6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require opioid
7	treatment programs authorized by the Department of Health to report to the

12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 4283(b) is amended to read:
14	(b)(1) As required by the Department, every dispenser who is licensed by
15	the Vermont Board of Pharmacy shall report to the Department in a timely
16	manner data for each controlled substance in Schedules II, III, and IV, as
17	amended and as may be amended, dispensed to a patient within Vermont.
18	Reporting Except as provided in subdivision (2) of this subsection, reporting
19	shall not be required for:
20	(1)(A) a drug administered directly to a patient; or

1	(2)(B) a drug dispensed by a health care provider at a facility licensed
2	by the Department, provided that the quantity dispensed is limited to an
3	amount adequate to treat the patient for a maximum of 48 hours.
4	(2) A health care provider shall report dispensing directly to a patient of
5	an opioid treatment program authorized by the Department pursuant to
6	subdivision 4752(4)(A) of this title any amount of methadone or medication
7	containing buprenorphine when it is initially dispensed and when there is a
8	change in the amount or type of substance dispensed.
