Vote explanations (at back of book)

The following are the House Rules governing voting in the House

XI

OF VOTING

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. Of the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 3, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Member shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

Page 1.

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There has to be an opportunity for both conventional farmers and organic farmers to exist in Vermont. Strict liability is not the proper legal term for use in this matter. Any farmer suffering economic damage from any source already has adequate avenues for recovering loss.”

Rep. Grad of Moretown explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My no vote reflects my respect for the committee process and role as Vice Chair. My committee passed a bill that while it may not go far enough for some, does provide new protections and access for farmers including allowing for recovery of economic damages and change of venue, thus strengthening current law. The Judiciary bill paves the way for the conversation of GMO’s to continue in conference committee. My no vote on this amendment is not against the need for stringent protection against GMO’s but in favor of the committee process.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I have looked beyond the battle lines. I vote “yes” to allocate responsibility for injury and damage to where it belongs: on the back of the corporations owning the patents, technology, and the genes, who reap the profits of the GMO seeds.

I do not condemn GMO seeds or crops and believe the benefits are great.

However, the Uniform Commercial Code, the Consumer Fraud Act and the Judiciary Committee amendment are inadequate to the protection needed by Vermont farmers, especially Vermont farmers using GMO seeds.

For those who can prove both injury and damages, their damages should be borne by the patent holder/manufacturer, not the already overly burdened Vermont farmer.”

Rep. LaVoie of Swanton explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There are bound to be many more issues that confront agriculture in the State of Vermont. We will need to have many difficult conversations. However, if the basis upon which these conversation exists, continues to pit traditional against organic farmer; large farm against small farm; dairy against crop, then agriculture in Vermont will cease to exist. We will lose the basis upon which this great State was formed.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This was a sentence that the Chittenden County State’s Attorney’s office called “illegal and stated that it undermined confidence in the Judicial system. It also would have created a chilling effect on future victims coming forward. I am profoundly disappoint in our failure to at least make a strong statement on this.

Rep. DePoy of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes because I don’t see any reason not to be as direct as possible, that the opinion of this legislature is that we, as a whole, feel the original minimum portion of the sentence was totally inappropriate, unless there is not unity amongst us in this regard.”

Rep. Endres of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker”

I am deeply disappointed that this chamber could not set aside partisan politics and provide a unanimous voice that expresses our belief that 60 days was an inappropriate sentence for this terrible assault on an innocent young girl.”

Rep. Smith of Morristown explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I hope that we can put as much energy in fixing the perceived problems in the system as we have in expressing our outrage.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The General Assembly is divided on whether a 60 day minimum is an appropriate sentence for aggravated sexual assault on a child. What a shame.”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

What makes me sad is that the victim has been lost in this discussion. I am also deeply troubled that this level of political exploitation has been made of what is a very serious plague in our “civilized” society.

We must put more emphasis on prevention. No matter what the sentence, 60 days of life, this girl and many others who suffer these crimes will never be the same.

Let’s address the underlying problems.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I believe the member from Newport City has pointed out that the language we have just adopted is not well drafted and has some operational problems in it. It would have been better to postpone action for a day, work out the problems, and then complete action on this bill. I will still vote for this bill, but I believe we have just handed the Senate a minor problem to work on.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote “no” because this amendment is unworkable, misleading, confusing and a waste of our time and energy. It reflects poorly on our deliberative process.”

Rep. Louras of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This body has decriminalized driving with license suspended to free up the courts to try more important cases and now their precious time will be used to determine who is liable for installing a furnace.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote “no”. It has been said California will lead us into the “Promised Land” of energy efficiency. But its anti-business legislation and regulations are causing its massive deficits and energy shortages. What a poor example to follow....into “deficit land”.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Everyone agrees civil commitment will only prevent 2 or 3 crimes of sexual violence in the next 10 years.

We enhance public safety not by investing our valuable resources in preventing 2 or 3 crimes but by investing in proven and effective measures which will prevent hundreds, if not thousands, future crimes and help eliminate a culture of sexual violence”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This amendment was a compromise that would have provided added protection for our communities in dealing with the most violent, untreated and highly likely to reoffend individuals. I am very concerned that a future legislature may be dealing with this under terrible circumstances. There will be no numbers that will explain away our failure here today.”

Page 23

Rep. Howard of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted against this amendment because I trust our prosecutors to make the best judgment for the safety of our communities and for the best interest of the survivor. A fifty percent acquittal rate of these cases, is a risk too great to take when the safety of our children is at stake.

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The facts and circumstances of criminal cases differ in many ways. The background and prospects of those convicted of crimes also vary. What is appropriate and advisable as a sentence in one case may be very different from the punishment suitable in another case.

Let us let the judges and prosecutors do their jobs. We should not tie their hands.

Page 24

Rep. Johnson of South Hero explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I supported civil commitment yesterday with its cap to confine the application to the ten worst offenders, and to insure the program did not outgrow the proposed Newport facility at great taxpayer expense. I cannot support the potential for its unlimited use, even with an automatic sunset.”

Page 25

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes with some reluctance. Whenever we shift discretion about confinement from the judiciary to corrections, we allow decisions to be made in the dark, instead of in the public eye.

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote “yes” reluctantly because this bill is better than nothing, but it should be so much better. I’m very saddened that we have done little or nothing to make sure that dangerous sexual predators spend time in prison.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I have been told it is better to take half a loaf instead of no loaf at all. I’m disappointed because all we have here is a crust that does little to fill the void of protecting the most vulnerable.

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Once again we have learned that good policy comes from careful thought and effort across party and philosophical lines. It does not come from press conference demands for simple answers to complex problems. Never has, never will.

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote “yes” with great disappointment. We have defeated amendments to add “Jessica’s Law” to this bill and we have rejected proposals to add “civil confinement” as well. As a result, we have declined to insist on mandatory minimum sentences for those who commit sex crimes against our children. Also, as a result of our actions, we have declined to add a provision to hold for treatment beyond their jail sentence convicted violent serial offenders who are deemed “highly likely to reoffend”. Contrary to what has been said on this floor, this bill does very little to prohibit the wrongs of the recent past from happening again. There is little in our actions today to be proud of. Never before has the disconnect between this body and the people of Vermont been more clear”.

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill accomplishes a number of things of value, but fails on several key fronts. No Civil Commitment, to protect us from the worst of the worst sex offenders, no mandatory minimums that would have addressed inappropriately weak sentences, and no expansion of the Sex Offender Registry. This bill clearly could have accomplished much, much, more.

Page 26

Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes because this amendment only asks us to slow down and make sure we have all our facts in before we begin to put up these wind mills on our ridge lines.”

Rep. Randall of Troy explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

As a steward of the land for my lifetime, I feel compelled to support this amendment. I say lets slow this process down before we commit irreversible consequences to our beautiful landscape.”

