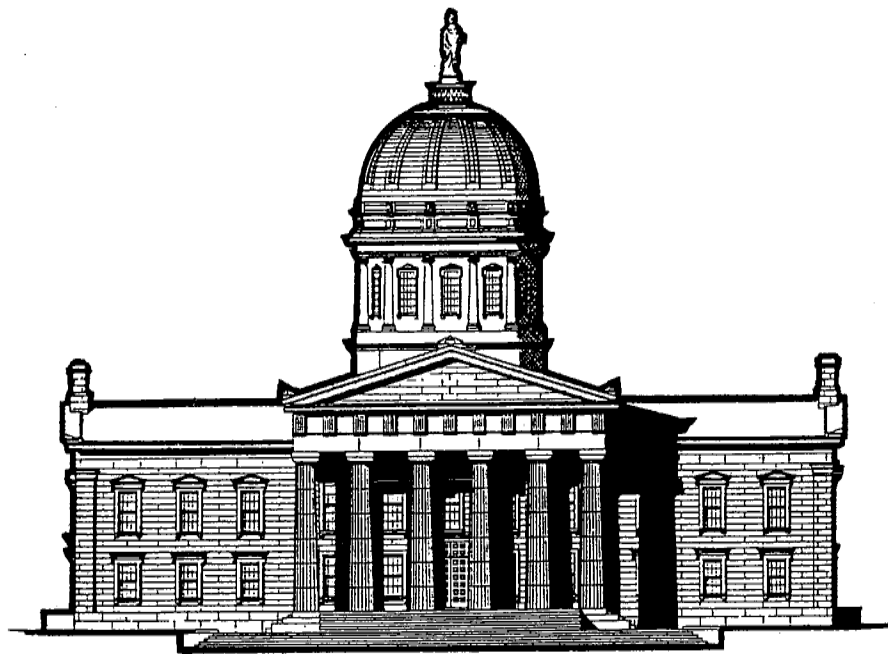

**XI  
OF VOTING**

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members.
70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing.
71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. If the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.
72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.
73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.
74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 73, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.
75. Members shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.
76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

# VOTE EXPLANATIONS

Page 1:

**Rep. Cross of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My yes vote on this issue has been cast in a spirit of unity for those who have suffered great loss in recent events and those who will continue to suffer such loss as the world's people struggle to learn how to live in peace with each other."

**Rep. Donovan of Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Patriotism cannot be defined by reverence for a piece of fabric, but rather by the protection of the minority to voice or demonstrate its point of view, however repugnant. I cannot support any action that may compromise those principles so carefully thought out and enacted over 200 years ago, our Bill of Rights."

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I would have preferred the House version which sought an amendment to the U.S. Constitution. In view of the terrorism of September 11, a day of infamy, the need for a Constitutional amendment is even more apparent. However, we cannot let negative voices paralyze the General Assembly and therefore the voice of the people of Vermont into silence. Thus, I vote for the bill so that the voice of the people's House will be heard in the halls of Congress. Let there be no doubt – the people's House is on record for a Constitutional amendment to correct the error of the U.S. Supreme Court."

**Rep. Nuovo of Middlebury** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I would like to vote for this resolution but I cannot support legislation that encourages abridgement of the right of free speech as stated in the First Amendment of the Constitution. The U.S. Constitution is as sacred a document as we have and it protects our freedom and flies over the land of free and brave people who defend freedom. Abridging this freedom is a desecration of our flag."

**Rep. Paquin of Fairfax** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My flag and my country can never be desecrated in the street. My country has shown this time and time again, and since September 11 we have shown this as we came together as a people in opposition to hideous foreign acts against us. We came together as neighbors for aid and solace as well as a military might willing to right grievous wrongs. My flag is not desecrated unless done so in our hearts."

**Rep. Tracy of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: This is the first time I have felt the necessity to explain my vote. This was also the first issue I rose to speak on when I was first elected to this chamber. I voted no then and I vote no today. When I was younger and our nation was engaged in a foreign conflict, I volunteered to serve. I served with pride. My patriotism was not questioned then – it should not be questioned now. I understand and respect the patriotism of those who support this resolution. I ask that you respect those of us who believe strongly in free speech and voted 'no' today. I am incredibly proud to be an American and proud of our long history of tolerance and respect for free speech."

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: While many believe this compromise is not strong enough, with the tragic events of September 11th, I believe it is imperative that we pass a resolution that puts Vermont, finally, on record honoring our flag and in opposition to the desecration of our flag – the flag that firefighters and police in New York City fought so hard to raise above the rubble. To do less would be a disservice to those who gave their lives to protect it, and our way of life."

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I ask everyone, what is desecration of the flag? Is it putting a bald eagle insignia on the flag? Is it putting "Remember 9/11" on the flag? Is it putting a peace sign on the flag? I don't think anyone would consider these acts desecration of the flag. Is there a symbol that can be put on the flag that is desecration? I am sure we can all think of something we would rather not see written on a flag. But that symbol is probably different for each of us. And that is where the problem lies. One person's statement is another person's desecration. That is why we must uphold everyone's rights to their voice of freedom. That is what the Constitution is founded on."

**Page 4:**

**Rep. Goodridge of Albany** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Chapter 1, Article 2 of the *Vermont Constitution* states that private property ought to be subservient to public uses when necessity requires it. The "necessity" for the state to purchase this land has never been clarified.

Also, Chapter 2, Sec. 66 of the *Vermont Constitution* states citizens may acquire, hold and transfer land or other real estate. This amendment would allow the citizens to do just that."

**Rep. Masland of Thetford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The member from Jericho brought up some interesting points which deserve thorough examination along with all the other points on which we have not had sufficient testimony. Therefore, I believe an affirmative vote on any resolution regarding the Champion lands before the committee has completed its work, would be ill advised and premature."

**Rep. Randall of Bradford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The essential foundation of liberty is the private ownership of the means of production, which is private property. I am an advocate of liberty and its underlying foundation of private property and will defend it at any opportunity. It supercedes any special interest."

**Page 9:**

**Rep. DePoy of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The fact that I do not want to overturn Roe v. Wade makes me pro-choice in my eyes. Whether people see me as such or not is irrelevant to me. I believe that parental notification is essential and will not support any PRO-Roe v. Wade resolutions that do not reference support for it."

**Rep. Endres of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: As someone who has firsthand experience with abortion due to health reasons, I have seen abuses that can take place. However, I have never seen a woman make this decision lightly and I strongly believe that this agonizing choice is personal and should remain between a woman, her creator and her physician."

