15	The general assembly General Assembly finds that:

17	(5) A temporary suspension of the granting of any certificate of need for
18	a new home health agency is warranted for the following reasons:
19	(A) to measure the impact of the statewide certificate of need granted
20	to a for-profit home health agency; and

2	certificate of need law and engage in long-term planning in this complex and
3	increasingly important area of health care services; and
4	(C) to allow time for the Executive Branch and the Green Mountain
5	Care Board to implement health care reform initiatives such as accountable
6	care organizations and an all-payer model, which will likely have a significant
7	impact on home health agencies and the rest of Vermont's health care delivery
8	system.
