H. 627 Shall House committee on Education be relieved of H.627 and the same be placed on notice calendar?

Rep. Buxton of Tunbridge explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The error that caused the need for the provision in question underscores the call for fidelity to our legislative review process. An accelerated path is not only ill-advised, it side-skirts the committee process and puts all our taxpayers in jeopardy.”

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Last week the rules suddenly changed for every school board in the state and many who thought they were playing by the rules have been penalized. Last week we had an Education bill on the calendar, but it was pulled back because it was complicated. I voted yes to give schools clarity that on this one simple issue we will move forward with certainty and the unity that the Education committee gave us when it approved this exact language on an 11-0 vote.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Legislating on the floor, on the fly, does a disservice to the process and to the voters that sent me here. My vote supports thoughtful considerate deliberations and the hard work of your Education Committee, whether I agree with them or not.”

H. 611 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I thank House Appropriations Committee for their hard work. But I must vote No. This Budget Adjustment simply demonstrates again that our budgets are not really balanced. We consistently promise more in benefits and programs than we can fund, and we give away more in tax expenditures than we can afford. And we are struggling during an economic EXPANSION. What will happen during the next recession when tax revenues drop?”

Rep. Christie of Hartford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

During the Civil War, Vermonters and all the other states were asked to contribute to the war effort \$500,000 at that time and this body voted not to send \$500,000 but \$1,000,000. We are again at war, this time it is the war against drugs. I voted as Vermonters do – yes.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is not a vote against this somewhat reasonable effort to adjust accounts mid-year base on policies and budget lines set last year. It is a vote against those policies and that budget – which are what has resulted in now perpetuating still higher spending supported by these tax increases.”

Rep. Johnson of South Hero explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This budget adjustment addresses critical changes in caseload by applying money we set aside for that purpose and funds we’ve responsibly scrubbed from elsewhere in the budget.

Because of these choices more Vermonters are insured, vulnerable children are better protected, we’ve invested in clean water and maintained our rainy day fund. All within a 25% growth rate.”

Rep. Manwaring of Wilmington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am troubled by the continual mantra that spending is the problem, a frame of thinking that to me is just another way of implementing supply side economic theory, a theory that was supposed to lead to trickle down investments to benefit all of us. The growing divide between the wealthy and the rest of us is proof enough of the wrong-headedness of that theory and the harm it has done to Vermont’s economy, our families and our communities.”

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cannot support a budget that again spends at a higher percentage than our revenue allows. Working Vermont families and businesses cannot continue to spend more than they make and neither should we. As a body we’re resembling Einstein’s definition of insanity.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This budget adjustment increases state general fund spending by \$12.3 million and relies on \$23 million in one-time resources. The FY16 general fund is growing at a rate of 5% and supporting revenue is growing at less than 3%. This is the definition of a structural deficit and is not sustainable. You cannot do this in your home or business and we should not do it with our state’s finances. Thank you.”

S.233 Shall the proposal of amendment recommended by the Committee on Education be agreed to?

Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Over the past weeks and months we all have been listening to many voices on the question of education thresholds. The House committees who worked on this bill went through an extensive process of discernment in pointing us toward a way to move forward.

What we have passed here today strikes an important balance from among those many voices from across Vermont.

This balance honors our school boards who are working hard to put together budgets to support their schools. This balance responds to property tax payers who value fiscal restraint. And this balance protects Vermont’s school children now and in future as our schools move on to the deeper work of collaborating with their neighbors as laid out in Act 46.”

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

A state representative has to consider the needs of the entire state, not just his/her individual district. While approval of this amendment might have the effect of slightly affecting taxes in my district, it will provide dramatic relief to other smaller districts who have also worked hard to control costs. It preserves the important focus on cost controls in Act 46 while responding to serious concerns about the effects of implementation of the new threshold penalties. It is balanced and fair. Act 46 has sparked positive changes all over the state, and this and future legislatures will be called upon to make necessary changes when equity issues arise.”

Rep. Lanpher of Vergennes explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have pursued today every possible tax relief to help the taxpayers of my district. I supported this final bill adjustment to Act 46 because it brings limited relief and supports the excellent work of my school boards. A half a loaf today is better than no loaf.”

Rep. Savage of Swanton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

School spending is down proving Act 46 is working. Passing this bill today modifying Act 46 raises the education spending limit, reduces the penalty for districts that did not comply with the law and will raise property taxes on hard working Vermonters. Thank you.”

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I want to recognize the hard work of the House Education and House Ways and Means Committees and members of this body that have supported our work to improve education for our children at a cost taxpayers can afford.”

S.233 Shall the House suspend its rules to bring the bill up for immediate consideration as moved by Rep. Pearson of South Burlington?

Rep. Buxton of Tunbridge explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

One week ago we faced a motion to pull a bill out of committee before the committee had done its due diligence. This week, after full committee consideration, a full floor debate, bipartisan house support and an intensive negotiation with the other body, we ‘are not ready’?”

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr Speaker:

I have heard it said here that “The error that caused the need for the provision in question underscores the call for fidelity to our legislative review process. An accelerated path is not only ill-advised, it side-skirts the deliberation process and puts all our taxpayers in jeopardy. And that legislating on the floor, on the fly, does a disservice to the process and to the voters that sent me here. My vote supports thoughtful considerate deliberations after speaking to the people this will affect.

One week ago today I wanted to move forward with language that had unanimous support, after a week of consideration- which has now been approved by both bodies.

Today there is a motion to suspend rules on legislation that passed last night in the Senate after many of us left the building. There are a number of us that have not had an opportunity to understand the changes the Senate made – and more importantly talk to the people who it will affect.

Rep. Haas of Rochester explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It is a sad day when we cannot move forward to give our local school boards the certainty they need to plan and budget for next year. Delaying consideration of this bill until next week is unlikely to change the ultimate outcome of a vote on the Senate proposal.. But delay certainly will feed the perception of our constituents that this body does not care enough to provide them clear guidance in a timely manner of the statutory rules that govern their labors in overseeing public education in their Vermont Towns.”

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe our school boards deserve to know the lay of the land beneath their feet. After all, they care for our most precious resources: our children. A failed procedural vote reveals the urgency expressed a week ago vanished. Where’s the consistency now that a fair solution is in hand?”

Rep. Shaw of Pittsford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

In our rush to do the right thing I'm not sure we are doing any better than the original Act 46. Why are we voting on a large change in a bill without taking a few days to learn what we are really doing? I vote no!"

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Many Vermonters, including school board members and parents of school-aged children, have asked us to revisit this issue and act quickly. Voting to delay this decision any longer sends a signal that we're happy to see communities suffer and squirm while we keep a reasonable solution on hold for another weekend. I vote yes to bring relief, and to end the confusion."

S.233 Shall the House suspend its rules to bring the bill up for immediate consideration as moved by Rep. Head of South Burlington?

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I have stood on this floor many times in the past in support of the right of our constituents to informed votes by their legislators. This vote would have us violate our normal process for legislation, over the objection of legislators who want more than a mere few hours of rushed consideration of new language on a complex financing mechanism. That is wrong. I vote no."

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I polled 8 members of the other body. I asked them what the average spending limit was that they voted out in their amendment yesterday. This dollar figure is key to this whole bill. Two of them knew the number, 2 had a number that was significantly higher than the average and the others had no idea what that figure was. This is what happens when we are more focused on getting something done rather than getting something right. Please give us our allotted time to understand this bill's impact on our districts."

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Suddenly many who wanted immediate action in order to give timely information to our school district are now willing to keep them in the dark."

S.233 Shall the House concur to Senate proposal to House proposal?

Rep. Buxton of Tunbridge explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I'm proud of the bill we just voted to support. It represents a compromise beyond parties, extending across legislative bodies. Members representing districts of all shapes, sizes and

experience were able to support a thoughtful, responsible, and timely act to help our taxpayers and our students. Our work couldn't be more different from the paralyzing dysfunction of Washington, DC."

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Concurring with the Senate on their proposal of amendment leaves property taxpayers at the mercy of the 'other body', and they have showed little interest in containing property taxes. I fear this vote will result in more 'For Sale' signs going up in my district and across the state."

H.622 Shall the bill be amended as recommended by the committee on Human Services?

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Although I vote no to this language, I support its intent and look forward to supporting clarifying language for third reading."

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

My vote to protect our children is consistent with my work. As a volunteer with Prevent Child Abuse VT, as a child care worker and as a family services worker for decades, I have been on the front lines of protecting our children. I didn't just show up for this issue, I have and will continue to be on the front line of protecting our children and my vote aligns with my record of service to the children of Vermont."

