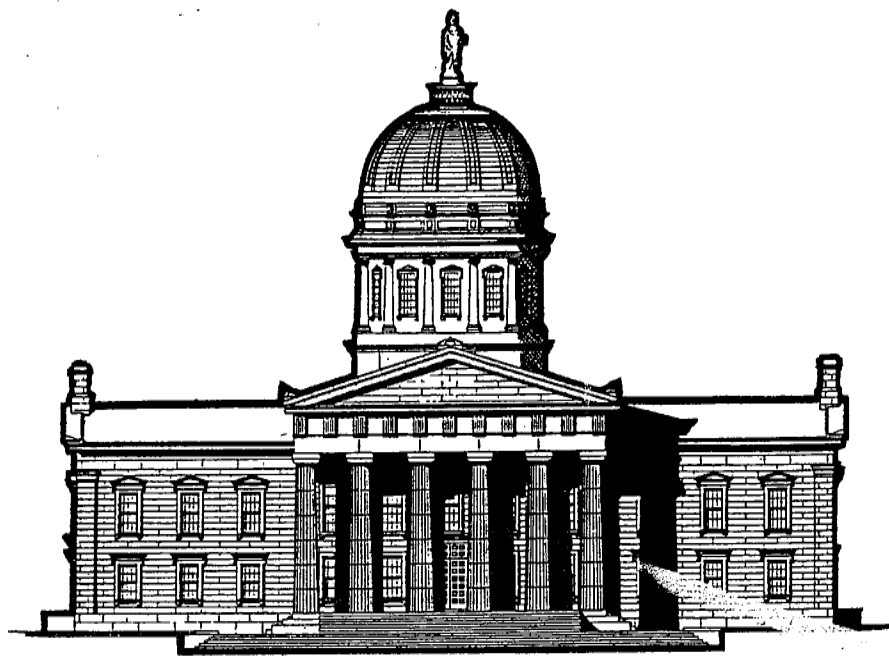

Vote explanations (at back of book)

The following are the House Rules governing voting in the House

**XI
OF VOTING**

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing. It is generally recommended that vote explanations should be infrequent and brief.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. Of the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 73, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Member shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

Page 3

Rep. Adams of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

While I have long supported the growing of industrial hemp as an agricultural crop because of its potential as a diversified product for our farmers and it’s ability to absorb phosphorus from the soil, I am dismayed that so much legislative time has been spent on making a statement when that time could have been used to provide immediate financial benefit to our farmers. Even so, I vote yes.”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no, not because I am opposed to growing hemp in Vermont, but because this bill won’t enable that to happen. There are other issues pertaining to agriculture that could benefit Vermont farmers that we should be voting on.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes so that Vermont’s hard working farmers will be able to immediately begin producing one more profitable crop whenever a long overdue change in federal policy comes about. They need all the help we can give them.”

Page 4

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I greatly appreciate the work of our House Natural Resources and Energy committee. While I support this bill, it is unfortunate that these investments could not have been made starting last year. It would have cost Vermonters no more, but we would have seen the results that much faster.”

Page 6

Rep. Acinapura of Brandon explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I state unequivocally that there is no corruption or buying of influence in this General Assembly nor among our elected constitutional officers. Nor have there been allegations to that effect. Rather there is the perception among some that we are prone to corruption or the buying of influence. Perception is not reality. To write a law to correct this perception lends credence to the perception that we are corrupt. Good law must be based in reality. To write a law based on a perception is wrong. It is bad law. It does harm to this body. We should be proud of our ethical standards. For these reasons I voted no.”

Rep. Clarkson of Woodstock explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes to limit the influence of money in our democracy. Potential litigation is a small price to pay to maintain the health of our democratic institutions.”

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes on this campaign finance reform bill to help prevent the appearance of corruption from coloring our Vermont elections. We shouldn’t wait until our elections become corrupt before we act.”

Rep. Donaghy of Poultney explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There is no public outcry on Vermont’s campaign finance. It’s a non-issue in the public’s eye. S. 278 is a solution to a problem that doesn’t exist; pre ’97 campaign contribution limits are neither

corrupting nor do they convey the appearance of corruption. There is no evidence of either.”