**Page 10:**

**Rep. Barney of Highgate** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The debate here on the floor was a good honest discussion very similar to the one we had in the Education committee. I am pleased the resolution passed. I want to make it clear that I understand the point of view of those who voted no, and would never question the patriotism or politics of anyone who did."

**Rep. Nuovo of Middlebury** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: When I was in school we all said the Pledge of Allegiance. I have no problem with that. This resolution says two insulting things – 1) To say that one can only be patriotic if you say the Pledge of Allegiance and that schools discontinued it, insinuates schools are unpatriotic. This is not so. 2) To say schools are actually promoting and unfairly denying students the opportunity to regularly reaffirm love of country is a slap in the face of schools and students. Who says we can't affirm our love of country in many ways other than a pledge. One way is our Constitution and fighting for it every day, all day. We don't say the pledge in the Legislature, why ask more of our schools? I voted for this but in my heart not for these two sections that denigrate our schools, school boards, teachers and students."

**Rep. Deen of Westminster** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: With the passage of this inaccurate, unnecessary and unsubstantiated resolution, my pride in America and what she really stands for is diminished and for that I am sorry."



**Page 17:**

**Rep. Metzger of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes. I believe in supporting these constituencies in their time of need. I just hope if this amendment passes we didn't make a mistake by funding it out of a reserve fund we may desperately need later. Taking care of people is a necessity, not a luxury."

**Page 18:**

**Rep. Atkins of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I too want everything that we were promised when we purchased the Champion lands in 1999 – including logging. However, I try to follow process whenever possible and I don't feel that H.646 is the proper vehicle to achieve this goal. I vote yes to strike section 60, but I look forward to the promised bill, H. 567, and hope that we can then restore what I feel was the legislative intent in the 1999 purchase of the Champion lands."

**Rep. Nitka of Ludlow** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Sec. 60 creates a problem for me in that the lands shall not be restricted by easement, or plan or in any other manner, provided there is compliance with acceptable management practices. The management practices referred to here are regarding logging and wood products productions. If indeed the management for these issues, and the needs for management of, for example, a deer wintering yard are in conflict at some point, this section puts the needs of the wood investors clearly first. I cannot condone what in the future might bring potential damage to the deer herd and in turn the traditions of hunting in Vermont."

**Page 21:**

**Rep. Amidon of Charlotte** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted for H. 646 because it represents a considered and reasonable response to our immediate cash flow problems. However, for the record, I oppose section 60 as it seems to elevate the needs of loggers above the needs of other taxpayers of our state."

**Rep. Dostis of Waterbury** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I commend the work of the Appropriations committee to balance the budget during these fiscally challenging times, and do it in a manner to minimize the impact on any one section of government services. They were forced to make difficult choices. Unfortunately, because of the language that puts at risk a well balanced plan for the Champion lands, A plan that balances the needs between logging, hunting and other traditional uses and environmental protection, I must vote against H. 646."

**Rep. Randall of Bradford**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote for this budget reluctantly as the level of spending and taxation is unconscionable. However, I understand the political reality is that if we fail to pass it we are likely to end up with something that is even more obnoxious."

**Rep. Symington of Jericho**, explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: As a member of the joint fiscal committee I reluctantly approved the Governor's proposed rescissions last summer and fall. Were it not for the Champion lands language, I might have voted for this budget adjustment. In all these cases we are faced with managing to limited revenues. But as we face the 2003 budget, we have the opportunity to address revenue shortfalls to provide stability in programs that serve vulnerable Vermonters. I hope that prior to this body's discussion of the 2003 budget, we will have the opportunity to discuss those state revenues in a way that addresses Vermont's needs responsibly."

**Page 22:**

**Rep. Haas of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The minimum wage was never meant to be a livable wage; but, merely an entry level wage for those entering the workforce. Raising this entry level wage is inflationary, harming those on fixed incomes and defeats the intended purpose of the minimum wage."

**Rep. Kirker of Essex** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote no because mandating higher wages could jeopardize some businesses that are already struggling. My preference is to improve the business climate in Vermont so employers can opt to pay higher wages. And I believe the best way to higher wages is for the citizens of Vermont to become more skilled so that their value to the employer is increased."

**Rep. Scribner of Bristol** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I have voted no on this amendment as I believe it is the wrong time as the amendment was plucked from the dark of night. There was no testimony, no thoughtful discussion based on facts instead of innuendo. Upon completion of the committee process and its inherent fact-finding, I will be more inclined to vote in favor of an increase in the minimum wage."

**Rep. Sheltra of Derby** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I know we can create a balance for all wage earners in our state by creating sustainable jobs and encouraging industry to move to our state. This will create a competitive livable wage environment for everyone, especially those in our Northeast Kingdom."

#### **Page 23:**

**Rep. Driscoll of Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I cannot support a bill that tells employers, who receive state economic development money, that we are decreasing their employee wage requirements. Economic development money is very valuable. But we must continue to ensure that the taxpayer it is coming from, get something in return, like better jobs, higher wages and job stability."

**Rep. Randall of Bradford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no because I object to the state confiscating the hard earned wages of the low paid workers of this state for the purpose of corporate welfare. If businesses have an economically viable need of trained workers, and the only way they can obtain them is to train them and pay them well, then they will do it. I did."

#### **Page 25:**

**Rep. Connell of Warren** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted "no" because this bill flies in the face of the importance of reducing hazardous materials from ever getting into the wastestream. Through consumer choice and retailer cooperation, we can reduce possible environmental and health care costs. It seems convenient to post labels for weekly specials, but not for hazardous materials."

#### **Page 30:**

**Rep. Alfano of Calais** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I object to this reapportionment plan not only because it disadvantages these towns in northeast Washington County, but because it seriously and adversely affects Washington County as a whole. As you can see from today's amendments, many Washington County towns are discontented and their residents are feeling disenfranchised."

**Rep. Deen of Westminster** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I cannot vote for this redistricting bill. My district was left pretty much intact – but this bill pulls apart too many geographic regions for short-term political gain at the expense of long-term fairness to, and trust by, the people of Vermont. This bill is contrary to the oath we took when we were sworn in that said "I will not assent to any bill which shall appear to me injurious to the people". This bill insults as well as injures Vermonters."

**Rep. Hooker of Rutland City** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted "no" not because of what this bill does to affect my district. There are no alternatives there. Rutland loses a representative no matter how the lines are drawn and our Board of Civil Authority, of which I'm a member, has already voted on a plan that moves me to another district within the city – but that's okay because Rutland is a community and I represent that community. I cannot support a plan that has caused so much controversy by separating towns in districts that have worked together to build coalitions and communities and where there are alternatives and a few amendments could have remedied many of those contentious situations."

**Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no because the voice and will of the people was not acknowledged."