Rep. Myers of Essex explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes, but I have reservations about Sec. 1(c). I would like a little more assurance that the report has been heard. The amendment has passed but I hope the Committee on Human Services takes another look at Sec. 1(c) before third reading."

Rep. Troiano of Stannard explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

After spending months on our Child Protection last session, I have no question that this amendment will clarify the process and ultimately protect our children."

Rep. Willhoit of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

As an adoptive parent of abused and neglected children, I want all witnesses of abuse to provide a report. Too often one report isn't enough to protect children. I vote no for my children and hundreds of other Vermont children abused and neglected every day."

H.187 Shall the House concur to the Senate proposal of amendment?

Rep. Berry of Manchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted ‘yes’ because it is a balanced compromise. It has been advocated for by Vermont Businesses for Social Responsibility and Main Street Alliance. Absent amendments I feel the Senate bill adequately reflects my reasoned evaluation that it strikes a balance between the modest and incremental approach helpful to the business community with the clear need to offer assurances to employees that their wellness and safety and that of their children and families will be more compassionately addressed. This bill moves in the direction of creating a more moral economy for those workers in greatest need.”

Rep. Botzow of Pownal explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My vote reflects my understanding that a more flexible workplace will make for a better labor market for employees and employers.”

Rep. Connor of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I represent three towns and some four thousand constituents, many of whom are under-employed in that, in order to provide for themselves and their families, they must work second and third jobs. I have heard from dozens and dozens of single parents who have to make a decision every time a child is sick. Do I send my child to school sick or do I risk losing my job when I call out to my employers? I have heard from folks who must decide if they care for themselves or another family member. Some have reached out because they were not able to be with a dying family member. I heard from a number of teachers who begged me to support this bill so that a sick child does not come to school sick and pass the sickness on to other students and even the teacher. I voted for H.187 to honor the requests from my constituents.

Far fewer constituents reached out to me asking that I not support this legislation. I believe the General, Military and Housing Committee did their due diligence in vetting H.187. I truly believe that every working Vermonter, young or old, should be provided the opportunity to care for themselves and or a member of their family. H.187 is a step in the direction that demonstrates that the employee is both valued and supported by their employer.

Vermont employers who invest in their employees by offering paid time off for illness and safety are demonstrating to the folks who work for him or her that they value their employee and their family. Employers who offer this benefit and others understand that a happy content employee is less expensive in the long haul.

I was raised in a large extended family with many family businesses and we were taught to care for one another. It was instilled in each of us that you get along far better with a healthy dose of honey than vinegar.”

Rep. Eastman of Orwell explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Without a small business exemption, this vote confirms to me that my minimal pay of \$18,000 per year, my first three years of start up with my business, doesn't matter and this further confirms that it is OK for the families of small business employers to starve as long as they are taking care of others. I, like many small business owners, sacrificed much and worked 60 – 80 hours a week to build my business to where it is today. TODAY I am proud to be able to afford to offer paid leave in my place of business. It just took time to get there. I am not against paid leave, but have recognized both through my work and personal experience that it takes time for some new and small businesses to be viable and have the ability to offer such benefits.”

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

In a state where total payroll exceeds \$15 billion, a tiny fraction of that going to keep many of our workers, often those working for low-wage jobs, the chance to stay healthy and productive is a sensible investment.”

Rep. Hubert of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote ‘no’ today not because workers do not need time off but for the mounting costs we have and will add to business. We will be adding higher fees this year and higher minimum wage this year as well as next year.

This bill will cost small business between \$2.8 to \$6.3 million.

We are taking away the owners’ wishes to put a package that works for both the owner and employees.

It seems government knows better how to run small than the owner.”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

A vote for this bill is a vote against our fledgling and small businesses, businesses that are struggling with minimum wage increase, ever-increasing fees, a weak economy and a terrible tourist season.

We should be focusing efforts on empowering Vermonters so they don't need to depend on low skill jobs. We should be providing improved entrepreneurial tools and training for jobs with career growth potential.

These efforts should be our top priority.

We have to make sure we aren't passing laws that make us feel good rather than taking steps to actually do good.”

Rep. Lewis of Berlin explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote ‘no’ on this bill, not because I don’t support paid sick leave, but because it is not the State’s job to dictate what benefits an employer should offer. Businesses know what they can provide and should have the freedom to choose. The majority of employers in this state do provide paid leave.

As I spoke last year on this bill, I mentioned a constituent who stated he did not have sick leave. But what he did have was health, dental and optical insurance, HSA, long and short-term disability, vacation and 401K. There is much more to this story and that has not been considered in this bill.”

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I voted ‘no’ on H.187 although I support employees getting sick leave, because I do not feel we got it right with this H.187. There are too many unanswered questions that I am sure will lead to unintended consequences.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My vote is for the children who will benefit, for the parents who work outside the home who need this provision and for the businesses who contacted me to ask that we level the playing field so those who do provide these benefits get a fair deal when competing against businesses that don’t. This bill is good for Vermont and helps create a better, brighter future for our kids, families and businesses.”

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted ‘no’ because this is another reason for a small business to say I’m ‘sick’ of all of their mandates and move to the live free and don’t die of high taxes state next door. A high tech company in my district which employs over 200 wrote me to say they are contemplating this move.”

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My intention in the first version of legislation to leave this house was to lift my Rutland City constituents who go to work faithfully each day and play by the rules, these Vermonters contribute greatly to the fabric of our state’s economy and community. This action will only serve to strengthen the relationship between employer and employee, as well as with job recruitment. I proudly vote yes for working Vermonters.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote 'no' because once again, the legislature foists a mandate on business in Vermont, with no exemption for small business. Spin it however you want, this is another hit on small business in Vermont."

Rep. Van Wyck of Ferrisburgh explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted 'no.' Please add Mom and Pop country stores to the list of threatened and endangered businesses-for the ones that are left. Rural Vermont loses again."

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I vote 'yes' on this bill. There is no doubt that there is a cost to business, large or small, to provide paid sick days to its qualified employees. Businesses routinely make investments in equipment that provides a benefit to their operation. Employees provide a benefit to their employers as well. Providing earned paid sick leave, a mere three days a year, should be considered a worthwhile investment by an employer in their business as well as in their employees."

Page 26

H.278 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Fiske of Enosburgh explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

As a 20 year veteran who defended his country in the line of fire, it is imperative we have a leader in our National Guard who knows what saving their country means."

Rep. Lewis of Berlin explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I want to thank the committee for thoughtfully contemplating this bill. The result is a blending of the bill I sponsored, H.420, which set specific criteria for candidates for the election of Adjutant and Inspector General, and H.278, which creates the Recommendation board.

This is not a position to be taken lightly. It is one that demands leadership and integrity. The importance of having a qualified candidate who will ensure the highest degree of both is of utmost concern. This is the highest ranking military officer in the state. This commanding officer needs to be Federally recognized at the General Officer level, for it will be his or her duty to participate at the federal level to negotiate for support for our Vermont troops.

Vermont has historically had the highest per capita of National Guard members in the nation. Whether it is Army or Air, these troops have been put to the test in recent years with deployments to war zones in Iraq and Afghanistan. Their level of professionalism is well respected across the United States. Their training is beyond compare.

The Vermont Army and Air Guard may be deployed at home for natural disasters or for homeland security. We must trust that the Adjutant General is the strong leader that this position demands.

As someone who has witnessed the election process of the Adjutant General from both sides of the process, I can unequivocally state that appropriate qualifications need to be set in statute. I applaud the Legislature for confirming the importance of this process.

Thank you.”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The election of the Adjutant General of our National Guard by the General Assembly remains unique in the United States. As such, we need to treat it as a privilege, and not a luxury. The process approved today will help make sure the best candidates for this integral job are vetted, approved and put forward for this body’s consideration.”

Rep. Tate of Mendon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe it is extremely critical that those who wear the uniform be led by someone who themselves has also worn the uniform and thoroughly understands the challenges and joy of service.”

Page 27

H.R.13 Shall the Resolution be amended as offered by Tate of Mendon?

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Elected by the voters of this state, the constitutional office of the treasurer has a sanctity that cannot be ignored. Elected by the people of Vermont the treasurer should not be bullied by the legislature or anyone else.

I vote yes. And I oppose the underlying resolution.”