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes to striking a reasonable balance between limiting the amount of money in political campaigns and retaining robust individual and political party ability to compete in statewide and local races. S. 278 meets Supreme Court concerns, sets contribution limits higher than several other states, and is right for Vermont.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I believe it is ethically wrong for me to sit here in Montpelier and decide how much someone who wants me out of office can raise, and therefore spend, on that effort.

All that is needed is full disclosure. Then the voters can decide whether they approve of what a candidate is doing.”

Rep. Minter of Waterbury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted for this bill because we need to limit the influence of money in Vermont’s strong and healthy democratic system. This clean election bill helps ensure that every candidate has as fair a chance as possible to run for public office.”

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

I voted yes for the same reason that I support laws that keep the river clean that runs through my town. It isn’t polluted because we made an effort to keep it that way.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madame Speaker:

By passing this bill today, we have risked the taxpayers money again. We do this to restrict contributions to Vermont House candidates that typically raise two to four thousand dollars! Apparently, we have found the enemy, and it is us! A person that is corruptible is just as corruptible at \$250.00 or \$500.00, as \$1000.00.”

Page 7

Rep. Hube of Londonderry explained his vote as follows:

“Mister Speaker:

I support the vast majority of this bill and the work of the committee on Natural Resources and Energy. I continue to be troubled by one section. I think it is poor public policy to subsidize companies that realize a 30, 40, and sometimes a greater than 50 percent annual return on their investment. Mr. Speaker, from my perspective that is corporate welfare.”

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

“Mister Speaker:

I voted against this bill yesterday because I believe it to be a significant expansion of the powers and cost of state government.

I have not changed my mind overnight.”

Page 9

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My understanding is that findings in a bill are supposed to reflect the testimony and evidence heard by a committee. Instead, we hear that this finding is intended to satisfy the United State’s Supreme Court’s

ruling that this law should be based on responding to at least an appearance of corruption. Where was the evidence heard in committee to justify it?"

Page 10

Rep. Haas of Rochester explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

It is hard to imagine how the State of Vermont could ever do enough to increase public awareness of the dangers to children from lead exposure. But that effort is underway. Every member of the environmental health team at the Dept. of Health includes lead education in their work with the public. This bill is an important step to educate all our neighbors."

Rep. McAllister of Highgate explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I do not think recommitting the bill will change the fact we were told there was no money, and that is the biggest problem."

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I guess our actions speak louder than our words. What are we so afraid of in developing a solid plan in regards to the critical resources and education piece need for this comprehensive bill?"

Page 12

Rep. Ancel of Calais explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

This bill is not a retreat from cost containment. Rather, it puts in place effective cost containment through a mechanism that allows school boards and administrators to plan, that respects local decision making and that has been proven to work."

Rep. Hosford of Waitsfield explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I am proud to support a proven mechanism for cost containment that encourages equity by not penalizing lower spending schools. School board members have told me that they keep a close eye on the existing threshold and budget accordingly. Lowering this threshold will encourage further savings while leaving spending decisions in the hands of local boards and citizens. Thresholds provide clarity and predictability in the ever-challenging task of providing quality education for our children while maintaining fiscal responsibility.

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I vote no. This is a feckless and reckless retreat from cost containment. It is no longer a matter of "thinking twice" – it is a matter of "not thinking at all!"

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted yes because I respect the good work of our local boards to control spending. I respect the hard work of our Education Committee to look at all possible ways to help in that effort. And finally, I voted yes because school spending is far too important to be a political football. Doing better work to control expenses is never a mistake."

Rep. Myers of Essex explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted yes on this bill, but in fact it didn't matter how I voted. My school district would have been adversely affected by the two-vote provision and will also be adversely affected by the threshold provision. What I hoped for last year, and this year, was some attempt by the Legislature to offer true tax savings to the people of my district. That has not happened."