**Rep. Kitzmiller of Montpelier** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no because:

A. No public hearings were held.

B. E-mails and letters received were predominately opposed to the plan.

C. Members of the Government Operations Committee requested public hearings and were denied.

D. The Chair of Government Operations Committee would not allow a delay to hold hearings."

**Rep. Larose of Richford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I remain disappointed that the amendment to bring Montgomery back into Franklin County was defeated. I recognize that every change in the map creates problems somewhere else and for someone else. After the amendment's defeat I voted 'yes' on the total plan as reapportioning must occur. Franklin County growth has necessitated change in some of the current districts. Hopefully ten years hence towns that are being reluctantly put together today will be adamantly be advocating to stay together! That is my hope."

**Rep. Morrissey of Bennington** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: With reapportionment this year, Bennington loses a representative in the process, due to our census count. I voted 'yes' to this reapportionment plan to represent my constituents and the unanimous vote of the Town of Bennington's Board of Civil Authority which concurred with the Reapportionment Board's final plan. I must note, however, that I am disappointed that easier and better solutions were not found for parts of Bennington County, as was defined within the Reapportionment Board's plan."

**Rep. Osman of Plainfield** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I cannot support this bill because it represents a 'through the looking glass' backwards kind of world. We do this exercise of reapportionment to insure the constitutional mandate of one person, one vote and therefore enfranchise the people of our state. The net effect of this bill is to disenfranchise voters. So my vote is a resounding no!"

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: While the reapportionment plan is not perfect and does not make everyone happy, it is clear that it is not possible for any plan to do that. Having researched the process, the court challenges, and the many unhappy towns from ten years ago, I am confident that this plan is much more fair than the highly partisan one passed a decade ago."

**Page 32:**

**Rep. Atkins of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I cannot vote for H. 749 because:

1. The 16.4 deviation voted on the Gov. Ops was not followed in the 17.3 map 9.1.

2. Map 9.1 did not consider incumbency.

3. The request to have additional hearings because of the new map was denied.

4. 9.1 created districts with little consideration for geography and compactness.

5. Map 8, presented by the minority party, lowered the deviation to 14.11.

6. Map 8 created fair competition districts.

7. Map 8 adhered more closely to the prime directive of one person – one vote"

**Rep. Bohi of Hartford** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: In looking at the proposed districts in this plan, some districts have too many people and some have too few. The deviation of 17.34% is large. In an ideal world, each House district would have either 4059 or 8118 residents. The federal courts said in Mahon "that a deviation of 16.4% approaches tolerable limits. This plan pushes that federal limit beyond tolerable. In Mahon it was said, "the ultimate inquiry is whether the legislative plan 'may reasonable be said to advance a rational state policy' and if so, 'whether the population disparities among the district, that have resulted from the pursuit of this plan, exceed constitutional limits. The limits can be pushed for a "rational state policy", This is not a rational policy. This is not a state policy. This is party politics. I think there are other ways to achieve equality of representation."

**Rep. Fisher of Lincoln** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: We have had many choices before us these last two days. This body has not been willing to budge on a map with serious constitutional problems. We could have avoided some of these hot spots, but

the majority chose to support a plan that severs existing political lines, ignores the patterns of geography, ignores social interaction, ignores trade, ignores political ties, ignores common interests and ignores the will of the people. For those reasons I vote no."

**Rep. Grad of Moretown** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no because this plan violates constitutional and statutory requirements of reapportionment. The plan tears apart Northfield and Roxbury and places them in different counties. The plan ignores the strong patterns of these towns' geography, social interaction, trade, political ties and common interests. Roxbury and Northfield share a high school, commercial, medical, and youth services. They share senior and youth centers, community programs and more. The plan also does not reflect a sense of community for Moretown which stated its desire to be in a district with towns that it shares schools, medical, social and political ties.

All of my towns' Boards of Civil Authorities, and many of my constituents participated in public hearings, wrote emails and letters. Roxbury even delivered a petition with 292 signatures of the 576 people who live there asking to keep their strong community relationship intact. Because the plan hasn't, I voted no."

**Rep. Miller of Shaftsbury** explained her vote as follows:

Mr. Speaker: Many Vermonters have been disenfranchised today by the House Government Operations plan for reapportionment. The plan denies town access to equal representation. It violates the principles of reapportionment as established by the Vermont Constitution, the U.S. Supreme Court and Vermont Statutes."

**Rep. Molloy of Arlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I cannot support the re-apportionment plan as presented. The government Operations Committee spent the fall and early winter in various parts of the State listening to towns thoughts about the Legislative Apportionment Board's Plan. This bill pays no attention to that Plan and no attention to what the towns requested. What was the point of the hearings if the towns were not going to be listened to? I feel they were a waste of time and money. At least the one held in Bennington."

**Rep. Nuovo of Middlebury** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The Vermont Constitution states that the General Assembly shall seek to maintain geographical compactness and contiguity, and to adhere to boundaries of counties and other existing political boundaries. The statute, 17 VSA 1903 states that districts should recognize and maintain patterns of geography, social interaction, trade, political ties, common interests, compactness and contiguous areas. The question in the Vermont Supreme Court case - In Re Reapportionment of Town of Hartland, etc. was whether constitutional or statutory criteria have been violated. The Court stated that the Constitutional and statutory criteria had been violated in that case. The plan before the General Assembly today fails to satisfy constitutional or statutory criteria. The geography, including mountains, various school districts, political ties, social interaction, trade, employment, solid waste districts, shared interests, health care, length of roads, or lack thereof between communities divide the sense of community. Shared interests are undermined and ignored when geographical barriers limit communication and transportation between communities. Alternative plans are possible for many of these areas of Vermont as has been shown by amendments to previous drafts of H-749 in the Government Operations Committee and in the amendments on the floor of the House on February 19 and 20, 2002. This proposal ignores the communities and their relationship with one another and fails the constitutional and statutory tests."

**Rep. Pillsbury of Brattleboro** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I cannot support a plan that took no testimony from my town to the consequences of this plans decision. Brattleboro has a very unique, one-of-a-kind form of government. This plan harms and confuses the people I represent, for no reason."

**Page 39:**

**Rep. Pillsbury of Brattleboro** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes. I believe the chair of the Health and Welfare committee, who on two occasions, said it would come back to the House floor."

**Page 42:**

**Rep. Hingtgen of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote no because buried in this tax bill is an 11.8 million increase in the size of the capital gains loophole. By continuing to tax unearned capital gains from stocks and bonds at a much lower rate than wages and other ordinary earned income, the legislative insults hard-working Vermonters and gives millions in unnecessary tax breaks to the very wealthiest individuals."

