The following are the House Rules governing voting in the House

**XI
OF VOTING**

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. Of the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 3, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Member shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

VOTE EXPLANATIONS

Page 3

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes, in spite of serious misgivings about committing to the spending of fictitious funds this early in the session.”

Page 7

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am not comfortable supporting a bill that could mistakenly give a wrong impression about its intent when no testimony was sought from organizations that might express concerns.”

Rep. Grad of Moretown explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I would like to support this bill on the issue of preventing date rape alone, I am concerned that the committee did not take testimony from organizations such as MADD or Drug Free Communities. On this process issue alone, I will vote no at this point. I am hopeful however, that the committee will hear from such organizations between second and third readings and I will reconsider my vote and support crime victims by supporting this bill.”

Rep. Trombley of Grand Isle explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As many of you know I am a licensed alcohol and drug counselor. I believe that prevention is the key to reducing the health problems related to addiction.

I am at conflict over the bill because I do not feel it is appropriate to penalize the hardworking bartenders in our restaurant and bar industry. I do fear the bill sends the wrong message to our youth.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is not a vote on the bill, I vote no because I am opposed to the bill...not the strike all amendment. Unfortunately, the roll call comes at the wrong time in the process.”

Page 8

Rep. Donovan of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As a representative from Burlington I understand our city Charter exempts us from this bill, but I voted for this because of my belief in local control.”

Page 9

Rep. Atkins of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I'm voting yes on H.113 with the wish that the State had included money for education. I'm opposed to unfunded mandates.”

Rep. Brown of Walden explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Regardless of any number reported or not, if this keeps one child from being harassed it is worth a career of teaching”

Rep. Haas of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Conflicting testimony convinced members of the Judiciary Committee to request the data that would support the claim of pervasive harassment in our schools. We were denied! I cannot, in good faith, vote for any bill based on deception of fact. Not only is this bill based on unconfirmed and possibly fraudulent data, it would also subject our schools to increased liability in lawsuits and could produce frivolous claims of harassment.”

Rep. Hinggen of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill is not about “teachable moments.” This is about harassment that is so severe that it prevents a student from receiving an education as is guaranteed by the Equal Protection clause of the Federal Constitution. We are required to guarantee that every child has equal access to a public education. H. 113 is a tool to live up to that guarantee.”

Rep. Kirker of Essex explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cannot support the amendment to this harassment bill because I believe we cannot legislate the behavior of children. I believe this bill will invite lawsuits against schools. The costs of enacting the bill have not been addressed. It will be more effective for parents and school personnel to teach children to respect others and their property than to create a law that protects not all children, but only protected classes from harassment. Equal protection under the law is not provided in H.113.”

Page 11

Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We cannot legislate intelligence. It must be in the essence of the individual.”

Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I choose to vote no on this bill because I do not want government to have more control. I believe the parents should be working harder to train their children to respect their peers. I relate an incident where a classmate stepped in to defend me from harassment from other students. It made my freshman school year more meaningful and I learned a lesson which I passed on to others throughout life.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I strongly support timely racial harassment and appropriate institutional response to all well-founded complaints of harassment and therefore I support the focus of the bill. However, it is structurally imperfect and needs further work in the other body to recognize and accommodate the rights and needs of several stakeholders in the process over whom the judiciary committee did not have jurisdiction, and from whom we could not hear in the available time.”

Rep. Sheltra of Derby explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have always supported local control, if we have a school that cannot control harassment, the issue needs to be addressed through the Superintendent, the Principal, the School Board and parents.

This law won't change the people in charge. They have to decide to make that decision and generally local discussion and reasoning can do that.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My wife, an excellent classroom teacher, would like to have time to teach....not be attending “encouraged education and training” on more and more and more programs.”

Page 15

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As an employer, I can say that ever increasing workers’ compensation costs give me the same painful headache every year at budget time. Not only does this bill offer nothing for the headache, it creates new ones for injured workers and utterly fails to address the underlying disease. I hope that when it comes back from the other body we will have the opportunity to vote on a better bill.”

Rep, Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As a business owner for 20 years I am acutely aware of workers’ compensation issues. Unlike the advice this legislature has received from the Mercer Report and the workers’ compensation working group, this piece of legislation accomplishes very little. One thing it does do, is cut benefits to injured employees.”

Page 17

Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes with the assurance that the language in Sec. 1 (A) will be changed as was mentioned by the reporter of the bill.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While such a proposal is well intentioned, it does serious violence to well ordered liberty, the age of majority proportional representation, the constitutional principle of “one person one vote” representation. Children should not be charged with adult responsibilities and duties for which they are ill equipped by age and experience. In my opinion, this is unconstitutional and I have taken an oath to do no injury to the Constitution, and more importantly, no injury to my neighbor.”

