# Vermont Office of the Child, Youth, and Family Advocate ("OCYFA") Budgetary Testimony, Senate Committee on Appropriations Matthew Bernstein, Child, Youth, and Family Advocate

# <u>Summary of OCYFA Statutory and Budgetary Implementation</u>

- Created by H. 265, A. 129, 2021-2022, Codified at 33 VSA § 3201 et seq.
- Act 129 appropriates \$120k from General Fund for FY23 to implement Act
- Governor's FY24 Budget uses FY23 appropriation as benchmark to request 250k for FY24
- Act 129 contemplates that the Advocate starts work 1.1.23. Actual start: 2.27.23
- Act 129 creates Deputy Advocate position—currently advertised on State careers website
- FY24 Budget request from OCYFA: \$413,811 (+\$164K from Gov Budget)

# **Summary of OCYFA Concept**

- OCYFA: Similar to Ombudsman office—independent, nonpartisan, transparent. Focused on improving outcomes for Vermont's Children, Youth, and Families, saving state money.
- Plugged into state systems (DCF, families, facilities, national policy people, governor, legislature, courts) to reduce barriers, mitigate siloed systems.
- Collaborates to improve systems on behalf of constituency: children, youth, families.
- OCYFA will be State subject-matter/policy experts on child development, brain science
- Ombuds offices on average return \$22 for every dollar spent.<sup>1</sup>

#### Summary of Goals and Purpose of OCYFA (33 VSA § 3202)

- Advance the interests and welfare of Vermont's children and youth.
- Advocate for the welfare of children and youth:
  - 1. receiving services from DCF
  - 2. involved in the child protection system
  - 3. involved in the juvenile justice system

#### Summary of Duties and Authority of OCYFA (§ 3203)

- 1. Provide information to the public
- 2. Analyze and monitor developments in law and policy
- 3. Receive and investigate complaints

- 4. Advise government entities Legislature, Governor, Courts
- 5. Push for systemic reforms
- 6. Submit a report each December 1 to "Governor and the General Assembly" to include:
  - A. the conditions of placements for Vermont's children and youth;
  - B. <u>findings related to services for and assistance</u> to children, youth, and families within the child protection and juvenile justice systems;
  - C. recommendations related to improving services for children, youth, and families;
  - D. <u>data</u> disaggregated by race, ethnicity, gender, geographic location, disability status, and any other categories that the Advocate deems necessary.

### DCF Shall Report to OCYFA (§ 3206)

- 1. All incidents of <u>actual physical injury</u> to children or youths in the custody of the Commissioner <u>or at significant risk of such harm;</u>
- 2. <u>Instances of restraint or seclusion</u> of any child or youth in custody of the Commissioner.
- 3. Within 48 hours, notice of any fatality of a child or youth in its custody.

# Other Important Parts of the Statute

- Advisory Council (§ 3205)
- Mandatory DCF reports to OCYFA of phys injury, restraint/seclusion, fatalities (§ 3206)
- Access to information and facilities (§ 3207)
- Cooperation of state agencies (§ 3208)
- Confidentiality (§ 3209)
- Oversight Commission (§ 3211)

#### Long-Term Goals

- Raise percentage of Vermont children who remain safely in their homes (shared goal)
- Reduce number of children in foster care (VT numbers disproportionately high)
- Reduce number of abuse/neglect court cases (CHINS) and juvenile justice cases (highly time consuming vs. other kinds of court cases, for both judicial officers and court staff)
- Increase evidence-based community services in Vermont, for children, youth, and families.
- Increase IV-E and IV-B (SSA) federal money to Vermont: "open-ended entitlement grants"
- Generate better data for DCF, OCYFA, general assembly and gov office.
- Improve outcomes (disproportionality) for protected classes, especially: race, gender, disability, language access / New Americans
- Improve daily working conditions for front-line stakeholders: families, DCF Family Support Workers, foster parents, respondent parents, GALs, older youth, infants, and others



# OCYFA Evidence-Based Data & Accountability Summary: How Much? How Well? Better Off?

- Performance accountability is central to the OCYFA mandate (vis-à-vis DCF and other governmental entities—"external") and to the OCYFA itself ("internal") (see below)
- First year largely implementation, partnering, listening, assessing, meeting
- Key barrier in 2023: DCF data systems
- Key asset: DCF has real will to improve and evolve, process underway
- Key future asset: OCYFA data system show best practices, track what DCF cannot

# OCYFA External Data Categories (examples):

- Number of youth in state custody restrained or secluded
- DCF social worker caseloads data
- Number and quality of evidence-based practice entities for children in VT
- Qualitative assessments of residential care system and providers boots on ground, ongoing, face-to-face contact with children and youth
- Collaborate with community partners on outcomes for children post-DCF custody
- Creation of public-facing informational website, track information requested

#### OCYFA Internal Data Categories (examples):

- Complaints: number, age, acuity/urgency, subject matter (i.e. abuse/neglect v. JJ v. mental health, and categories within each), identity of reporter (i.e. youth report, parent, foster parent, DCF worker), outcome—investigation, information, referral
- Facilities visited (goal for year one: visit every facility in Vermont)
- DCF offices visited (goal for year one: visit every DCF office in Vermont)
- Community organizations visited, presentations, legislative testimonies
- Media appearance and topic (goal is quality not quantity)

#### Service-Delivery Model of Small Office

- Assets: Flexible, adaptable, dynamic (i.e. two regional offices for price of one?)
- Deficit: not as financially efficient
