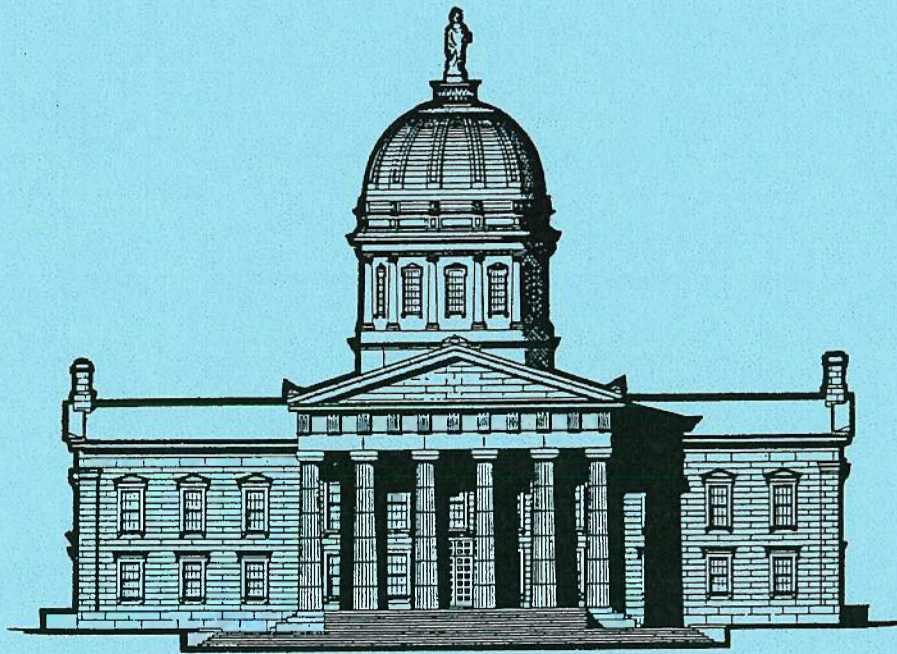

Vote explanations (at back of book)

The following are the House Rules governing voting in the House

**XI
OF VOTING**

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing. It is generally recommended that vote explanations should be infrequent and brief.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. Of the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 73, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Member shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

Page 1

Rep. Hube of Londonderry explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

In eight years I have been serving the people. I am appalled that we are wasting the tax payers time when we have so much to do for the people of this state.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I do not need advice as to the exercise of my Constitutional right and duty to explain my reasons for a recorded vote. Neither will I affront or insult my fellow Representatives in recommending how frequently or to what extent they exercise their individual right of recording their reasons for their vote. To do so is an insult to the Constitution and the citizens of Vermont from whom we derive our power and authority.”

Page 3

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The policy of U.S. occupation has clearly created instability in that nation and the region. I further believe that our continued presence, regardless of the best efforts of our soldiers, will not lead to stability in the region.

I do support the final resolved clause, but I cannot support the amendment due to the second instance.”

Page 4

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker;

Today we thankfully passed an important amendment to this resolution, but at the very same time that we were allowed to improve this resolution, by this vote, the public has been shut out.”

Page 6

Rep. Canfield of Fair Haven explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Noting Vermont’s newly elected Congressional Delegation – it is my humble opinion – that – rather than trying to micro-manage Washington, this body would best serve the people of Vermont by; addressing issues that we may affect and by supporting our military personnel 100%.”

Rep. Krawczyk of Bennington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

No one hates war more than a warrior. No father wishes his child to come home more than I. They say that the third time is a charm. My daughter is on her third tour of duty in Iraq. I wonder what the third time means for her, but I know that she and her soldiers, and the soldiers who served with her for more than 27 years would expect me to be loyal to my oath and vote “no” on this resolution.

Duty, Honor, Country.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no on H.R. 11 because Vermonter’s have been denied a voice in this important “conversation” due to lack of due process.”

Rep. O'Donnell of Vermont explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted yes today because of the compromise language about our troops.

