7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to authorize the
8	Commissioner of Motor Vehicles to issue permits for the use of blue, amber,
9	red, and purple signal lamps on law enforcement, fire department, EMS, and
10	funeral procession lead vehicles, provided the signal lamp is mounted so as to
11	be visible primarily from the rear of the vehicle.

18	(a) When satisfied as to the condition and use of the vehicle, the

7	(3) No vehicle may be authorized a permit for more than one of the
8	combinations described in subdivisions (1) and (2) of this subsection.

10	(4) No motor vehicle, other than one owned by the applicant, shall be
11	issued a permit until the Commissioner has recorded the information regarding
12	both the owner of the vehicle and the applicant for the permit.
13	(5) Upon application to the Commissioner, the Commissioner may issue
14	a single permit for all the vehicles owned or leased by the applicant.
15	(6) Sirens and red or red and white signal lamps, or sirens and blue or
16	blue and white signal lamps, may be authorized for restored emergency or
17	enforcement vehicles used for exhibition purposes. Sirens and lamps
18	authorized under this subdivision may only be activated during an exhibition,
19	such as a car show or parade.

1	(7) One purple signal lamp may be authorized for all funeral procession
2	lead vehicles, provided that the Commissioner shall require the lamp be
3	mounted so as to be visible primarily from the rear of the vehicle.
4	(b) Amber signal lamps shall be used on road maintenance vehicles, service
5	vehicles, and wreckers and shall be used on all registered snow removal
6	equipment when in use removing snow on public highways and the amber
7	lamps shall be mounted so as to be visible from all sides of the motor vehicle.
8	A vehicle equipped with an amber signal lamp Road maintenance vehicles,
9	service vehicles, and wreckers may not be issued a permit for the installation
10	and use of a siren.

12	§ 1255. EXCEPTIONS
13	(1)(a) The provisions of section 1251 of this title shall not apply to
14	directional signal lamps of a type approved by the Commissioner of Motor
15	Vehicles.
16	(2)(b) All persons with motor vehicles equipped as provided in subdivision
17	subdivisions $1252(a)(1)$ and, (2) , and (7) of this title, shall use the sirens or
18	colored signal lamps, or both, only in the direct performance of their official
19	duties. When any person other than a law enforcement officer is operating a
20	motor vehicle equipped as provided in subdivision 1252(a)(1) of this title, the
21	colored signal lamp lamps shall be either removed, covered, or hooded. When

1	any person, other than an authorized ambulance emergency medical service
2	vehicle operator, firefighter, or authorized operator of vehicles used in rescue
3	operation operations, is operating a motor vehicle equipped as provided in
4	subdivision 1252(a)(2) of this title, the colored signal lamps shall be either
5	removed, covered, or hooded unless the operator holds a senior operator
6	license. When any person, other than the authorized operator of a funeral
7	procession lead vehicle, is operating a motor vehicle as provided in subdivision
8	1252(a)(7) of this title, the colored signal lamp shall be either removed,
9	covered, or hooded.