**Page 46:**

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote for this bill reluctantly and only because it is revenue neutral. For the people of Vermont I desire to eliminate the death tax, reduce state income tax, and learn, as a state government, to live on less, as we require our taxpayers to do today."

**Page 47:**

**Rep. Randall of Bradford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I decided to support the bill after conferring with some of my colleagues, that at times this proposal enhances justice and at other times it impedes it. It cuts both ways. This simply shows that there is no justice as long as people control the land who do not own it."

**Page 48:**

**Rep. Amidon of Charlotte** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted against the amendment because it appears to weaken H.644. Improved water quality is very important but must be balanced against the desperate need for new housing, good jobs, avoidance of sprawl and other environmental and economic concerns."

**Page 50:**

**Rep. Darrow of Dummerston** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes with the understanding that before third reading, the Health and Welfare committee will resolve the problems we have discussed."

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Floor debate and interrogation at second reading have again proved their value by the gracious and appropriate response of the chair of Health and Welfare. The people have been well served."

**Page 52:**

**Rep. Young of Orwell** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote yes to refer the bill and amendments to the Health and Welfare committee. Not to kill the bill, but rather to insist on the survival and health of the committee system. What good do we do if we add law to the statute books if the health care providers are going to be unwilling to sign certificates? Shouldn't someone ask?"

**Page 53:**

**Rep. DePoy of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I'm not going to vote in favor of something that may improve a bill in which I am not going to vote in favor of anyway."

**Page 58:**

**Rep. Atkins of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: If I'm going to make a mistake, I want it to be a mistake of the heart. My heart wins out on this day and I do support this bill. Many unfortunate people really need this opportunity for relief. However, I will be very vigilant regarding problems and/or abuses and will submit remedial legislation if abuses are found."

**Rep. Haas of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Passage of this legislation sends the wrong message to our youth. It reinforces the message sent each spring by UVM students, openly using an illegal drug on campus, while law enforcement officers idly look on."

**Rep. Hall of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no because we are the law makers. It is sending mixed messages to our children and I also know, it will cost the state tons of money in legal fees."

**Rep. Partridge of Windham** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The following is an excerpt of a letter I received from a friend in South Londonderry:

"Close to twenty years ago, my 26 year old daughter Becky was dying of liver failure. She had all the usual symptoms, including a relentless sort of nausea that remained undiminished in spite of the generous use of all the legal anti-nausea drugs known to the hospital. She remained semi-comatose at times, crying for help and barely able to lift her head. Then her doctor asked her friends and family if they could find some marijuana. In no time, the door to her room was closed, the window open, and room full of smoke and Becky was sitting up in bed playing her banjo. I think she sang "Boil that Cabbage Down". I know for sure that when the boy who was bringing her supper tray opened the door and looked as if he couldn't believe what he was seeing, she roared with laughter.

Soon after that, (she played her banjo on December 28), on December 30, she slipped away into a coma, and on the morning of January 1st, died. Clearly, the medicinal properties of marijuana are astonishing, and to those who are very sick or dying, they ought not be denied."

Mr. Speaker, I cast my vote today in memory of Becky Newton."

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes on H.645 because I believe the result will be a limited use of medicinal marijuana for a small amount of gravely ill people. The review and sunset that passed will essentially make this a trial program, that will enable us to determine whether or not there are positive results for Vermonters."

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The message this bill sends is that there is an appropriate use and an inappropriate use for marijuana. The appropriate use is for medical purposes."

**Page 61:**

**Rep. Darrow of Dummerston** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My objection is not to the bill itself, but that we are being asked to turn state drivers licenses into defacto National I.D. one small piece at a time."

**Rep. Deen of Westminster** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no on moving this bill to third reading because there is more we don't know than we do know about the bill. We do not know:

- \* what level of government requires a SS# upon application for a drivers license?
- \* who outside government has access to our SS# through DMV?
- \* are SS#'s retained at DMV, who requires that and for what reason?
- \* what happens to someone caught in an information warp – how long will they be denied a license?
- \* what happens to a citizen without a SS# who is a law abiding contributing member of the Vermont community – are they denied a license?

If these questions can be answered before third reading, I may be able to support the bill on the vote for passage."

**Rep. Goodridge of Albany** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no in an attempt to keep the frog from turning belly up."

**Page 63:**

**Rep. Voyer of Morristown** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: By voting for this bill you will ignore the fact that custodial parents fall below the self support reserve whenever a non-custodial parent doesn't pay their child support. Therefore, you encourage non support and put the children of both parents at risk. I will not be a part of ignoring what is done to the children by passing this bill."

**Page 64:**

**Rep. Darrow of Dummerston** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I support this bill, but I wish the bureaucrats who want us to make more far-reaching changes to the drivers licenses statutes would propose it all up front, and not in this continuing piecemeal, time-consuming fashion. I can't think of any other minor section of law we spend so much time on, rewriting, so regularly."

**Page 67:**

**Rep. Webster of Brattleboro** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Vermonters often say, when in doubt, vote no. My vote is in that tradition. If information received at third reading indicates that the language in this bill does not harm the essence of the environmental value of the California standards, I will support the bill. This subject needs more time."

**Page 68:**

**Rep. Flory of Pittsford** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I believe this is the goal we should strive for. Unfortunately, I believe we need to develop the appropriate system to facilitate this transition as well as information to assess possible fiscal impacts. For this reason, I could not support this amendment at this time."

**Page 70:**

**Rep. Goodridge of Albany** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes even though I feel our time would be better spent reducing taxation and other regulations on our farmers thus ending the need for a dairy compact."

**Rep. Randall of Bradford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Money taken from the consumer mandated by government force is a tax. In 1937 the Federal Government put dairying under socialism with the so-called Price Stabilization Act. The effect has been to keep the dairymen in a marginal and declining industry with consistently low prices for their product. We will not cure the situation by government force. The market must in the end prevail."

**Page 76:**

**Rep. Kitzmiller of Montpelier** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I want the record to clearly show that every vote against this amendment is a direct vote against all Vermont women."

**Rep. Koch of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The member from Montpelier has a constitutional right to explain his vote. When he attempts to explain mine, he oversteps his bounds."

**Rep. Lippert of Hinesburg** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Removing the historic independence of the Governor's Commission on Women, by placing it in the Executive offices, speaks volumes. This is a move from independence to control. How ironic. It would be sad enough if this move was just symbolic. It is sadder still that the true independence of the Commission's work will be put at risk."

**Page 78:**

**Rep. DePoy of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I cannot support something that costs this state so much and returns so little."

**Page 79:**

**Rep. Atkins of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: With the funding stripped from the amendment, I cannot vote yes; however, I do wish the Medicaid information had been included in the bill on appropriations."