I really wish we could have done the right thing today, and send a strong letter to our Congressional Delegation who's job it is to deal with this issue. To date they have done nothing.

Instead, we played politics and for all of those who so strongly support our troops and not the war. I ask you to seek out Vermonters who are serving their country so bravely and send them a note or a package. Let them know you care and appreciate their service to their country."

Page 7

Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted no however prior to final bell in May; this is now a stay of execution. This vote is not satisfactory to the property tax payers."

Page 8

Rep. Donaghy of Poultney explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

The arrogance of Government in this debate has reared its ugly head once again. By not passing this amendment, we are once again telling the taxpayers of this state we, the Government, know best what to do with your money than you do. I am thankful to have been one of the 15 who voted against H. 880 last year."

Page 9

Rep. Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

"Madame Speaker:

As a member of the Education Committee charged by you with among other things, formulating a bill which has provisions for educational cost containment. I have great hope that in fact we will provide such a bill for discussion on the House floor that will address some of the concerns of Act 60/68.

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote no despite sharing the same concerns as the proponent of the repeal of Act 60. I will wait and see what reform comes out of our Committees, but the clock is ticking and tax payers expect action... The Legislatures feet must now be held to the fire on property tax reform and relief."

Page 10

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted no because this is a nine million dollar tax increase on working Vermonters, in order to give a tax break to those individuals wealthy enough to own a second home."

Page 12

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I fully respect folks who have come to their peace with this vote based on moral, religious or personal beliefs. I am concerned, however, when people base their votes on constituent calls that were, in part, derived through misinformation.

I have heard of numerous instances and read petitions that vastly misled the public with respect to the ramifications of this bill. When parishioners are told that seniors going to their doctor for a hip

replacement will be met by a doctor who will instead kill them, I understand when the calls are so overwhelmingly opposed. In my own district the calls were a ratio of 4 to 1 against. Yet, as a lead sponsor of the bill for the last six years, I was not removed from office.

I do not believe the calls were indicative of the feelings of the silent majority.

Instilling fear through misinformation is a powerful tool. I am sorry that those in positions of trust have chosen to use that tool.”

Page 16

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My no vote reflects my concern that passage of H. 353 will mean replacing a system that has worked well, with one that is meant to ensure the outcome of every union election. The card check or petition is unfair and undemocratic. Hopefully, there is a pen poised and ready.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The fundamental right to a secret ballot has been breached today for some workers in this state. It is a blow to the right of workers to choose a union, and to long-standing principles of our democracy.”

Page 18

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We must be able to pay for the services we want to offer in our state. Increased taxes are not ever a source for generating increased sources of tax revenues.”

Page 26

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I appreciate all the work done by the many members and the committees and those who offered and considered the many amendments to this bill, including the amendment I offered.

However, I am still not clear that the people I represent in Windham-5 will be helped by this bill.

My vote recognizes the work done by all and also recognizes the special circumstances of the people I represent – which is why I must vote no.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no because with the defeat of the many proposed amendments, H. 526 is a weak bill that delivers little leaving property taxpayers disappointed and disillusioned. Hopefully, the Education committee will take up the ideas that were rejected today.”

Page 29

Rep. Howrigan of Fairfax explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes because special favors for utilities for generating should follow also for housing. Vermonters have annual raises, frost heaves and property tax raises. Property tax payers – need special favors.”

Page 31

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The thought of a law permitting a minority to overturn a majority vote is quite extraordinary, and I would never vote for legislation to create such a system. But this is a long-standing tradition in Vermont, and reversing it takes away a right that many believe is essential to their voice in local government.”

Rep. Minter of Waterbury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support H. 78 because it seeks to enhance our democratic process by protecting the right to appeal a decision while ensuring that a significant minority cannot overturn the vote of a majority of voters.”

Rep. Nuovo of Middlebury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I believe that obtaining 5% for a petition is sufficient and that the possibility of requiring 20% of the names for a petition is impossible and disenfranchises our citizens.”