Rep. Metzger of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I know some pretty smart kids and some pretty dumb adults.”

Page 18

Rep. Bailey of Hyde Park explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The student member is not elected by the voters and therefore should not have the privileges and responsibilities of the elected school board members.”

Page 19

Rep. Koch of Barre of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

I supported this proposal as a means of providing funds for much needed substance abuse and mental health services. With the defeat of this part of the amendment, it is with much regret that I will not be able to vote yes on the next question.”

Page 20

Rep. Clarke of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I’m supportive of this bill because it promotes the fundamental principles of good government adhering to justice, moderation, temperance and frugality. These, Mr. Speaker, are the things that will preserve the blessings of liberty.”

Rep. Fallar of Timmouth explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I applaud the Appropriation committee’s hard work on this bill.

However, I voted against the budget to send a message that there is a freight train of structural deficits headed in our direction. There are many cars on this train – health care, paving and bridges, mental health and capital construction, to name a few.”

Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My thanks to the appropriations committee for all their efforts.

However, we cannot continue to buy land and the non-working landscapes with dreams.

Our value standards must change. Thank you Mr. Speaker.”

Rep. Reese of Pomfret explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I too applaud the Appropriations committee for its hard work in making very difficult decisions. But we need a concrete plan to deal with the obvious impending deficits, which I estimate to be as much as \$109 million.

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While this budget is not perfect, and I supported an amendment to it, I support the budget as an effort to support Vermonters while keeping spending under control, and growing our economy without the increases that would only stifle that growth. After all, Mr. Speaker, it was President John F. Kennedy who said (in advocating for tax cuts) “a rising tide lifts all boats.” Criticism without alternatives will not do.

Page 21

Rep. Shaw of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I think that the home sharing is a great program, which has already gotten additional funding of 30k – we need to make sure this program certainly gets additional funding in the future.

Thank you Mr. Speaker.”

Page 22

Rep. Shand of Weathersfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker”

The budget in front of us relies on over \$40 million in one-time spending. Vermont is facing a \$109 million dollar deficit with an additional \$130 million of upward cost pressures each year. We cannot afford not to plan ahead as we do our job of serving the citizens of Vermont.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I would suggest that the cost, time and effort that would be expended by the suggested special committee guessing at a five-year budget plan could be better spent looking for immediate cost saving measures throughout state government. I am happy to note that the members of this body that created a Dr. Dynasaur plan that is more generous than my bank’s Blue Cross/Blue Shield plan are finally finding religion.”

Page 24

Rep. Atkins of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I’m voting yes because I’m a process person. I am also not in favor of windmills on our ridges without public input.

Hopefully, the process will work.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes for a study because it is clear the Legislative intent of the study is not intended to affect delay or suspend any applications for permits, reviews or other Government actions relating to turbine wind generator projects pending on, or filed after, the effective date of the study.”

Page 27

Rep. Shand of Weathersfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because I believe that the money in the capital construction bill should be used for building projects that are ready to be built. Only after the bricks and mortar projects are satisfied should any extra monies be spent on marketing initiatives and other non-capitol items. A school addition should come first.”

Page 28

Rep. Keenan of St. Albans City explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

Since the word “moratorium” has appeared in the capital bill, I feel any “moratorium” is an opportunity for discussion.

This is precisely the reason policy should not be involved in our capital expenditure bill and should be left to the appropriate committee of jurisdiction.”

Page 29

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

I have grave reservations about building 330 foot towers on our ridgelines. I must, however, support our government processes, including the legislative process for reviewing utility legislation in the Commerce Committee and the Section 248 process for the Public Service Board to apply the Act 250 criteria.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

I strongly support the development of wind power in Vermont, and I believe it can be achieved balancing all of our state’s values. However, it calls for an informed public policy framework set by the General Assembly, not reliance on an existing process established before commercial wind power was an active issue.”

Rep. Metzger of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

I have no problem supporting wind power. I do have a problem moving forward without a sound, reasoned State energy policy.

We have debated for two days and for many hours because we lack a sound energy policy in Vermont.”

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

Vermont has adequate regulatory procedures in place to protect the natural beauty of the state without delaying consideration of the wind tower question for 15 months.

Solving Vermont’s need for affordable energy should be permitted to go forward.”