Rep. Gage of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If this body spent the same time and effort in trying to solve the 1 billion dollar shortfall in our pension funds as we spend in trying to tell the treasurer on how to do her job we would better serve the voters of Vermont.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While our treasurer is elected by Vermont voters, so are we. In a republic, we are the voices of our voters back home, and my vote is bringing the voices of my constituents who say yes to divestment and no to this amendment.”

Rep. Shaw of Pittsford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My yes vote represents my respect of the knowledge of our State Treasurer and my confidence in her financial judgement in her management of our state pension funds.”

Page 28

H.R. 13 Shall the House adopt the Resolution?

Rep. Bartholomew of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cast my vote to come down on the right side of history.”

Rep. Cole of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

A resolution is an appropriate way to put on record that the Vermont Legislature takes our investments in heavy fossil fuels that are seriously losing market value for real reasons seriously.

Global climate change is something we need to take responsibility for. We can change the overall rate of warming making our planet more livable for your grandchildren, neighbors and all Vermonters.

We are respectfully asking our Honorable Treasurer to diligently explore our Vermont investment options. She heard some knowledgeable people give testimony and was mutually thankful for the opportunity.”

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As someone who is held to a fiduciary standard and under various state and federal regulations, I feel it is highly inappropriate to make an investment recommendation to the Treasurer, which if I had made to my clients on the same rationale I could possibly be sued, fined or lose my license. Let's leave this to the elected Treasurer the appropriate fiduciary for our state employee's pension fund.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe that our public policies should support every reasonable effort to address climate change. However, this resolution risks imposing our public policy views on the rights of state employees regarding best strategies for investment of their pension funds.

Those best strategies may well include these divestments, but that decision is the province of the Treasurer, unfettered by pressure from this body.”

Rep. Donovan of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

“KEEP IT IN THE GROUND! To avoid the worst impacts of climate change, we must keep fossil fuels in the ground.”

Rep. Graham of Williamstown explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because it is a sad day for democracy when we tell another elected official how they must do their job.”

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. This resolution is another political mandate by the Governor and his majority. This “buy high and sell low” advice will lose money for Vermonters who worked hard for their retirement.”

Rep. Rachelson of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Climate change is real and requires urgent action. State employee pensions are not a fair target for the many political statements we can continue to make for advising our very capable treasurer and Vermont Pension Investment Committee. The treasurer’s report said this would hurt these funds. I worry we are stepping outside our bounds with these gestures and that we have a duty of care. Let’s concentrate on the ways we as a state can make a difference within the authority we do have as a legislature, without hurting Vermonters’ pensions.”

Rep. Viens of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no today on this resolution. This body’s responsibility is to work on legislation for the betterment of all Vermonters. This resolution today falls way sort of this goal.”

Page 29

H. 458 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This change is an important part of strengthening our democracy because it helps remove barriers to voting. I appreciate the good work of the Government Operations committee and the overwhelming support of the House.”

Page 31

H. 571 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Graham of Williamstown explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Again we show we don’t need to take responsibility for our actions.”

Rep. Martel of Waterford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Fairness of this bill started when Chittenden and Windsor had a one day restoration day. Which left the rest of the state out in the cold. This bill was put forth to treat all Vermonters the same. We do all live in the same state.”

Page 32

H.171 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Till of Jericho?

Rep. Miller of Shaftsbury explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Even though I believe that prohibition does not work in modifying or changing behavior, I do believe that education works. I support Representative Till's amendment because health care costs increases have been out of control for years and years.

My committee, Education, recently increased the penalty threshold in Bill H. 46 by 9/10 of one percent to help school boards with their budgets because health care costs increased 7.8 percent this year.

Till's amendment offers a way to decrease spending while saving the lives of our youth.”

Rep. Morris of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My respect for this process is great. My obligation to the youth of Vermont is greater. This conversation is not new and I applaud Rep. Till and the advocates who fought to have this heard as it was omitted from the process. We have failed to support tobacco prevention and cessation in this state. It is my respect for public health and loyalty to Vermonters and not Big Tobacco that will keep me fighting this fight.”

Rep. Webb of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My vote here does not reflect my view on the importance of this amendment and its reasonableness. I am disappointed that this did not go through the deliberative process. It speaks to my request to the committee to take this up and begin the deliberative process ASAP.”

Page 33

H.812 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill does not provide sufficient protection for Vermonters from the risk of reductions in health care by Accountable Care Organizations due to financial pressures. It will be very difficult for the Green Mountain Care Board to properly enforce the regulatory provisions established here. Nevertheless, I vote yes, because sometimes it is better to have a fig leaf than to be naked.”

Page 34

H.261 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Let’s remember that this bill is meant to provide Vermonters who have made a mistake and paid their debt to society an opportunity to maintain their rehabilitation by becoming normal again. Applying for a job and maybe – just maybe – landing that job is an important part of the stability needed to re-enter society. Removing the box seems a small thing to those of us who don’t have a criminal record, but it can be a lifesaver to those who do.”

Page 36

H.861 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Understanding and making good legislation takes more than one week.”

Rep. Zagar of Barnard explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Choosing to not regulate toxic substances that may pose a threat to humans or the environment would be reckless and irresponsible. We’ve learned too many lessons the hard way.

Page 38

H.522 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The current Federal regulations on wildlife habitat have already caused hurdles to an important circumferential highway in my district that millions of dollars and years of work were unable to overcome. If the federal regulations are already working, and preventing Vermont from building needed infrastructure in the only part of the state seeing economic growth, I fear that an additional layer of bureaucracy, regulations and decision makers will only further damage the economic habitat that Vermont’s endangered private sector needs to thrive.”

Page 39

H.620 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Gamache of Swanton explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Bill does not include religious exemption for institutions or religious believers.”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

In light of Colorado’s results we know that increasing access to Long Acting Reversible Contraceptives will result in fewer unintended births and abortions. I want to thank the committee for their work on this bill.”

Rep. Rachelson of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It’s important that all Vermonters have access to reliable birth control. This bill will remove cost being a barrier to Vermonters and we’ll have fewer unintended pregnancies in our state.”

Rep. Shaw of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Breaks my heart to see abortions. My daughter had one 30 years ago, and still not over it mentally.”

Rep. Till of Jericho explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support this bill to increase the use of Long Acting Reversible Contraception. These are the most effective contraceptives known. They reduce unintended pregnancies and widespread use of LARCs has been demonstrated to reduce abortions.

Additionally, there are other medical benefits such as lifelong reduction of cancer of the uterus.

With 46% of pregnancies in Vermont being unintended, this is a very wise step.”

Page 40

H.872 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill disguises the 20.8 million dollars assessed against mutual funds as fees and then creates an exemption to comply with a recent court decision. Make no mistake, this is a \$20.8 million tax increase! Thank you.”

Page 41

H.873 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As much as we might wish that our country would join the rest of the world in finding a way to make health care a right of citizenship, we are stuck here in an employer based health care system. Changes made here on the employer assessment create a more level playing field between employers who are participating in the system and those who benefit from the plans offered by other employers.”

Rep. Fiske of Enosburgh explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Here we go once again, Mr. Speaker. I have people in my district who can't pick up their prescriptions from Rite Aid; they try to figure out if they can buy wood for heat or put gas in their car. This weekend I'll go home and listen once again how unaffordable it is to live in Vermont.”

Rep. Hebert of Vernon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This legislature has a spending problem, not a revenue problem. You cannot continue taxing your way out of it. Vermonters simply cannot afford what we're doing. Thank you.”

Rep. Higley of Lowell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My constituents and businesses are telling me that they'd like to see some predictability and stability in Vermont's regulations and taxation, not more of each.”

Page 42

H.875 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Bancroft of Westford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This budget does not fulfill our responsibility, as elected legislators, to put the state on the path to fiscal health. On the contrary, it will continue the reckless and unsustainable cycle of spending beyond Vermont’s means.

Increasing new spending by \$58 million (for the General fund alone) and creating an ongoing budget gap of over \$30 million does not serve the people of Vermont. As a consequence, I cannot support the passing of this bill in good conscience.”

Rep. Conner of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I rise to recognize and thank sincerely the two money committees, House Appropriations and Ways and Means, for their due diligence and process and transparency in developing and funding our state government. So very many of my constituents rely on a host of programming to live with dignity and purpose.

There are programs that, if I had a choice, I might be inclined to not support. However, my constituents, be them Progressives, Independents, Republicans or Democrats, have asked that I look forward to being inclusive for all Vermonters.”

Rep. Cupoli of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermonters’ deserve to live in a fiscally sound state that boasts employment growth and economic vitality.