Page 32

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Once again it is double-speak from the Administration. Boisterous talk of supporting college scholarships on one hand while with the other hand proposes a budget to underfund the college scholarship 2 + 2 Program that provides scholarships for young people aspiring to have a future in Agriculture.

Talk is cheap His real priorities are clear in the budget.”

Page 34

Rep. Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am supportive of this amendment because I don't want the legislatures in New Jersey, New York and Illinois to lead the Vermont legislature in controlling and restricting human behavior.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We treat many matters in this House as though they were matters of life and death. This one truly was. Approval of this amendment means that Vermonters will live who otherwise would have died.”

Rep. Minter of Waterbury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote in favor of this amendment in memory of my three classmates from the class of 1979 who died, tragically and unbelted when ejected from their vehicle just three nights before my high school graduation.”

Rep. Rodgers of Glover explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

One more step toward a police state has been taken with the passage of this amendment.”

Page 35

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

A little here, a little there, nickel and dime. We have a huge problem and we need the political leadership and the where-with-all to really do what is necessary to solve the problem. This doesn't come close and that's why I voted no.”

Rep. Spengler of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The time has come to take global warming seriously. We must be bold and enact legislation that will lead the charge to a new economy and culture. This is a small step. Our children depend on us.”

Page 36

Rep. Barnard of Richmond explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted “yes” on this bill for the students of Browns River Middle School who brought this critical environmental and health issue to our attention. Their research has earned them an A+ in civics, science, language arts and mathematics!”

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Once again the heavy handed influence of the Vermont Legislature has usurped the authority and autonomy of local school boards. There is no reason for this body to force this decision on the duly elected members of our communities that serve most ably. I vote ‘no’ on this bill to honor and preserve local control in our communities and to express my trust and confidence in the wisdom of the Rutland Town School Board.”

Page 37

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am disappointed at the defeat of this amendment. It was about local control and understanding local needs. It was about common sense. Have we really come to the point where the Legislature does not trust local school boards to make the right decision on something as small as how long the school bus engines should be allowed to run?”

Page 38

Rep. Andrews of Rutland City explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker;

I voted no because, like the Representative from Woodstock, I feel that the ballot box and proceedings currently underway is the most appropriate place to express our outrage.

But, I do not feel that the time spent in this discussion has been wasted. Throughout this session, I have become increasingly aware of how the problems we need to be spending our time on have been exacerbated or even created by the actions of this administration.”

Rep. Atkins of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no on this resolution more because I feel that we, members of the House, have more pressing subjects that require time on this floor more than the merits, pro or con, regarding our President’s actions or non-actions.

Health care, property taxes and prescription drugs are only a few subjects that we promised to solve in this session.

Our time needs to be spent on the above problems, not on an issue that Washington has not even requested our input or our assistance.”

Rep. Clarkson of Woodstock explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no. I believe it is a mistake to substitute an impeachment process for electoral wisdom. While our President maybe incompetent, however, our anger at his misleading us, at squandering international good will and human and financial resources is insufficient to justify an impeachment process. This would

divide us and distract us from the important work of ending the war in Iraq. The proper channel for our frustration is the upcoming 2008 election.”

Rep. Fisher of Lincoln explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Impeachment has become a metaphor for outrage. That being so, I vote a heartfelt yes.

I also fully support Congressional investigations that seek to hold the Bush administration fully accountable for its misguided domestic and foreign policies.”

Rep. Grad of Moretown explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

While I agree the best course of action is for Congress to continue its work to investigate the actions of the current administration and demand honesty and accountability, my yes vote today is to give a voice to my constituents who at town meetings voted in favor of impeachment and against the war and to give a voice to those constituents who feel the current administration has caused unnecessary loss of lives, numerous violations of civil liberties, extraordinary environmental degradation and governing through secrecy. My vote sends the symbolic message that Vermonters be heard.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The resolution is biased, contrary to the United States Constitution, and factually unfounded and unsupported. I took an oath to uphold the Constitution of the United States and I proudly do so today by my “no” vote.”

