I was watching the Finance Committee meeting about **S.68** last week.

Here is a little background on the bill.

S.68 is elegant in its simplicity and it is only applicable to students living, working, and paying taxes in VT.

S.68 Education costs as a tax deduction

Student loans should be considered as tax deductible. Once students are employed and repaying their loans, they should be able to use them as a tax deduction, just like a business.

Over the years I have mentioned this idea to many people, with nearly 100% positive responses. **Gov. Scott, Senators Leahy and Welch, as well as Robert Reich and Lawrence Lessing have expressed support for this idea.**

We need to bring more young people to Vermont, and to keep the ones we already have. What better way to do this than to implement a form of tax relief