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Vermont has among the best public schools in the world and local school boards have controlled costs lower than health care and fuel oil costs which drive their budgets. The discussion we should be having is about how we face the educational challenges presented by 21st century economics. I hope we will vote to keep Vermont schools first rate and give our Vermont students the best possible start in life.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Repeal of the think twice provision, while replacing it with something that did not fly last year, sends a bad message to over taxed citizens across Vermont. Serious reform bills sit gathering dust on our Education Committee walls, while we present the failed bill from last year. Today, by passage of this bill we have failed badly on the test of leadership.”

Page 13

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill builds on correct law and actually makes it easier for those in compliance to remain so. This bill is also part of a collaborative effort that will present an array of services to protect our children.

I voted for this bill because it allows us to do something, rather than do nothing, to protect our children.

Our actions here are the voice for Vermont children and shows leadership in practicing fidelity in our commitment to our children – and our children’s children, the future of Vermont.”

Page 14

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote “No”. The Constitution does not give me two or more choices in descending order. It gives me one vote for each position. In a two member House District or a six member Senate District, the confusion and convolution is beyond the comprehension of the brightest among us.”

Rep. Marcotte of Coventry explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I cannot vote for a \$90,000 appropriation for IRV which our town clerks do not support and only 53 towns support. Yet two weeks ago we could not find any money to help educate parents on the dangers of lead.”

Rep. Moran of Wardsboro explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support S.108 because:

1.) I believe in majority rule . At my town meeting we vote as many times as necessary to arrive at a majority accepted candidate. S.108 accomplishes this democratic process in a realistic fashion;

2.) I believe every citizen should have a real, equal say in how we are governed. Either by espousing a cause or by running for office. Regardless of political party and without abandoning what they stand for in the process.”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

To clarify for the record – 53 out of 56 towns that voted, supported using IRV.

Kenneth Arrow won the Nobel Prize for proving that there can never be a perfect voting method.

But it is also worth noting that the American Political Science Association has adopted IRV to elect their own national president, because it is the fairest method to find a majority winner.”

Page 16

Rep. Fisher of Lincoln explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The Burlington experience with IRV has demonstrated that Vermonters can easily understand what it means to say my first choice is for candidate “A” and my second choice is for candidate “B”.

There is nothing hypothetical about such a vote.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support IRV because I believe it will encourage voter participation and democracy works best when more people participate.

I also note that the testimony we heard on the floor states this bill will not cost towns more money or work.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no on S. 108 despite the fact that it has worked well mechanically in local elections in Burlington. If instant runoff voting had been in place for all elections throughout our country’s history, Abraham Lincoln and Woodrow Wilson might well have been replaced by President Douglas and President Fairbanks, and Bernie Sanders’ career may never have happened.

A major change in our voting procedures like IRV should have been voted on by the entire electorate, as it was in Burlington.”

Page 17

Rep. Donovan of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes because this bill protects a landlord’s investment, while insuring that a tenant has a safe and healthy place to call home.”

Rep. Head of South Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My vote for H. 863 is a vote to create and preserve housing including affordable housing, which working Vermonters’ desperately need”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no. This “I want Vermont to be a picture postcard in my image” is anti-family, anti-affordable housing, anti-choice, and anti-reason. It claims “noble goals” but defeats them at every turn. Like so many of our other misguided efforts at controlling our citizens and their economic choices it will be swept into meaningless by the economic disaster which is currently bearing down on us.”

Rep. Leriche of Hardwick explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes. Lack of affordable housing in Vermont is having a negative impact on employers ability to recruit a qualified workforce. H. 863 is an important tool that will provide incentives for builders and municipalities to create affordable housing for middle-income workers.”

Page 19

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill probably won’t hurt the few lucky Vermonters who received subsidized housing funded with scarce taxpayer dollars, and the few lucky Vermonters who are wealthy enough to build their

mansions on 10 acres. This bill will hurt low and middle income Vermonters who need decent housing that they can afford. I must vote no.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes to a thoughtful and balanced program to assist development of affordable housing without compromising Vermont’s natural resources. Vermont is about housing and conservation NOT housing versus conservation. H. 863 continues our long history of thoughtful development.”

Rep. Leriche of Hardwick explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

H. 863 provides incentives for builders and municipalities to join the effort in creating more affordable housing for the middle-income working Vermonters. I voted yes, because Vermont is not a gated community.”