Page 28

Rep. Green of Berlin explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no to recommit because I accept the point that those who might have wanted to testify can do so when the bill is taken up on the Senate. I did so reluctantly because I think we should always err on the side of openness, when there is a question whether full testimony was permitted.”

Page 29

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

If Catamount Health is worthy of enactment – and it may be – it is worthy of “sufficient...and sustainable” funding, as stated in Sec. 1 of this bill. This amendment proposes funding that is neither sufficient nor sustainable. One funding source begins to decline as soon as it is enacted (the tobacco tax); one source is uncertain after 2010 (the global commitment); and one source completely dries up after ten years (the strategic settlement funds). We are creating a permanent program with temporary funds.”

Rep. Louras of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

One of the key guiding principles of the underlying bill is that: the financing of health care in Vermont must be sufficient and sustainable. Admittedly, by all, its funding sources are neither.”

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Although tobacco monies may not be sustainable beyond the year 2010, we don’t know for sure what the level of sustainability will be. Since there is an in-depth monitoring and reporting process established by this bill under the direction of the Secretary of Administration concerning the progress of all health care reform initiatives, including catamount health, and because the reports from that process come directly to this General Assembly yearly beginning in January 07, I feel comfortable we will be able to act in an appropriate manner based on the information we are getting yearly to deal with any problems that may arise in funding that relate to all health care reform programs.

I voted yes to get us started on the road of health care reform, because, to do nothing will only continue for another year the huge problem we have with the escalating costs of health care and add more people to the ranks of the uninsured.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

To fund a major expansion of state provided health care with a regressive tax that ultimately will undermine sustainable funding for the Catamount Health Plan is totally irresponsible.”

Rep. Nuovo of Middlebury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I recognize that health care reform may need financing beyond the cigarette tax in the future. A good way to start though is the new tobacco settlement and the increased tobacco tax rather than shifting costs of \$40 - \$50 million to our employers. This later cost could also diminish as employers reduce and end their coverage.

However, the cigarette tax, by making important investments would reduce the number of smokers and the cost of smoking illnesses.”

Rep. Pugh of South Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The research is clear. Every single state that has significantly raised its cigarette tax rate has enjoyed substantial increases to state revenues, despite the fact that cigarette tax increases reduce state smoking levels. In sharp contrast, those states that have failed to increase their cigarette taxes have experienced

gradual tobacco tax revenue declines caused by ongoing reductions in state smoking levels. Simply said, raising the cigarette tax makes good fiscal sense and good health care sense.”

Rep. Shaw of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

A carton of cigarettes in Vermont are costing the smokers \$45.00 per carton, while across the line in Canada many are purchasing them for \$20.00. 2002 cigarette sales were 57 million packs, while 2005 Vermont only sold 39.7 million packs. New Hampshire cigarette sales in 2002 were 165.7 million packs, and 180.1 million packs in 2005. We are losing revenue on cigarette taxes to both New Hampshire and Canada and hurting our local businesses.”

Rep. Winters of Williamstown explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We have a state-run health care program called Medicaid. Over the years this program has continuously been expanded and made more generous. The result is a projected short-fall in funding of 212 million dollars in the year 2010 – that credit card is “maxed-out” – Today we start down a different, but parallel path. We take a different credit card but I believe the result will be the same.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Catamount Health will be funded by sources that are not sustainable over time in order to cover 1/3 of the uninsured. At the same time we potentially put our most vulnerable seniors at risk in the future and lose the very important scholarship program. The benefits are outweighed by the risks. We must spend the time this year to find a better way.”

Page 30

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

At a cost of over \$800,000 to the Vermont taxpayer, we should certainly have the information to go home to our constituents to explain this new comprehensive health care plan that they will be ultimately paying for. That is why I voted yes, so that maybe we will be able to obtain that very important information.”

Page 31

Rep. Allaire of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The House Ways and Means committee was presented with one option for funding H. 861. This proposal is an extremely aggressive expansion of our government sponsored and taxpayer funded Health Care program for the uninsured. It is funded with an declining source of revenue, is unsustainable, and uses money which was designated to lower the Medicaid deficit going forward. Another unsustainable government run program.

This legislature seems to have an insatiable appetite to create new programs, raise Vermonters taxes, and tell us they’ll re-evaluate the program at intervals down the road where no doubt they’ll need new money.

Once you begin a program like this, you’ll never be able to stop it.

The goal of the bill is commendable. The Ways and Means of paying for it is unsustainable.”

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote against this bill because it is fiscally unsustainable. We need to provide a set of basic services for all Vermonters, a safety net of health benefits our citizens can expect to receive regardless of ability to pay. If this bill is passed into law, we will shortly be looking for a long-term broad-based tax to fund it.”

Rep. Darrow of Dummerston explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill does not create a government run health care system. As a society we decided long ago that health care is an essential service and a public good that should be available to everyone just like electric and phone service. And just like those utilities, the health care industry has a long history of state and federal rules, regulations, programs, preexemptions, cost shifting and subsidies. The present health care system is the result of a long public/private evolution. This bill is a long overdue improvement, it is not a government-run health care system.”

Rep. Donovan of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes on H.861 because of its positive impact on our Medicaid program. First, it utilizes the Global Commitment waiver without jeopardizing the waiver’s sustainability. Second, it reduces the Medicaid deficit by over 20 million dollars. Third, the inclusion of Medicaid recipients with chronic illnesses in the Chronic Illness Prevention and Management Program is an investment that will reduce the cost of their care, and therefore further contribute to the long-term sustainability of Medicaid.”

Rep. Head of S. Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We cannot afford to continue a health care system focused on costly acute care. I vote “yes” for preventive and coordinated care. “Yes” for the right care at the right time, saving millions over the long term.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I cannot support this bill in its present form. However, I hope that amendments to be offered tomorrow will be approved, so that I will be able to vote yes on final passage.”

Rep. McCullough of Williston explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support, quality, affordable, accessible health care for all Vermonters. Some have vilified H. 861 as too generous, costly and therefore doomed to failure.

For me, failure to provide quality, affordable, accessible health care would no doubt, prove to be the most costly failure this legislature could produce.”

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Twenty-five percent of Vermont’s population is eligible for Medicaid compared to only nine percent of the people across the Connecticut River in New Hampshire. Part of this difference results from the transfer of assets from elderly parents to their adult children. This leaves Mom and Dad dependent on the state for support. Some Vermont lawyers promote these transitions calling them estate or Medicaid planning. Our state government does not seem to know how many of these gifts are being made or the amount of assets involved. Until we are able to understand and control our present Medicaid program, it is unwise to embark on a new and costly health care system.”

