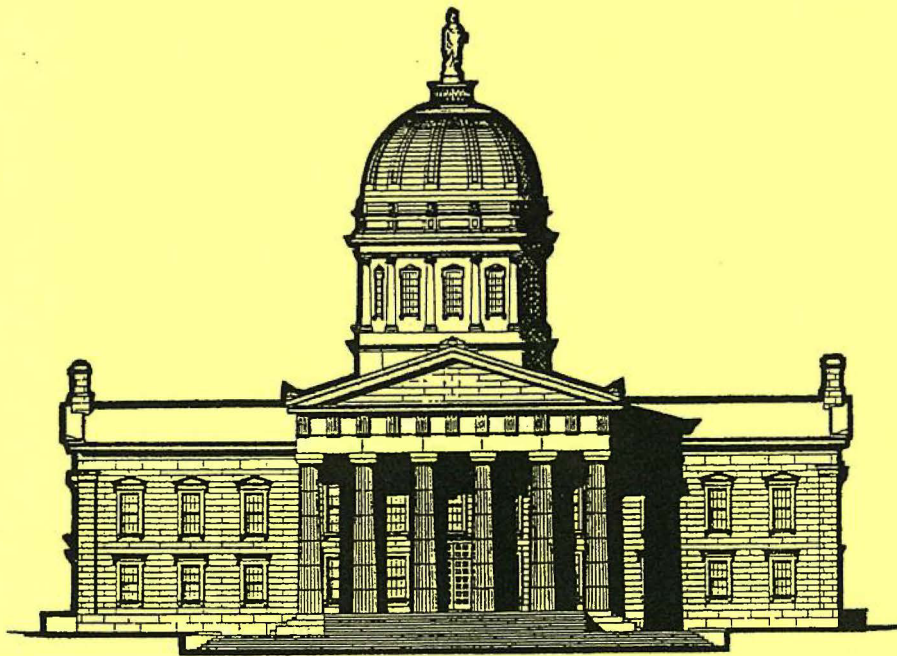

## **Appendix**

**Vote explanations (at the back of book)**

*The following are the House Rules governing voting in the House*

**XI  
OF VOTING**

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing. It is generally recommended that vote explanations should be infrequent and brief.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. Of the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 73, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Member shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

## Vote Explanations

Page 2.

**Rep. Branagan of Georgia** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We are in a significant financial crisis. We simply cannot continue government as usual. This bill limits the continued growth of government and saves \$1.6 million doing it. We still have a long way to go.”

**Rep. Browning of Arlington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill imposes the burden of cost savings on a small number of applicants. I think we should have found a way to share that burden among program participants. A state subsidy or benefit should be adjusted according to ability to pay. As this program is currently structured, there is no way to do this.”

**Rep. Clarkson of Woodstock** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

H. 485 makes important changes to current use – a program which is critically important to the conservation and economy of Vermont – which maintains its integrity and helps ensure its sustainability.”

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Deferring costs for a year does little to address a multi-year fiscal crisis; it is just an easy way out for now.”

**Rep. Nease of Johnson** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. It is important to note that in this bill we solved only one onehundredth of the \$150 million dollar challenge that we have before us. I would remind those who have been saying that we need to make hard choices this year, who also voted ‘no’ on this bill, a bill that passed two committees with unanimous votes. It only gets harder from here.”

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. This is a permanent tax increase, an illusory “one time” benefit and a failure to address the misuse of current use to cause hardworking Vermonters to pay the taxes of the wealthy, including many out of staters, with no real and direct benefit to those who live and work in Vermont. The cost shift is in many cases from those most able to pay, to those least able to pay. It has not saved farms and certainly has not saved the logging and wood industry. It is inequitable.”

**Rep. Morrissey of Bennington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The Ways and Means committee based their \$1.6 million savings on several hundred. Today, in the thirteenth hour, House members are told on the floor that it could effect between 750 to 1,000 applicants for the current use program.

One can only wonder, what are the real savings and what will be the real long term effects to the program?”

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill costs those enrolled for the long run no more money. There is no cost shift. Those enrolled will see no difference in their annual property tax bills.

False statements for political purpose does a disservice to this program which is the heart of Vermont’s working landscape.”

**Page 4**

**Rep. Ainsworth of Royalton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

No one enjoys an increase in fees or taxes in these challenging times. However, this bill basically concurs with the Governor’s request except for the unjustifiable increase for water discharge fee upon Vermont Yankee. Because of the majority of the bill concurs with the Governor, I also do.”

**Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no, with all due respect to the Ways and Means committee. In these controlled and hard times, all things being equal, or not, only bread should rise.”

**Rep. Morrissey of Bennington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermonters who are presently struggling in this economy and who will ultimately be paying for these fee increases should not be asked to shoulder this additional 2.6 million dollar burden at this time. A one year moratorium would have been the right thing to do.

