simple answer: trust our citizen, taxpaying parents with vouchers to be used for qualified early education, private or public. Vouchers promote liberty, diversity, and health competition.

My second principled objection is to Section 178a. Vermont State Colleges: Collective Bargaining Agreement. We shirk our constitutional and statutory responsibility by sending the "early retirement decision" to mandatory arbitration, an act of supreme legislative cowardice. If we had the courage to do our duty, we would take a vote to either keep the current early retirement program in force and effect or sustain the Labor Relations Board. Finally, Sec. 178a. should have been a separate bill and not hidden in the budget as childish political gamesmanship."

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

We're not getting our legislative work done on time and on budget. In this bill, we're trying to take on more work that we can't do well. We cannot micromanage labor management disputes at the Vermont State Colleges and expect the Colleges to provide an affordable education to Vermont students."

Rep. Livingston of Manchester explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Local option taxes were made available through Act 60 to those townie who bear an unusual burden of resort and retail traffic to help with municipal expenses. These towns not only provide the bulk of consumption tax revenues to the state, but also support other towns, like Montpelier, through the pilot programs.

This bill should be providing for an expansion of that option, and it is only an option, to all towns, as it is a dependable resource in Vermont tax policy"

Rep. Houston of Ferrisburgh explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

The reason we are here today is because the language concerning the Vermont State collective bargaining agreement does not belong in the appropriations bill."

Rep. Milkey of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

According to the dictionary I found on my desk this morning, the first definition of "compromise" is "an agreement over a dispute reached by each side changing or giving up some demands".

While there is no compromise in this bill, I voted "yes" because of the language in the resolution we passed prior to this bill. I will look for the proof of the compromise in the results of the study by the legislative committee on the Vermont State Colleges."

Rep. Westman of Cambridge explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

You can't listen to the debate on this issue and say it is isolated.

The politics in this legislature has become the politics of confrontation not accommodation on issues like this and health care."

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote yes. The foregoing heated partisan debate proves but one thing to me. Collective bargaining never should have come before this body, and never should.... Hence the need for H. 1."

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Keeping your word and promises is "the Vermont way". It used to be your word, than a handshake, then a contract, then a law and now even that does not count anymore."