Rep. Trombley of Grand Isle explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill helps create affordable and moderate housing, where communities want housing. It will help builders at a time of economic need. It helps working families. It is a historic step for housing in Vermont.”

Rep. Barnard of Richmond explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I would like to explain the reasons for my "belly-aching" and my no vote regarding this bill, H.863. Like most of us here, when I review a piece of proposed legislation, one of the first things I consider is how it will affect the community and constituents that I specifically represent here. It is what I found when considered H.863 and what it would provide, or more specifically what it would NOT provide, for Richmond that has caused my belly aching.

Let me be specific. Richmond does meet the many filters that are required of communities in this bill to apply for a VT Neighborhood designation: we have zoning, subdivision, an approved town plan and we host a designated Village Center. Clearly, Richmond is a community that takes planning for growth seriously and values our traditional village center. We know that in order for our village to remain economically robust we need people to live in or nearby it. In fact, a few years ago we approved the development of a new homeownership development (Church Street) with moderately priced homes within our village center. And people want more similar housing options within or nearby the village.

The problem with this bill is that it would make incremental changes to regulations that pertain to affordable housing, but, not address, in a meaningful way, the market forces that are driving the costs of all housing. This bill makes no attempt to go there.”

Page 20

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill has the potential of crating a devastating human health incident that could injure the Vermont dairy industry permanently.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I’m not an expert in many areas that come before this body. When members I trust who are dairy farmers think it’s a bad idea without inspections, I vote no.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes on this bill in support of consumer choice. I just wish this House were also supportive of the concept of choice in other areas, such as education and health care.”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

If it was so devastatingly dangerous, where were the amendments to eliminate the exemption altogether?”

Page 22

Rep. LaVoie of Swanton explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Our concerns for our pregnant teens should not depend on where they live or where they go to school.”

Page 24

Rep. Andrews of Rutland City explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I agree with the concept of this amendment. Income sensitivity in property taxes is not intended to underwrite the wealthy. But I agree with the committee that the details need much more work to avoid unintended consequences that could be just as inequitable.”

Page 25

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted against the statutory change two years ago, because beyond privacy, it was a hidden theft of taxpayer money in the year it was applied. The privacy issue is a concern to many of my constituents, and I regret that we have not resolved it. Unfortunately, I do not think reversing the statute this way is the solution”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes because this amendment would protect Vermonters’ personal income information. On 8/9/07, the Secretary of State issued a formal opinion which stated “We believe a town could reasonably take the position that the prebate information is not public since, by a simple calculation, this information can be used to determine an individual’s income level.” On 9/10/07, the Vermont ACLU and the Vermont Association of CPA’s testified that property tax adjustment information can be used to easily determine a person’s household income. I’m disappointed that the Ways and Means committee determined that the Secretary of State, the ACLU and the CPA Association are wrong.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

My constituents are happy that they are receiving honest property tax bills that finally show what they actually are paying. I voted to keep it that way.”

Page 26

Rep. Errecart of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Mandates make health insurance premiums in Vermont even more expensive. I vote for the amendment, for reduced mandates and for more affordable insurance premiums.”

Page 27

Rep. Leriche of Hardwick explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Health care costs are rising by \$1 million dollars per day in Vermont. I voted yes because this bill takes concrete steps to help bring down the rate of increase in health care costs, helps more people get health coverage, and contains provisions that will improve health care quality.”

Rep. Wheeler of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Although I voted for this bill, I did so with great reservations. It is not the bill that I had hoped for. I do not feel we can continue to pay for health care on the backs of our employers. I can only hope that as we as a state and we as a nation can find a new way to fund health care so all Vermonters can receive all the health care they deserve.”

Page 31

Rep. Manwaring of Wilmington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

As we recently marked the loss of 4000 soldiers in Iraq, Vermont remains the state which has lost the most soldiers per capita. While we can't bring them back, we can help their fellow soldiers who have returned to move into normal life.”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

It is a false choice between our veterans and court mandated expenditures. We all value and respect our veterans.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Every single member of this House honors our veterans. Members of my family have served our country overseas in 3 centuries and one serves us today. However, this amendment tried to reverse a Vermont court decision on the floor of the House. We can and should find this money elsewhere.”