No mas, no mas, no mas!!!!.”

**Rep. Olsen of Jamaica** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

By passing this bill, we are adding to the tax burden of small businesses and trades people throughout Vermont. In addition to sharp increases for various construction permits, this bill increases the plumbing license fee by 32%, the specialty plumber license fee by 25%, and the dealer/repairman license fee by 100%. Small business and trades people can ill afford increased fees and taxes during these difficult economic times.”

**Rep. Consejo of Sheldon** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I would have liked to allow our forces to vote electronically, unfortunately our Secretary of State is telling us that it is not possible at this time to allow the sanctity of the vote to be insured. I look forward to the day it will be possible for all of us to vote electronically, knowing that the privacy of our vote is being preserved.”

**Rep. Mrowicki of Putney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote to support the work of the committee in support of Vermonters far from home who want to securely exercise their right to vote. I'm someone who has had their supposedly secure online financial information compromised several times by the lack of internet security. I would hope we would make sure without a doubt that voting can be reliably secure before taking a chance with others ballots.”

**Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes Mr. Speaker for my son Mike and for all of our soldiers who value their freedom to vote so much that they are willing to risk their lives for the freedom of others. We should be doing everything in our power to make it easier for all our soldiers.”

**Rep. Adams of Hartland** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted “yes” in committee to bring this bill to the floor for debate. I made it clear at that time my floor vote would be “no” because I feel it unnecessary to codify what is currently an active program at the Agency of Natural Resources.”

**Rep. Moran of Wardsboro** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This legislation further offers assistance to Stamford and other Vermont towns which are constantly threatened by flooding and unpredictable river course changes. Through cooperation between town and state we are reaching out to our fellow Vermonters to audit future property damage and loss.”

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because this version is better than the underlying bill. However, I will be voting no to read the bill a third time. I explain my vote to save you the time of my requesting another roll call vote.

This bill avoids our obligation to Vermonters. We cede the budget process to the administrative branch which has not yet managed government with any of the efficiencies sought.

This is good long-term planning, but it should not be how we balance a budget. We should be more clear. Either cut services or raise revenues or both but we cannot waive a magic wand and have 38 million dollars just disappear without there being unforeseen and unfortunate consequences.”

**Rep. Komline of Dorset** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I worked very hard to get an amendment passed last year that was similar to this resolution. I was told it was too difficult to implement.

I don’t think we should be passing any bill without knowing its fiscal impact but this is a good start. It’s unfortunate we didn’t pass it last year.”

**Rep. Moran of Wardsboro** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Today we offer genuine protection to property tax payers in Vermont.”

**Rep. Turner of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes on this common sense measure which will hopefully protect our communities from the unfunded mandates of the past. However, I wonder why it is a good idea now but was so soundly defeated by this body less than a year ago.”

**Rep. Donaghy of Poultney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Thanks but, I don’t like either version.”

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Having other states become as progressive as Vermont is a laudable aim. Delegating away our control over Vermont’s health care future unfortunately is not the way to attain that goal. My “no” vote will be followed by a “yes” on adopting the best approach to helping other states become more like us.”

**Rep. Till of Jericho** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no on this amendment to J.R.H. 39 because this amendment would undermine health care reform, the Vermont blueprint for health and long-term control of health care

spending in our state. It does nothing to control our overall health care spending and cripples our tools to do so.”

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes due to the resolved clauses while I disagree with the fifth whereas clause. If all other states adopted the good consumer protections that Vermont offers then the economy of scale would help everyone. Once we are all in together there would be every reason for the feds to go the final step and make it a universal plan across the country.”

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If we cannot be assured of safeguarding even our most fundamental consumer protections, then we should not be silent on federal law that may offer only some of those protections through pre-emption of Vermont law.”

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

No, this resolution would deny me fundamental liberty over the control of my own body and health choices. It proposes economic and personal enslavement to the government plantation of slavery. I want to choose my health care and the means of paying for it. I will not violate that right for myself, but most of all for my fellow citizens for who, I have taken an oath to protect and defend their fundamental rights and liberties.”

**Rep. Koch of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We've just spent an hour proving what we already knew. Republicans favor interstate sale of health insurance, and Democrats don't. Unfortunately, they're probably not making any greater progress at today's gabfest in Washington.”

**Rep. McFaun of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because I want to preserve my right and the right of all residents of Vermont to purchase health insurance from wherever we want to.

We just passed a resolution urging Congress not to allow me and all residents of the State of Vermont to purchase health insurance from another state if I so choose.”

**Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The answer here is not to isolate ourselves from the rest of the nation. That will only serve up poorly. My hope is that the federal government will allow the purchase of health insurance across state lines while maintaining the integrity of our system with regard to consumer protections, and extending those nationwide.”