Rep. Kitzmiller of Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker,

I have had more contacts from my constituents on this issue than on any issue in the past. Every single one, without exception, has asked me to vote in favor of this resolution. They knew what they wanted me to do, and they knew why.

Madame Speaker, I have deep personal reservations about this vote, but on this day I am proud to vote “Yes” on behalf of my district.”

Rep. Manwaring of Wilmington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My vote against the impeachment resolution was difficult for me, as I am just as passionate about the unspeakable damage that the Bush Administration has done not just to our country, but to the world.

In 2006, the voters spoke loudly and in effect impeached Bush’s rubber stamp in Congress.

It is the next Presidential election that is the key. I do not believe in my heart that impeachment serves that end. Our collective energies are better spent at the ballot box.”

Rep. McCullough of Williston explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am a supporter of H.R. 18. One always steps correctly when following one’s heart. I followed mine.”

Rep. Milkey of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The best outcome we can have from today’s debate is that all of us who believe that the leadership of our country has set us on a wrong and dangerous course – regardless of how anyone voted today – can work together in every avenue available to us to restore liberty and justice in our country, and to restore our role in the world as a beacon of hope and a defender of liberty for all world citizens.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My vote today was not the same as yours would be, but I hope it is in accord with the high standards of respect and acceptance of diversity that you have set with your example.

I hope we all remember the Speaker is on record as being just as aggrieved by the current administration as anyone. The diversity of thought is in what to do with that displeasure.

I will take from the Speaker's example that how one does something is just as important as what one does.

Thank you Madam Speaker."

Rep. Pellett of Chester explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote "No" on this resolution with a divided mind and heart. I condemn the actions of this administration and would like very much to stem the outrageous conduct of the President and Vice President. But I feel that voting for impeachment at this point would do little good toward that end except to register a conviction or sentiment which I fear would end as a futile gesture.

Congress' energy and actions should be focused on ending the war in Iraq, dealing with our energy issues, world hunger, poverty, health care and much more and will not be able to do that if it is in pursuit of impeachment."

Rep. Spengler of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

When presidential power, a weak congress and press collude with corporate influence to determine the laws of the land it is called fascism because the will of the people is removed from the process. Americans under George Bush have unknowingly entered this miasma.

Impeachment is justified and is the first step to gain citizen control. The second is demanding election finance reform to extricate elected officials from powerful interests. The third step is breaking up the conglomeration of the media. Until we have a president who is not above the law, meaningful election finance reform and a free press, our most sacred union will continue to be in peril."

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker"

By considering this action and resolution today the Vermont House of Representatives has demonstrated that it is numb to the serious and back breaking needs of Vermonters. While nearing the end of this legislative year, we have done nothing to ease the property tax burden on Vermonters, we have done nothing substantial to help our farmers remain viable over the long term, and we have done nothing to make our children and communities safer.

Vermonters have lost this legislative year at a price of over 3-million dollars in legislative costs alone. Because of our inaction on important and relevant issues, they will continue to suffer with some of the highest taxes, fewest economic opportunities, and most overbearing state governments in the nation. I voted 'No' to protest our jumbled and misdirected priorities and will hold out hope for a brighter future."

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted no on this resolution as inappropriate... But I salute you Madam Speaker for doing this in the right way... As opposed to the way the "other body" in this building passed it. No debate on a resolution of this magnitude is wrong."

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

This vote was a statement to our delegation, no more, no less. It was not easy, nor hard but necessary. A prior congress diminished the impeachment process, that is no reason we should not move forward.

We can and must deal with many issues. They are all important. The separation of powers is extremely important. To spend one hour on this issue is nothing near a waste of time. This is not about policy but it is about our Constitution."

Page 39

Rep. Davis of Washington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker,

I do not debate the value of using or not using a seat belt, nor do I oppose the voluntary use of seat belts.

