<u>Whereas</u>, Dr. Steven John earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from Occidental College, a master's degree in education at Antioch Graduate School New England and, more recently, a doctorate in education leadership, policy, and assessment at the University of Massachusetts, and

<u>Whereas</u>, he started his career as an educator, serving in the Peace Corps as a math and science teacher stationed in Malaysia, and

<u>Whereas</u>, on returning to the United States, his first job was at the Whitingham School, originally from 1973–1990, and later from 1993–1999, and

<u>Whereas</u>, during his years at the Whitingham School, Steven John taught in the classroom, served as the middle school coordinator, then principal, was named the University of Vermont's Outstanding Educator (1985), and implemented an inclusive town meeting form of school governance, and

<u>Whereas</u>, during a three-year hiatus (1990–1993) at the Phillips Middle School in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, Steven John taught science and coached the winning team at a regional Science Olympiad, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in 1999, Steven John assumed a new position as the Leland & Gray Middle School's principal, where he supervised curriculum innovations, including the introduction of a course in Chinese, advised on a successful building addition, implemented waste recycling building-wide, improved nutrition in the school's cafeteria, and oversaw the installation of an information system enabling parents to review students' homework, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Steven John served as president of the Vermont Association for Middle Level Education and has many other professional affiliations, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in 2009, after completing his doctoral degree, Dr. Steven John was appointed superintendent of the Windham Central Supervisory Union (WCSU) and has provided expert guidance to all of its schools, and

<u>Whereas</u>, since 2002, Steven John has served ably as Marlboro Town Moderator, having previously held the office of town auditor, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in 2016, Dr. Steven John is concluding his outstanding leadership tenure at WCSU, now therefore be it