**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This resolution was the wrong message at the wrong time. Just as the President and Congress try to find common ground, we pass a divided resolution along party lines. A resolution that was unable to gain support from across the political spectrum, was clearly the wrong message to send.”

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I would rather we pass a resolution in the affirmative for a national public option bill. But, at least we could have merged the best of both versions; the previous amendments resolved clauses and the committee amendments whereas clauses, but we let partisanship get in the way.”

**Rep. Ainsworth of Royalton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I don't like laws that use the term at “his or her discretion”. That may adversely affect the Agriculture industry..”

**Rep. Dickinson of St. Albans Town** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I support the underlying intent of the bill, but cannot support the bill as written with all the jurisdictional questions unanswered.”

**Rep. Olsen of Jamaica** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill fails to recognize that many Vermont farms are comprised of non-contiguous parcels. I vote no in support of the farmers who have so eloquently expressed their concerns. I hope the deficiencies with this bill can be rectified.”

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. This bill, as amended, shows the work of this body at its best: when a need for clarification emerges in floor discussion, the committee of jurisdiction is responsive to the need, and a better product emerges from the body with full consensus as to the outcome.”

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I oppose state intervention into private safety decisions. However, that decision was made much earlier by this body. I vote yes because secondary enforcement is an illogical mechanism of law.”

**Rep. Turner of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If this law generates a thousand officer discretionary stops and only saves one life, it is worth it to me.”

**Rep. Atkins of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. I am not in favor of primary enforcement.”

**Rep. Rodgers of Glover** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This country was founded by people who broke unjust laws. I will not give up any freedom easily no matter how small it may seem.”

**Rep. Wheeler of Derby** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If our actions become law we, as legislators, need to set the example.

Laws are not only made for others. They are also meant for us. How many legislators haven't gotten a speeding ticket because of their legislative plates and celebrated that?

If we are pulled over for any of these proposed new laws, or any other motor vehicle laws, including speeding, not only should we worry about getting a ticket, but we should also expect them. Personally, I think we as lawmakers should be held to a higher standard, not a lesser standard. We must not be hypocrites.”

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My no vote on the provisions outside of the texting ban, reflects my belief that we need to pass a ban on texting while driving this year. The one thing we all agree on. The rest of this bill has already been passed and sent to the Senate.”

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because texting while driving is taking others lives into your own hands. That is where we should focus our efforts, not telling people what to do with their own lives.”

**Rep. French of Shrewsbury** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Any lister who didn't include this information in his or her normal duties would be doing the town a great disservice by depriving it of possible tax revenue.”

**Rep. Lewis of Derby** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no on another unnecessary government mandate. It seems I vote no on a lot of proposed mandates. If we continue in our path of travel we may as well change our Coat of Arms from Freedom and Unity to Government and Mandates.”

**Rep. Mrowicki of Putney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote for this bill in support of the Vermonters who desire to live in safe, decent housing.

Mr. Speaker, we are in the economic mess we're in because lack of oversight allowed Wall St. to dump the mess of their excess onto Main St. This bill provides the oversight to help ensure that Vermonters who live in rental housing will be living in housing that is safe, decent and habitable.”

**Page 22**

**Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because I believe that there should be standards that our landlords have to live by. I just don't think our listers should get stuck with the job or that our towns should have to pay. I don't like unfunded mandates.

Our property taxes are already too high. Let's not add to them. I do hope though, Mr. Speaker, that the member from St. Johnsbury gets to keep his home.”

**Page 24**

**Rep. Higley of Lowell** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have a neighbor from Jersey and when I tell him about bills like this that we pass he states we passed that a long time ago in Jersey. That's when I inform him that he moved to Vermont, I didn't move to Jersey.”

## Page 25

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Surely, we do not want our state public policy to declare the once respected self-made person a second class citizen. What is good for a majority is not always good for everyone, and we should always respect that. I vote no because this bill implies otherwise.”

**Rep. Gilbert of Fairfax** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because only one in five New England college undergraduates succeed in earning a post-secondary degree or credential. A PreK-16 council will focus on a key leak in that pipeline – high school graduation to college continuation. It is a way to improve the quality of our workforce by removing barriers between high school and post-secondary education.”

**Rep. Turner of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support the need for higher education in Vermont, but the high powered lobby of our state institutions is leading this body down a path of secrecy. This bill shifts our focus from the always rising cost of tuition/higher education to a general goal in which we can all support while taking control of the Vermont Higher Education Endowment trust fund. Does the term “putting the fox in charge of the hen house: mean anything to you?”

## Page 26

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support this amendment because the changes proposed in H. 470 to our assistant Judges, result in minimal savings, and minimal assurance, regarding any positive change to our justice system.”

## Page 27

**Rep. Johnson of South Hero** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. All of state government has felt the drastic shift in our economic landscape. Difficult choices have been necessary. On behalf of Grand Isle County residents, I thank the House Judiciary committee for preserving courthouses and judicial services in ALL 14 counties.”