Rep. Shand of Weathersfield explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Your committee on Health Care heard from over 800 Vermonters. It considered 8 different reform plans, including 8 full days of testimony about the administration’s proposal, from the administration.

I am comfortable that the committee followed proper process.”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am a representative of the demographic that is most impacted by this bill, and I would probably benefit from it. However, I believe the system is broken and voters are looking for more substantial change where everyone pays based on ability to pay and everyone is covered.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no because this amendment would likely block people who do not file income or homestead tax return from eligibility for Catamount Health, which is exactly the opposite of our intent to reduce the cost shift caused by uninsured Vermonters to the health care system and other Vermonters.”

Page 36

Rep. French of Randolph explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

H. 861 is a first step in health care reform. I voted no because we need the studies in order to be able to continue to move forward on health care reform. My understanding is that we are already appropriating more money to fund services for Guard members and their families.

Rep. Houston of Ferrisburgh explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

It is unfortunate that we continue to waste taxpayers money for reports that are not produced when we could be directing that same taxpayer money.... \$450,000 to the families of the Vermont National Guard members who are our real heroes.”

Rep. Hunt of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

It should not be forgotten that this body opposed today, the \$250,000 originally recommended to fund mental health services to our guard members and their families. It should also be remembered that this money was put forward because our Federal government has not recognized and met its obligation to our valued guard members.

Rep. Leriche of Hardwick explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no because I object to using our troops; our guardsmen and women as pawns for political gain in the debate on whether or not people should have affordable healthcare.”

Rep. Milkey of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The effect of this proposal of amendment is to use the men and women of our National Guard as a political football in a debate on health care. I find that shameful.”

Rep. Perry of Richford explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I fully support the objective of continuing these programs of support to Vermont National Guard members and their families. I do not support this proposed source of funds.

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

It would be better to spend money buying yellow ribbons for our returning guardsmen than claiming to have spent it on missing red tape.”

Page 37

Rep. Botzow of Bennington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Dr. Thorpe focused us on costs and how to control them. Chronic care management and health care for the uninsured will move us out of the dilemma we’ve been debating.”

Rep. Cross of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My votes on H. 861 today have been cast so as to continue Vermont’s effort to provide high quality health care, including preventative care and chronic disease management, to all our citizens. My votes coupled with the majority have prevented a \$50 million cost shift onto the backs of our state’s employers, large and small, who are currently providing health insurance as the administration’s plan would have done. Today’s action on this floor was the right thing to do.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There was a commitment made in last year’s appropriations bill that I would receive economic impact and financing studies so that I could responsibly assess a new plan. We received no such information, and I can only see in the Catamount Health Plan a potentially devastating impact on our obligations to our poorest elderly and disabled Vermonters/ I regret that its attachment to the rest of this bill forces my “no” vote.”

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no because I don’t want to repeat last year’s exercise in gridlock and futility. Vermonters don’t need more political posturing and promises that we can’t keep. Vermonters need more affordable health insurance now.”

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I cannot support a bill that threatens to bankrupt Medicaid, harming our most vulnerable, poorest people, in order to provide a more generous, inexpensive insurance plan to people earning over \$70,000. Our poor cannot afford to subsidize our wealthy simply so that we can claim we did health care reform.”

Rep. Hosford of Waitsfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The point of H. 861 is to control health care costs. Everyday we do nothing, our health care costs rise by one million dollars. We have to take action now. To change how we manage health care. H. 861 is an important first step.”

Rep. Johnson of South Hero explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

One million daily increase in health care costs. 65,000 uninsured Vermonters. 183 million annual cost shift. Funding sources that carry us through 2011. This is the information I need to proudly vote ‘yes’ on this bill that chips away at those tragic numbers by providing affordable insurance, curbing costs and improving quality of life for my chronically ill constituents.”

Rep. Keogh of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There are those who think we went too far; others think we didn’t go far enough. Nevertheless, this bill is a step in responding to our constituents’ cry for health care relief.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Orleans explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Catamount Health is a leap off Niagara Falls with no wooden barrel or life vest. We ignored the signs that said “danger, Rapids Ahead”. Then we ignored the rapids of “cost shifting”, provider underpayment, and growing deficits which have already disintegrated our life rafts and safety nets.

While the moments of freefall between now and the November election may be exhilarating to some, everyone who can count on their fingers and toes knows that after November 2006, we are going to be sucked down the raging whirlpools of deficits and drowned in debt.

Creating fiscal corpses of Vermonters in the name of “better health” will lead to the destruction of essential health services for the most vulnerable and needy.

Out of love and respect for my neighbor, I cannot consent to harm them in the name of helping them.”

Rep. Louras of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am unable to support a bill that initiates a new program that is by design and by admission already broken. Medicaid must be brought into balance, not driven into bankruptcy.”

Rep. Minter of Waterbury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

H. 861 is a first step to control costs without a proactive effort to reform our health care delivery system, address chronic care and increase access to care . We accept the status quo: more uninsured Vermonters and rising health care costs that are swamping our economy and breaking the bank on our State, municipal and school budgets.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

H. 861 truly has all the fiscal implications and complexities of Act 60 when it was passed. There is a saying “If you don’t heed the mistakes of the past you are doomed to repeat them”.

Rep. Peterson of Williston explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote for this bill because I applaud that it is focused on one thing – reducing costs. It accomplished that in two ways, with innovative chronic care and Catamount Health. Catamount Health is responsible initiative leveraging available federal fund to drive down the number of uninsured.”

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Because this bill is built; unsustainable funds, unknown costs and unknown benefits, and because it places in further jeopardy our already unsustainable Medicaid system, because it is built without the very information that just one years ago, this body said was critical in order to proceed, because the Vermont taxpayer is on the hook for 100% of the cost overruns with no Federal match assistance, because this bill threatens the already over-taxed and under-protected Vermonter, I have no other choice but to vote “No”.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

For those Vermonters concerned about the high cost of Health Care, of creating a scholarship program to keep young Vermonters in Vermont and concerned about the future of our Medicaid program, passage of this bill must cause great concern.”

Page 40

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

If I had any faith that this tax would actually sunset, I would have voted ‘yes’ to this amendment. I don’t have that faith and therefore voted ‘no’.

Page 41

Rep. Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This gas tax hike is ill-advised and untimely. It will have a catastrophic effect on the Vermont economy and on Vermonters, but more importantly will be their continued sense that we aren’t here to help them, but make things worse for them”

Rep. Partridge of Windham explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

At all of my town meetings my constituents told me over and over not to raid the education fund as suggested by the governor. I am honoring their requests and choosing a much less costly source of revenue to make the investment in our roads, bridges, and rail that we so desperately need to make.”

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

At a time when gasoline and diesel prices are near record levels I cannot support an increase in fuel taxes. These tax increases are a direct assault on working Vermonters who use their cars and trucks to get to work or to earn a living to support themselves and their families.

