### **Reach Up Coordination with WIOA**

- As a mandatory partner within the WIOA plan, Reach Up administrative staff has participated in WIOA planning workgroups with VDOL
  - Planning around common intake, data-sharing, coordination of services, recruitment of Reach Up participants, training
- Local districts work together to coordinate services for Reach Up participants
  - o Referrals (both directions)
  - o Connect Reach Up participants to training and apprenticeship programs
  - Share schedules for job clubs, resume writing classes, etc.

# **Barriers to Employment**

- Transportation
  - 36% of Reach Up participants have a transportation barrier
  - No license, no car, no access to public transportation, fines
- Childcare
  - Shortage of quality childcare for children under age 2
  - When childcare is available, even with a full childcare subsidy, participants usually still pay a co-pay;
    depending on the number of children and cost of care \$50 to \$100 per week
  - Childcare hours/schedule do not always line up with work/training program
- Housing
  - Only 27% of families participating in Reach Up live in subsidized housing.
  - o Grant for a family of three is around \$700
  - o Approximately 160 homeless families receiving Reach Up

# **Family Development Plan Overview**

- Every adult receiving Reach Up must have a Family Development Plan, which outlines their employment plan, and addresses barriers to employment
- The plan is specific to the individual and a family's unique needs and goals