**Page 81:**

**Rep. Webster of Brattleboro** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I would like to find additional money for adult education – but from a different source. I cannot justify a 16% cut in a program that helps our economy grow and which will sustain vital programs in the future such as adult basic education. Mine was a very reluctant no."

**Page 85:**

**Rep. Adams of Hartland** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: State security is an important issue to me, however, I cannot vote for this amendment at the expense of cutting the budget of the Vermont Housing and Conservation Board."

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My only regret is that the most excellent Representative of Poultney did not take the appropriation from the Agency of Natural Resources."

**Rep. Shaw of Derby** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: As much as I would have liked to vote in the affirmative on this amendment, because of the need for a fulltime state police force. But with a housing shortage of 7500 units in this state, already loosing a portion of the funding from the Housing and Conservation, \$2,000,000 – has already been cut, and a loss of back rent.

If there is ever a vehicle to take the State Police to a fulltime status, I would like to be the first to sign."

**Page 86:**

**Rep. Mackinnon of Sharon** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: There is a lot of input that is involved with arriving at a way to vote. Certainly ones parents can be of considerable influence. My father, Barclay Edward Mackinnon, who passed away a few years ago, was born on March 29, 1917, and today would have been his 85th birthday. Dad, thank you for the guidance, rest well and Happy Birthday."

**Page 89:**

**Rep. Pugh of South Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My no vote reflects a concern with powers. The way to ensure that we deal with the critical issue of mercury would be to appoint a committee of conference rather than send this Senate proposal of amendment to committee where the risk is great no action will be taken."

**Page 90:**

**Rep. Jordan of Middlesex** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The amendment does change legislative intent – at least my legislative intent – in the passage of No. 1 of the Acts of 1999. Had this so-called clarifying amendment been part of the aforementioned Act #1, I would not have voted in favor of the underlying bill back in 1999."



**Page 93:**

**Rep. Nitka of Ludlow** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: With regard to how this strike-all amendment is worded, I continue to be concerned about the management and protection of the deer herd should its needs come into conflict with the priorities of the wood products industry and the economic needs of timber investors. This amendment in Section 2 (a)(4) specifically prohibits specially treated, managed or set asides, for the exclusive use of one primary purpose. Thus, this language could prohibit managing deer wintering yards and in the end, damage the tradition of deer hunting in Vermont."

**Rep. Nuovo of Middlebury** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: This bill is against the Vermont Constitution, Article 1, Section 10, case law – Trustees of Caledonia County, Grammar School v. Howard (1910) 84 Vt. 1 and Statute law, Title 10."

**Rep. Randall of Bradford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I have supported this bill throughout the afternoon. The only reason for doing so is that it broadens the use of this land. It is a situation that should not even have to be addressed. As the member from Barre pointed out, that by reading between the lines in the testimony from Island Pond and I will add also in the Fish, Wildlife and Water Resources Committee, of which I was a member, it was obvious what the proposer's intended use for this property was: it was not directly stated. It was instead dressed in a lot of language to conceal the real purpose and to enlist the support of a number of groups who were convinced it was being purchased for their purposes. It is an easy trap for those who wish the State to take by force money from those who earned it and spend it for their group's benefit. Now we spend hours of legislative time fighting over the spoils of this public robbery. The government should own only the amount of property necessary for the administration of good government and none for anybody's special interest. That is why I worked on an amendment to delete the appropriations for this deal and voted against the State participation in the deal itself. I lost on both counts. Mr. Speaker, I think this day proves that just because you lose doesn't mean you were wrong. The fight over these spoils will never be resolved."

**Page 99:**

**Rep. Bourdeau of Hyde Park** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I long for the Vermont where a man's word was his bond and a handshake took the place of an attorney."

**Rep. Donovan of Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My mother taught me to always receive a gift graciously and I am convinced that the Champion lands are a wonderful gift to all the people of Vermont for generations to come."

**Rep. Sheltra of Derby** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes because we are clarifying and enforcing the Legislative intent of 1999. This has been a bitter-sweet process, but it has proven that citizen involvement can be the key to effecting significant Legislative action. The tireless efforts of the Federation of Sportsman and other groups along with Steve McCloud, Clint Gray and Mary Mastaler, have sent a message that outweighs even the value of this legislation."

**Page 101:**

**Rep. Amidon of Charlotte** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The committee did an excellent job, but I can't live with the concept of discipline for a one-time minor mistake. I hope an amendment will fix this on third reading."

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Absent the amendment which Judiciary recommended by a vote on 9-2-0, I will not be able to support this bill on third reading. A single act of mere negligence should not be the basis for discipline. Incompetence, gross negligence and repeated acts of negligence are the appropriate standards."

**Page 102:**

**Rep. Sheltra of Derby** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes if this change in law could prevent one person from becoming infected with HIV. It is worth my vote. My vote is for concern for the public, including children."

**Page 103:**

**Rep. Randall of Bradford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no to this proposal. It is nothing more than further government intruding into the private affairs of the citizens of this country and this state. Employment and compensation should be by agreement between the employer and the employee. The employer should be able to set the compensation that they deem appropriate for themselves based on the skills, or lack thereof, of others."

**Page 104:**

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My yes vote reflects my disappointment with the Senate's action, and their involvement in the House map, which, violates a longstanding tradition, possibly lengthens our session and sets a terrible precedent for the future. All to create a different map with a different set of hot spots. I wish the Senate would have concentrated on a redistricting map of the Senate, which we have still not seen on April 12."

**Page 106:**

**Rep. Hall of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes because I feel if we are going to offer school choice it should be for everyone."

**Page 109:**

**Rep. Deen of Westminster** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Since this amendment would help the elderly, why are we hesitant about using a tax source that is available, that has unused capacity, and that will have a positive spin-off that provides a price barrier to potential smokers? Why are working Vermonters and the elderly asked to bear a cost for our lack of planning? I vote to use a tax capacity to help our elders."

**Rep. Koch of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I do need to explain this vote, because it contradicts positions that I have taken publicly on other occasions, including my votes in committee. To be clear, I support a 67 cent increase in the cigarette tax, and I support full restoration of the V-Script Expanded program. However, what we do today is not to the final word, but part of a larger process. I am confident that the final product will look substantially different. This vote, with others I may cast today, is simply intended to advance that process."

**Rep. Hooker of Rutland City** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: This amendment gives us the time to address the serious problems we have with health care costs in Vermont while allowing those Medicaid programs so necessary to the elderly, poor and disabled to continue. I believe that this amendment puts us on the road to health care cost recovery. I believe that a society will be judged by the way it treats its citizens who are most in need."