You don’t have to be an economist to understand that raising taxes and fees by 48 million dollars is not the way to achieve that goal. I cannot enable the continuation of this crisis and I vote no.”

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

‘Mr. Speaker:

I would like to thank the Appropriations committee for reversing and almost decade-long trend by taking an important step to invest in Vermont public higher education. The increase in support to the Vermont State Colleges is a strong signal that the body recognizes the importance of higher education to our future economy and workforce.

This budget begins to take pressure off tuition increases for students at Castleton, Johnson, Lyndon, Vermont Tech and Community College, the schools where Vermonters go to college, mostly supporting the regional economies outside of Chittenden County. This is an important, long overdue, and more than symbolic action.”

Rep. Miller of Shaftsbury explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The 1st veteran was admitted to the Veteran's Home in 1887. Today it is governed by the Vermont Veterans' Home Board of Trustees.

The Home has 130 beds, 190 employees. They received 5 out of 5 stars for the excellence of their staff.

The veterans at the Home provide long term care, short term rehabilitation, Alzheimer's/dementia care, respite care, hospice/palliative care, residential/domicile care and out-patient rehabilitation services.

The Veterans at the Home served in one of the following wars: World War II, Korean, Vietnam, Gulf War.

The veterans and their families, the staff, administration, the community and region appreciate the Appropriations committee's support of the Home."

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Austerity budgets do not get my support because they are regressive budgets. They hurt working families and exacerbate poverty. This budget on the other hand makes responsible investments, stimulates the economy, trims the fat, and strengthens the safety net. I vote for this bill with appreciation."

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I thank the Appropriations committee for their thorough work and eye toward cautious fiscal policy.

My 'yes' vote includes support for Vermont Public Television which has been enjoyed for years by my constituents in Rutland."

Rep. Sibilia of Dover explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I campaigned and arrived for my first biennium deeply concerned about the relationship between Vermont's revenues and Vermont's budget. I am still concerned. However, I believe there are not an abundance of easy or inconsequential choices to cut in front of us.

I voted to support this budget process, the inclusivity extended to the public and all members of the House, the commitment to examining each aspect of the budget to assess if it was serving Vermonters and how well, and the request for all committees to examine the programs within their jurisdiction and prioritize them. I voted for this budget because of the process and progress I believe the committee is making. Clearly there is still work to do. And clearly a budget needs to be paid for.

My vote on the tax bill this afternoon reflects lingering specific concerns I have with some of the specific tax increases. I am hopeful with amendments those concerns may be alleviated."

Rep. Strong of Albany explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As we look to ways to curb the opiate epidemic in our state, and the ever increasing costs to our budget to deal with that burden, I believe it is imperative to strengthen programs that help families to stay together and become healthier and function well. The Parent Child Centers have been level funded for 20 years, and these centers provide much needed prevention services that can save us money in the long run. Thank you.”

Rep. Toll Danville explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This state budget is the responsibility of every member of this chamber. Where was your voice and your thoughts when asked to participate and be heard? Silence is not acceptable.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The majority promised to propose a budget that would start bending the curve on spending this year. The House Republican Caucus is committed to preserving a much brighter financial future for Vermont, and we introduced numerous bills in support of this goal. Disappointingly, you have ignored our cost-cutting measures and decided against making the difficult yet crucial choice to rein in spending.

By increasing general fund spending by 4% or \$58.8 million even though the revenue is projected to grow at a mere 2.2%, this budget will perpetuate the state’s budget problems. The projected budget gap will be in excess of \$30 million for next year. Therefore, I cannot endorse an appropriations bill that will dig even deeper in the pockets of Vermonters to sustain the overspending crisis of the state government.”

Rep. Viens of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Montpelier is trapped in a quicksand of prodigality. Over the last 5 years, General Fund spending alone has grown at an average of 4.5%. Instead of focusing on generating revenue through strong fiscal policies, this budget proposal intends to fund the growth of government and ideological pet projects by taxing Vermonters even further. I remain committed to making Vermont affordable and giving Vermonters a much deserved financial break. As a consequence, I cannot support this bill.”

Page 43

H.620 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Willhoit of St. Johnsbury?

Rep Berry of Manchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I appreciate the spirit of the amendment and the attempted negotiation of the establishment clause and free exercise clause. However, the law of the State of Vermont does not circumvent or controvert a person's religious sensibility or sense of conscience. I voted against the amendment for that reason and in order to help protect women's rights and health care."

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

This amendment supports a simple principle: the state should not be forcing churches to buy something for their employers that violates their conscience and religious tenets. This amendment is essential to me to support the many benefits of the underlying bill, and is in the finest tradition of Vermont tolerance for the beliefs of others."

Rep. Donovan of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Some argue that schools, hospitals or any place of employment have a 'conscience' and 'freedom of religion.' According to my Catholic tradition, women have consciences and deserve to exercise them without coercion."

Rep. Morris of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Our unintended pregnancy rates are unacceptably high. The bill as presented does not run afoul of the 1st amendment because it is neutral and broadly applicable. I voted against this amendment as it not only denies an individual's right to control their health care choices, but it sets a dangerous precedent that will likely leave our state vulnerable to allowing discrimination in other aspects of our lives."

Rep. Walz of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

One person's religious beliefs should not override another's."

Page 44

H.873 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Olsen of Londonderry?

Rep. Burditt of West Rutland explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

My local ambulance provider has no idea how this amendment will affect them. I'm sure I am not the only Representative with this situation. A complete vetting needs to be done so our services can fully assess their gains or losses."

Rep. Hubert of Milton explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

This is just another tax with no way of knowing it will be spent on ambulance services. I vote no.”

Rep. Johnson of South Hero explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes now so I can, with integrity, vote yes to a later amendment to substantially raise Medicaid rates for ambulance services. I vote to move this proposal forward and give time for ambulance services across the state to decide if they would like to be implemented.”

Rep. Lewis of Berlin explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cannot support an assessment on our already stressed municipal budgets, with no guarantee of any sort of reimbursement. 3% on net patient revenues does not take into account the expenditures incurred in the operation of municipal ambulance services, which are already running in the red. This is a twilight zone of an ambulance ride over the abyss.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

How can this body vote for an amendment when we have not been provided the positive or negative financial impact to our communities. Appropriations, Ways and Means, and Healthcare took up this important issue and not one had the resolve to include it in their bills that we debated this past week. That is why I voted no. Thank you.”

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I’m glad we’ve found a way to increase reimbursements for ambulances. The people that serve Vermonters in emergencies have been in a financial crisis for too long.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As the chief of an ambulance department I can tell you first hand that ambulance services in Vermont need additional revenue to sustain the essential services they provide to our constituents, However, voting to create a new tax on the services’ current revenue stream, with \$250,000 of administrative costs in hopes of giving a future Medicaid rate increase is not the right approach. This body controls Medicaid reimbursements and could reprioritize \$1 million dollars of existing revenue to help these essential services if the majority chooses to do so. Thank you.”

Page 46

H.875 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Sheldon of Middlebury and others?

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While this amendment uses money to reprioritize spending there is no offsetting reduction to hospital payments. This means that it will put new and further pressure on us during budget adjustments if hospital utilization stays the same. I support reprioritizing spending into prevention and away from acute care, but I fear that in January instead of reprioritizing spending, we will only increase it due to the new pressure created by this amendment.”

Page 48

H.875 Shall the amendment be substituted?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

How long, how long do Vermonters have to wait? I vote yes on this amendment substitution in an effort to ensure that Vermonters have the fully functioning health insurance exchange that they should have had years ago; sooner rather than later.”

Rep. Carr of Brandon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have constituents with cancelled checks that are getting big bills that claim to be unpaid.

The Health Connect needs to be fixed now and funds can later be found for Dr. Dynasaur, a program I admire and support.”

Rep. Graham of Williamstown explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes for this amendment because I have had to call Health Connect about every two weeks when I get notice that I requested cancellation or non-payment, two bills in one month, neither right. And their response is always “I don’t know why. We show everything is OK.””

Rep. Johnson of South Hero explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I agree that we need to assess Vermont Health Connect to evaluate where to go from here. However, this fly-by-night amendment, because of the federal match money we would lose, would strip that budget of \$2m - \$5m, further destabilizing a struggling system. We can find more sensible funding.”