I am not convinced that there are not reductions in the cost of government or other sources from which these matching monies could be obtained without inflicting hardship on so many of our citizens.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

It is unfortunate that some candidates say one thing while campaigning, but do the opposite once they are here.”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am one of those who believe a gas tax is regressive as quoted by another member. However, we are also responsible for making tough choices. It is easy to criticize this funding source, but with no alternative being presented removing this funding is the responsible thing to do.”

Page 42

Rep. Acinapura of Brandon explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes in anticipation of favorable amendments of other revenue sources before the end of the process.”

Rep. Adams of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

One the same day that a gallon of gasoline here in Montpelier rose in price, in a one day jump of fifteen cents per gallon, I cannot vote for a further increase of four cents in taxes. Is tax the only word in our vocabulary?”

Rep. Allaire of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I had the opportunity to spend four years upstairs in House Transportation. In those years we were always looking for ways to come up with extra money for paving, bridges, and to help the locals. I support the hard work of the transportation committee, and hope that other alternatives are explored in the upcoming weeks to not only match the new federal dollars, but to also plug the hole in an underperforming transportation fund, and do so with an increasing, sustainable source of funding.”

Rep. Bohi of Hartford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The transportation bill holds the line on property taxes by increasing funds to towns to maintain our local roads. We all pay taxes, both municipal and education. This bill will help all our towns to keep municipal rates lower.”

Rep. Dunsmore of Georgia explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I believe the transportation committee has done a splendid job with the transportation bill, but I cannot, and will not, support raising the gas and diesel tax, when other avenues have not been given due diligence

for funding the match for federal money. If we just cut one percent across the board for government, we would not have to put it on the backs of our constituents.”

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There is no question our transportation fund needs these funds. I vote no, reluctantly, with the hope that tomorrow we can find funding by tightening our belts rather than forcing our constituents to tighten theirs.”

Rep. French of Randolph explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The transportation bill for us raises the money we need without taking money from the Education Fund. This bill helps to hold the line on raising property taxes.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I’m not sure what other members of this body were told by their constituents, but my constituents told me loud and clear “no new taxes”.”

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I cannot vote for a transportation bill that drastically increases the tax burden on already over-taxed Vermonters. We must find a way to fund our needs through spending reductions and not by raising taxes.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The transportation fund has been raided by the legislature for many years. Now we foist a gas tax increase on Vermonters! May the Senate save us.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Some already say that government taxes anything that moves, if we raise the gas tax and suffer the impact of a tax increase and skyrocketing prices, we just might not be guilty any longer. – there will be nothing moving!”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

With respect to this bill and the amendments, re the sunset, that we voted earlier, I would like to add that I have full faith and respect for who will be in this body in 5 years to ask them to make the right decision at that time.

Today the right, albeit different, decision was to raise the resources to fix our roads, and maintain our infrastructure.

I am thankful that past legislators have respected us and I will always err on the side of respect for the future people that will serve this state. By sunseting the gas and diesel increase we have said that this funding source is for a specific purpose and that when that purpose is over then the future legislators will need to be accountable to the voters as to the needs and decisions at that time.

Thank you.”

Page 43

Rep. Adams of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Shame on us for listening to the whims of partisan special interest groups over the concerns of those who would have to implement and would be burdened by this scheme – our hard working town clerks – shame on us.”

Rep. Barnard of Richmond explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The Clerks in Vermont agree that same day voter registration will increase voter participation!!! As a member of the House education committee who worked on, and passed, a civics education bill this session and also a member of the committee that helped to organize the civics education summit that was held in this very room! I urge you to vote yes – increased voter participation is a good thing???”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

vote no to a failed solution to a non-existent problem which will only create havoc, confusion and unnecessary burdens. It will further degrade electoral responsibility. The only things missing are bread and circus’ as additional incentives to election day charades.”

Rep. Marron of Stowe explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

While this bill is supposed to help republicans, who have been described as low income and under-educated, I believe it disregards the concerns of our Town Clerks, who are responsible for maintaining the integrity of our election process.”

Rep. Minter of Waterbury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support this effort to make it easier to vote in our state. Having visited South Africa in the mid 1980’s, and again in the 1990’s, I witnessed first hand both the denial and achievement of the franchise. People in South Africa waited three days in line to cast their vote. They did not have to register. If we in this body are not about making it as easy as possible to exercise the right to vote, I don’t understand our purpose.”

Page 47

Rep. Botzow of Pownal explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Let’s remember that for every 20 cents we raise, we receive 80 cents in federal funds to help fix our deteriorating roads and bridges. That’s great leverage of our dollars and, most importantly, that’s safer roads and bridges.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I never expected to see the day that as a Republican I would have to vote against a regressive tax supported by Democrats.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote today to support a better transportation system and the work that our Transportation committee has done to plan our system improvements. I do not, however, support the tax package contained in this bill. As a member of this House, I have often said a short prayer of thanks that I do not live in Nebraska; as I vote for this bill, I pin my hopes on the Vermont State Senate.”

Rep. Marcotte of Coventry explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I would like to let the Transportation and Ways and Means committees know that I sincerely wish to thank them for their hard work on H. 869. I am sorry that I cannot support this bill because of one of the funding mechanisms: raising the gas and diesel tax. I firmly believe that we must find the funds to match the federal dollars, however, not by raising the gas and diesel tax. It is time that we, as legislators, begin to take responsibility and start budgeting within our means, just as the citizens of our state do. Why do we want to try and break the financial backs of our most vulnerable through increased taxes? Many have said how difficult it is to raise taxes. I say it is the easy way out. Why are we on such a tight schedule that Ways and Means doesn’t have time to explore other areas to raise the needed funds? Shame on us.”

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes. No one likes the idea of imposing a gas tax, but the alternative – increased property taxes – is completely unacceptable. Under the Governor’s proposal to raid the education fund, a Vermont family earning fifty thousand dollars would pay over \$100 in property taxes. Under this bill, that same Vermonter, if they drive 20,000 miles a year in a car that averages 20 miles to the gallon, will pay less than \$45.00 in gas taxes.”

Rep. Niquette of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

While I agree we need to raise the monies necessary to receive the Federal matching funds and repair our roads and bridges, I reluctantly vote no because I cannot support raising gas and diesel fuel taxes. I believe the increase fuel taxes will create harmful economic consequences for Vermonters, especially for our low and moderate income individuals and families, our farmers, our tourism and recreational industries, and our businesses, especially our small businesses.”

Rep. Shaw of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no on H. 869 for the following reasons: Truckers have a fuel range of well over a thousand miles, so you will not be gaining revenue from them. Our local businesses however, will be the ones to suffer, by them passing the increase onto the consumer will only be another form of creating inflation. The whole Transportation Department needs to be looked at, and we as legislators should make sure that they have the proper funds earmarked to do the job.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am torn today, I feel that I had no choice but to vote against this bill in order to stand up for not raising gas and diesel fuel taxes.

