## Health Care Share: A Farm to Patient Collaboration

The Vermont Famers Food Center (VFFC), in alliance with local and state partners, began the VFFC Health Care Share (HCS) initiative in Rutland County in 2015. In 2016 the VFFC HCS expanded from 75 to 125 shares for 15 weeks, partnered with one new farm and employed 8 youth in Rutland County.

- The Health Care Share provides Rutland County families and individuals facing food-insecurity and chronic diet-related illnesses with 12-14 pounds of locally grown farm-fresh food and nutrition education.
- Families are identified by Primary Care Providers, Case Managers from the Rutland Regional Medical Center Community Health Team, and local health services providers.
- Cooking skills and nutrition classes are widely available to members, at no cost, in collaboration with partners at Hunger Free Vermont, Rutland Area Farm and Food Link, and University of Vermont Extension Expanded Food and Nutrition Program. Class curriculums align with foods provided in weekly
- Food for shares is aggregated through a Farmers Network
   Cooperative comprised of small-scale and emerging farms in
   Rutland County. Farmers are compensated at a wholesale rate for
   the food.



- The HCS creates a new market niche and offers an innovative approach to farm viability and agricultural economy through public health.
- Rutland area Youth are hired in partnership with the Vermont Youth Conservation Corps and Department
  of Vocational Rehabilitation to work on participating VFFC HCS farms as a summer employment
  opportunity.
- The HCS inspires lasting lifestyle changes through building familiarity with fresh, local foods while addressing cooking skills, budget, transportation and health challenges.
- Rutland Health Care Share is being initially supported by the Bowse Health Trust of Rutland Regional Medical Center and will look to the community for future support.

## **Outcomes To Date:**

- In 2016, 125 HCS Memberships are benefitting 354 individuals, 116 of which are children living in the 50 HCS member households with children under the age of 18. In 2015, 75 shares reached 289 individuals.
- 4 new and emerging farmers in Rutland county are receiving the income equivalent of 30 new CSA customers for the 2016 growing season.
- 6 Rutland Area Youth ages 16-19 and 2 young adult crew leaders, were employed in an 8 week summer job training experience working with the VFFC Health Care Share.
- In 2017 the HCS will expand to 150 Shares for 18 weeks, work with one new farm and employ 8 youth.