Rep. Toll of Danville explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My no vote supports responsibly identifying funds that will be net neutral to complete this critical 3rd party analysis of VHC. I cannot support grabbing money and creating a hole in a department’s budget by using committed funds.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermonters are suffering today! Your committees say they are committed to assessing VT Health Connect. An earlier amendment re-appropriated 750K. This amendment uses their language and identifies the money necessary to do it now. Why would we study a new program and continue spending money to repair VT Health Connect until we know if it is salvageable.

Vermonters cannot wait. They have waited long enough!

Thank you.”

Page 49

H.875 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermonters want to know that when their grandmother can no longer care for herself alone, supports will be there to help her live a safe and dignified life. Vermonters want to know that when a neighbor falls victim to addiction, a Department for Children and Families will be there to support the children. And Vermonters want to know that when a carcinogenic pollutant is found in their well, a swift and strong response will ensure they have safe drinking water. For those reasons and thousands more, I vote yes for this budget that slows the rate of growth to under 3%, invests in our prior commitments, and concentrates our resources on the important priorities ALL Vermonters value.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Budgets are value statements. What we value, who we value, is made real with where we put our money.

I stand in support of this budget and all the inclusive hard work of your Appropriations Committee. They addressed so many needs of so many Vermonters, all the while maintaining budget discipline and fiscal responsibility.”

Rep. Rachelson of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill is the result of the invited input from so many in addition to the Appropriations Committee’s work, uses no one time funds and sets up a reserve for the 53rd week of Medicaid costs. It includes many items to make state government more efficient and save tax payers money including changing procurement policies, audit findings policies and audit remediation do policies, which will increase efficiencies and financial savings to Vermonters.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The majority promised to propose a budget that would start bending the curve on spending this year. The House Republican Caucus is committed to preserving a much brighter financial future for Vermont, and contrary to the comments of the Appropriations chair we introduced numerous bills in support of this goal. Disappointingly, you have ignored our cost-cutting measures and decided against making the difficult yet crucial choice to rein in spending.

By increasing general fund spending by 4% or \$58.8 million even though the revenue is projected to grow at a mere 2.2%, this budget will perpetuate the state’s budget problems. The projected budget gap will be in excess of \$30 million for next year. Therefore, I cannot endorse an appropriations bill that will dig even deeper in the pockets of Vermonters to sustain the overspending crisis of the state government.”

Page 50

H.853 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Browning of Arlington?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to require the State to take responsibility for paying the costs of the merger incentives. It is not right to impose those costs on non-merging districts, so that they pay higher property taxes than they otherwise would.”

Page 51

H.853 Shall the rules be suspended to permit consideration of a non-germane amendment?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to allow the House to just consider whether or not the State Board of Education should have the power to dissolve local school boards and force mergers without a vote of the community as Act 46 currently allows.”

Page 52

H.853 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Olsen of Londonderry?

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The House has consistently defended education cost controls to keep pressure in place to lower property taxes for Vermonters, even going past midnight to defend our position for 2017. This amendment would remove all cost controls with no promise of a replacement, so I vote no.”

Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If only this biennium we had done what Vermonters have begged us to do for so many years – conform comprehensively and meaningfully the education funding system.

For, if we had, maybe – just maybe – we wouldn’t be in the desperate search for equity in outcomes. Which will, undoubtedly, lead to a race to mediocrity.”

Page 53

H.876 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Jobs, economic development and infrastructure are why I vote ‘yes’ – moving transportation forward for Vermont!”

Page 54

H.877 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The most important components in efforts to attract business and economic development to our state are (1) an educated and willing workforce, (2) communication infrastructure, (3) presence of an international airport, (4) a well maintained transportation infrastructure. This revenue is vital to the future of Vermont.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill raises more than 11.5 million dollars in new or additional transportation fees. This will increase the burden and cost of living for all hardworking and struggling Vermonters. Many of Vermonters have said loud and clear that it already costs far too much to live in Vermont. Thank you.”

Rep. Young of Glover explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

There is a connection between the Transportation Bill and supporting the funds to do the work. You can’t have one without the other.”

Page 55

H.853 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no despite the several useful components of this bill because it fails to meet the needs of Vermonters. It fails to loosen the merger requirements that are making it difficult for some districts to find partners for consolidation. It fails to remove the threat of forced merger by the State Board of Education that hangs over our school boards. It fails to fully explore possible alternative approaches to the reform and renewal of our education finance system. It fails to hold the state responsible for paying for its own policies, instead shifting those costs onto property taxpayers. H.853 fails Vermonters.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We could have given all Vermont property tax payers a much needed reduction in their property tax rates had this body not modified Act 46 in the early morning hours of January 30, 2016. Thank you.”

Page 56

H.879 Shall the bill be committed to the committee on Human Services?

Rep. Hebert of Vernon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Many people outside this building have little faith in what we do here. Our not following process is a major reason why they don't.”

Rep. Hubert of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill should have been sent to the committee of jurisdiction and not the tax committee.”

Rep. Till of Jericho explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is purely a tax bill. It changes no other policy. Why should it go to the Human Services Committee?”

Rep. Viens of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have never smoked. Twenty four years ago I was married to a smoker. She tried to quit many times with no luck. She died at the age of 42. Cause of death – plaque in main artery near the heart. Not sure if e-cigarettes would have worked to help her stop smoking and we will never know. The Vermont legislature – the best business partner New Hampshire has ever had!”

Page 57

H879 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

All I heard in debate was how bad tobacco is for our health. Yet we have a bill before us that taxes tobacco substitutes, not tobacco, and which its reporter tells us is not about health: ‘It’s purely a tax bill.’”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My vote supports the work of your committee as this issue has been to the Human Services Committee and the evidence and testimony we heard led the committee to include vaping in the bans on public and workplace use we already have in statute for tobacco.

Along with the testimony of physicians I was convinced when I saw the name of the company pushing this product, RJ Reynolds. We have heard their claims about their products’ safety before and so I was convinced to vote for this.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This vote is not about Vermonters’ health. When explaining why the bill did not go to the Health or Human Services committees, said best by the presenter of the bill: this is not a health bill, it is simply a tax bill. A bill that assesses another tax on Vermonters! Thank you.”

Page 58

H. 878 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Browning of Arlington?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because this amendment is our best current opportunity to raise the chances that an independent analysis of Vermont Health Connect will be done and that Vermonters will eventually have a fully functional health insurance exchange.”

Rep. McCoy of Poultney explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no for this amendment putting my full faith in the Chair of Appropriations and her Committee to find funds for this critical independent outside audit of Vermont Health Connect.”

Page 59

H.93 Shall the report of the committee on Human Services be amended as recommended by the committee on Ways and Means?

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Reducing the number of young people who smoke will lower health care spending. Vermont spends \$348 million annually on tobacco related health care including \$87 million in Medicaid expenses. Pregnant women experience adverse maternal fetal and infant outcomes that are negative. Preterm and low weight neonatal infants cost as much as \$63,000. This is not a tax, Mr. Speaker, this is a way to make Vermonters healthier.”

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted No because this revenue strategy will require retailers across the state to perform a labor intensive inventory every year for the next three years. They have no choice on that cost. Vermont's local stores have already been burdened enough. There must be a better way.”

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is a self-imposed tax. If you don't want to pay the tax, don't smoke.”

Rep. Hubert of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no today on H.93 as this is not a health bill but just another tax and anti-business bill. We just prove every day that we do not want small businesses in the state of Vermont.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Day 92 of the session and yet another tax increase. Today's \$2.7 million in tax increases in addition to the numerous others previously approved by this body this session total well over \$50 million in new or additional taxes. Combine this with last year's \$50 million and the grand total for the biennium is well over \$100 million. Vermonters can't afford it! Thank you.”

Page 60

H.93 Shall the report of the committee be amended as offered by Rep. Wright of Burlington?

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support this change but it now becomes inconsistent with the slap on the wrist for misrepresenting one's age to purchase alcohol. That makes no sense, and I cannot support the discrepancy."

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

This vote is one small positive vote for small business and their employees across the state and a recognition that those that set out to break the law should pay a significant fine, rather than a "slap" on the wrist."

Page 61

H.93 Shall the report of the committee on Human Services be amended as offered by Rep. Helm of Fair Haven?

Rep. Bartholomew of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

This is not a bill about supporting young Americans who serve our country in the armed forces. This is a bill about health and about the increased tendency of young people to become dependent on a dangerous product. There is nothing about the physiology, judgement, brain chemistry, or immunity to adverse health effects of military members that would warrant an exemption to Vermont's minimum smoking age."

Page 62

H.93 Shall the bill be amended as recommended by the committee on Human Services as amended?