It amazes me that in an era when our constituents and their employers, our Vermont businesses, are having to implement cost saving measures just to survive the ever increasing cost of doing business in this state but, we the (state-as most people outside this building refer to the government) are not willing to do the same and cut our government operations costs to implement this plan. I am not will to tell the people to just suck it up! And you need to pay just a little bit more!”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

It is easy to vote no. It is easy to criticize, it is easy to get money for local projects, but it is hard to pay for it and it is hard to come up with alternative proposals.

For all of the explanations I did not hear proposals for alternatives. It is also the job of those who criticize, to work to come up with those alternatives.”

Page 50

Rep. Rusten of Halifax explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I was unable to be here yesterday for second reading. I would have voted ‘no’. The two amendments approved today to delay implementation until January 1, 2008, and the assessment of the statewide checklist are reasonable compromises that allow the next legislature to take appropriate action before implementation of same-day voter registration, if necessary. Also, I keep hearing Vermont should act more like New Hampshire.”

Page 51

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

These are no found dollars until the Ways and Means bill passes the House, the Senate and is signed by the Governor. That is a long arduous path before we might actually have this supposed windfall. Counting on a windfall that might be is not a sound way to address a long-term road, bridge and public transit problem.”

Rep. Evans of Essex explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no because it is not a viable solution or fiscally sound to use one-time money to address a long-term problem with our infrastructure and at least a five year opportunity for federal appropriation is wrong.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes. To do otherwise is to allow the already overly fattened bull of regressive taxation bull and jam his way out of the china shop of careful and thoughtful deliberation onto the highways and the by-ways of Vermont to stick and gore the most vulnerable of Vermont. The House should keep the bull in the china shop, and strip it of its horns and weight so that it does not injure the poor, elderly and vulnerable among us.”

Rep. Livingston of Manchester explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I will not support raising what is a regressive tax on the Vermont public until all other sources have been exhausted.”

Rep. Marcotte of Coventry explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

As the owner of a convenience store with gas, I had to raise my gas price by eight cents last Friday. Can you guess the topic of conversation on Saturday and Sunday? Not only were people unhappy with the eight cent increase but the vast number of customers also know that I am a member of this chamber and they are not happy about this tax increase. I invite any member to join me next weekend at my store to face the music.”

Rep. Shand of Weathersfield explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This motion to reconsider is a last minute, seat of the pants, quick fix. This quick fix very well may cost our local towns state transportation help with their roads and bridges. Do we really want to do that?”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am very pleased to hear from some members about their deep concern for the working poor and our state’s most vulnerable.

I look forward to the day what those with similar concerns would vote for minimum wage increases, or universal health care to really alleviate some of the burdens that those individuals bear.

Please, do not play politics with poor people.”

Page 53

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

This was neither a simple nor easy vote. It would have reduced the increasing cost shift to property owners, not shift more to the income-sensitized. It would have helped protect our lowest income group –

renters – from increases. Many non-residential property owners in my district are Vermont retirees with their old farm or a piece of woodland they can no longer afford the taxes to keep after lives of hard work..”

Rep. French of Randolph explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

H. 880 will lower the tax burden on lower income Vermonters by lowering the rebate rate for lower income families. I don’t want to do anything to remove this positive effect.”

Rep. Livingston of Manchester explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

At some point we have to take fiscal responsibility for the increasing cost of being a Vermont taxpayer. This amendment is a small attempt toward that end.”

Page 54

Rep. Clarkson of Woodstock explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

H. 880 goes a long way to simplifying what many view as an overly complex education tax mechanism. I applaud the simplification of our prebate/rebate system, the further reduction of our tax rates, and the protection of Vermonter’s confidentiality.”

Rep. Donaghy of Poultney explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Although I am very much in favor of what this bill does, I cannot in good conscience vote for a bill that would have a constituent of mine, Aunt Eileen, pay \$9,000 in property taxes on an annual income of approximately \$15,000. We need to provide some remedy for her and those similarly situated.”

Page 55

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This amendment clarifies an over zealous and mean spirited mis-interpretation by the tax commissioner that is wrong on the law and harmful to Vermonters in our care. This amendment costs the Education Fund absolutely nothing.”

Rep. Dowland of Holland explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

If the veterans have to pay on their disability checks, why exempt these caregivers? This is why I voted NO! The caregiver takes care of the disabled veteran, caregiver gets a free ride and the vet pays. Something is wrong with this system.”

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no. In the name of expressing gratitude to caregivers who provide an essential and difficult service, we’re taking more than \$600,000 each year from the Education Fund.”

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support the intent of this amendment. However, it should be out of the General Fund, NOT the Education Fund. At a minimum, this discussion points out the difficulties with poorly worded general resolutions.”

Rep. Kennedy of Chelsea explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We’re still playing games with words here. If we can’t use Education money for Transportation needs, how can we justify using it for H. 880. I vote no.”

Rep. Partridge of Windham explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Transferring funds from the Education Fund to the Transportation Fund to use for non-educational purposes is raiding the Education Fund. Using Education Fund money for income sensitivity that is current practice is not raiding the Education Fund, it is using the money for the purpose that was intended.”

Rep. Smith of New Haven explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support the concept and purpose of this amendment but I voted no because I believe this should be funded from the General Fund and not the Education Fund.”

Rep. Smith of Morristown explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I have never gotten a clear answer what portion of difficulty of care payments is paid as income as opposed to expenses. Without such clarification, I do not think it appropriate to count these payments as income for purposes of calculating household income.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no – the amendment belongs on H. 881 instead of H. 880. Let’s pass an accurate Appropriations bill.”

Page 56

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no because we gain a \$33 million windfall to spend from this revision. It doesn’t come from thin air. That means it comes from low income Vermonters paying from an invisible year in a forever future that is hidden in a date change.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill is titled “An act relating to education finance simplification.” Unfortunately, I do not perceive simplification, but rather confusion. I am also concerned that this system erodes taxpayers’ privacy, and I do not support the manufacturing of a supposed windfall by postponing our obligations to Vermonters who earn less than \$47,000 annually from one fiscal year to another. I appreciate the hard work of the Ways and Means committee, but on balance, I cannot support this bill.”

Rep. Allaire of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am still troubled by the continued expansion of income sensitivity and the dollars associated with collecting property taxes to fund education and turning around and sending more and more money back out through rebates and prebates, and now back to the towns through H. 880.

Yesterday, for the first time in my six years in the Legislature, I’m beginning to truly believe there is now momentum in this building and throughout Vermont that its time to scrap Act 60/Act 68 and the continued complicated way we fund education, and replace it with something more simple and based entirely on ability to pay.

