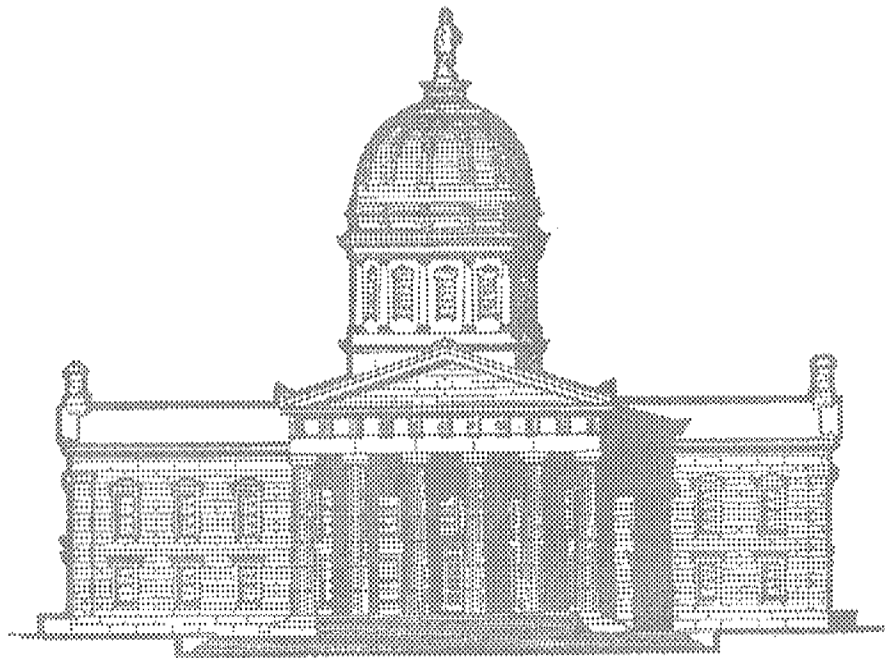

The following are the House Rules governing voting in the House

**XI
OF VOTING**

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members.

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. If the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 73, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Members shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

Rep. Bourdeau of Hyde Park explained her vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: Voting in favor of this bill, especially as it pertains to the Champion Land sale was very difficult for me. I would have preferred to see the future use of this land spelled out with all of its details. That has not happened and so I am voting in support of this money being used towards the purchase of the Champion land based on the repeated assurances given to this body by the Governor, the leadership and representatives of the Vermont Land Trust and by the Memorandum of Understanding put on our desks and journalized by this body when the bill was originally passed. Some of these assurances have been that the forest products industry will be allowed to actively harvest trees over the long term under whatever "working forest" easement is finalized with the Vermont Land Trust on this property. This body has been repeatedly told that traditional uses of this land will continue and not be diminished. Traditional uses include: hunting, fishing, trapping, logging, snowmobile usage of the trail system among other common practices. I hope these words spell out to future generations what this body understood and intended for the use of the Champion property. We do not intend Essex County to be turned into a "theme park". We expect the trees to be harvested in a responsible manner and the land to be enjoyed by Vermonters in the same ways they have for decades. That is what we have been told the future holds for this property and that is my firm intent as I vote "yes" today. May time prove my expectations were met and the intent of this legislation was honored.

Rep. Hingtgen of Burlington explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: I cannot support this conference report because it still does not address the great unmet needs in the ANFC and Aid to Aged, Blind and Disabled programs, but instead holds tax cuts as a higher priority than the wellbeing of Vermont's most vulnerable residents."

Rep. Bouricius of Burlington explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: Act 60 and Act 71 are not the bulwark defending educational equity. That is the Brigham decision. I have no fear of repealing Act 60, since it represents the worse we can have, while still complying with the Supreme Court's ruling. I voted for these repeals because they eliminate the state's policy supporting school choice, a completely defective economic development package that constitutes a corporate welfare give-away, tax cuts for the rich, and a regressive, property based education funding system. We are bound by court order to provide educational opportunity equity. We could do no worse than Acts 60 and 71, but we might do much better."

