10	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to change the
11	name of the legal holiday from Columbus Day to Indigenous Peoples' Day.
12	An act relating to Indigenous Peoples' Day
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS
15	The General Assembly of the State of Vermont finds:
16	(1) Indigenous Peoples' Day was originally proposed in 1977 by a
17	delegation of Native Nations to the International Conference on Discrimination
18	Against Indigenous Populations in the Americas.

1	(2) Many cities and towns in the United States have recognized
2	Columbus Day as "Indigenous Peoples' Day," to highlight and celebrate
3	indigenous heritage and resiliency.
4	(3) The General Assembly recognizes and values the historic, cultural
5	contemporary significance of the Indigenous peoples of the lands that later
6	became known as the Americas, which includes Vermont.
7	(4) Vermont was founded and built upon lands first inhabited by the
8	Abenaki people and their ancestors and allies, and Vermont honors these
9	members of the public, both past and present.