I vote yes today in recognition of the hard work of my colleagues in Ways and Means. Recognizing the positive effects of combining the rebate and prebate programs, lowering the statewide property tax, and the one-time savings in the Education fund and in the General fund. I do believe in the short-run, this is a step in the right direction.”

Page 57

Rep. Botzow of Pownal explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

When it comes to rural economic development everybody talks about affordable housing, farmers, job training, entrepreneurs, infrastructure and more. Today, with the passage of this budget, we “just do it”.”

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We have raised a gas tax; we have raised a cigarette tax; we have refused to lower our property tax as much as we could’ we have put our Medicaid funds further at risk; we have spent more than 2/3 of our Global Commitment money and we have spent all of the money for the VT Promise Scholarship – all in previous bills. Unfortunately, there is now little left to debate. Hopefully, we’ll have another chance after conference committees.”

Rep. Hosford of Waitsfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

In a time when federal funds for social programs are being cut, this budget supports Vermont children and families. It increases money for our youngest children, our teenagers, our homeless and runaways. As a lifelong educator, I applaud this investment in the children who are our future.”

Rep. Kiss of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I would be remiss not to register the absence once again of funding in this bill for dentures and eye glasses for people eligible for Medicaid in Vermont. And, the rateable reduction for Reach-Up grants remains below 50% of the standard of need. We can do better.

Despite these gaps, this budget does increase child care subsidies, improves the back rent program, supports micro-business development, independent savings accounts, and women’s small business development – and it protects the dental cap in Medicaid at \$475 annually. This is progress.”

Page 58

Rep. Barnard of Richmond explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill touches a lot of us on many different levels – our government, our constituents, and our families. I have a personal story. My 19 ½ year old son, Taylor who was adopted at six days old, was given the birth name of Jeffrey Allen Sky-Eagle.”

Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My great grandmother was named Axie, certainly not from Dublin. Ojena and Zenapher were her sister and brother from Highgate and surrounding area called the French village. Now may they rest in Peace! Thank you.”

Rep. LaVoie of Swanton explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Today’s vote speaks not only to the future, but also to the past. It speaks to the acceptance of a heritage, a rising of a peoples, an acknowledgement of a state. Today’s passing of S. 117 is the equitable thing to do, the moral thing to do, the right thing to do. The time has come.”

Rep. Marcotte of Coventry explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes today in honor of my grandfather. As a naturalized U.S. citizen who was born in Quebec, his mother, a full-blooded native American, he very well knew racism because of his ability to speak French, his heritage and also because of his religious convictions as being Catholic. There is fear. I have fear, my constituents have fear, and many of us here have fear. But we have put our fears aside and put our faith in

the commission to be formed that they will do right by all Vermonters, just as we, by this vote, have done what is right.”

Page 59

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes for these very minor improvements. However, no one should mistake this legislation for real meaningful health care reform.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no. All that I can see of this bill is 41 pages of bureaucratic health care cost increases!

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker;

While there may be steps of improvement, here, as long as we continue to perpetuate an inefficient health care system of gambling and profiteering through health insurance schemes, I cannot vote yes.”

Page 60

Rep. Fisher of Lincoln explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I very much appreciate the attempt to make the House schedule fit in our lives. Today is the first day of Passover. This Friday is Good Friday. We must be efficient in our work to support these allowances and to get out of here as soon as reasonable. The committees must be allowed to work.”

Rep. Houston of Ferrisburgh explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Once again, Madam Speaker, the democratic process has been ignored in this State House.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We have just authorized nearly half of the members of the House to be in committee during debate on the floor of the House. With normal absenteeism, this most likely deprives the House of a quorum. This action is not good for democracy.”

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes. Yes to allowing discretionary judgment, yes to moving things along, yes to adjourning this body at a reasonable date.”

Rep. Young of Orwell explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no. Are we in such a hurry to get home that we don't completely think through legislation in committee and then send it to the floor to be voted on by barely a quorum? I would hope not! Here's hoping the Senate will fix the issues in the other body.”

Page 61

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Our small general stores are on the brink of survival, and this is a public service they do. The least we could do was give them a penny more after 18 years.”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Once again we convince the little guy that a small compromise is all they can get. Then politically we make it the reality through arm-twisting and walking out, not voting. We should be raising this and the deposit level.”

Page 62

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I believe this item is germane. Free speech is one of our fundamental rights and so is the right to peaceably assemble. However, when the exercise of these rights interferes with someone else’s ability to do the same, we need to draw the line.”

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Isn’t it ironic that on a bill designed to protect free speech, we are being denied that right?”

Rep. Helm of Castleton explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This is a very important issue to veteran’s groups and constituency. Therefore, to quote the Governor of California, “I’ll be back”.”

Page 63

Rep. Endres of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker;

Our taxpayers have made it clear that they want the Education Fund used for K-12 public education. However, we need to answer the question of publicly funded pre-K education once and for all. This amendment simply suspends newly funded programs from being started until the study is completed and the next legislature acts. It is the fiscally responsible thing to do.”

Page 64

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote “no” on this report of Committee of Conference because the report helps no one, certainly not any of the farmers in my district. The \$3,500 threshold is a sell out. The bill encompasses all Vermonters whether they farm or not. We need to look for common ground. Sadly, after all the effort, this bill does not provide it.

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I have received a dozen post cards in support of S. 18 from constituents who are not engaged in agriculture. I respect their right to voice their opinion to their elected representatives. However, I have polled the farmers in my district who actually cultivate crops and find that they oppose S. 18 by a margin of 11 to 3. Since it is the livelihood of this latter group which is at stake here, I cast my “no” vote as preferred by them.”

Rep. Smith of New Haven explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Vermont Agriculture is at a critical juncture. We are experiencing the traditional challenges of unstable commodity prices on our traditional dairy farms, at the same time diversification of our age industry is clearly visible with the increased production of a wide variety of other livestock and Horticulture products. The Vermont Legislature should embrace this diversity and develop programs and policies that support and enhance all types of production that is supported by sound science, sound regulatory oversight and that is customary and ordinary though out Vermont and the U.S.

For the first time in my life, however Vermont Agriculture is clearly divided on many issues. This is the result of conscious efforts on the part of some to dictate how others farm. The Vermont General assembly has allowed this division to accrue around issues for which we could easily find better solutions. Many of these contentious issues could be resolved by taking the time to educate ourselves on the subject based on facts, science, data and an understanding of the regulatory process that governs how we farm. It is very interesting to me that we are putting in place a solution for a problem that does not currently exist and, at the same time undermining our Right to Farm Law.

