4	Sec. 18. STATE BUILDING NAMING; STUDY COMMITTEE; REPORT
5	(a) Creation. There is created the State Building Naming Study Committee
6	to develop a proposed process for naming State buildings that are under the
7	jurisdiction of the Department of Buildings and General Services.
8	(b) Membership. The Committee shall be composed of the following
9	members:
10	(1) the State Historic Preservation Officer or designee;
11	(2) the Secretary of Commerce and Community Development or
12	designee;
13	(3) the Commissioner of Buildings and General Services or designee;
14	(4) the Executive Director of the Vermont Historical Society or
15	designee;
16	(5) the State Librarian or designee
17	(6) the Executive Director of the Vermont League of Cities and Towns
18	or designee;
19	(7) the Executive Director of the Office of Racial Equity or designee;
20	<u>and</u>
21	(8) The Executive Secretary of the Transportation Board or designee.

1	(c) Powers and duties.
2	(1) The Committee shall develop a proposed process for naming State
3	buildings that are under the jurisdiction of the Department of Buildings and
4	General Services. The proposed process developed by the Committee shall
5	address the following:
6	(A) an entity within State government, other than the General
7	Assembly, that should have authority for naming State buildings that are under
8	the jurisdiction of the Department of Buildings and General Services;
9	(B) entities and individuals who should be involved in determining
10	whether to name specific State buildings that are under the jurisdiction of the
11	Department of Buildings and General Services;
12	(C) methods by which a municipality or the general public may
13	petition to name a State building under the jurisdiction of the Department of
14	Buildings and General Services after a specific person;
15	(D) any requirements for a historical nexus between the building
16	proposed to be named and the person for whom it is proposed to be named; and
17	(E) the process for considering a petition to name a State building,
18	including requirements related to public notice, conduct of hearings, and
19	standards for rendering a decision on a petition.

1	(2) In carrying out its duties pursuant to subdivision (1) of this section,
2	the Committee shall hold not fewer than three meetings and shall solicit
3	testimony from stakeholders and interested parties.
4	(d) Report. On or before February 15, 2025, the Committee shall report to
5	the House Committee on Corrections and Institutions and the Senate
6	Committee on Institutions regarding its proposal and any recommendations for
7	legislative action.
8	(e) Meetings.
9	(1) The State Historic Preservation Officer shall call the first meeting of
10	the Committee to occur on or before September 1, 2024.
11	(2) The Committee shall select a chair from among its members at the
12	first meeting.
13	(3) A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum.
14	(4) The Committee shall cease to exist on February 28, 2025.