Rep. Canfield of Fair Haven explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

As a matter of legislative priority, I vote yes on this amendment. This money would go to a most notable project to help our homeless veterans who did not hesitate to help and serve our State and our Country.”

Page 32

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Why are we giving these raises? Costs are rising and budgets are tight. We are contractually obligated to give raises to collective bargaining units, which would have been done without this bill but we are not obligated to the rest. I voted against giving these raises that we cannot afford, including, apparently, a raise for ourselves.”

Rep. Hube of Londonderry explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The median income for a state employee is roughly \$50,000.00 about equal to the Vermont median family income. To ask Vermonters to pay for pay increases of just under 4% each of the next two years is unfair and unreasonable.”

Page 33

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes for H. 685. I am a strong supporter of environmental enforcement, however, I must express my disappointment with the amended portion of the bill.”

Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I explain my vote for the following reason. The penalty to the towns for environmental enforcement assessment to the natural resources agency are excessive and beyond reasonable budgets of all.”

Page 34

Rep. McCullough of Williston explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted yes for our transportation bill with a tear on my cheek for the loss of the bicycle and pedestrian program and the attendant lack of future budget considerations for all non motorized citizens of Vermont.”

Page 35

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support HR 32 as it supports the creation of a Veterans’ housing facility for our homeless veterans, to serve those who have served us so proudly.

Wording on a piece of paper is cheap. We had an opportunity to truly support our homeless veterans through this initiative by putting our money where our mouth is during this week’s budget discussion, and failed to do so!”

Rep. O’Donnell of Vernon explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

If we supported our military unconditionally we wouldn’t need roll call votes. Some things shouldn’t be political.”

Page 36

Rep. Brennan of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This amendment will serve to send a strong and firm, yet respectful, message to leadership which will serve to highlight the desperate demand to explore bonding which will start us on a path to transportation recovery.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

In offering this amendment, my concern is strictly to maintain the appropriate constitutional separation of powers, and in no way is it intended to mitigate the committee’s intent to generate a discussion of the need for additional revenues to support our transportation infrastructure.”

Rep. Minter of Waterbury explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support this amendment in order to send a strong message that this body stands united today, across party and throughout all regions of the state that we must not continue to get further and further

behind in transportation but must take real action to fix our crumbling roads and bridges and not leave this crisis to future generations.”

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

The purpose of this section of the transportation bill is to hold this administration accountable. Slogans and sound bites are like thin overlays and hot mix in potholes. They might be ok in the short run, but they can not take the place of a competent long-term plan.”

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes with significant disappointment. Time and time again, all 150 of us are pushed into a box by one man in the state government who never hesitates to make us look bad. Today we took the teeth out of an opportunity to hang our hats on responsible public policy that happens to have a nice push back.”

Rep. Westman of Cambridge explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Our roads need work, that is clear. No to this or that funding source isn’t good enough anymore. We need to begin to develop real solutions. This is about our future.”

Page 38

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no with mixed emotions. While safety is an issue of paramount importance, the division of fire safety opposes the way this is proposed to be implemented. I also fear that adding this amendment will imperil the passage of S. 372.”

Page 39

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill takes yet another step encroaching on the civil liberties of Vermonters by giving them no choice in turning their medical information over to the state.”

Page 42

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Today we required full and fair funding of the Vermont Yankee decommissioning fund – nothing more and nothing less. If it already is fully funded, as some assert, then it will cost nothing. But, if it is not, then we will have protected Vermont and Vermonters from huge potential future costs.”

Rep. Perry of Richford explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill is not necessary.

This bill reflects a lack of trust in the owners and operators of Vermont Yankee, a lack of understanding of the federal Nuclear Regulatory Commission role and responsibility to require compliance with federal regulations for decommissioning, and a lack of faith in the Vermont Public Service Board to act prudently on behalf of Vermonters in this matter, without special direction from the General Assembly.”