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

I voted yes because, while I believe wind power will be important to Vermont’s future, I also believe that, as with genetically modified organisms, a time to give more consideration of the impacts on Vermont can’t hurt and just might help.”

Rep. Towne of Berlin explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

All moratoriums are not created equal, A moratorium dealing with Genetic Engineering is about trying to deny farms a choice of an approved and tested product based on the approval system that is established for the whole country. The Assistant Attorney General has made it very clear that a moratorium on Genetically Engineered seeds would likely be in violation of the Commerce clause of the U.S. Constitution.

Today reminds me of the quote made by a N.Y. judge in the late 1800’s. “No man’s life, liberty or property is safe while the Legislature sits in session”.”

Page 30

Rep. Maier of Middlebury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

I vote yes for this bill despite my grave concern about the language in this bill that interferes with a fully executed legal agreement concerning the Peterson Dam.”

Page 31

Rep. Hall of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

I voted no because I know this, if passed, will open up a can of worms that will spread to all aspects of our lives.”

Page 32

Rep. Atkins of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I don't like unfunded mandates. I don't like legislating medical school curriculum. I don't like dealing with a drug that is now illegal. I don't like not having enough scientific data on pain.

However, allowing marijuana to be included in a pain study is the least we can do. I voted yes to allow a study.”

Rep. Bostic of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am a believer in medical marijuana in pain management. I voted no because of the back door process used to get the subject to the floor.”

Rep. Brown of Walden explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My yes vote is for my friend Bert! He was taken to the hospital at 2:00 a.m. this morning with excruciating pain caused by cancer. Pain that doctors told him they could regulate, they couldn't. I hope my vote helps someone, anyone.”

Rep. Rodgers of Glover explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I hope the medical marijuana bill comes out of committee so we can fully debate the issue on the floor. A dear friend of mine is suffering from cancer and told me marijuana helped him more than any of the prescription drugs that he had tried. This is proof enough for me that we need further study.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no – the first half of the amendment directs us to “investigate and evaluate” – the second is a directive to include medical marijuana in medical training. Sounds to me like the study committee report has already been legislatively dictated.”

Page 33

Rep. Larson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My vote today reflects my commitment to supporting local communities making decisions about what they feel is best for them. This Legislature should adopt all charter changes that are constitutional and adopted through an appropriate decision making process.”

Page 37

Rep. Amidon of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I respect the concerns of sportsmen and of the ailing timber industry, having grown up in an area of New York state with many now abandoned logging camps and a strong hunting lifestyle, I believe that the future of the Vermont economy is better represented by p. 63 of the National Geographic Traveler magazine – coincidentally placed on the members' desks this morning. Vermont is on that page listed as tied for 7th in a worldwide list of attractive tourism destinations. On the other hand, logging in our national forest is not going to stop the flood of cheap Russian lumber into world markets and save the North American timber industry. I also believe wilderness designation will not hinder traditional non-motorized hunting despite the possible closing of a few access roads. I support confirmation of the planning process and oppose detailed land management by legislative vote.”

Rep. Anderson of Woodstock explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cannot support this because there is no middle ground in this resolution. We tried to insert some with amendments, or perhaps find some through the committee process, but each effort failed. This is a line on this and not one more acre of wilderness designation. Our forests should be used for multiple purposes- for logging; wildlife habitat management; access to motorized vehicles; and wilderness in balance.

Rep. Miller of Shaftsbury explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I signed on to this resolution because I have concerns and know there are concerns in the town and district that I represent. Creating additional wilderness is a federal responsibility not to be taken lightly. However, I believe that a better expression of this body’s concerns to our Congressional delegation could have been crafted had this resolution gone through a more deliberative process.”

Rep. Rodgers of Glover explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support wilderness. I also support sound management of public land. Without money to maintain roads or build new ones. I believe much of the National Forest is already wilderness in most people’s view. Roads are needed for disabled and handicapped people to access the forest. More wilderness designation limits access to these people. For these reasons, I vote yes.

Rep. Robinson of Richmond explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am very concerned about our environment which includes our wildlife. Expanding our wilderness will impact on the amount and diversity of our wildlife, by limiting the proper forest management which would include logging.”

Rep. Shaw of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I rise today proud of my vote on this very important resolution. The people of the State of Vermont were lied to in 1999 when they were told everything would remain the same. Well it’s about to happen again Mr. Speaker. If we the people of the legislature don’t send this clear message to our delegation in Washington.

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes on this resolution, despite my wish that we could have achieved compromise language that might have sent a stronger message to our Congressional delegation, with broad and widespread support. Nevertheless, a message needs to be sent, and I fear a “no” vote would send “no” message.”

