6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require towns
7	to collect civil process fees for constables and remit 15 percent of the fee to the
8	State Treasurer for deposit into the General Fund.

10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. 32 V.S.A. § 1591 is amended to read:
12	§ 1591. SHERIFFS AND OTHER OFFICERS
13	There shall be paid to sheriffs' departments and constables in civil causes
14	and to sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, and constables for the transportation and care
15	of prisoners, juveniles, and patients with a mental condition or psychiatric
16	disability the following fees:
17	(1) Civil process:

19	(C)(i) All civil process to be served by a sheriff or deputy sheriff
20	shall be directed to their respective sheriff's department for service. The

1	sheriff shall assign civil process to personnel within the department to ensure
2	that process is completed in a timely and orderly manner. All payments for
3	service of civil process shall be made to the sheriff's department. A sheriff or
4	deputy sheriff shall not be entitled to fees paid for service of process nor shall a
5	sheriff receive fees or payment in lieu of fees for civil process, except payment
6	for actual and necessary expenses. A sheriff may appoint deputy sheriffs and
7	establish compensation for service of civil process.
8	(D)(ii) The Executive Director of the Department of State's
9	Attorneys and Sheriffs shall develop a uniform reporting system to reflect:
10	(i)(I) Civil civil process received by a sheriff's department;
11	(ii)(II) Payments payments made to a sheriff's department for
12	service including fees and reimbursements;
13	(iii)(III) Payments payments made by the sheriff's department to
14	deputy sheriffs for serving process; and

17	(E)(iii) Quarterly, 15 percent of the gross civil process fees received
18	by a sheriff's department during that quarter shall be forwarded to the State

20	(D)(i) All civil process to be served by a constable shall be directed

Sec. 2. 24 V.S.A. § 1936a is amended to read:

## § 1936a. CONSTABLES; POWERS AND QUALIFICATIONS

- (a) A town may vote at a special or annual town meeting to prohibit constables from exercising any law enforcement authority or from exercising the service of civil or criminal process.
- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, constables may perform the following duties:
- (1) the service of civil or criminal process, under 12 V.S.A. § 691; [Repealed.]

## Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

This act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
