13	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to create the
14	Commission on the State Bank of Vermont.
15	An act relating to creating the Commission on the State Bank of Vermont
16	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
17	Sec. 1. COMMISSION ON THE STATE BANK OF VERMONT
18	(a) Creation. There is created the Commission on the State Bank of
19	Vermont, a citizens panel charged with designing a results-based public
20	banking model that will:

1	(1) deliver organizational and economic efficiencies within State
2	government;
3	(2) promote economic development and infrastructure investment; and
4	(3) maximize returns or generate additional revenue using existing State
5	dollars.
6	(b) Membership. The Commission shall be composed of the following
7	members:
8	(1) One member appointed by Vermonters for a New Economy.
9	(2) One member appointed by the Gund Institute for Ecological
10	Economics at the University of Vermont.
11	(3) One member appointed by Vermont Businesses for Social
12	Responsibility.
13	(4) One member appointed by the Vermont Community Foundation.
14	(5) One member appointed by the Public Banking Institute.
15	(6) One member appointed by Fresh Tracks Capital.
16	(7) One member appointed by the Trust Company of Vermont.
17	(c) Powers and duties. The Commission shall consider the following issues
18	and design an organizational and operational framework for the State Bank of
19	Vermont:
20	(1) the outcomes and benchmarks for the Bank and who should have the
21	authority to assess its operation;

1	(2) the management and operational structure of the Bank, including the
2	officers and other leadership roles necessary to ensure effective daily
3	operation, as well as one or more persons or entities charged with oversight
4	authority of the Bank's management;
5	(3) the scope of the bank's program authority, including what banking
6	and other services and activities the Bank is authorized to perform, and what
7	State, municipal, and private persons may or must use the Bank's services;
8	(4) the amount and form of capitalization necessary for the Bank;
9	(5) the issues relating to regulatory oversight, public records, auditing,
10	and confidentiality of records;
11	(6) the Bank's relationship to existing programs and activities, including
12	the programs and operations of VEDA, VSAC, VHFA, the Municipal Bond
13	Bank, the Office of the Treasurer, other State programs, and private banks and
14	credit unions;
15	(7) the potential to generate savings or additional revenues through
16	investment in local infrastructure projects; and
17	(8) any other issue the Commission determines to be necessary.
18	(d) Access to information; assistance. The Commission shall have the
19	administrative, technical, and legal assistance of:
20	(1) the Vermont Economic Development Authority.
21	(2) the Vermont Housing Finance Agency;

1	(3) the Vermont Municipal Bond Bank;
2	(4) the Vermont Student Assistance Corporation; and
3	(5) the Office of the Treasurer.
4	(e) Report. On or before January 15, 2018, the Commission shall submit a
5	written report to the General Assembly and the Governor with its findings and
6	recommendations on the framework for the State Bank of Vermont.
7	(f) Meetings.
8	(1) The member appointed by the Gund Institute for Ecological
9	Economics shall serve as the Chair of the Commission and shall call the first
10	meeting of the Commission to occur on or after July 1, 2017.
11	(2) A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum.
12	(g) Compensation. Members of the Commission shall be entitled to per
13	diem compensation and reimbursement of expenses pursuant to 32 V.S.A.