My main purpose is to oppose seat belt laws and to speak out to protect our Constitutional rights to freely choose our own individual personal safety and life style decisions without government intrusion. Such laws infringe on a person's rights as guaranteed in the Fourth, Fifth and Ninth Amendments and the Civil Rights section of the Fourteenth Amendment. The U.S. Supreme court ruling of a case in 2002 clearly proves that each person has a right to make his or her own healthcare decisions even if such is hazardous to one's health AND even if such decision will increase medical expenses.

With primary enforcement of a seat belt law, your vehicle can be stopped at anytime, night or day, by police under suspicion that a seat belt is not being used. And even if the officer is mistaken, he or she can begin routine interrogation and visual checks of the inside of the vehicle, all without the right of legal council. Primary enforcement also encourages random roadblocks. non-use of seatbelts is a state created crime and seat belt laws are an unwarranted intrusion by government into the personal lives of citizens.

I have heard from several of the folks in my district urging me to vote "no" on any primary seatbelt law, as they feel it is a further erosion of their freedoms. Madame Speaker I could not support this section of the bill.”

Page 40

Rep. Perry of Richford explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This provision of motor vehicle law, like many others, is not necessary: it is not likely to be enforced in a consistent or fair manner.”

Page 42

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We spend more time than I would choose to cast symbolic votes in this body. This amendment does not belong attached to this bill; it deserves the full process of this legislature. But as a symbolic vote, I must vote yes in support of the young girls of this state whom we abandon in the name of their right to live with the consequences of a very adult decision: to end the life of the child they carry.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no despite my support for parental notification. I do not believe this is the correct avenue, nor the right time for this debate. However, the debate should happen, hopefully when we come back in January rather than the waning days of this session.”

Page 43

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I cannot assent to a bill that confuses and confounds an objective determinable genetic fact and then gives benefits and protections to an undefineable status that is claimed to be present one moment only to disappear the next moment.”

Rep. Lippert of Hinesburg explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This vote is for Jes and Sarah and Liz and Dave and Heather and so many other amazing Vermonters who have been waiting for these legal protections to protect their lives.

It is time for Vermont to join 10 other states and over 75 municipalities in protecting our citizens from acts of discrimination based on gender identity. I look forward to our actions today establishing these important legal protections from discrimination. It is time!”

Page 45

Rep. Oxholm of Vergennes explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I have had the privilege of observing closely the commitment and competence of Vermont’s firefighters – as Mayor of Vergennes and as wife and mother of firefighters.

With this legislation we were able to recognize in a meaningful way all that the men and women of the fire service do for us every day – including putting their lives in jeopardy to serve their respective communities.

I proudly supported this bill.”

Page 46

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We took time to debate, on this floor, the Iraq resolution. We took time, on this floor, to debate the Impeachment resolution. It was said we did this so that people could be informed and have their say.

Yet this evening, we refused to send this bill to the committee that has jurisdiction over Constitutional matters and refused to allow time for review of a 17 page amendment to an even larger bill, that we received less than four hours ago, that will potentially place us in a court costing us millions of dollars.

This is a travesty and we dishonor the oath we all took to protect our Constitution.”

Page 49

Rep. Adams of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

In light of the US District Court ruling on New Hampshire’s Prescription Data Ban, I vote “no” simply because this bill, S. 115, should be deferred until final disposition of the ‘IMS Health’ decision to avoid a similar fate here in Vermont, especially since this body continues to refuse to have our committee on Judiciary review this bill.”

Rep. Hosford of Waitsfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

When this bill, Vermont once again leads the nation in health care reform to address the fastest growing expense within the health care system – prescription drugs.

S. 115 contains provisions that will help to contain costs, increase transparency and improve health care quality by helping to ensure that patients get the most effective drug at the lowest cost, free from the influence of the marketing practices of pharmaceutical companies.”

Rep. Hube of Londonderry explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Two years ago this body with much fanfare voted almost unanimously in support of I save Rx, S. 49 was going to bring much needed relief to 1000,000 Vermonters.