**Page 110:**

**Rep. Endres of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted for this bill because I believe strongly that the state Medicaid program must be restructured to assure financial sustainability. This important bill addresses this need and my vote reflects a desire to move the process forward. My hope is the end result of this bill will preserve the effort to restructure Medicaid while, at the same time, protecting our most vulnerable citizens, particularly the elderly and the poor, by restoring some or all of the pharmacy programs."

**Page 112:**

**Rep. Haas of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: As with other portions of this tobacco based tax, I fail to see why cigarette smokers should shoulder the burden of providing dentures. Again, 20 percent of Vermonter's population has been singled out to fund a tax increase."

**Page 113:**

**Rep. Haas of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I cannot, in good conscience, vote to impose an additional tax burden on Vermonters. A tax is a tax.... Is a tax and this tax is non-sustainable, discriminates against 20 percent of Vermonters and impacts those whom are least able to afford it. ADDITIONALLY, retailers throughout Vemront will suffer as consumers seek other sources to obtain tobacco products."

**Rep. Sheltra of Derby** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted "yes" to say "no" to a greater tax increase than that which has already been proposed."

**Page 116:**

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I am proud to vote yes on school choice. I do not believe the dire predictions of doom and gloom. Good schools will have nothing to fear from this bill and parents and their children will have everything to gain. The public, I believe, wants school choice. The status quo is no longer acceptable."

**Page 117:**

**Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote against this bill because I feel it should not be necessary for this body to be spending time working on an issue that is – as the bill states – a basic and natural act of nature, and I add, nature and God."

**Page 118:**

**Rep. DePoy of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: It's a share that previous government action has put us in a situation where we need this money. I realize in today's economic climate we do need the revenue. I hope that some day we will no longer need it and can vote yes to this proposal."

**Rep. Krawczyk of Bennington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no. I think we all here are blowing smoke of one kind or another."

**Rep. Vinton of Colchester** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I am sure this exercise is part of the member from Pownal's 12 step program to stay off cigarettes. I hope my vote helped."

**Rep. Young of Orwell** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Demands on the state's resources are up and yet revenues are not keeping pace. Maybe some well placed advertising could bolster liquor and tobacco sales."

**Page 124:**

**Rep. Bolduc of Barton** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Words of wisdom I was told long ago. "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is."

**Page 125:**

**Rep. Dakin of Colchester** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I try my hardest to understand proposals as they come before me, but when proposals keep coming, I don't rely on my leadership or fellow members to explain proposals to me. I need to study and integrate the information that comes before me. This latest proposal of amendment has too many ramifications in it to vote at this time. this is not the environment to create good public policy."

**Page 126:**

**Rep. Cross of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no on Powerball because the \$6.4 million in projected revenue would simply be transferred to the wealthiest communities in the state to help eliminate the sharing pool. There are much better uses for these dollars."

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I wish to advance Act 60 reform to third reading. There are several reasons each of us may have for voting no, some matters of conscience."

**Page 127:**

**Rep. Connell of Warren** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted "yes" to show my support for changing the burden of Act 60 for the majority of my towns. However, I find Powerball a troubling funding model for our children. If our schools do a good job in teaching math, Powerball will prove to be an unsustainable funding source. I hope for other changes to Act 60 focused on the common level of appraisal on issues around rebates, and on the definition of a homestead."

**Page 131:**

**Rep. Mullin of Rutland Town** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I am fully committed to reducing our reliance on the property tax. However, without a funding replacement I cannot in good conscience vote for this amendment at this time."

**Page 134:**

**Rep. Adams of Hartland** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes on passage of this bill in the hope that the overcrowded Albert Bridge School can build a long overdue addition to that facility without having to raise extra dollars for a sharing pool."

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I did not vote today for Powerball which offends my conscience. I voted today to: Undo the Gordian Knot which binds us; to take a large, but still imperfect step in giving legislative meaning to education equity, to equal educational opportunity; to measure equity and opportunity by outcomes, not inputs; to put a companion piece next to our bill for "school choice" to empower parents to ensure their child has a real opportunity for choice. Today I voted for choice and quality of opportunity."

**Rep. Metzger of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes to restore value to economic development and job growth in Vermont. Hopefully, now our well educated youth will one day be able to find it feasible to remaining this state beyond their high school graduation."

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The fatal flaw of Act 60 was the shark pool. Passage of H. 741 removes the divisive, punitive part of Act 60, reduces most towns tax rates, increases the per-pupil – block grant, while preserving substantial equity. It is a good first step. The next step will be to reduce our reliance on the property tax to fund education, and this bill calls for a report on that also."

**Page 143:**

**Rep. Randall of Bradford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Again we spend nearly a whole legislative day, with all its costs, fighting over who will do what on public land. As I've said before, this is an issue that will never be resolved. The Legislature didn't spend 15 minutes on this subject when the land was privately owned."

**Rep. Seibert of Norwich** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I would hope that the camp culture continues and that the opportunity to be a part of it becomes available to all Vermonters."

**Page 146:**

**Rep. Keogh of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: While I understand the concept here, I cannot support a measure that would cost Burlington one seat."

**Rep. Hingtgen of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: This plan is not perfect, but I support it because Burlington and its neighbors, South Burlington and Winooski, are fully represented with 15 seats, creating a nearly perfect deviation from the principle of one person, one vote of less than 1%."

**Page 147:**

**Rep. Amidon of Charlotte** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The problem of passing new construction bonds in gold town districts with growing populations is approaching crisis proportions. However, the Act 60 reform legislation recently passed out of this House will hopefully help the situation."

**Rep. Pike of Mendon** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: It is time to stop penalizing towns and taxpayers for normal repairs and maintenance that are mandated by the state. We can do better."

**Page 148:**

**Rep. Metzger of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Attempts to control growth in Milton by limiting access to or construction of a wastewater line have only accelerated uncontrolled growth and development (sprawl) as well as put many Milton residents health at great risk."

**Page 154:**

**Rep. Mackinnon of Sharon** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Don, we miss you. Get well soon."

**Page 157:**

**Rep. Paquin of Fairfax** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Though I respect and agree with most of the decisions implicit in this compromise, my no is offered in recognition of the difficult burden we place on families supporting folks with developmental disabilities."

**Page 158:**

**Rep. Cross of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes on this motion to not concur not because I think the House bill is superior to the Senates. I think both bills are bad. The Senate bill ignores important language related to technical education policy and includes higher education language that is questionable. The House bill dilutes conservation policies and rewards select individuals. My yes vote is cast in hopes that the conference committee can craft a bill that solves these problems and is in the best interest of all Vermonters."

