House resolution allowing for the House of Representatives to vote remotely to extend the House Declaration of Emergency

Offered by Committee on Rules

Whereas Governor Philip B. Scott declared a state of emergency with regards to the COVID-19 pandemic until July 15, 2020; and

Whereas the House of Representatives declared a State of Emergency until June 30, 2020, and

Whereas the Center for Disease Control (CDC) has issued guidelines for people to maintain a safe social distance of six feet and minimize gatherings to reduce the infection rates of COVID-19, and

<u>Whereas</u> in order for the House of Representatives to conduct its business, the standing committees and panels of the House of Representatives may participate remotely, and

<u>Whereas</u> the House of Representatives Panels on Sexual Harassment Prevention, Ethics, and Discrimination and House Rules are granted the ability to vote remotely; and

<u>Whereas</u> to allow standing committees and panels of the House of Representatives to resume voting remotely the House of Representatives must vote to extend its Declaration of Emergency; and

<u>Whereas</u> standing committees of the House of Representatives may meet during the recess with the permission of the Speaker of the House as is custom and may do so remotely; and

Whereas the House of Representatives may convene remotely and vote remotely during the recess to extend its Declaration of Emergency; now therefore be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives:

That the House of Representatives may reinstate the House Declaration of Emergency by a remote vote when the House of Representatives reconvenes.