The chair of the Health Care committee acknowledged his disappointment concerning the fact that only 302 Vermonters have enrolled.

I fear that the counter detailing provisions in S. 115 that could produce in excess of \$10 million in savings will end up on the scrap heap with I save Rx, thus providing no relief to the 99, 698 Vermonters without adequate drug coverage.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill is so full of legal holes as to represent another “full employment act” for lawyers. It represents

another effort to use someone else's resources for an ideology that fails to deliver for the needs of human beings it dares to benefit. It's transparent.... Just as transparent as the emperor's new clothes. What an awful picture."

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

"Madame Speaker:

This bill has several good provisions that have the potential for saving Vermonters money as they purchase prescription drugs.

Unfortunately, the bill also contains a provision that holds little promise of savings and a near certainty of incurring substantial litigation costs. I oppose the practice of data mining, but I also oppose our frequent commitment of taxpayer dollars to court proceedings, be they ultimately successful or unsuccessful.

I would wait on the data mining provision until the New Hampshire case has run its course, at which time we would have better guidance on what we can constitutionally do to restrict data mining, without needlessly spending another million dollars defending our actions.

On balance, I am constrained to vote no on this bill."

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

For far too long this pharmaceutical industry has held sway over too many of our political institutions. It has treated our country as a haven for obscene profits at the expense of average Americans. Today, in a limited and reasonable way, this House told it that we have had enough and want it to stop."

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

This bill has several good points and will help people. I voted no because I don't think we can avoid a lawsuit that is going to cost the taxpayers a lot of money – we have a decision, on the NH case, given by a US District Court Judge – That decision as far as I understand, was based on the 1st amendment dealing with freedom of speech – the Judges specifically stated the NH law restricts constitutionally protected speech. I wish we could have had the Judiciary committee take a look at this bill and take testimony on this point.

I don't see how the doctor being able to opt in or out is any different than the state of NH trying to restrict the use of this prescribing information."

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

We don't know when or whether any law we pass will be challenged. But we do know that drug companies are causing Vermonters great expense, manipulating doctors, and violating doctor's right to privacy. All for increasingly larger profits. Will we allow ourselves to be intimidated by a potential threat of litigation from this goliath? I voted yes for Vermonters and no to pharmaceutical industry intimidation."

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I strongly support the concept of persuading, encouraging or even legislating the use of generic in lieu of brand name drugs in an attempt to curb the cost of prescription drugs to consumers our constituents.

However, I am very concerned that we have heard very little, if any, testimony on how consumers will be affected. Also, assessing another tax, fee or whatever else we decide to call it this week, is counter productive and sends the wrong message to our taxpayers.

Last week we taxed a power supplier to create a fund for promoting energy efficiency. Today we create a fund to create a program to save money on prescriptions funded by a tax on drug manufacturers. Thankfully, for the peoples sake, we are going home next week."

Page 52

Rep. Johnson of South Hero explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Costs borne by taxpayers are reviewed and approved by the Appropriations committee in a transparent and democratic process. I don’t believe it is necessary to legislate yet another report.”

Rep. Sunderland of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

What do we have to hide? This amendment simply asked that we track and report litigation costs associated with defending the questionable constitutionality of this bill. It’s unfortunate that this Legislature is not open nor transparent enough to keep the people of Vermont informed. What do we have to hide?”

Page 53

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no on the amendment. I am confident that a majority of Vermonters believe there should be reasonable limits on monetary contributions to political campaigns. I believe we have set prudent limits which have more than doubled the previous maximums. We have set new limits equal to or surpassing those in other states which have survived constitutional challenge.”

Rep. Martin of Wolcott explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I believe that large contributions reduce public trust. That candidates do favor contributors who give them large amounts of money to their campaign. This is why I voted no for this amendment. The limits are too high.

Our committee worked hard to find a contribution limit that would allow constitutional limits but not have the appearance of favoritism. I believe we achieved it in our bill.”