**Page 160:**

**Rep. Jordan of Middlesex** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: This body addressed this question last year in the passage of H. 485 and, I believe fairly adjusted the penalties for failing a compliance check at that time. To act again without further testimony or justification is a mistake. Therefore, I voted no."

**Page 161:**

**Rep. Nuovo of Middlebury** explained her vote as follows:

Mr. Speaker: I believe this whole bill should go through the budget process and the appropriations committee each year like every other budget issue."

**Page 162:**

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I support this bill because for the most part, stores and their employees are not the problem, although we all want the stores to remain vigilant. A Free Press editorial from July 13, 2001, quotes from the Vermont Youth Risk Behavior Survey, which found that only 2 to 5 percent of teens questioned bought their alcohol or tobacco directly from stores. The remainder got it from friends or adults. Our efforts to reduce teen smoking and drinking need to be re-examined."

**Page 163:**

**Rep. Connell of Warren** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no because we need to do the hard work of improving a process if it is not working, rather than passing a quick fix of making exceptions for individual projects."

**Rep. Metzger of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: It is a shame that we need legislation like this because past attempts to address the legitimate problems in the Act 250 process have been ignored and not listened to. That is why actions like we are taking today have to be done."

**Page 165:**

**Rep. Hall of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes because I believe what's good for the goose is good for the gander."

**Page 166:**

**Rep. Adams of Hartland** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: While I certainly want to encourage and support our small businesses and also bring property tax relief to our homeowners, I find it fiscally irresponsible to approve this amendment at this time."

**Page 168:**

**Rep. DePoy of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: In order to avoid two hours of wasting taxpayers' money debating this issue, I vote yes. Rest assured, whenever it is attempted to define, specifically in state law, what a spouse is, we will be watching closely."

**Rep. Vinton of Colchester** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I suspect this is the last time I will ever have the chance to support the Civil Union law as a member of the Vermont House of Representatives. I am pleased to have the chance to vote yes, once again, to support this law."

**Page 172:**

**Rep. Palmer of Pownal** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Although I support the underlying concept of this bill, too many questions remain unanswered. I hope that my fears can be laid to rest and my concerns answered before third reading."

**Page 173:**

**Rep. DePoy of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I don't think it appropriate for someone from ANR to be on this House floor during a roll call vote lobbying a member of this House on this bill who has decided to oppose it. Further, I know our rules prohibit such behavior."

**Rep. Hall of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no because I know this will cost people more money and it will also cause the state bureaucracy to grow."

**Page 174:**

**Rep. Marron of Stowe**, explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The people of Morristown, including the Selectboard and the Board of Civil Authority, have made it abundantly clear that as the largest town in Lamoille county, they did not wish to be split. I have been honored to represent them for the past six years."

**Page 176:**

**Rep. Goodridge of Albany** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My yes vote is not for personal interest as stated by rule 75, but my yes vote is a vote for the hard working professional logging community in Vermont."

**Page 177:**

**Rep. Pugh of South Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: If "savings of at least 5% are substantially likely" is not a commonsense elaboration of "significant quantifiable savings," I don't know what is."

**Page 178:**

**Rep. Goodridge of Albany** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The good people of the Orleans-Caledonia 1 District elected me to serve them and protect their best interest. They did not elect me to be the Governor or some agency's puppet."

**Rep. Krawczyk of Bennington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Passage of S. 27 has a bad smell to it."

**Rep. Sheltra of Derby** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I cannot vote for legislation that negatively impacts the low to moderate income citizens of Vermont while giving more jurisdiction and power to the ANR which they are forced to support through their hard-earned tax dollars."

**Page 180:**

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: This bill represents the best compromise possible in a difficult map. It represents fairness for both Winooski and Burlington, which would share a district with a 50/50 split, leaving both towns with an equal chance to win the seat. Some alternatives would leave Burlington unfairly under-represented."

**Page 181:**

**Rep. Metzger of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The Chittenden County Senate District is the largest State Senate district in the nation. Having a district so disproportionately large to the other districts in the state deprives thousands upon thousands of Vermonters of their rights to equal representation. I am confident that when a suit is filed to declare this district unconstitutional, the court will see fit to uphold the rights of all Vermonters."

**Page 185:**

**Rep. Bourdeau of Hyde Park** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: While I support this amendment, I voted against it to save H. 501 which has been over 1 year and three committees of conference in the making."

**Rep. Koch of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I wholeheartedly support this amendment, but in view of the fact that its adoption would probably kill a good bill, I have to vote "no"."

**Page 186:**

**Rep. Randall of Bradford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Once again, Mr. Speaker, we erode our constitutional guarantees for some perceived security. We have done so, so often, that those guarantees are for all practical purposes nonexistent."

**Page 189:**

**Rep. Duffy of Rutland City** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: As other states have discovered, there is a point of diminishing returns when folks begin to purchase their cigarettes on the internet or in neighboring states. The unsustainability of this source of funding makes this an irresponsible way to finance healthcare costs over the long term. This is also a regressive tax. Raising taxes on the few to provide services for the many puts us on a slippery slope indeed! I voted in favor of this bill with a 36 cent tax, as it was passed out of the House. Containing the cost of health care is of paramount importance to me. How we accomplish that is of equal importance!"

**Rep. Shaw of Derby** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes with great regret! I think that this is a terrible act upon our businesses in this state. But, it would be worse to make our people on Medicaid go without proper care."

**Rep. Young of Orwell** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I must vote no – the cigarette tax is not a sustainable source of revenue upon which to fund any program. The tax is regressive and lastly the premise upon which the tobacco settlement case turned, was that people were addicted to nicotine and could not stop or avoid the health risks – or this tax."

**Page 190:**

**Rep. Driscoll of Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: At least we can continue to rely on good old foreign oil."

**Page 191:**

**Rep. Bohi of Hartford** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: The lobbying restriction imposed on the Governor's Commission on Women is why I voted no."

**Rep. Mackinnon of Sharon** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Any vote I make is quite likely the result of the influence of two extraordinary people in my life. My mother, Nancy Maguire Mackinnon, who passed away in 1980, was a remarkable person who instilled in me the confidence and courage to try to make this world a better place for all of us. Mom, thank you for the guidance, I love you and rest well. My sister, Nancy Conley Mackinnon, has been my lifelong best friend and confidante. Her wit and wisdom have served me well throughout my life and certainly during my deliberations here in the Vermont House of Representatives. Bam, you are truly a great friend and I thank you for always being there for me.

Thank you Mr. Speaker."



**Rep. Miller of Shaftsbury** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: If the provision in the Governor's Commission on Women was a stand-alone provision, I would have voted against it. The Commission has served us well by championing issues of great importance. To deny them the right to advocate like any other state agency is to single them out and that's just plain wrong. Because H. 766 is improved over earlier versions, I have reluctantly supported the bill."

