8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to establish a
9	program to set aside five moose permits for Vermonters who have served in
10	any branch of the U.S. Armed Forces.
11	An act relating to moose permits for veterans of the U.S. Armed Forces
12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. 10 V.S.A. § 4254 is amended to read:
14	§ 4254. FISHING AND HUNTING LICENSES; ELIGIBILITY, DESIGN,
15	DISTRIBUTION, SALE, AND ISSUE
16	* * *
17	(i)(1) If the Board establishes a moose hunting season, up to five moose
18	permits shall be set aside to be auctioned. The moose permits set aside for
19	auction shall be in addition to the number of annual moose permits authorized
20	by the Board. The Board shall adopt rules necessary for the Department to

1	establish, implement, and run the auction process. The Commissioner annually
2	may establish a minimum dollar amount of not less than \$1,500.00 for any
3	winning bid for a moose permit auctioned under this subdivision. Proceeds
4	from the auction shall be deposited in the Fish and Wildlife Fund and used for
5	conservation education programs run by the Department. Successful bidders
6	must have a Vermont hunting or combination license in order to purchase a
7	moose permit.
8	(2) If the Board establishes a moose hunting season, there shall be
9	established a program to set aside five moose permits for Vermont residents
10	who have served on active duty in any branch of the U.S. Armed Forces of the
11	United States and who have been awarded or are eligible to receive a campaign
12	ribbon for Operation Iraqi Freedom or Operation Enduring Freedom. The
13	Department of Fish and Wildlife shall adopt a procedure to implement the
14	set-aside program for veterans who have been awarded or are eligible to
15	receive a campaign ribbon for Operation Iraqi Freedom or Operation Enduring
16	Freedom, including a method to award applicants preference points and a
17	method by which veterans who applied for but failed to receive a permit in one
18	hunting season are awarded priority in the subsequent moose hunting season.
19	The procedure adopted under this subdivision shall be consistent with the
20	preference system for the permit auction authorized under subdivision (1) of
21	this subsection. Veterans awarded a moose permit under this subsection must

1	possess a valid Vermont hunting or combination license in order to purchase a
2	moose permit. The Department of Fish and Wildlife shall coordinate with the
3	Department of Veterans Affairs Office of Veterans Affairs to provide notice to
4	eligible veterans of the moose permits set-aside under this subsection.