Rep. Adams of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote no because I believe this body does not fully understand the fiscal impacts and consequences of this bill to Vermont rate payers and other potential risks to our state.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes to make clear that business should be responsible for all their costs. Decommissioning a nuclear plant after it is no longer operating is a legitimate business cost. S. 373 makes clear that Vermonters are guaranteed, guaranteed not to be responsible for any decommissioning costs, should that plant be decommissioned in 2012, 2032 or 2090 or whenever.”

Rep. Kupersmith of South Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I fully appreciate the many concerns expressed in the debate on this bill yesterday. I am comfortable voting for this bill, not because these concerns have been put to rest, but rather because these concerns will be fully addressed by the entity that is equipped to do that work — that is, the Public Service Board.

Despite much of what we have heard in this debate, the Public Service Board's ability to determine whether this proposed sale is in the public good — and whether the resources for decommissioning will be adequate, remains intact.

The bill's specific language allows the Board to look to the "decommissioning fund, other funds and financial guarantees" to ensure that decommissioning will be paid for. The debate effectively ignored this language providing for other financial guarantees. I trust our Public Service Board to broadly interpret this language to accommodate the party's particular financial situation.

Rep. LaVoie of Swanton explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Unfortunately for the people of Vermont and the businesses that employ them, this bill calls into question the ability and credibility of the National Regulatory Commission and our own Public Service Board, as well as endangers the reliability and cost of our energy future. Our real motives ought to be questioned.”

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Our action today is responsible and appropriate. This bill protects Vermont from a potential, Enron-like financial crisis.”

Rep. Barnard of Richmond explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I ran for the Vermont House of Representatives in 2004. I beat an incumbent under the old campaign finance rules, which were more restrictive than the limits that are proposed in S. 278.

This is not incumbent protection!”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote to sustain the Governor's veto. The bill promises to take “Big” money out of the Vermont political races is an illusion. S. 278 accomplishes little or nothing, yet risks another court case which might run into the millions to defend. Risking Vermont taxpayers money again is not worth the illusion that this bill attempts to provide.”

Page 48

Rep. Nease of Johnson explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I strongly support the decriminalizing of small quantities of marijuana. The underlying bill provides a way for this legislature to look closely at our marijuana laws and to reform our laws in a responsible way. I voted no because an amendment like this would make important policy changes on the fly.”

Page 50

Rep. O’Donnell of Vernon explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I commend the Natural Resources Committee on a job well done! You truly put the safety and well being of Vermonters before anything else.

It is amazing how easy it is to support a bill in this room when everyone’s voice is heard and listened to in the committee room.

I congratulate you Mister Chair.”

Page 51

Rep. Flory of Pittsford explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

If what we truly want is to have our President elected by popular vote, we should be trying to amend the Constitution to eliminate the Electoral College not this back door way, which further reduces the values of our State and our individual vote.”

Page 58

Rep. Botzow of Pownal explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This resolution is a voice for all those struggling to keep up with too rapidly increasing fuel prices.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I support the underlying message of this resolution, within a context of a strong distaste for the use of time spent on resolutions such as these that are purely symbolic. I vote no because I believe even symbolic actions should not be deceptive to other bodies and our Attorney General to the degree that the language in this resolution is.”

Rep. Fisher of Lincoln explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

If CNN Money has it right, Exxon Mobile will continue to earn \$1,385 of profits every second all day long, and for days to come. I have often heard people talk about how expensive a debate is. As a demonstration of excessive profits, during this debate Exxon Mobil’s profits have topped \$7,479,000,”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote “no”. While I do not like the increase in gas prices, I cannot consent to assuming, without evidence, that the price increases are the result of criminal activity, and not international market conditions. By making such unfounded sensational accusations we destroy our integrity in order to create infantile political fuel to fan the flames of an upcoming election.”

Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I am voting yes with the hope that this resolution will be fixed to address all windfall corporate taxes by third reading. The people we represent are suffering just as much with the high cost of propane and natural gas.

They deserve our help too! No one should be able to price gouge when it comes to the basic need of heating our homes."