Rep. Bancroft of Westford explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

When I was much younger I believed that if I could be drafted and sent to war, I should be able to drink. And if there was a 21 age limit on tobacco I would have said the same today. I now look at this issue differently. Individuals under the age of 21 should not be allowed to be in combat. Because I do not think they have fully developed their analytical decision-making capabilities."

Rep. Burditt of West Rutland explained his vote as follows

"Mr. Speaker:

It seems like some of the bills we pass are more parental than responsible legislation. We have adults wanting to and asking to smoke. We are saying 'No!' They will ask why. What is the explanation going to be? We know better..."

Rep. Conner of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support H.93 because I have been a smoker for more years than I care to share. Mr. Speaker, I have an addictive personality and giving up smoking has been the hardest issue I have ever had to do.

Mr. Speaker, if my vote can keep one teenager from starting down this road I will feel a measure of success. I vote for this bill for those struggling with addiction.”

Rep. Cole of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I see H.93 as the removal of human rights, age discrimination of 18-20 year olds. I believe in freedom of choice. To smoke tobacco is not something to be encouraged by anyone of any age; that is why it is a controlled substance and heavily taxed. Funding education reasoning why people of different ages have different but terrible risks, is cost effective to reduce the cost to life and society. Prohibition does not work. In our society at 16 one is considered a legal adult. One can sign contracts, go to war. How dare we make illegal their decision to make the unhealthy decision to smoke.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We have established 18-year-olds as legal adults. The right to make decisions as an adult is only meaningful if it includes the right to make decisions that others consider to be bad decisions, without discrimination based upon the age of the adult in question.”

Rep. Lucke of Hartford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Tobacco use has long been a leading public health issue – nicotine addiction has both short and long term health effects particularly for those who started young. My vote today honors the lives lost to complication of this addiction and is an attempt to break this cycle of addiction for future generations.”

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I could have voted yes for this bill in a heartbeat if there was a carve out for those in the military because I can't bring myself to say to them thanks for your services full well knowing they have made a decision to put their life on the line, **for** me to be able to debate this bill on the floor and preserve our freedom and, in the same breath say but you can't have a cigarette if you want to. That's why I voted no.”

Rep. Morris of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote for this bill as a symbol of strength and solidarity with Vermont's youth who are inundated with messages and influences that drive them to use tobacco. We owe them more and must do whatever we can to ensure they do not have to lose their lives to preventable diseases. Fortunately, our state has committed to providing FREE quit tools for all Vermonters who still use tobacco."

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes for Louise Poirier Randall."

Rep. Till of Jericho explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Make no mistake, H.93 is a health bill. Right now alive in Vermont, according to the CDC, there are 31,500 kids who will become addicted to tobacco. Ten thousand of those kids will die a premature death due to tobacco. H.93 could reduce this number by half.

This is also a fiscally conservative bill. H.93 has the potential to cut by half the \$348 million Vermonters spend on diseases caused by tobacco, every year."

Rep. Zagar of Barnard explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes, because I don't believe that young people with developing brains should be smoking a substance that is addictive, physically harmful, and that adversely affects their developing brains."

Page 63

H.93 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Helm of Fair Haven and Rep. McCormack of Burlington?

Rep. Martel of Waterford explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes on this amendment. My brother served in Vietnam with the Marines. He was 19 years old when he was sent to serve on the front line. He was asked before going overseas if he smoked, he said yes. They asked him what he smoked, his answer – Marlboros – is there anything else. He said it was his comfort zone."

Page 64

H.865 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Johnson of South Hero and Rep. Lippert of Hinesburg?

Rep. Buxton of Tunbridge explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

A thorough analysis of the functionality and long-term sustainability of Vermont Health Connect will be of great value to this body as we fulfill our duty to taxpayers and Vermont Health Connect users. It was worth the long wait to ensure this analysis could be adequately funded and answers the important questions before us.”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I can save this body \$400k. Vermont Health Connect doesn’t work.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes to once again support the independent analysis of the Vermont Health Connect System. However, the funding should have been funded in the Appropriations Bill and not in this convoluted fashion. This has been too important for too long!”

Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I suspect many of my constituents could give you an analysis of Vermont Health Connect for no money at all – just a few coarse words – I support this independent analysis because we must instill greater faith in our government from Vermonters. Most importantly it uses money already approved by the House – a state budget already too high for my liking.”

Rep. Trieber of Rockingham explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I wholeheartedly support the independent study of Vermont Health Connect. As this amendment will overwhelmingly pass, I must stand on principle. I cannot, in good conscience, support additional spending on Vermont Health Connect that doesn’t come from within the existing Department of Vermont Health Access all funds budget of \$1.2 billion.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Republicans are, and have been, committed to restoring healthcare independence for Vermonters. This study is a move in the right direction toward developing a path forward that will allow greater access to more affordable healthcare plans. Using a bill that is not relevant to VT Health Connect is concerning. But, today, putting aside politics in Vermonters’ best interest is the right thing to do! Thank you.”

Page 65

H.865 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. McCullough of Williston explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote Yes! Everybody has to have a habitat and quality, affordable, accessible healthcare as a human right.”

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I wish to thank all Committees of Jurisdiction for advancing H.865 and the positive effects which will result from this Economic/Workforce/Housing initiative for Vermont. I vote Yes.”

Page 68

H.870 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Marcotte of Coventry and others?

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote ‘yes’ in an effort to bring full transparency to the Vermont Dispatch issue. This is vital to my city of Rutland as well as every city and town in Vermont.”

Page 69

H.870 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Turner of Milton?

Rep. Berry of Manchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no on the amendment because I want to be able to tell the citizens from tiny Sandgate in my district (that receives only 2.2% service) that fees for broadband and the Telecom Bill will help bring their town the long awaited service they deserve.”

Rep. Conquest of Newbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Whether it’s telecomm or transportation or toothpaste, if you want it you have to pay for it. You simply can’t separate the two. To support something, want it for your district, but vote against the funding whether it’s a fee or tax, seems like a political calculation rather than a statement about what you believe in.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I hear from the majority that ensuring every Vermonter has access to high speed/broadband internet is a top priority. However, a 1.5 billion dollar budget passed this body a few weeks ago without \$1 in it to support this priority. I’m not aware of a comprehensive plan or any other

financial commitment by this legislature to achieve this priority. This is just another tax on hardworking Vermonters! Adding to the \$100 million tax and fee burdens already approved this biennium by this body. Thank you.”

Page 70

H.870 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Botzow of Pownal explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Connectivity is essential to our future. I want all Vermonters to have that opportunity.”

Rep. Graham of Williamstown explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because some of us care if people can buy food, medicines, heating oil, etc., and I guess the rest of us don’t.”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Of course those of us who oppose this bill support broadband expansion. We also support expanding coverage in a fiscally responsible manner. Given the case before the AG’s office we have good reason to be wary.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Seeing the photo of draft horses pulling fiber optic cable up a hillside inaccessible by any other means illustrates how difficult a proposition building out broadband is. Trying to do it without funding makes it impossible. I vote for broadband expansion and the funding to do it.”

Page 71

H458 Shall the House concur in the Senate proposal?

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

At a time when many states are putting up barriers to vote, we should be proud that not only are we making voting easier – we have passed this bill with just one member of the general assembly voting against it. Thank you all for supporting this important change.”

Page 72

H.R.16 Shall the bill be committed to the committee on Commerce and Economic Development as moved by Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe?

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted ‘no’ because Donald Trump is against our unfair trade agreements.”

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My parents, now deceased, stood on a picket line against NAFTA, proudly. I vote yes so that House Commerce can get to the bottom of TPP.”

Rep. Tate of Mendon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I support sending this resolution to the Commerce Committee, I believe more so that this matter falls firmly within the purview of Messrs. Leahy, Sanders and Welch – the delegation Vermonters have elected and sent to Washington to address these and other national and global concerns. It is my hope that this body spends the next few weeks focused solely on the good governance of the State of Vermont.”

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The Trans-Pacific Partnership has been in the news for several years. As legislators who are or should be aware of issues like this, I would hope that consideration of this resolution by our Commerce and Economic Development Committee will be swift, and that we will have an opportunity to vote on it before we adjourn.”

Page 73

S.225 Shall the amendment offered by Rep. Poirier of Barre City be substituted for the amendment offered by Rep. Till of Jericho?

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As best as I can tell from the debate, we should be lowering the BAC limit to 0.05 for all drivers. However, lowering it only for those with detectable traces of psychoactive drugs is not justified by the evidence. Only lowering it for delta-9 makes even less sense – but that is no the amendment before us.”

