Whereas, throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, the staff and volunteers of the Living Well Group have safely conducted activities in congregate settings, met residents' daily living needs, and adhered to all requirements of the Governor's emergency order, and

Whereas, no resident in a Living Well residence contracted COVID-19, and

Whereas, the Living Well Group gave critical assistance to peer provider organizations and offered innovative support statewide on the provision of elder care during the COVID-19 pandemic, now therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly honors the Living Well Group's staff and volunteers for their superb elder-care services during the COVID-19 pandemic, and be it further
