S.40 (Vetoed). Minimum wage

This bill would have increased the minimum wage from \$10.50 to \$15.00 by January 1, 2024. It also would have established a minimum wage for secondary school students of \$3.00 less than the standard minimum wage rate, and would have provided that a tip is the sole property of the employee who receives it unless he or she were participating in a tip pool with other tipped employees. The bill would also have required the Commissioner for Children and Families to amend the federal Child Care and Development Fund State Plan to adjust the benefits and market rate for the Child Care Financial Assistance Program in relation to increases in the minimum wage and would have required the Office of Legislative Council and the Joint Fiscal Office to prepare a report regarding potential mechanisms for indexing the minimum wage for inflation after 2024.