Page 40

Rep. Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no on this request to keep the committee process in tact. This was not a vote on the issue of school choice which ought to be discussed but on the merits of relieving a committee of a bill they’ve worked on but not yet competed.”

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I support school choice, I can’t support this process. In addition, I recently promised my local school board that, prior to voting on any school choice bill, I would discuss possible ramifications with them. I cannot break that promise.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support school choice and would have liked the Education committee to report this bill to the floor. But, I also believe in the committee process, and I need to support that process even when it produces results I do not like.”

Rep. Marron of Stowe explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have supported public school choice in the past and I worked hard to gain passage of Act 150 when I was a member of the House Education committee.

I am concerned about the impact that this bill would have on small schools in Vermont. As Chair of the cost containment committee this past summer, I am convinced that consolidation of schools should be encouraged but decision should be made locally. This bill might have the effect of increasing the cost of education.

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Though I am a strong supporter of school choice, I vote against this process of relieving the House Education committee of this important issue.”

Rep. O’Donnell of Vernon explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The town I live in has had school choice for many years. Two of my children have gone out of the school district and two have not. None of the personal decisions made by the residents have in any way hurt our Union School. But, they have all helped the families who have made them. I look forward to the day when every Vermonter can make the choice for their child.”

Page 41

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cannot win. I strongly support a farmers’ right to farm and I thank the House Agriculture committee for addressing that issue. On the other hand, I think its time we said no to the E.P.A. rather than subjecting our farms to more mandates and hurdles. I can only hope that they are not unfunded mandates that we impose.”

Page 43

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I think it is important to include the information contained in the second whereas clause in the substitute that brings into question the accuracy of the findings of the Tax Foundation. The Congressional budget office, and no less a financial guru than Alan Greenspan, have criticized the way the Tax Foundation overstates the tax burdens of the vast majority of families.”

Page 44

Rep. Atkins of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because this resolution and the amendments discussed are “full of sound and fury, signifying nothing”. That’s a Shakespearian comment. Thank you Mr. Speaker.”

Rep. Perry of Richford explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I cannot support this resolution because I do not agree with, or support, the recent actions of the U.S. Congress which have resulted in major national debt. This large debt is unnecessary and counterproductive to the economic well-being of our country and its citizens. This is an unfortunate legacy for our children and grandchildren."

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Another resolution. Another debate. Two roll calls - and for what? I think we just did our part to make Tax Freedom Day, or whatever you want to call it, a little later. The taxpayers of Vermont, our employers, I believe would have been better served if we had returned to our committees and worked toward an early adjournment."

Page 45

Rep. Duffy of Rutland explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

A vote for this amendment puts us on the road toward single-payer government run health care, with NO incentives for cost containment. The costs of this program will be borne by our hospitals and doctors and finally by those who are insured in non-government programs.

This plan will further aggravate the cost shift for health care and could result in the collapse of the private insurance market in Vermont.

This is NOT viable plan for improving the healthcare picture in Vermont.

Therefore, I will vote against this amendment and support the underlying bill."

Rep. Kirker of Essex explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I cannot support this amendment which provides an approach to health insurance that adds to existing cost shifts in health care, does not provide incentives to encourage consumers to use health care services discriminately, undermines the private health insurance market, which is already fragile in Vermont and further shortchanges payments to health care providers."

Page 46

Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because we already have a process to take care of complaints. We have internal and external rules with 92 subsections, plus a health care ombudsman. We also have a very regulated industry adding to health care costs.

As a substantial change in policy, this section deserves the Commerce committee process. Good legislation is not voted on without knowing its repercussions."

Page 47

Rep. Cross of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Yesterday we learned from a wise small business owner, a member with this body, that his company's health insurance costs have escalated 1 percent in three years.

Today, we learned that small business owners generally control the choice of health insurance provided to their employees.

Is there only one smart small business owner in Vermont?"

Page 48

Rep. Milkey of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The insurance market has failed miserably when it comes to health care. When good-old-fashioned health insurance was no longer working, we tried managed care. That didn't work, so now we're going to try MSA's and MRA's. When they don't work either, we'll be back discussing universal access once again. Universal access to quality, affordable health care is what Vermonters want, and maybe next time we, their so-called leaders, will get out of the way and let the people lead us to it.”

Rep. Pugh of South Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

There is much that is wrong with this amendment from its frame to its funding source, but what is right about it is its vision and hope for all Vermonters to have access to quality health care. That was reason enough for my vote of yes.”