Rep Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because we had a chance to send a message to the public that we are serious about drug driving. Instead we chose to give lip service to the drug driving problem in Vermont.”

Page 74

S.174 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill is an unneeded overreach of state power. Not only are we spending more taxpayer money without need, we are preparing to establish a police policy without cause.”

Rep. Lippert of Hinesburg explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

A model policy for law enforcement use of body cameras must reflect the appropriate balance between protecting the needs of law enforcement and protecting the privacy needs of Vermont citizens. Such a balance can be achieved. Achieving this balance requires not only review by the appropriate legislative committees, but also requires review and final approval of the full legislature.”

Rep. McCullough of Williston explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. I see a significant opportunity for losses of civil liberties without guarantee of legislative oversight of the proposed recommendations. I hope to support an amended version for 3rd reading speaking to this serious flaw.”

Page 75

S.20 Shall the House propose to the Senate to amend as recommended by House committee on Human Services as amended?

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

There are many aspects of this bill that will improve dental care for all Vermonters and especially low income Vermonters. On third reading I'll have an amendment to address my concern of therapists practicing with no licensed dentist on site.”

Page 76

S.230 Shall the House propose to amend the bill as recommended by the committee on Natural Resources and Energy as amended?

Rep. Strong of Albany explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Thank you. This is a good first step in the process of towns having a bigger voice in the energy projects that are proposed in their communities. This bill brings more balance to the discussion and gives more power to communities to determine what is in their best interests. Again, thank you to the committee chair and his committee for their efforts.”

Page 77

S.55 Shall the House propose to the Senate to amend sections 5 through 17 and 18(b) only?

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is yet another increase in the cost of living in Vermont. A half penny increase on Vermonters’ telephone service including voice cell phone bills doesn’t seem like much. However, combine this with the \$98.6 million in increased taxes and fees already passed by this body this biennium and it is unbearable for many struggling hardworking Vermonters. Enough is enough Mr. Speaker. Thankfully the end is in sight. Thank you.”

Rep. Young of Glover explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill provides much needed funding for broadband that my constituents and rural Vermont have been crying out for. We will not leave them behind.”

Page 79

S.243 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I thank the committee on their work of vital importance to my city of Rutland and other cities and town across Vermont. I vote yes!”

Page 82

H.858 Shall the House propose to the Senate to amend the bill as offered by Rep. Conquest of Newbury and others in the first instance only?

Rep. Bartholomew of Hartland explained his vote as follow:

“Mr. Speaker:

There are strong arguments on both sides of the marijuana legalization issue. After much reading, many conversations, and considerable thought, I've concluded that all of the arguments presented by proponents and opponents are largely irrelevant. We've been fighting the drug war for over 100 years. It is clear to me that prohibition has not worked and never will. It's time to try something else.

Rep. Berry of Manchester explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Prohibition of cannabis is bad for Vermont. Legalization needs to be the goal for our state. The Black Market in cannabis sales needs to be eradicated. Eighty thousand Vermonters should be able to legally use marijuana. That said, I voted yes on the amendment because the Senate bill is not ready for prime time. The bill is unwieldy and cumbersome. Legalization should happen. Marijuana needs to become legal but I believe the commercialization of marijuana needs to be vetted further. Commercialization concerns me. Prohibition is not the answer but neither is S.241. Legalization needs to be done the Vermont way, smartly, to scale. I support legalizing home grown."

Rep. Chesnut-Tangerman of Middletown Springs explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Last week I was discussing this issue with a retired New York City police officer, who was arguing against legalization. I asked him what percentage of the domestic violence calls involved alcohol. He replied, '90%, easily.' I asked what percent involved marijuana. He laughed and said you go up there and do what's right."

Rep. Grad of Moretown explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

My vote to strike S.241 is a vote against creating a large scale commercial market that does not allow for small scale growing for personal use or does not further the role of small growers and community supported agriculture. S.241 is not the Vermont way."

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I vote no, which in fact, Mr. Speaker, is a yes vote for the legalization of marijuana! Long overdue!!"

Rep. Rachelson of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

On the one hand, I support the concept of legalization but the lack of time that the House has had compared to the Senate to fully vet S.241 and address some of the concerns I have had with implementation of it is problematic. On the other hand, wasting our tax dollars and resources on enforcement and continuing to make felons out of people who are over 21 and privately using is unacceptable."

H.858 Amendment as offered by Rep. Conquest of Newbury be amended as offered by Rep. Turner of Milton?

Rep. Buxton of Tunbridge explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

There’s no better way to give voice to the voters than to speak with them directly. My constituents expect me to take the time to query, question, and consult with them on a regular basis.

Asking Vermonters to excuse us from this duty is self-indulgent. Our work should be about them, not us.”

Rep. Copeland Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Here’s how I would have asked the questions:

‘Should Vermont create a legalized and regulated market place for marijuana?’ and ‘Should Vermonters be allowed to legally grow marijuana for adult consumption?’

Furthermore, if the intention was to gauge public support for legalization of marijuana, I would ask the questions at the November election.”

Rep. Lucke of Hartford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We need more time and more work to vet the question of legalization to get it right for Vermont. For example, I am particularly concerned given the shortage of prevention and treatment professionals in our state to do the current work not to mention the potential work in our communities and schools. The shortage of licensed addiction providers in Vermont is evident by the wait lists for treatment and the long recruiting cycles it takes to find these professionals. A quick scan of electronic ‘want ads’ today shows seven Vermont employers looking for LADCs in communities all over the state including Burlington, Vergennes, Montpelier, Morrisville and Windsor.

While I am uneasy with decriminalization I fully support youth education and prevention, the advisory commission and the workforce study committee. We need to get this right for Vermont and the legislature needs to do the work.”

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I regularly consult with my Rutland City constituents and have discussed my overall concerns on this issue.

I vote no.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Should Vermont legalize marijuana for recreational use? Why would a legislator oppose allowing their constituents to vote on this question? I believe that Vermonters deserve the right to have their voice heard on this issue. Thank you.”

Rep. Webb of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Only 12% of registered voters voted in the 2012 primary compared to 65% in the general. The general election would have been the more appropriate time for such a question.”

Page 84

H.858 Shall the House propose to the Senate to amend the bill as recommended by Rep. Conquest of Newbury in Section 10 and 11 only?

Rep. Berry of Manchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Decriminalization of 2 marijuana plants is not much to ask. I am glad to have voted for this amendment. We need to work toward legalization in a thoughtful, safe, manner. No criminalization is a good step in that direction.”

Rep. Christie of Hartford explained his vote as follows;

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. I spent a half hour last night with my chief of police and his direct comment to me was ‘We are not ready.’ We spoke about the families affected by this and we still have so much to learn. I have a great deal of respect for the work he has done in his short tenure, such as 2 officers adopting each school. This is not a solution.”

Rep. Cupoli of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have taken the time to speak with my school superintendents, principals and teachers in my community as well as law enforcement. You have met members from Project Vision in Rutland who have worked to make our community a safe place to live and work. Introducing another component to an already stressed state is wrong – I vote no.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Disappointing outcome. So much for Vermont’s reputation as a liberal state. Continuing to label Vermonters as criminals for small use and possession of weed (pot) is backward outdated policy.”

Rep. Martel of Waterford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no on this bill: human nature is to always want more!! We allow 2 plants then they want four, before you know it everyone has their field of dreams in their backyard. What a great example for our young generation to grow up with.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We as a body have debated this issue of legalizing or decriminalization of marijuana for the past five hours. We sliced and diced this discussion through amendments, questions and answers, assumptions and statistics from everywhere. At this point I would contend that we have no idea what the consequences are in this piece of legislation, should we pass it. The ‘devil is always in the details’ and we have no idea what those details are.

This piece of legislation is too important to decide on the fly, whether you are in favor or not. The committees of jurisdiction need to have time to complete the appropriate due process in order to pass or not pass this controversial piece of legislation.”

Rep. O’Sullivan of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because it is time we recognize reality as opposed to prohibition fantasies. I believe adult Vermonters have a right to grow their own, just like they brew their own.”

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no for the children. We can’t cure a drug problem with another drug problem.”

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My concern with this legislation is over burdens placed on Vermont law enforcement. I believe a more thorough study of this topic needs to be accomplished.

Although a workplace study and an advisory commission are included, I must vote ‘no’ as this legislation is proposed.”

