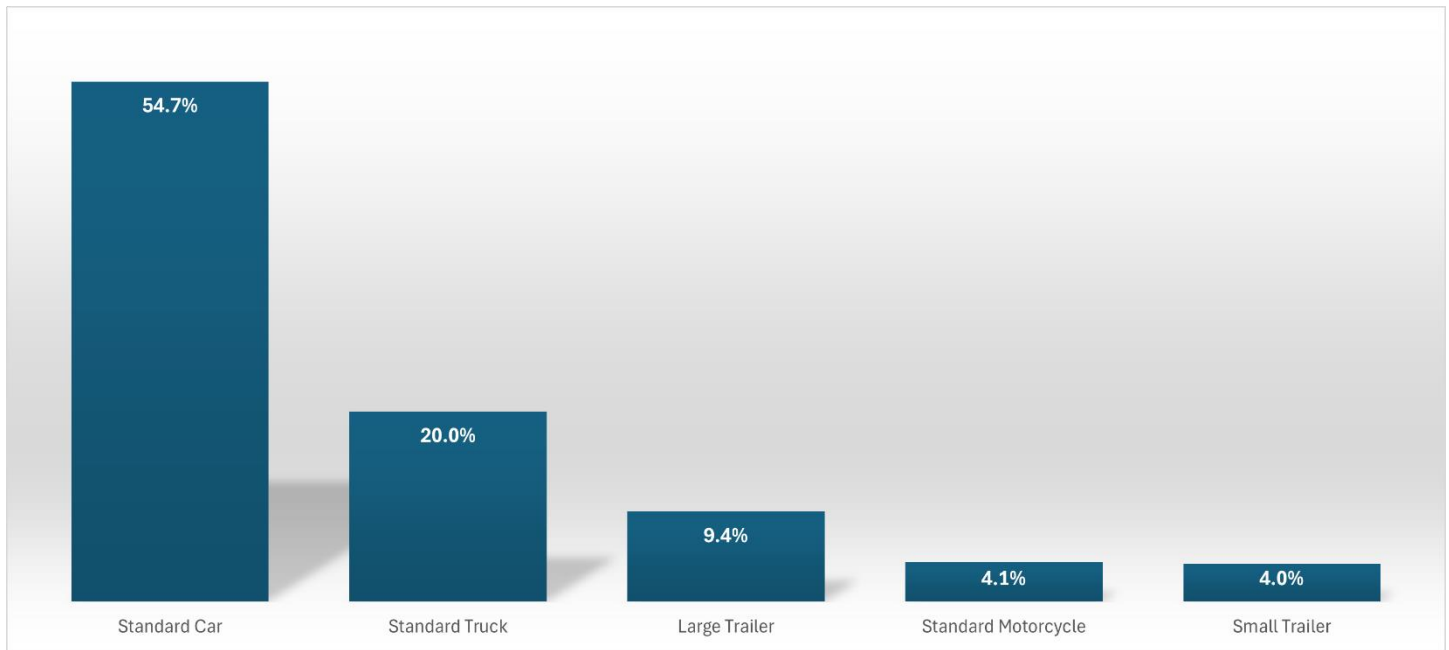


License Plates

DMV currently issues 101 plate types and has 709,646 active registrations (as of 04/03/2024). The top 5 plates account for 92% of all plate types (see the list of all plates at the end).

- Car, Standard 54.7%
- Truck, Standard 20.0%
- Trailer, Large 9.4%
- Motorcycle 4.1%
- Trailer, Small 4.0%



Standard large plates allow seven characters; small plates allow six characters.



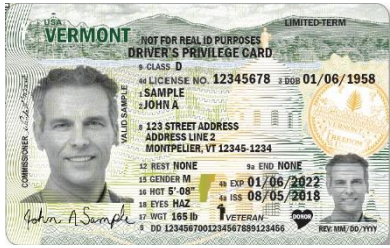
Plates with Veteran, Conservation, or other decals have fewer spaces (generally 4-6).



Sample Electric Vehicle Plates from other States

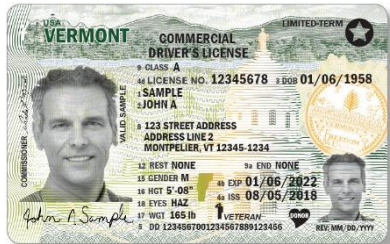

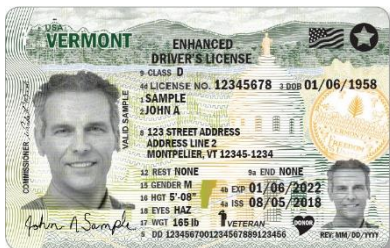
Driver Privilege Card

- US and Non-US Citizens
- Does not require proof of lawful status in the US
- Solely for driving purposes
- Marked "Not for Real ID purposes" and is NOT Real ID compliant
- Identity and Date of Birth
- Social Security Information
- Vermont Residency and Current Address



Real ID

- US and Non-US Citizens
- Proof of lawful status in the US is required
- Identity and Date of Birth
- Social Security Information
- Vermont Residency and Current Address



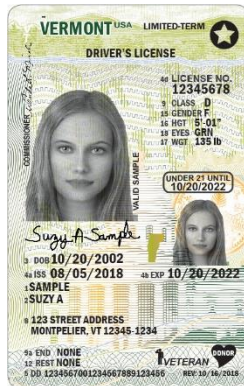
Enhanced License (EDL)

- US Citizens Only
- Proof of US citizenship is required
- Identity and Date of Birth
- Social Security Information
- Vermont Residency and Current Address

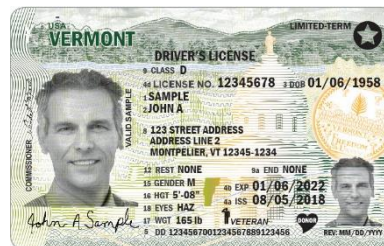
Each credential type has multiple possible iterations.



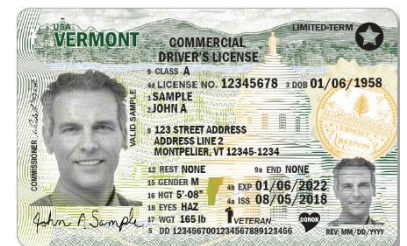
Under 18

Identification

Verifying identity is crucial due to the nature of the credentials. Once a card is issued, an individual can use it to establish benefits, open bank accounts, travel, etc. If Identification is limited to an affidavit, DMV is at risk for creating multiple identities.