Page 49

Rep. Brown of Walden explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have listened to three health care proposals in the last two days. One with funding sources and two without, one with details, two without. I voted to help Vermonters. It is not the complete answer by far, but I am not, and will not, play the deceit game with my constituents.”

Rep. Donovan of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Today we are about a week away from the end of the budgeted sixteen week session for the second year of the biennium, and we have spent two days debating an important policy issue vital to all our constituents which will not receive serious, if any, attention in the Senate due to the constraints of time.

To address health care with so little time and so little substance, is not only unfair, it is an insult to the 63,000 Vermonters who don't have health insurance and to the many small Vermont businesses who are struggling to provide health insurance for their employees.”

Rep. Fisher of Lincoln explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no because I can't support what amounts to a frivolous expenditure of taxpayer dollars for very little gain. This bill does nothing to substantially address the rapidly rising costs of health care. This bill does nothing to help the small businesses that are now struggling to provide health care for their employees. We could have, and should have, done much more, much earlier.”

Page 50

Rep. Albert Krawczyk of Bennington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because its just another mandate forced upon our school boards...a feel good item”

Rep. Schiavone of Shelburne explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because I believe it is unreasonable to formulate a school nutritional policy that extends beyond the school grounds.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

One more initiative that I would bet will someday take my wife, a fine classroom teacher, out of her class for a day for training leaving her students with a substitute.”

Page 51

Rep. Adams of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe in the 1st Amendment to the U.S. Constitution – Freedom of Speech – the right to say what one feels about an issue. I voted to allow the remarks of the member from Norwich to be journalized and likewise have voted to allow journalization of the remarks and views of the member from Derby as well.”

Rep. Donovan of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes so that the remarks of the junior republican U.S. Senator Rick Santorum could be a matter of our record.”

Rep. Duffy of Rutland explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

For those who march in Washington under the guise of a “March for Women’s Life Day” – I would suggest they call it what it is – PRO ABORTION DAY!

Rep. Edwards of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because I believe in the constitutional right to free speech. I also believe in the constitutional right to choose. My yes vote does not endorse the content or sentiments expressed in the remarks. I will be marching in Washington, DC.”

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Whether one agrees with a position or disagrees, this body has always and hopefully, will always, be a place where freedom of speech is paramount.”

Rep. Hummel of Underhill explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Although I wholeheartedly disagree with the member’s remarks, I defend her right to make them.”

Rep. Kitzmiller of Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes in support of a member’s right to have remarks journalized. However, I disagree totally with the contents of those remarks, and wish to be counted among the many millions of Americans who are grateful supporters of the Roe v. Wade decision.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I would like to note that I voted against entering the remarks of the member from Norwich in the Journal, and I have voted no on this question as well. In my view, this House is journalizing far too many comments, and before we know it, we’ll be publishing a document akin to the Congressional Record. Journalizing remarks should be reserved to those matters on which we all agree, and in rare instances, statements inserted to create a record of legislative intent.”

Rep. Lippert of Hinesburg explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It is the longstanding tradition of the House that a vote to journalize the remarks of a member does not necessarily indicate agreement with the intent or sentiment of the remarks. I vote today to journalize these remarks only for the purpose of reflecting accurately the nature of today’s proceedings.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My vote was simply to record the member’s comments, not to endorse them. I would afford the same courtesy to any member.”

Rep. Metzger of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Abortion is a difficult and divisive issue. This country has been struggling with the issue for over 30 years. This issue doesn’t become any easier to deal with and only hard feelings arise when it is rammed down our throats time and time again, by extremists on both sides of the abortion debate. They may be able to go home feeling good about themselves. They can, also go home knowing they changed not a single mind. Abortion is a national issue which won’t be settled in the Vermont State House, now or at any point, in the future.”

Rep. Milkey of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I do not agree with the remarks being journalized, I am voting out of courtesy to another House member, and with respect for our right to disagree on this or any other issue.”

Rep. Miller of Shaftsbury explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Once again my belief in the 1st Amendment has been put to the test. I voted for free speech.”

Rep. Myers of Essex explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I do not agree with the remarks of the member from Derby, I feel that in light of the member from Norwich, the remarks of the member from Derby deserve equal consideration.”

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I disagree with the opinion being expressed in these remarks, I disagree still with any effort to erode the courtesies that we as members extend to one another in this body. Therefore, I voted yes.”

Page 52

Rep. Kirker of Essex explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

H. 629 is a bill that I have struggled with. I believe that bullying is a symptom of larger, pervasive, social and cultural issues in our society.