Rep. Corren of Burlington, explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: The present amendment repeals an Act and its sequellae that has been the worst possible implementation of educational funding: only marginally constitutional from the point of view of school children, while perpetuating the hugely unfair property tax funding of education which has no result other than to require low and middle-income Vermonters to pay a greater share so that the wealthiest can pay less than their share. Further, by being based on town-by-town property taxes, it has pitted town against town in what may have been Vermont's most self-destructive act. So flawed was Act 60, that its best feature was to repeal the foundation formula. But its follow-on, Act 71 was yet worse. In addition to the privileges and loopholes for the wealthy, Act 71 added uncontrolled and unaccountable corporate welfare for the well-connected, yet more new taxes and even an unconsidered radical "school choice" that threatens all public community schools. With this latest round of transfers from most Vermonters to the privileged few through yet another income tax cut, the structure should collapse. Let us not fear; the Brigham decision and our constitutional imperative to provide a reasonably equal educational opportunity will stand. Only our last-rate execution of that duty would fall, and we can only do better."

Rep. Kinsey of Craftsbury explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: This issue reminds me of my Uncle Willie. A lot of years ago Uncle Willie was out in the garden hoeing his beans. Along comes his neighbor Gene with his horse and buggy who said "Willie, are you going to Kilgallens funeral?" Uncle Willie replied "There's no need - he ain't a-going to mine."

Rep. Bouricius of Burlington, explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: Some advocates for affordable housing, seniors concerned about VSCRIPT, and others, have suggested a yes vote on this bill as-is, because there are some genuine improvements contained in the bill. In my opinion, this is actually the worst budget I've ever had to vote on in my nine years here - because it represents the greatest disparity between what is fiscally possible and what has been actually achieved. When the legislature was slashing programs for the weak and vulnerable throughout this decade, at least there was the excuse that there was a state deficit. It turns out it wasn't the deficit that motivates such cuts, because now that we have a surplus, there is still no willingness to restore even half of the cuts to such programs as Aid to Aged, Blind and Disabled. This budget is predicated on tax cuts for the rich, cuts to the earned income tax credit for the poor and expanded state promotion of gambling. I can only hope that the other body will markedly improve this bill before it returns.

Rep. Koch of Barre Town, explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: By the time I read this explanation, I will have voted. As I write it, I am still uncertain how I will vote. This is one of the most difficult votes I have ever cast. There is much that is good in this budget: pharmaceutical coverage for the elderly, estate recovery policy, help for higher education and some protection for tobacco funds. At the same time, the bottom line is too high, human services increases overall are excessive, and on-going programs have problems which will return next year. Make no mistake, I do not believe that his is the best budget we can write for the people of Vermont, and I hope it will be far improved before we adjourn."

Rep. Symington of Jericho, explained her vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: I vote for this budget out of respect for 11 members of this House who constructed this budget on a foundation designed by others within ceilings they had hoped could have been loftier, and with an extra room added by others and whose floor beams I distrust. I vote for this budget now in hopes that when it returns from the other body, the number of rooms will be more in keeping with the foundation on which it is built, and with the chancy floor beams removed."

Rep. Young of Orwell, explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: Have we learned nothing from history? Once again we have begun making financial promises and expenditures that the future won't allow us to keep."

Rep. Barney of Highgate, explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: How many Representatives weren't here for this vote? All discrimination is wrong."

Rep. Kinsey of Craftsbury, explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: My son is in Africa where many of these despicable things are going on. I would sign and carry any resolution, poster, or placard and march in any parade, to show my protest."

Rep. Randall of Bradford, explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: I have been asked by members of this House what I was going to get into trouble today. I assure you I do not seek it out. I am not unaware of the justifiable emotional outrage that drives this resolution or of the political consequences of my vote. I regret the ill will that my vote on this resolution may cause. However, I will not shrink from being counted because my vote will be unpopular. It is not because I am unsympathetic to, or unmindful of, the deplorable fate under which the majority of the female gender is subjected to in the world today. It is indeed outrageous and deplorable. What I find objectionable to in this resolution is the power bestowed to the United Nations in order to carry out the intent of this resolution. It leads directly to one-world government. There is no checks and balances to one-world government. So one-world government ultimately is a formula for slavery for all. Mr. Speaker, I still do not accept the idea that doing something is better than doing nothing, regardless of the ultimate outcome. Because of this, I reluctantly had to vote no on this resolution."

Rep. Young of Orwell, explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: Rest assured that I strongly support the fight against any type of discrimination but discrimination is discrimination regardless of where it happens or upon whom it is directed."