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I am glad the support for this resolution is so broad, but as some members stated, what actions could we take on the state level? For one, last year we could have enacted policies like that urged on this resolution by taxing the excess profits of Vermont Yankee and then, this past winter, the heating bills for thousands of Vermonters could have been lowered with energy efficiency programs.

There are many other areas such as transportation, taxes, and incentives that we could implement if the members of this body stood in unity on energy law and not just resolutions."

Page 59

Rep. Adams of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

Just this morning we were considering legislation asking business to refrain from increasing costs to consumers for one year. In passing this bill we, once again, are increasing costs to businesses in this state. Do as I say, not as I do."

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I voted against this bill because I was unable to finish reading it before we voted. In finishing reading as we voted, I discovered we re-repealed the anatomical gift statute that we restored this morning after it was inadvertently repealed in the Department of motor vehicle licensing bill."

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

It's a shame we are reduced to raising state revenues through regressive fees that are almost entirely paid by working class Vermonters.

We have other options to raise revenues, but they have been "off the table" for the last six years, and average Vermonters are the ones who suffer under such a policy."

Page 60

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

When we recessed for dinner, I was the last to leave this chamber. I had reached page 19 of 43 pages reading this report. I returned as soon as I ate the sandwich I ordered. I am still on page 19. It is inappropriate to my ability to fulfill my duties to my constituents to suspend rules and expedite this matter."

Page 61

Rep. Otterman of Topsham explained his vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

I am happy to hear concerns raised about our failure to cut education property taxes. Ways and Means earlier voted out H. 866 the Adjusted Gross Income Education Tax bill to do exactly that. Perhaps next January there will be support to pass that concept into law."

Page 62

Rep. Consejo of Sheldon explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This vote is proof that even freshmen can contribute a great deal to the quality of the work that is done in this assembly. I thank them for their hard work.”

Rep. Hosford of Waitsfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

Every year more burdens are placed on our school system. H. 711 removes some of these burdens.

Teachers will have more time to teach students. Superintendents will have more time to act as education leaders helping districts carry out their vision. The Department of Education and higher education will spend less time on unnecessary reports.

H. 711 is a common sense bill that will help Vermont schools and students.”

Rep. Stevens of Shoreham explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I am proud to support this first step toward ensuring that Vermont’s regional technical centers and secondary schools will continue to teach and prepare students for careers in agriculture, horticulture and forestry.”

Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

As the Chair of House Agriculture, I would like to thank our conferees for their hard work and the Education committee for allowing us to dip into their arena to such an extent. It’s great what we can accomplish when we all work together.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

There is much good in this bill. Placing multiple bills from the works of different committees into one conference committee and one bill destroys the ability to vote on very separate fundamental policy issues. The invasion into our private homes granted under a bill on affordable housing forces me to vote no.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I vote yes because I am comfortable that a Vermont neighborhood designation will not compromise any existing natural resources if and when any development results from the creation of this program. After all it is still the market that will determine the future of housing development and that market does not look very good right now!”

Rep. LaVoie of Swanton explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted for this “Housing bill” knowing that it does not wholly deliver the policy changes that will deliver the housing stock that Vermont desperately needs to keep the youth we have, expand the business we need, and attract more of both. However, it is a reasonable step toward understanding that we must find a balance in how we plan growth and how we support our natural resources.”

Rep. Peterson of Williston explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This bill starts with a plausible approach towards establishing more affordable housing by streamlining permitting, however, I must vote against it because along the way the definition of affordability was lost. Cruelly there is no assurance that the homes built in the new neighborhoods will be within reach for the vast majority of Vermonters.”

Rep. Trombley of Grand Isle explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

This is historic housing legislation. Vermont neighborhoods, housing stimulus, affordable units, smart growth study, protecting children from lead poisoning, mobile homes as real property, clear eviction rules, and housing unit preservations. This is a step for Vermont’s housing future.”

Page 64

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted for this resolution with enthusiasm. If Exxon/Mobile stock is held widely, it’s important to note over 3.5 million shares are owned by five men.

This resolution is not a slap at all . Those who own shares in a mutual fund. It is a message that Vermont will not tolerate we the on-going greed of the super-rich.”