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have a lot of concerns regarding legalization of marijuana including how it is done, how we keep it out of the hands of young people, what effect it will have on our highways, and other issues of control and enforcement. That said, I have listened to the debate on this amendment, and I believe there are legitimate arguments for and against decriminalization. Decriminalization is not legalization, and I think the arguments for outweigh those against.”

Rep. Zagar of Barnard explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

With the results of this vote, the Vermont legislature has decided to keep one foot firmly planted in the Nixon era.”

Page 85

H.858 Shall the House propose to the Senate to amend the bill as recommended by Rep. Conquest of Newbury in all remaining instances of amendment?

Rep. Dakin of Chester explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am appreciative of the work done by the Judiciary committee. Today I have gained a better insight in the issues.

Section 9 I believe is well crafted, covers many of the areas relating to outreach and education, and I must echo the member from Hartford’s concerns about the lack of resources available today in our schools to carry out important subsections in Section 9 of this amendment.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support the remaining parts of this amendment but I cannot support any bill without having a source of funding identified.”

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because how much it costs and where the money is coming from are unanswered questions. This is poor budgeting.”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

By refusing to legalize marijuana, or even decriminalize it, we honor the darkness where cannabis currently resides. In the shadows, our children will continue to buy illegal drugs, and we will continue to refuse to shine a light on the need to control this substance for the safety of all.”

Rep. Till of Jericho explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. No other time this session can I remember us passing a bill with an expenditure which did not go to the Appropriations committee and did not have a source of revenue to pay

for that expenditure identified by the Ways and Means committee. It is not a good way for this body to operate.”

Page 86

H.873 Shall the report of the committee of conference be adopted?

Rep. Hooper of Montpelier explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes on this bill to support our weatherization program. It keeps Vermonters warm and healthy in their homes while saving money.

It shifts the existing tax structure so that when fuel prices spike Vermonters will pay less than they do today.”

Rep. McCormack of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I wish that we were voting on a carbon tax tonight but instead we are voting on a very small tax increase that amounts to about \$4/year for the average Vermont household, for one of the best programs we have that lowers heat bills for low income Vermonters, reduces the state’s carbon footprint and employs skilled Vermont workers instead of purchasing imported fossil fuels.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My vote affirms the tough decisions and wise investments in Vermonters, such as weatherization. Not only will this help address the reality of a warming planet but will help bring comfort to the less fortunate living in older housing stock. I appreciate how the committee did not shirk their responsibility to raise the funds necessary to do the people’s business.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is a carbon tax! \$49 million in new taxes and fees this session and a total of over \$98.6 million this biennium. Vermonters cannot afford any more! Thank you.”

Page 87

H.533 Shall the report of the committee of conference be adopted?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The underlying bill about crime victim notification is certainly worthy of passage. But the unrelated material about the animal welfare board added in conference has not been vetted by the up to four House committees that should have been able to evaluate it, and there is no funding to pay for the Board or the Correctional Program. Even well-intentioned proposals must be vetted. To vote yes disrespects the very House procedures we are so often directed to uphold.”

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because I have heard from my constituents the same issue raised by the member from Hartland. Also, Mr. Speaker, for the Senate to threaten to not pass the Education yield bill is asinine.”

Rep. Webb of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because I don't want victims of violence to be pawns in end of session chess games.”

Page 88

H.872 Shall the report of the committee of conference be adopted?

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It's unfortunate that innocent small brokers trying to help Vermonters plan for their financial future are being caught up in the EB-5 dragnet - especially when their registration prohibits involvement in such private placements. I hope in the future the committee can look at making a distinction between resident and non-resident license fees the way we do for insurance agents. Especially since the vast majority of their regulation is done by FINRA, a federal regulatory body.”

Rep. Till of Jericho explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes. This fee bill raises nearly \$27 million with almost \$24 million coming from outside of Vermont. That \$24 million will cose Vermonters nothing.”

Re. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Fees are not taxes and taxes are not fees! Well, that is true unless the legislature changes the law to make taxes appear to be fees as is the case in this bill. \$20.80 million in new taxes that are now classified as fees. Maybe we could have used this money to reduce the tax burden on hard working Vermonters! Thank you.”

Page 89

H.875 Shall the report of the committee of conference be adopted?

Rep. Johnson of South Hero explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This budget supports our communities with increases to our child care providers, designated agencies, Home Health agencies, Parent Child Centers, ambulance services, state colleges and courts. We reduce property tax pressure with increased PILOT payments and fully funding the Education Fund transfer. We fully fund the Pay Act, increase payments to primary care and set \$1.2 million aside for anticipated needs. All within 2.4% growth rate. I’m proud to vote yes.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I proudly vote yes to support this appropriations bill. I salute you, Mr. Speaker, for your leadership and guidance these past 8 years. And to you my legislative family, I bid you good night, good health and good luck.”

Rep. Savage of Swanton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Increasing general fund spending by 4.8% or \$71.0 million even though the revenue is projected to grow a mere 2.2%, this bill will perpetuate the state’s structured budget problems. The projected budget gap is currently in excess of \$30 million for next year. Therefore I cannot endorse an appropriations bill that will dig even deeper in the pockets of Vermonters to sustain the overspending crisis of state government.”

Rep. Toll of Danville explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes to support funding that will benefit my community and all Vermont communities. Without this budget critical funding would not be available to support all Vermonters, including our children, senior citizens and veterans.”

Page 90

S.260 Shall the rules be suspended?

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If members are looking for an obstructionist – look at the Governor who vetoed S.230. This session was called to address his vetos we ought to deal with that first, before starting a brand new process on a brand new bill.”

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is a sad vote. Minority leadership has decided to obstruct a simple technical solution supported by almost everyone to negate a 142-0 vote in this House. It pains me on what I thought was my last day to see the Senate act with speed and courage to fix a simple problem and watch planned partisan obstruction thwart that result.”

Rep. Jewett of Ripton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

With a veto of S.230 on our desks, now is the time to remember that politics is about what is possible. S.260 presents what is possible and avoids ending the day in an all or nothing position.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The minority party has a role and legislative rules are intended to protect the voices of the few, so that the majority cannot silence them. We have now been forced to test these rules. Our Caucus has stood strong to protect the voices of Vermonters and the integrity of the state’s legislative process. Introducing a new and unvetted bill with modified language, and expecting to pass it in a few hours, sets a bad precedent, and circumvents our legislative process – a process designed to allow all parties, not just special interests, to be heard.”

Rep. Willhoit of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Fool me once, shame on you. Fool me twice shame on me. On the last day of this year’s session, we were presented with S.230 after our caucus’ deadline to suspend rules. Nonetheless, after being directly told by Democratic leadership and the Administration that this compromise would be accepted and not vetoed, my caucus agreed to suspend rules. The reality is...we were lied to. I was told when I first became a member that, despite party, you can trust what is said by a member in this building. As of May 6th, that trust was broken. Despite that trust being broken, I am being asked to believe this new bill, just introduced, does not interfere with the intent and substance of S.230. You have lost my trust. I vote no.”

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Voting not to suspend rules to take up this bill that clarifies and removes all objections to S.230 that prompted the Governor’s veto is pure politics of obstruction. We have a chance to make a good bill better, but we are prevented from doing so just to score political points.”

Page 91

H. 601 Shall the House committee on Education be relieved and the same be committed to the House committee on Ways and Means?

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This will give us an opportunity to decide whether we will leave a veto in place with no corrective action – or – allow ourselves to pass a good siting bill that will allow increased local input.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker;

We were asked back to Montpelier, presumably to cast a vote to sustain or override the Governor’s veto. So far we have done everything but that. Now we apparently are into parliamentary maneuvers. Vermonters deserve better than this.”

Page 92

S.260 Shall the rules be suspended?

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

OK, quick history. In May, there is an agreement to a very watered down bill to gain a “no veto” commitment. Now, we are to be strong-armed into just a teeny bit more dilution? I draw a line on bullying and this is it.”

Rep. Graham of Williamstown explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. I was called here today to vote on a veto. After 7 hours we have not been allowed to vote on that issue. We just keep playing games so the few can get their way. This is not democracy, it is a dictatorship.”

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because I fear the governor may veto this bill again which would cost the state even more money when we would need to come back.”

Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am hopeful that now these political shenanigans will come to an end and we will have the opportunity to finally vote to override or sustain the governor’s veto of S.230. After all, that is what we were called in for. So let’s do our job and go home.”

Page 93

H.518 Shall the bill pass the failure of the Governor to sign notwithstanding?

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted NO and I’m not changing my vote!”