This bill is one more example of the state expecting schools to assume parental responsibilities.

However, I support the bill in the hope that a clear message about the importance of respect in our society will be brought to the forefront. Let us all remember that children learn from adults who model behaviors and set expectations for right and wrong.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The childhood poem “sticks and stones will break my bones, but names will never hurt me”, is hereby repealed.”

Rep. Audette of South Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cannot vote for this Act with the e-court as the court of appeals. This is not permit reform, but makes work for lawyers. The e-court will be plugged up by the first three months.”

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Sec. 50 (J) and (K) make it clear that the land use panel and the water resources panel are empowered to participate as a party “in all matters” before the Environmental Court, so either panel may appeal an Environmental Court decision to the Supreme Court, and I would agree may bring an appeal to the Environmental Court.

Beyond that I voted no on H. 175 because H. 175 does not speed permitting at the start of the process. H.175 does not consolidate any permits. The bottom line seems to be that Vermonters can no longer be trusted with influencing the environmental impacts of development in Vermont, a sad day for Vermont.”

Rep. Edwards of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I support the efforts made at correcting parts of Ch. 117, I do not think this bill, as offered, will help the overall process. It does little to reform permitting in the way my constituents have asked. It will not help the business community.”

Rep. Hummel of Underhill explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My no vote is, among other things, an expression of regret and gratitude to all those citizens who have served on the Environmental Board and the Water Resources Board. Over several decades, the competence and commitment of those hundreds of individuals have enriched our civic life and have done a great deal to assure the continuing health of Vermont’s lands and waters. I salute them.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because the permit appeals reform part of the bill is not good for business. It’s good for lawyers. It will bring reliability and predictability to the process and that will be that all parties can now say “see you in court”. How can that possibly be good for business?”

Rep. Maier of Middlebury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to support the good work related to the local and regional permit process revisions. I do not believe the Act 250 revisions represent real permit reform and may, in fact, create significant problems in the future.”

Rep. Nuovo of Middlebury explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The Vermont Constitution Chapter II Section 30 states as follows:

“The Supreme Court shall have administrative control of all courts of the state....”

The case law in *Ketchum V. Lehner*, 1988, 149 Vt. 314 is a case concerning the assignment of judges and states as follows:

The “power of assignment, regular or special, is in the judicial branch under the Vermont Constitution and laws.....

The assignment and reassignment of judges among the territorial units is part of the administrative control. There is no justifiable inference, much less any specific language, putting that power anywhere else.”

The Constitution does not give the legislature the right to tell the court how or when they can assign judges, only the court has the constitutional power to do that. The committee of conference report is unconstitutional in this section under the Vermont Constitution and under case law.

I would also like to state that the environmental court will be more expensive and take more time for the parties. I believe the business community will be sorry for these delays and the cost of going to court.

The present Act 250 law involves the citizens of the state of Vermont. It was very important to the drafters of this law that citizen participation was essential so that citizens could state their concerns, their values, their interests, their liberty, the protection of the environment, the viability of their communities, to protect their property, and even their democracy. It is the citizen's state and they should also have a say in what happens to their state. In Act 250 to have citizen participation you must have good reason; and it must be relevant and material to the case at hand. It is very important that these points be kept and I cannot vote for this bill while taking away the rights of citizens or violating the Constitution of Vermont."

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

This bill reforms a process which has served Vermont well, but needs to be streamlined to ensure economic growth and vitality, as well as, potentially spurring the building of more affordable housing across Vermont. This is a successful compromise which strikes a delicate balance between environmental and business needs, as well as addressing the needs of housing. This is a proud day for Vermont."

Page 55

Rep. Kiss of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

S. 154 doesn't solve every health care problem, but it does establish in public policy a new commitment to protect health care workers from retaliation if they raise legitimate concerns about violations of the law or quality of patient care in Vermont hospitals and nursing homes where they're employed. This law is a positive step forward."

Page 57

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Back in 1981 stormwater run-off referred only to discharges from large scale developments. That term now means precipitation and snow-melt that does not infiltrate the soil.

Today we are voting to impose an impact fee, \$30,000 per acre of impervious surface on any construction site~ (including private homes) where roofs, parking areas and driveways, both paved and unpaved reach the one-acre limit.

This fee will be assessed in watersheds draining into streams where the Secretary of Natural Resources has determined that biotic organisms in the water are threatened by sedimentation.

The \$30,000 impact fee is not affected by the value of the land or the ability of the landowner to pay.

