17	(b)(1) School and Town Meeting Committee. To augment the statutory
18	responsibilities for the annual Town and School District meetings that are
19	specified to the Town and the School District and their respective officers,
20	there shall be a School and Town Meeting Committee that shall organize,
21	arrange, and provide for the comfort, presentation, publicity, program,

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1	refreshments, entertainment, and other nonstatutory aspects of the Town
2	meeting cycle, such as the Warrant Information Night and School District Day
3	meeting. The Town Clerk shall appoint one member for a two-year term.
4	(2) The Selectboard shall appoint one member for a two-year term and
5	one member for a three-year term. The School Board shall appoint one
6	member for a two-year term and one member for a three-year term. No School
7	Board member, Selectboard member, or Town Clerk may serve on the School
8	and Town Meeting Committee. Each appointing body or person shall have the
9	power to remove any incumbent member of the School and Town Meeting
10	Committee appointed by that body or person and shall have the power to
11	appoint a replacement member to serve the unexpired term of any person who

20	Monday night in February eight days prior to Voting Day, a Town and School