While we try to find solutions that help us though this transition we need to be mindful and respectful of the competing needs of the different agricultural segments by following the Vermont tradition of working together, finding solutions that benefit all. The same tradition that generations of Vermonters have been using for the last 200+ years, that has also worked well these last ten years of growing biotech crops.

There are some organizations and people that support these changes in agriculture that I would like to mention.

"I think it is fairly well known that I did everything I could as President to support the development of biotechnology and its practical applications in American life. I did support, I plead guilty to supporting the development of the genetic engineering and agriculture, as long as we subject all the results to proper testing and continuous monitoring. I think that we should be driven in America by science, evidence and argument, not by assertion and fear." Past President Bill Clinton at the Bio 2006 convention April 14 2006.

Past President Jimmy Carter condemned those who portray biotechnology as a threat to safety and to the environment without offering any facts to back up those claims. " Almost all of the seeds (including cotton, soybeans and corn) planted on my own farm have been genetically modified, to protect the plants from disease, insects and weeds, and to provide higher nutrition, my own yields have increased greatly".

The World Trade Organization ruled directing the European Union to end its defacto moratorium on biotechnology-improved crops. The ruling supports a 15 year study funded by the European Union itself found, biotech plants and products have not "shown any new risks to human health or the environment" and concluded that these foods are in fact safer than conventional foods.

The World Health Organization, American Dietetic Association, American Medical Association among others have all agreed that biotech crops with such beneficial traits as resistance to drought, pest and weeds offer the potential of increased agricultural productivity and improved nutrition, which can contribute directly to enhance human health and development.

The National Center for Food and Agriculture Policy (NCFAP) found the six biotech crops- canola, corn, cotton, papaya, soybean and squash increased grower income by an additional \$1.9 billion, boosted yields by 5.3 billion pounds and reduced pesticide use by 46.4 million pounds in 2003 alone.

Why would we do anything to stigmatize a technology that increases yield, reduces soil erosion, reduces greenhouse gasses, decreases the use of herbicides and pesticides at the same time improves farm income. I can not support legislation that is not friendly to human and environmental health by shamelessly ignoring science and government regulation. Trading off the benefits of food quality, safety, and nutritional values that clearly benefit human nutrition and environmental improvement for a problem that does not currently exist is just bad legislation.

This bill is not only a remedy in search of a problem it is a bill that creates a problem for farmers.

Page 65

Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted no because we have just created another delay and delay planning procedure. The creation of a state planning office is of immediate necessity to bring this legislation from potency to active."

Rep. Minter of Waterbury explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I am pleased to support S. 142 for the future of Vermont Designated growth centers will enhance our downtowns and village centers program. By reducing regulatory barriers to development and offering financial incentives, communities can better develop mixed-use, compact community centers to maintain our historic settlement patterns and preserve our rural heritage."

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Last year the U.S. Supreme Court handed down its *Kelo* decision holding that privately owned property could be taken by Eminent Domain for commercial development so long as the owner was compensated.

Now we are asked to allow the Executive Branch of state government to designate sections of towns and cities as Growth Centers where public and commercial development will occur, thus preventing or deterring such improvements on property outside the specified area. Neither the owners of property within

the Growth Center nor the owners of property outside the Growth Center receive payment for the loss of their right to use their property for other purposes which they may consider its highest and best use.

This sounds a lot like Kelo WITHOUT compensation.

Page 66

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The Green Mountain Promise Scholarship is a great idea but to quote someone I admire greatly – “We have made promises to seniors, low income Vermonters, Vermont youth, our working families, those who need and deserve health care. The money had already been promised. We can’t break promises to make new promises.”

If this scholarship plan is important we need to fund it responsibly.”

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no for two reasons. One is that the original high school completion bill is one of the most important bills from the education committee this year and should stand alone.

Second, promise scholarships are an exciting idea that need a full and open discussion by both bodies; which never happened this year because of the link to its highly controversial funding source – tobacco settlement funds. I look forward to that discussion, and will have no trouble explaining to my constituents why I chose not to rush through an 11th hour proposal which has not been fully considered in either body.”

Rep. Miller of Elmore explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

If we want to keep exporting our youth, let’s make college only a dream not something attainable.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted to sustain the Speaker I her ruling that the matter is not germane. Not only is it not germane, it would create new, unaffordable, and totally unsustainable promises with no concern for any notion or real fiscal responsibility. Promising everything while paying for nothing may be the way of Washington and it may now be the way of our own executive, but it is not the way of this body or its leadership, or its committees. If we lose sight of that, it is not we, but the taxpayers who will pay in the end.”

Rep. Parent of St. Albans City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The state of Vermont is facing a quiet crisis. This crisis is as serious as any environmental, economic or transportation predicament we find ourselves in.

To ignore it is to ignore the unsustainable graying of Vermont.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The Green Mountain Scholarship fund ought to be germane. Because it is germane to the future, and economic vitality of Vermont. This defeat is another blow to an important proposal that most Vermonters support.”

Page 69

Rep. Rodgers of Glover explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Perhaps partisanship melts with a good idea.”

Rep. Winters of Williamstown explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This vote shows that partisanship melts over a good drink.”

Page 72

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support aspirational goals for improving our environment. I vote no because the goals in this bill will be impossible to meet, and we don’t know what the consequences are of placing unattainable goals in statute.”

Page 74

Rep. Dunsmore of Georgia explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We have done a wonderful thing for the future generations of sportsmen and sportswomen in the state of Vermont.”

Rep. Green of Berlin explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no to the Senate rewrite of H. 447 to prevent the future inappropriate siting of new firing ranges, not to close or limit the operations of any existing ranges, and not to prevent the appropriate citing of firing ranges in the future.”

Page 75

Rep. Acinapura of Brandon explained his vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

I have no idea what “perceived expressions” means and I think it’s the Legislature’s responsibility to do so and not leave it to the courts.”

Rep. Lorber of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

While we cannot legislate against hate, ignorance, prejudice and bigotry, we can outlaw discrimination. We can say “nit in my state.” Not here in Vermont.”

Page 77

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no. I am tired of wasting precious tax dollars on a specious study for a patently unconstitutional proposition. I will not add insult to injury to the integrity and intelligence of Vermont citizens.”

Page 78

Rep. Clarkson of Woodstock explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes on H. 861. I applaud the tremendous work done by so many House members. The process has resulted in a bill we can all be proud of. This is an important first step on the path of health care reform and long overdue.”

Rep. Condon of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

As someone who lived without insurance for more than a decade, I’d like to thank the committee and the conferees for taking this first step towards available, accountable and affordable health care. Thank you.”

Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

With health care expenditures rising by \$1 million a day the status quo is not acceptable. H. 861 brings a system of care to the way we treat people with chronic conditions. For the first time we begin reigning in health care costs by keeping people healthier. We should all thank the conferees for their patience and persistence in going back to the table time and time again in a good faith effort amidst political games to give us today a good health care reform bill.”