It is sure to influence the location and size of both business and residential projects and to impede the improvement of their property by many Vermonters."

Page 59

Rep. Duffy of Rutland City explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

While I have reservations regarding the sections of this bill that relate to pornography, I would be happier if they were deleted, I strongly support protecting the innocent in our communities from sexual predators. Therefore, I support this legislation."

Rep. Haas of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

The internet sex offender registry is a great benefit to our communities. Just today I received word of a sex offender being foiled by a concerned citizen in Helena, Montana. The citizen became suspicious of an unknown person offering baby sitting services for children under age eight. The internet listing of this offender confirmed his suspicions and resulted in the arrest of the offender for violation of parole."

Rep. Kiss of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Mr. Speaker, over the last several weeks the House Judiciary Committee took substantial testimony related to Vermont's current sexual offender registration and community notification process. What I believe we learned was that our current registry could be improved with better guidance and support for law enforcement and with better information available to people in the community with specific concerns for their well-being. What I believe we also learned was that electronic posting of sexual offenders does not make Vermont safer. In fact, it is more likely to have negative consequences on offenders re-entering society while it gives the community a false sense of security.

I support the elements of this bill that refine the non-Internet sexual offender registry process in Vermont including the study in Section 17. But I vote no on the House amendment of S.227 for the inclusion of electronic posting--which ultimately plays on fear for no gain.

Rep. Symington of Jericho explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I believe successful re-entry of a convicted sex offender makes for a safer community. Public notoriety can further isolate the offender and does not make for a safer community. For that reason I voted in favor of the amendment offered by the House Judiciary committee."

Page 62

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I fully support the intent of this amendment, but I believe the funding mechanism is wrong. Hopefully, in the future we can stand up and support victims of domestic abuse with an appropriation that matches the need."

Page 63

Rep. Amidon of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted for this amendment because a remarkably broad and numerous cross-section of my constituents strongly support the Senate bill and the amendment is a reasonable compromise between the Senate and House versions."

Page 64

Rep. DePoy of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes to this question because I prefer the Health and Welfare version to S. 76. It's the lesser of two evils but I am opposed to the issue as a whole and will vote no on S. 76 as amended."

Rep. Dunsmore of Georgia explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I believe that this is sending the wrong message to the children of our state. We all preach to our children that drugs are bad for you and don't ever do them. So in good conscience I cannot tell them there is a gray area. It still has to be black and white. Marijuana is the beginning, for much worse drugs which our state is struggling with now. It is not worth losing just one child to drugs. This is Pandora's box and we should not open it."

Rep. Hall of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because the Federal Government says it’s illegal. And we also took an oath which I take very seriously.”

Rep. A. Krawczyk of Bennington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes for all those that wish to use medical marijuana at their end of life stages.

If we can support methadone clinics in this state for hard drug users, I think we can help those that are suffering great pain.

I worry that this is the camel’s nose under the tent. Maybe we could put a hobble on it.

Thank you.”

Page 65

Rep. Robinson of Richmond explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill is not about helping those people who are terminally ill. There are legally prescribed drugs which will accomplish the same effect as marijuana. This bill is just part of a national effort to legalize marijuana for everyone. This bill is just the beginning that starts us down the slippery slope of greater drug use that will adversely impact our youth.”

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Compassion. Honesty, and doing the right thing, are hallmarks of Vermont. We have shown compassion towards those among us in desperate pain and suffering. We have been honest with our children about the appropriate use of drugs in our society. I have voted to do the right thing with this bill.”

Rep. Shaw of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I thought that I could make a difference when I ran for the House, but have now found out different. For you Republicans that voted for this bill, “enjoy next year, but I will not be part of your party and will not seek re-election.”

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Because we are not seeing arrests among those currently using marijuana for symptom relief, because of the complete lack of science and data supporting the use of marijuana for pain relief, because of the negative effect this bill will have on the parents of Vermonters raising young kids and teens, and because of the oath I took to support the laws of this land, I must oppose this bill and vote no.”

Page 66

Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because in this home and house of democracy the people have the right to know two voices of discussion. To silence voices by the use of a pin on a plaster wall is highly similar to a coffin.”

Page 68

Rep. Brown of Walden explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As I see it, this amendment would allow us to have a twenty-four seater yet only a one holer! I would have preferred in this case to have someone engineer this debacle. I would have preferred the Agency to write all their rules. I will sit now.”

Rep. Towne of Berlin explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Just one and 2/10 miles west of the State House is a dairy crème with at least 3 picnic tables. Yesterday we spent 4 hours bending the rules for marijuana use and today we are quibbling over this amendment to allow a few harmless picnic tables! It is indeed time to finish up.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I knew cutting his hair would make a difference.”

