Workforce Development

\$14,026,151 | ≈75

Receives state and federal funding to strengthen Vermont's workforce through training and development for in-demand sectors. Service is provided to both jobseekers and employers equally.

Unemployment Insurance

\$15,700,786 | ≈85

Is predominantly federally funded and federally regulated. UI benefits are designed to provide partial wage replacement for individuals who become unemployed through no fault of their own and who are able and available for work, and actively seeking work.

Labor Market Information

\$1,161,373 | ≈12

Nearly completely federally funded, LMI aligns most of its work with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics. LMI's focus is on the Vermont labor force and association data.

Workers' Compensation + Safety

\$7,939,121 | ≈40


Funded through a pre-set fee on WC insurance premiums paid by employers, WC provides mediation and dispute resolution for WC claims. VOSHA, Project WorkSafe, and Passenger Tramway exist to ensure workplace and rider safety.

Wage & Hour

\$354,846 | ≈3

Funding by General Fund dollars, this program provides information to Vermonters regarding workplace rights and responsibilities and administers enforcement actions for the recovery of unpaid wages.


