- **Misdemeanors Over Goal:** Reduced by nearly **50%**. These cases frequently involve low-level public order offenses that previously faced significant delays. With the additional time and resources provided by the pilot program, these cases are now being resolved in a timely manner.
- **Felonies Over Goal:** Reduced by **38.9%**. As felonies represent the most serious charges, this reduction directly translates to faster resolution and timely justice for victims and the public.
- **Total Docket Case Count:** Decreased by **21%** overall (inclusive of probation violations).
- **Ongoing Oversight:** Accelerated resolutions were achieved without sacrificing public safety. As noted during project reviews, many resolutions included continued Department of Corrections (DOC) supervision for participating individuals.
- **Fiscal Responsibility & Logistics:** The Rutland County SAO executed the pilot program using existing personnel without incurring overtime expenditures. Additionally, the SAS Transport Program via the Rutland County Sheriff's Department successfully transported all detained individuals. SAS is still in the process of analyzing data but it is presumed that overtime funds were utilized to support transportation to and from the pilot program.
