(B) Meals reimbursement. A member who elects to receive
reimbursement of expenses shall receive reimbursement equal to the actual

however, that the total amount of the weekly reimbursement available pursuant

12	consider issues related to serving as a member of the Vermont General

16	(1) three current members of the House of Representatives, not all from
17	the same political party, who shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House;

1	(c) Powers and duties. The Working Group shall consider and make
2	recommendations on issues involving legislative compensation and benefits,

6	General Assembly, including:
7	(A) whether current salaries and benefits, including those added or
8	increased by this act, are sufficient and, if not, how they should be increased;

12	(C) the impact of making members eligible for the State employees'
