Vermont State Colleges System Contributions to Mental Health in Vermont

- The VSCS enrolls over 10,000 Vermonters.
- Almost half will be the first in their families to earn a degree.
- 95% of U.S. jobs created since the Great Recession went to college degree holders.

Mental Health Workforce Issues Are Vermont Workforce Issues

To address urgent workforce and economic development needs, Vermont will need to increase the number of Vermonters who have a postsecondary credential of value to 70% by 2025. <u>http://70x2025vt.org/</u>

The key challenges are access and affordability:

- 35% of low-income Vermont H.S. graduates continue on to college, compared to 60% non-economically disadvantaged.
- 60,000 working-age Vermonters have some college education but no degree.



Affordability

Average yearly net <u>cost of college</u> for Vermonters, after all federal, state, and institutional grant aid is awarded, for students in the bottom quintile of family income (\$0-30,000):
