7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to remove all
8	criminal and civil penalties for possession of two ounces or less of marijuana
9	and cultivation of two mature marijuana plants and seven immature marijuana
10	plants for a person who is 21 years of age or older; adjust the civil and criminal
11	penalties for possession and cultivation of marijuana in amounts in excess of
12	the legalized amounts; establish civil penalties for consuming marijuana in
13	public and cultivating marijuana in a manner that is not on property lawfully in
14	possession of the cultivator or without the consent of the person in lawful
15	possession of the property or outside an enclosure that is screened from public
16	view; establish criminal penalties and a civil action for damages for furnishing
17	marijuana to a person under 21 years of age; and establish a crime of chemical
18	extraction of marijuana.
19 20	An act relating to possession and cultivation of marijuana by a person 21 years of age or older

1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
2	Sec. 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT; CIVIL AND CRIMINAL PENALTIES
3	It is the intent of the General Assembly to eliminate all penalties for
4	possession of two ounces or less of marijuana for a person who is 21 years of
5	age or older while retaining the current criminal penalties for possession of
6	larger amounts of marijuana and criminal penalties for unauthorized dispensing
7	or sale of marijuana. This act also retains civil penalties for possession of
8	marijuana by a person under 21 years of age, which are the same as for
9	possession of alcohol by a person under 21 years of age.

12	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

1	(1)(A) No person shall knowingly and unlawfully possess more than one
2	ounce of marijuana or more than five grams of hashish or cultivate marijuana.

5	knowingly and unlawfully possessing more than one ounce two ounces of
6	marijuana or more than five 10 grams of hashish or cultivating more than two
7	mature marijuana plants and seven immature marijuana plants shall be
8	imprisoned not more than two years six months or fined not more than

- (5) If a court fails to provide the defendant with notice of collateral consequences in accordance with 13 V.S.A. § 8005(b) and the defendant later at any time shows that the plea and conviction for a violation of this subsection may have or has had a negative consequence, the court, upon the defendant's motion, shall vacate the judgment and permit the defendant to withdraw the plea or admission and enter a plea of not guilty. Failure of the court to advise the defendant of a particular collateral consequence shall not support a motion to vacate.

8	State shall reimburse the person at state State expense.
9	(e)(1) A law enforcement officer is authorized to detain a person if:
10	(A) the officer has reasonable grounds to believe the person has
11	violated this section; and
12	(B) the person refuses to identify himself or herself satisfactorily to
13	the officer when requested by the officer.
14	(2) The person may be detained only until the person identifies himself
15	or herself satisfactorily to the officer or is properly identified. If the officer is
16	unable to obtain the identification information, the person shall forthwith be
17	brought before a judge in the Criminal Division of the Superior Court for that
18	purpose. A person who refuses to identify himself or herself to the Court on
19	request shall immediately and without service of an order on the person be
