#### 1 § 102. GENERAL POWERS

Thereafter all terms shall run for two years beginning on October 1. <u>Appointments to vacated positions shall run until the expiration of the existing</u> term. The Planning Commission shall perform such planning functions and duties as may be required by the City Council, this chapter, ordinances, or applicable State laws.