Page 55

Rep. Hosford of Waitsfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We need a careful and sustained collection of information about groundwater and with S. 92 we will have it.

Water is a shared resource that every Vermonter depends on to a greater or lesser extent.

This amendment, which calls for a survey rather than reports, will not give us the level of understanding that we need.

For this reason, I voted “no” on the amendment.”

Page 57

Rep. Adams of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

While I fully support energy conservation and many of the goals of this bill, I cannot support the funding for it which, make no mistake, is nothing short of legalized plunder of an easy target.”

Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am part of a family business in manufacturing which is an energy intensive business. I share with you the truths that inform my vote on this bill: Efficiency in thermal and electrical energy in Vermont will benefit my family’s business. H. 520 will NOT impact any electrical rates which are set by contracts that expire in 2012. There is almost unanimous agreement here this afternoon that an all fuels utility WILL save Vermonters and Vermont businesses money. We have the choice today whether to continue banging

our heads against the wall, acting like energy hogs, stupidly wasting our money and girdling our businesses and families by our wastefulness. Do you really want to make Vermont a good place to work and raise a family? Or only if it doesn't cost anything?

I'm through with procrastination, soothing expedients and delays. I voted yes."

Rep. Clark of Vergennes explained his vote as follows:

"Madame Speaker:

It's not that the government needs to be concerned with the problems of the consumer. With this bill it's the consumer who needs to be concerned about its government. Higher taxes with no relief in sight we ought not to be concerned about the decisions our constituents make, but they have every reason to worry about ours. Promoting higher taxes is an easy decision. Using common sense in our tax policy and decisions seems to be conspicuous by its absence."

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

"Madame Speaker:

This bill relies upon trade-offs that do not benefit our conservation, energy, and renewable resource efforts over the long term."

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

Madame Speaker:

"I support renewable energy and energy conservation. I'm sad that I must vote against a good bill that's been fatally damaged. Climate change should not be an excuse for passing an unconstitutional bill and throwing away Vermonters' money."

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

"Madame Speaker:

Let's call it for what it is... theft, victim targeting, deceit, political chicanery, a back alley bludgeoning, breach of trust, false representation, and fraud. If a citizen did what we are doing today, we'd levy grand larceny charges in the blink of an eye, obtain a conviction and send them out of state to do "hard time". Because we are the Legislature we think we are the law or are above the law. The Constitution of the People says we are not... I think we will know their wrath sooner rather than later. God knows we deserve it with this miscarriage of justice."

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

"Madame Speaker:

I voted yes to begin now helping Vermonters save money helping Vermonters reduce their CO2 emissions and helping create lots of good paying jobs for Vermonters. Now is the time Vermonters need help. I'm more concerned about Vermonters, and less concerned about a message being sent on trying to answer now the hypothetical question of what we do now will raise the price of power we may purchase from a plant that may not be operating after 2012."

Rep. LaVoie of Swanton explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Unfortunately for the citizens of Vermont, H. 520 is more about the political agenda of a few, rather than the energy future of many."

Rep. Maier of Middlebury explained his vote as follows:

"Madame Speaker:

My vote for this bill is for my children and all of our children. May our action here today be the first of many steps to preserve Earth's many life systems, including those that support human life and prosperity."

Rep. Minter of Waterbury explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote yes on H. 520. By investing in efficiency now we move our State toward energy independence and security. Establishing and funding on all fuels utility will place savings into the budgets of Vermont

families and businesses. It will help our state take a significant step forward in the fight against climate change. Our children and our energy future depend on our taking action now.”

Rep. Peterson of Williston explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes for energy efficiency and challenge those opposed to funding by raising the rate on a existing flat tax to identify other funding sources, perhaps starting with closing existing tax exemptions.”

Rep. Trombley of Grand Isle explained his vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

We have an aging and energy costly housing supply. High costs for heating oil, bottled gas, wood and electricity, hurt working Vermonters. The rehabilitation of homes into energy efficient dwellings will help working Vermonters pocket books.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

I vote no on H. 520. Unfortunately when the Senate got their hands on this bill, process went out the window, and politics trumped policy. The message to business if this bill passes is “be afraid, be very afraid”. We would have been more productive passing something which could become law, instead of encouraging a veto.”

