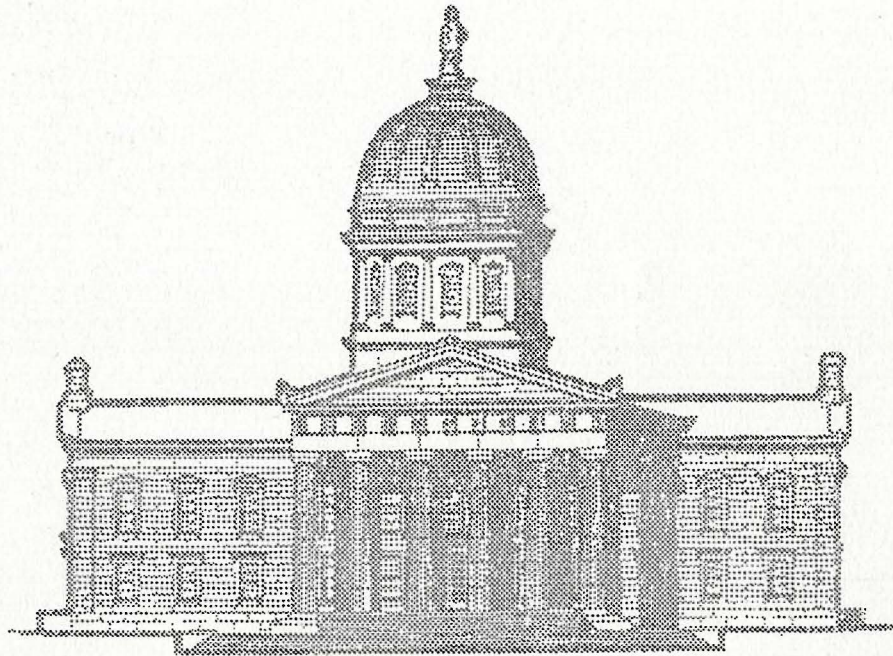

The following are the House Rules governing voting in the House

**XI
OF VOTING**

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members.

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. If the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 73, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Members shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

Explanation of votes

Rep. Bouricius of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted in favor of Act 60 and support those portions of H. 577 that make technical corrections to Act 60 to allow its smooth implementation. This Conference report, however, goes far beyond technical corrections. It includes a variety of corporate welfare provisions and, most disturbing, a commitment to school choice. I believe this provision marks the beginning of the destruction of our public education system and is far more significant than the bill to which it is attached. Our public education system is the backbone of any hope for a true democracy. I shall mourn this House's action today.

Rep. Corren of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

It disturbs me to the utmost, that in the attempt to rush through an important bill by an artificial deadline, it has been burdened by even more critical issues upon which this House has taken no testimony, received no favorable action by a committee and has conducted inadequate deliberation. The sleight-of-hand that brings Vermont school choice by telling supporters one thing and opponents another, is indicative of the quality of the contents and procedure regarding this legislation. This is equally true of the discredited elements for so-called economic development. In the short-term, this situation is yet superseded by our utter disregard for the Rules of this House and the sudden and premature cessation of debate.

In the long term, our actions today will have the most profound impact, long after Act 60, which I support despite its serious limitations and technical corrections to it, are forgotten.

Rep. Livingston of Manchester explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

H. 577 offers several concessions that help soften the blow to my taxpayers - and for that we are grateful.

Manchester residents do not resent extending a helping hand to other school districts, but feel the tax structure employed by Act 60 is basically unfair.

The most laudable goals do not necessarily translate into good legislation."

Rep. Mazur of South Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Unsound taxes, unsound economics, unsound equity sharing, unsound economic development policy, and unsound belief that spending buys education quality = all make Act 60 and its technical amendments a black hole.

Rep. Perry of Richford explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I support the Conference committee's report on H. 577 because it retains or improves on most of the House-passed provisions. These are necessary and important to timely and effective implementation of Act 60. However, the school choice provisions are a notable exception. The findings are vague and have not been substantiated in this Chamber. I believe the as-scheduled commitment to be premature and potentially counter-productive to achieving equal education opportunity in Vermont. I trust that this problem will be addressed and corrected in the next General Assembly.

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Our local schools are the center of the community, and I voted yes despite the fact that I agree with the school choice remarks of Rep. Bouricius. I hope to be a member in the future when this provision of the Conference report will be repealed.

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted no - Mr. Speaker, I was concerned that I might be unable to vote no on the record of history. It is important to me that the people of Vermont realize that I knew Act 60 and H. 577 were too complicated, too expensive, too invasive of local control and just won't do much to improve this state's educational quality.

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Our education system is a central point to our communities. We could have made a loud resounding statement to support our communities by rejecting this report and pushing the conferees to produce a clean technical corrections bill, without school choice. I believe we would have been able to do that without the self-made deadline of I own Meeting Day, and I would have supported that bill as I did act 60. But, for school choice, I voted no.

Rep. Brady of Bennington explained his vote as follows:

There is a fundamental problem with this piece of legislation. Many in this room feel smoking is harmful, inappropriate, undesirable and unacceptable. This legislation does not address these issues. What is fundamentally wrong here is these manufacturers are engaged in a very legal activity. The sale and manufacturing of tobacco products is not only perfectly legal, the growing of this product is subsidized in our tax dollars to the federal government.

What we are doing in this legislation is stripping a legitimate enterprise of defenses of liability, a right that is given to all other litigants through this land, simply because it will make the states case easier. One may question the constitutionality in violating the right to due process or the protection of arbitrary liability. Yet, we do this simply because we can get away with it.

If we can do this today and get away with it, what happens to the next group, organization, class or segment of society that becomes unpopular? I will not be party to the start down this slippery slope. Today I said no to the taking of ones legal defense.”

Rep. Brunelle of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

There are time where prostitution is a way out.”

Rep. Hyde of Fayston explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted against this bill as it is unclear as to the rulemaking authority contained in S. 181. The labeling and incineration requirements must be consistent and in compliance with federal law. This should not be interpreted to be a blank check for ANR in their rulemaking process to be more restrictive.”

Rep. Brady of Bennington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am hesitantly supporting this version of the bill. I think we have secured protection for Eveready and I fear in a new bill, in the next biennium, may not contain these protections. I have here, a letter from John Miller of the Agency of Natural Resources. It states that button battery packs, albeit “The air cell batteries” are exempt from labeling and the landfill ban. The bill says that this applies only to “consumer products.” I am assured by the Chair of the House Natural Resources committee that this also exempts the 9 volt air cell sold for medical purposes. I journalize these remarks to make my intent, as well as that of the Agency, and the House Natural Resource committee, perfectly clear. Button cell batteries, as well as air cell batteries, are exempt from labeling and landfill bans. If Rules shall change this, they are in contempt of the actions of this body, as well as the Senate. If this changes in rules, I plan to work for the repeal of this law.”

Rep. Suchmann of Chester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The language of this bill is an egregious example of legislative vagueness. Its conclusions are based upon statistics and sentiment, rather than hard scientific observation and evidence. It is a soupy bill at its worst.

But regardless, I am voting “yes” purely on the basis of its good intentions. I just hope it doesn’t lead us along the road to Hell.”