Rep. Cross of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Today the Governor of Vermont stated, “we have succeeded in forming an alliance of ideas fashioned around our common commitment to making health care affordable and accessible for every Vermonter.” He went on to say, “Today’s agreement on health care is an important step toward making Vermont more affordable for Vermonters.” The Governor also said, “I want to thank legislative leaders, Speaker Symington in particular, for continuing to work with me and my administration to reach an agreement on health care reform measures that protects taxpayers.

Tonight I stand with my Governor, my Speaker and my Health Care Committee and voted yes.”

Rep. DePoy of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes with the understanding that there is a bill yet to be voted on and possible amendments to that bill which will fix problems that currently exist in this bill. Without these fixes my vote would be no.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There have been two core changes at stake in the health care reform efforts of the past decade.

One has been in how care is delivered. This bill takes significant steps forward in the changes already set into motion by the governor and the Republican House and Democratic Senate two years ago: the vision of greater statewide planning established in Act 53, and the chronic care initiative put into place by the Department of Health.

It adds new improvements that we have all agreed are “common sense” - indeed, have been encouraged for years, and finally will be moving forward, from insurance paperwork requirements to technology advances.

I told my constituents a month ago how much I respected the fact that these initiatives were set out in a separate bill, not hostage to the contested financing issues. Regrettably, I spoke too soon.

The second issue has been in how costs are allocated. We have the benefit of living in a state where care - perhaps inefficient care - but care, is delivered, even to the uninsured. So we talk about more efficient spending, and reducing the cost shift -- how the money is routed. This is a little misleading.

There will always be costs shifts, unless every person pays directly for all care out of his or her own pocket. We are not changing whether costs are shifted, but rather, whether they can be shifted more fairly, and spread out more fairly upon the citizens of this state. We must remember that all health care costs, just like all taxes, are ultimately only paid by individual people, regardless of the route through which they are channeled. Some of the shifts in this bill are bad ones - I’ve spoken before of how a half to a third of the tobacco tax is paid by those with serious mental illnesses.

But there is a much bigger falsehood in this bill. It claims to address health care financing, while ignoring the huge number of Vermonters who already rely upon the state - upon us - for their health care. We haven’t taken up all the costs and re-sorted how to share them. We’ve left out our existing commitment, and how we are going to fund it in the years ahead. And that means the math doesn’t work.

Last week, I heard another member on this floor speak about not making promises we can’t keep. This vote, however well intentioned, is about making promises without putting the whole picture together on the table. That does not represent progress in the reallocation of how we pay, and who pays, for health care for all Vermonters, because it leaves out a huge number of Vermonters, and a huge amount of our financial commitment.

This bill should be called the “Medicaid Bankruptcy Act of 2006.” I am left now only to hope that time proves me wrong.

Rep. Hosford of Waitsfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This is an enormously complex bill addressing an enormously complex problem. Has every possible future exigency been addressed? Perhaps not. But it is a first step – a step we must take to reduce health care costs and provide better health care to Vermonters. It will need to be adjusted and changed at the checkpoints. But we can’t let the complexity force us into paralysis. We must take the excellent work of our Health Care committee and build upon it.”

Rep. Houston of Ferrisburgh explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We have just created the Act 60 of Health Care. Costs will rise and the funding will not be sustainable. As it has been said many times... if you think health care is expensive now, wait until it is free.

Rep. Keogh of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

As we proceed with health care for all Vermonters a step at a time, I was privileged to vote yes as one of the toes.”

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

It is unfortunate that we haven’t taken control of our present health care costs before embarking on a new adventure.

Vermont’s rate of Medicaid enrollment is nearly triple the rate in New Hampshire. Yet we fail to enforce our laws against faking financial need in order to receive benefits.

Doctors’ insurance costs have gone through the roof as recoveries for medical errors are fattened with add-ons for punitive and non economic damages. Meanwhile lawyers calculate their fees as a percentage of the award instead of on the basis of time spent and the value of their services.

We are going in the wrong direction. Tobacco money shrinks as time passes and will never support this new program. We are headed toward major tax increases as government proves once again that it is less efficient than doctors and hospitals practicing in the private sector.

Rep. Pugh of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

No state can solve the national health care crisis by itself. But Washington’s failure can’t be our own. We must do what we can do now to make health care more affordable for Vermonters. H. 861 does just that by basing premiums on an individuals ability to pay.

Rep. Shand of Weathersfield explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

H. 861 will reduce the present cost shift from the uninsured, to insured Vermonters. That is good for Vermonters.

Rep. Winters of Williamstown explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill stinks!”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes, and hope my fears that this bill lead to a single payer health care system are unfounded.”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I appreciate all of the hard work many have done. I hope that I am proven wrong. I hope that the claims of this being a step towards an efficient universal single payer system come true. But I am afraid that we are claiming reform and will not seriously address the underinsured and many uninsured for many, many more years.

Page 79

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker

Although I still have many concerns and fears concerning H. 861, this eases one of the concerns for many of us by placing the financial risk with private insurance rather than burdening State taxpayers with that risk.”

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker

I voted yes because our Health Care Committee stayed at the table. This will allow the first step to be taken for comprehensive, affordable health care for all Vermonters.”

Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker

While I appreciate the compromise between the Health Care Conferees and the Administration, I still cannot support H. 895.

This bill still uses global commitment money and does nothing to address a two hundred million dollar future deficit in Medicaid. Medicaid was set up as a health care program for our most vulnerable citizens and a large portion of the children in Vermont.

I cannot support a bill that puts one program in jeopardy for another.

Rep. Niquette of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker

While the bills H. 861 and H. 895 include positive steps toward health care reform in expanding preventative and chronic care. I do not believe the plan is fiscally responsible or financially sustainable.

Therefore, I must vote no.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes because there are many important items in this bill, expanded special investigative units, being able to hold offenders while they are successfully treated, and mandatory minimums are among the many good things. However, failure to pass civil commitments means dangerous, untreated predators in corrections now will continue to be released into our communities, and that is a failure.”

Rep. Smith of Morristown explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I appreciate the hard work of the committee and am sympathetic to those who desire to support the film industry in Vermont, but I cannot support the one million dollar appropriation for the film production grant program and therefore cannot support the bill.”

Rep. Reese of Pomfret explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes in order to recognize the diligent and thoughtful work of all who worked on this bill.

I also strongly support the improved accountability of our economic tax incentive program.

However, the greatly expanded Tax Increment Financing (or TIF) authority in this bill lacks fiscal accountability and legislative oversight and therefore risks bringing substantial harm to the Education Fund.

Further, these changes will likely make future reforms to our education funding system much more difficult. I sincerely hope that I am proven wrong.”