Page 71

Rep. Allard of St. Albans Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

For years we fought with the Agency of Natural Resources over the 10 acre exemption. When we finally agreed on closing the 10 acre loophole in exchange for new affordable alternative systems, I thought it was over.

The agency has not lived up to the agreement, so it is time to return to what we had.”

Page 73

Rep. Gray of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe the members of this body should get a raise but I don't believe the President pro tem of the Senate has nearly the duties or responsibilities of the Speaker of the House.”

Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have great misgivings on raising the President pro temps salary to match the House Speaker's salary. As a member of the House Government Operations committee, I know the work that has gone into condensing all parts of the bill to what it is today. Therefore, in spite of my disagreement with that one section of the bill, I voted yes to pass the report of the Committee of Conference.”

Rep. Miller of Elmore explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted against the minimum wage last year for our most vulnerable, so I must say no to these raises.”

Page 74

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This Chair's hat is off to all the members of the Commerce Committee and in this instance the member from Shelburne and the member from Waterbury in particular. Someone once said “it is better to be lucky than smart” and I couldn't agree more. I certainly am not smart, but I have been blessed and lucky to have an excellent committee and I thank them all.”

Rep. Dakin of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Last week I voted yes to get this bill out of committee. Today I voted “no”. Last week was the eleventh hour; today, the day of adjournment, is just too late. I will settle today for what’s included in the budget bill on this subject.”

Rep. Head of South Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The high cost of prescription drugs is a huge issue for my constituents and thousands of other Vermonters. This issue deserves our full consideration and debate.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because the cost of prescription drugs continues to push many Vermonters to the brink of economic and health disaster. To vote no because of process and that it would slow adjournment is incomprehensible when so many are suffering. Why have we done so very little on something so important? A small step is not good enough. Vermonters need help – we need substance not symbolism.”

Rep. McCullough of Williston explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted to relieve Appropriations of S. 288 in order to protect the Vermont population’s baby’s - elder’s right for this body to discuss the possibility of better quality, affordable, and accessible health care that this bill is a quality step toward.”

Rep. Hummel of Underhill explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no on the transportation conference committee report because I believe that Sec. 3, subsection (8)(A), regarding construction funds for the Circumferential Highway is in direct contradiction of federal regulation 23 CFR 450.324, which is based on federal law 102-240 of 1991. That regulation requires that the MPO taken an action to amend its TIP to reallocate dollars from Circ construction. Since that has not yet happened, it is premature and incorrect for the General Assembly to reallocate this money.”

Rep. Kirker of Essex explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am supporting this bill with the hope and expectation that the CIRC highway Sections A and B will be completed in the near future. In the meantime, I support transportation infrastructure projects throughout the state that are long overdue and are important to be completed.”

Rep. Mazur of South Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This conference committee report on the transportation bill attempts to address the many infrastructure needs distributed geographically throughout the state. It establishes a mechanism for dealing in the future with very pressing transportation projects within our limited fiscal capacity.

The redirection of the circumferential highway project money was proposed by the Governor after consultation with the Chittenden County MPO. The legislative council issued a legal opinion which fully supports our efforts. This was reflected in the agreement between the House and Senate budget conferees as the best and fairest way to address the many state VTRANS projects ready for construction but lack funding to activate. The approach used is consistent with current law passed by this body in the transportation bill last year.

We’re a small state and it’s critical that all communities and regions work cooperatively to ensure a safe transportation system and that will enhance job creation and our quality of life. This bill certainly advances this vision.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes not only because of the hard and good work of the transportation committee, but to ensure that in the future Chittenden County continues to be treated fairly by this body, and that we do not pit Chittenden County against the rest of the state. Any action by the Legislature or the MPO that creates that friction would be a huge mistake. I will leave the legalese to the lawyers.”

Page 77

Rep. DePoy of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I don't like this bill much. However, I vote yes because the dog spay and neuter is a good idea, I just don't like its mandatory \$2.00 fee. I think it should be an optional fee.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The day needs to come that we draw the line on creating policy in the wrong way, in the wrong place and at the wrong time. We put it off to the detriment of our duties as Representatives.”

Rep. Seibert of Norwich explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We should all be concerned when important decisions on weighty issues shifts between a Friday night and a Wednesday morning (the next convening day) and a committee vote changes from 9-1-1- against to a vote of 7-4 in favor with no testimony other than that of a very limited concerned party.”