Page 58

Rep. Consejo of Sheldon explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Today I gave my vote, and my voice to all the victims of predators that never had a chance to do it themselves.”

Rep. Nuovo of Middlebury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

We all want to have safe communities but when we take away the right of some members of the community we infringe on the rights of other groups or of all.”

Page 59

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes for H. 526, but let us not fool ourselves into thinking we’ve been successful in our work on Education cost containment. This is one small step on a very long road. I hope our committee begins work in earnest when we convene in January. Our constituents deserve better than what has been delivered this session.”

Rep. Martin of Wolcott explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I had a very hard time voting for H. 526, but I agree if we don’t take this step and begin cost containing measures, we cannot provide tax relief for our citizens. There are some very good provisions in this bill. I have been promised that this conversation will continue.

Rep. McAllister of Highgate explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

In the five years I have served in this body, I have not felt the need to explain my vote.

I was set not to vote for this bill because I was hoping there would be more significant work on areas that would lower the property taxes. I am very disheartened by this and can only hope more will be done next year. However, I know a lot of work went into this bill by our Educational Committee and I have chosen to support their work because it is a start at some savings, but much more needs to be done.

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Although the Education Committee and Conferees have worked diligently to restrain education spending. I do not believe we confront the main issue on voters minds in the last election, namely relief from property taxes

Perhaps when we convene next January a bill could be prepared giving long term relief to home owners. We might be better situated to consider cost restraint if we know how future education money is to be raised and whether the relation of school spending to taxes will be more obvious.

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

My education leaders have told me two things – no caps – no reduction in the threshold level. My constituents have asked me to help slow the rising cost of education so they would see moderation in their property tax increases. Seems to me that H. 526 meets those requests.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

If there are these Vermont town out spending recklessly, perhaps they will now “think twice”. In struggling towns like mine that vote “no” already because they cannot afford the tax burden, there may now be more “no” votes.”

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

This bill contains more mandates, less local control and little help for school boards, students and taxpayers. We must do better.”

Page 60

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote “No”. In the old days, people of my generation posed a dilemma in the alternative. We asked, “Do I live to work, or work to live”? Today, every thoughtful Vermonter asked the question, “Do I live and work to pay taxes, or pay taxes to live and work?” Sadly, both sides of the dilemma are truisms. The tax burden in Vermont threatens to destroy the fabric of our families and communities. Already the fabric is torn and tattered, but soon, if we do not decrease taxes, our families and communities will be destroyed. The tax in H. 520 is a class warfare tax on the so-called corporate “rich”. In fact, it is a tax on a stable and inexpensive source of energy that does not contribute to “global warming”. The tax is really another tax on Vermonters and punishment for having the foresight to have the benefit of this excellent energy source. I cannot support another tax on Vermonters.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes to move Vermont forward to a clean, safe, reliable affordable energy future. I choose with my vote to support the economic interests and concerns of everyday Vermonters over protecting multi-national billion dollar corporations.”

Page 62

Rep. Adams of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

In our discussions over the past several months you made it very clear to me that this body would not consider any new legislation today. That we would be acting on the veto votes only.

As recently as yesterday you again indicated to me that the vetoes were our only business. I am frustrated and disappointed in these political games.”

Rep. Partridge of Windham explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes to take up this compromise bill that will take a first step to reduce Vermont’s carbon emissions, create economic opportunities and a more prosperous future for our children and grandchildren, and to make home heating more affordable for Vermonters. S. 209 is a win-win bill and it deserves our consideration so we can begin the challenging work ahead of us.

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

At the same time as the Legislative leaders in the House and Senate have indicated they did not want to pass new legislation on the fly, nor would they consider letting us take up the original H. 520 legislation, now we are considering just what we were told would not happen. This is pure politics.”
