9	Upon receipt of an application for license and the license fee, the licensing	
10	agency shall issue a license when it determines that the applicant and hospital	
11	facilities meet the following minimum standards:	
12	* * *	
13	(23) A registered nurse who is licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A. chapter 28	
14	and educated and trained in perioperative nursing shall be present and serve as	
15	a circulating nurse for the duration of any invasive or surgical procedure	
16	conducted in a hospital operating room. As used in this subdivision,	
17	"circulating nurse" means a licensed registered nurse who is responsible for	
18	coordinating nursing care, responding to the safety needs of a patient in the	
19	operating room, and supporting the surgical team as appropriate during a	
20	procedure. A circulating nurse may leave the operating room for a short period	
21	of time during a procedure to perform an activity related to the procedure or, in	

1	accordance with hospital-specific protocols, may be relieved by another
2	circulating nurse.
3	Sec. 2. 18 V.S.A. § 9437 is amended to read:
4	§ 9437. CRITERIA
5	(a) A certificate of need shall be granted if the applicant demonstrates and
6	the board Board finds that:
7	(1) the application is consistent with the health resource allocation plan;
8	(2) the cost of the project is reasonable, because:
9	(A) the applicant's financial condition will sustain any financial
10	burden likely to result from completion of the project;
11	(B) the project will not result in an undue increase in the costs of
12	medical care. In making a finding under this subdivision, the board Board
13	shall consider and weigh relevant factors, including:
14	(i) the financial implications of the project on hospitals and other
15	clinical settings, including the impact on their services, expenditures, and
16	charges;
17	(ii) whether the impact on services, expenditures, and charges is
18	outweighed by the benefit of the project to the public; and
19	(C) less expensive alternatives do not exist, would be unsatisfactory,
20	or are not feasible or appropriate;

1	(3) there is an identifiable, existing, or reasonably anticipated need for
2	the proposed project which is appropriate for the applicant to provide;
3	(4) the project will improve the quality of health care in the state <u>State</u>
4	or provide greater access to health care for Vermont's residents, or both;
5	(5) the project will not have an undue adverse impact on any other
6	existing services provided by the applicant;
7	(6) the project will serve the public good, including with regard to
8	ambulatory surgical centers, a requirement that at any invasive or surgical
9	procedure conducted in an operating room of a new health care facility, a
10	registered nurse who is licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A. chapter 28 and educated
11	and trained in perioperative nursing be present and serve as a circulating nurse
12	for the duration of the procedure;
13	(7) the applicant has adequately considered the availability of
14	affordable, accessible patient transportation services to the facility; and
15	(8) if the application is for the purchase or lease of new health care
16	information technology, it conforms with the health information technology
17	plan established under section 9351 of this title.
18	(b) As used in this section, "circulating nurse" means a licensed registered
19	nurse who is responsible for coordinating nursing care, responding to the
20	safety needs of a patient in the operating room, and supporting the surgical
21	team as appropriate during a procedure. A circulating nurse may leave the

1	operating room for a short period of time duri	ng a procedure to perform an	
2	activity related to the procedure or, in accordance with hospital-specific		
3	protocols, may be relieved by another circulating nurse.