**Rep. Randall of Bradford** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: We have met the enemy and they are us."

**Page 192:**

**Rep. Cross of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted against this bill because the bill itself declares that it will diminish school funding equity and that a study is needed to determine how to restore that equity. Would it not be wiser, Mr. Speaker, to determine the equity question prior to changing the system?"

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote for this because it does not increase taxes and gives important relief to the ski industry workers, children, and parents. I regret that the other body did not engage in the comprehensive tax equity measures of the House. Hopefully, the other body will see the wisdom of the needed equities recognized so clearly by the House, in the next biennium."

**Page 193:**

**Rep. Bourdeau of Hyde Park** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My vote of "no" is on the reapportionment plan sections attached by the senate yesterday to the professional regulation bill which I had previously supported in my committee and in this chamber. The decision of the senate to remove the towns of Wolcott and Eden from Lamoille Co. and place them into the Essex-Orleans district with which they have nothing in common other than a border was not necessary. The numbers would have allowed a better fix. At the very least, as a second choice for Wolcott, they could have been put into Caledonia with which they share some familiarity instead of putting the town of Orange out of Orange Co. and putting it into Caledonia, but I guess that would have defeated the true goals of why this gerrymandering was done in the first place. By the same token I find it ironic that of all the options available for towns to be moved into the Essex-Orleans district, it just so happens that the town of Eden was picked by the Senators. I note that it is the hometown of the candidate who provided stiff competition in the last Lamoille Senate race. What a coincidence! The senate insisted on their plan or else they would adjourn and go to a prolonged court battle over the map and we have stayed an extra two weeks trying to persuade them otherwise. I publicly apologize to both Wolcott and Eden that my best was not good enough in trying to prevent this travesty from happening to you."

**Rep. Cross of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: A combined Winooski/Burlington district with 80% Winooski and 20% Burlington provides Winooski with 1.6 representatives and Burlington with 9.4. Yes, Burlington is shortchanged, however, that shortchanging is not caused by Winooski's representation, but rather by South Burlington's."

**Rep. Deen of Westminster** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Many of the voices today have been critical of the final outcome of the reapportionment bill because they say the Senate has been too political. This is a political process and the plan presented to the minority House party early on in the process was extremely political. As someone what was dictated to by the House majority party, I thank the Senate for their reasoned and balanced view of the House passed plan and for hanging tough on behalf of us in the Minority."

**Rep. Goodridge of Albany** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Even though H.761 does not draw the redistricting lines to my satisfaction, it does show me that there are some, left wing radicals, in the Democrat party who are willing to put their personal agenda before what is financially best for the Citizens of Vermont. Passage of this bill shows the Citizens of Vermont that there are those of us, in this body, who are willing to do our Constitutional duty that we were elected to do and not allow the courts to do our job for us."

**Rep. Hall of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no because I believe we're boiling that same old frog. Thank you."

**Rep. Hummel of Underhill** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My yes vote expresses my conviction that it is the legislature's job to do reapportionment. I find it unfortunate that other members have found it necessary to "arraign the motives" of the other body. According to Mason's rules, we do not allow ourselves the liberty to so criticize each other."

**Rep. Johnson of Canaan** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted favorably on this second redistricting bill (H. 761) as I did on the first House redistricting bill (H. 749, Act 85) with the understanding that the Town of Westmore would be in the House district I now represent, and that the name of that district would reflect all of the home counties of the Towns in that district. Westmore is in Orleans County, and as the bills are currently written this is not reflected in the district's name. I understand that the Legislative Council will revise the name of the district in the codified version of H 761 and H 749 to be "ESSEX-CALEDONIA-ORLEANS" and I want the record today to reflect this editorial revision."

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote "yes" out of my Constitutional duty and conscientious desire to put the welfare of the citizens of Vermont above the venal, power and partisan politics of certain members of the Senate. I vote "yes" to avoid a Constitutional crisis, the costs of uncertain litigation, and placing the issue before an activist Supreme Court which is unelected and unresponsive to the electorate. I hope the citizens of Vermont will recognize the difference between those who put their venal political ambition above the "common good" and those who put Constitutional duty above personal ambition. The people of Vermont can reward those who do right by placing more like them in both bodies of the General Assembly. If they do, we can easily and quickly address the injustices which have been visited on us in the next General Assembly."

**Rep. Kiss of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted no on the statewide reapportionment bill because this plan unfairly under-represents the people of Burlington, particularly its working class districts, unfairly over-represents the people of South Burlington, and in creating a shared district with Burlington and Winooski so disproportionately represents Winooski residents that Burlington residents, regardless of their political affiliation, lose quality and fairness in their voting rights."

**Rep. Palmer of Pownal** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes, Mr. Speaker, but obviously Mr. Speaker –the best horse thieves in the building are in the other body." Thank you Mr. Speaker."

**Rep. Pugh of South Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted yes for this "redistricting" plan because it give South Burlington the 4 seats which the city's Board of Civil Authority believes accurately reflects our population growth. Combining South Burlington and Burlington with Winooski into one large district while reducing the total number of representatives was the result of actions taken by the House of Representatives. The subsequent drawing of the internal lines of this district had to be made within that context."

**Rep. Rusten of Halifax** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I voted "no" to reflect the anger and disappointment of the people of Wilmington in having their town moved into the Bennington Senatorial district. This fight is not over."

**Rep. Symington of Jericho** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: With my vote I express my appreciation to the other body for modifying the version of the redistricting plan that was originally approved by this House. This final plan for the House respects the interests of our communities and our state more effectively than had been originally proposed by the House whose plan set the stage for a partisan discussion."

**Rep. Webster of Brattleboro** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I agree with the members of Newport, Albany and Londonderry in voting yes. That rarely happens. We all wear glasses. The difference is that we have differing corrective lenses."

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: My yes vote reflects my desire to keep reapportionment out of the courts. But let the record also reflect my deep disappointment in the Senates refusal to compromise and put the town of Orange back where it belongs, in Orange County, as well as my disappointment with Senate negotiators on the other side who sold Burlington down the river, the Winooski River. Only one body was willing to compromise to save taxpayers a costly court fight and to avert a Constitutional crisis, and I am proud to say it was the House, and certainly not the Senate."

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: Due to partisan politics the map, drawn by Democrats, for Burlington and Winooski clearly under represents Burlington and gives those votes of Ward 1 very little voice in their new shared district with Winooski. I have worked on many issues with members from the other parties and the independent and it pains me to have to say these words, but it is a shame that party politics has turned out to be more important than community representatives."

**Rep. Young of Orwell** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker: I vote yes, obviously the system has already failed."
