<u>Whereas</u>, afterschool and summer learning programs keep children safe, inspire learning, create jobs, and help working families, and

<u>Whereas</u>, numerous organizations in Vermont provide afterschool and summer learning programs for kindergarten through grade 12, and

<u>Whereas</u>, high-quality afterschool and summer learning programs are typically based on collaborations of schools and partners, including community groups, libraries, organizations serving youths, and recreation departments, and

<u>Whereas</u>, according to Vermont Afterschool, Inc., more than 24 percent (21,690) of Vermont students in kindergarten through 12th grade participate in afterschool programs, and 33 percent of those who are not enrolled would participate if more programs were available and accessible, and

Whereas, afterschool and summer learning programs provide students with summer meals, afterschool suppers, healthy snacks, and physical activity, and

<u>Whereas</u>, many full- and part-time jobs across the State, including important work experience opportunities for high school youths especially in Vermont's rural communities, are attributable to these programs, and

<u>Whereas</u>, a sizeable number of surveyed 5th through 12th graders reported a sense of belonging in their afterschool program, and

<u>Whereas</u>, participation in afterschool programs designed to build skills in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics has proven beneficial for students, and

<u>Whereas</u>, according to the Youth Risk Behavior Survey, Vermont high school students who participate in afterschool activities (up to 19 hours per week) are less likely to consume alcohol, use illegal drugs, or be in a physical fight than those students not similarly enrolled, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Vermont's PreK–16 Council's Working Group on Expanded Learning Opportunities documented that every \$1.00 invested in afterschool programs saves Vermonters \$2.18 in the future by increasing students' earning potential, improving performance at school, and reducing crime, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the State's schools and communities are able to leverage important federal funding for afterschool and summer learning programs, and

<u>Whereas</u>, educators, advocates, parents, and students involved in these programs are in Montpelier today to celebrate their work and to continue learning about best practices for their respective programs, now therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly designates February 16, 2017 as Afterschool Day at the State House, and be it further
