

XI OF VOTING

- 69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members.
- 70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing.
- 71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. If the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.
 - 72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.
- 73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.
- 74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 73, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.
- 75. Members shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.
- 76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

Vote explanations for H. 144, An act relating to sex offender registration and community notification, amendment by Rep. Bourdeau of Hyde Park et al:

Rep. Atkins of Winooski, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I would never "throw away a child". By voting yes on the amendment to have juveniles on the registry, I am voting to not set them up for failure. Is it wise for an alcoholic to seek employment as a bartender? Should a compulsive gambler work in a casino? If this change in policy helps one person stay away from temptation, it is worth a yes vote."

Rep. Dakin of Colchester, explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My "no" vote was cast not on the merits of the amendments, but on the statement from the reporters of the bill that this amendment was a major public policy change which the Judiciary committee didn't have a position on at this time."

Rep. Driscoll of Burlington, explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote against this amendment as an advocate for our youth, in order to maintain the current, necessary protection of privacy, and our dedication to rehabilitation. I believe the state's attorney has the ability to try a juvenile as an adult when it is deemed necessary, thus, subjecting the youth to adult consequences. I will continue to be sensitive to this issue, and will work for adjustments as necessary."

Rep. Keenan of St. Albans City, explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I cannot support a floor amendment that the committee of jurisdiction has no position on. Either the amendment is without merit or the committee process is flawed."

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote for the amendment for the following reasons: Three twelve year old boys raping and killing by strangulation, an eight year old girl, if they are to be released from prison in their forties, or from juvenile detention at 21, need to be registered for life. Treating these 3 "boys" differently because they were adjudicated as "delinquents" is an abdication of our responsibilities to all citizens, especially parents and innocent children, if the underlying bill passes, to which I am opposed."

Rep. Wright of Burlington, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Despite my concerns about privacy and process, my yes vote reflects my belief that public safety, especially surrounding children, is the number one issue here, and that sexual predators should never be in a position to be working around children."

Vote explanations for H. 485, amendment by Rep. Sweaney of Windsor et al:

Rep. Atkins of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I have thought long and hard about Rule 75 – conflict of interest. After consulting with the Clerk of the House, I was told that I was one of many who could benefit and Rule 75 does not prohibit my voting. I felt this vote was very important to our communities, our kids and our teachers active and retired. I voted yes out of respect to them."

Vote explanations for H. 502, passage:

Rep. Fisher of Lincoln explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: I voted no because of the serious negative financial and business impacts of this bill. because of the many important unanswered family court issues that are brought up by this bill and because I believe my gay and lesbian neighbors deserve at least a respectful parallel to marriage... not less."

Rep. Haas of Rutland City explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: It is not government's place to provide benefits to special groups for solely private concern. Government's role in bestowing benefits to married couples was to protect the vulnerable natural product of their relationship... children. I had hoped that we could fully restore traditional marriage to its rightful place in society by repealing the Civil Union Law. Since that vote did not occur, I have reconsidered my opposition to H. 502 and will now support this legislation to at least remove same-sex partnerships from our marriage statutes and abolish state certification and sanctioning of these relationships. Passage of H. 502 is a step in the right direction."

Rep. Hall of Newport City explained his vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: Yes. It was the right thing to do."

Rep. Miller of Shaftsbury explained her vote as follows: "Mr. Speaker: I believe deeply in the ten commandments: Thou Shalt not Kill. Thou Shalt not Commit Adultery. Thou Shalt Honor Thy Father and Mother. But I believe deeply that we should not be allowed to marry them. And that's what H. 502 permits us to do."
