"Dispatch Center" means a physical facility that provides work stations for people to receive and send electronic messages by radio, cellular, telephone, or other IP means to designated public safety entities, there are three types;

- (a) State Dispatch Centers: Call takers receive calls via the 9-1-1 or 888 network from people identified as being in a "dispatchable location" requiring emergency assistance and transfer pertinent information received to agencies able to provide police, fire, or emergency medical services. They are also known as Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPS)
- (b) Regional Dispatch Centers: Receive information from State Dispatch centers, public safety service providers, or the general public and send messages to appropriate agencies within a defined geographical area to respond with needed services. They are managed by local processes.
- (c) Regional Dispatch and 9-1-1 Centers provide both services