**Page 28**

**Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. This amendment opened the conversation, and has allowed for an open avenue for reflection. The people on the street need to know.”

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. Conflicts between two fiduciary duties are resolved by recusing oneself, not by arbitrarily placing one duty above the other. That has been a settled fiduciary principle for generations and my “no” vote was because it would have been wrong to change it here, however well intended the reason.”

**Rep. Turner of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. The taxpayers of this state think that we are accountable to them and I feel that the \$100 plus million that UVM, VSAC and the state colleges get annually either directly or indirectly should flow in a transparent manner. What are we hiding and from whom?”

**Page 31**

**Rep. Ancel of Calais** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. This is not a tax increase. The production deduction will be frozen at the current 6% rate for only two years. Even at that, Vermont will be the only New England state other than Rhode Island to provide this tax benefit.”

**Rep. Clark of Vergennes** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. The approval of this section of the amendment represents a tax cost of \$50,000 to the B.F. Goodrich manufacturing plant in Vergennes. It’s the wrong time and sends a poor signal to our manufacturing businesses if this tough economic time.”

**Rep. Clarkson of Woodstock** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because without this revenue we will not be able to reduce the property tax rate 2 cents. We are one of only two states in New England which allows this deduction. In this amendment, with this tax deduction at 6%, we continue to support our businesses in a significant way.”

**Rep. Donaghy of Poultney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. By not allowing the 9% federal deduction to pass through to Vermont manufacturing businesses and farms, we are in fact, increasing taxes on these businesses who have already factored in the deduction in their business plans. It couldn't come at a better time for them with the booming economy.”

**Rep. Komline of Dorset** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. This tax deduction is provided by the federal government to help provide our businesses with some economic stability in these challenging times. By passing this – Vermont is no better than a highwayman taking money we have no right to. This makes it even tougher to convince businesses to move to our state.”

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. Every business has an argument why they should be exempt from paying and have a special deduction. If they don't pay, average Vermonters do. Their burden, as so many repeatedly tell us, is heavy enough already.”

**Rep. McDonald of Berlin** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermont lost 25% of its manufacturing jobs this decade leading up to the recession and we continue to lose more. Any relief in taxation or other costs of doing business is critical to holding onto our manufacturing base. Without the \$9 million, relating to the production activity deduction, which manufacturers have been expecting and counting on, Vermont manufacturers and others will have a harder time climbing out of the recession and keeping Vermont jobs from being lost or transferred out of the state of country.”

**Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. Taxpayers won't have to worry about paying their taxes when they don't have jobs.”

**Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. Increasing taxes on cigarettes, soda and junk food are deemed important to curb their use and it has proved to be successful. I wonder how much in-state manufacturing will be curbed as a result of this tax increase.”

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because there is a better way to raise the money for the property tax reduction. We could have found the same \$5 million by slowing the income tax reduction for those couples making \$170,000 or more this year, rather than leveling the production deduction and taxing dietary supplements. However, I would like to clarify it is \$3 million that will not be passed on, not the \$9 million just referenced.”

**Page 32**

**Rep. Donaghy of Poultney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

CLA, co-efficient of dispersion, equalized pupils and phantom students? These are all terms in which we can easily make our constituents understand. Right?”

**Rep. Marcotte of Coventry** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The current system is burdensome, but not only for the school district, but also to the municipality. As a selectboard member for over 20 years, I know that selectboards and city councils struggle every year to keep their portion of the tax rate down because of the ever-increasing school tax rate, so we don't overburden our taxpayers. This has had a profound effect on our towns infrastructure. Towns are sacrificing our infrastructure to finance our school system. That's not the choices our towns should have to make.”

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill already correctly says that the time has come to consider education and its funding anew. This amendment's use of loaded negative findings, which totally ignores all positive results from our education system, is not the way to begin any objective conversation. It is like looking only at your housing costs while ignoring the fact you have a house as a result.”

**Rep. Till of Jericho** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

What we have done here today by decreasing the state-wide property tax rate to 86 cents residential and 1.35 for non-residential property reduces the previously projected property tax increase in my district to less than 1/3 of what was projected on town meeting week. Starting with the assumption that the current system must be scrapped is an inappropriate way to order a study of the system.”

**Rep. Webb of Shelburne** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Everything this amendment proposes to fix is already being addressed.”

**Page 33**

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. We once again change the rules of the game for taxpayers as applied to last year’s income. A retroactive tax always denies the democratic process and the representation of the people. Taxation without representation is tyranny.”

**Rep. Masland of Thetford** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

There are many good aspects to this bill. However, I am very concerned that the \$425,000 “soft cap” does damage to people in the towns I represent, who, for no fault of their own, are seeing property tax values rise much faster than their incomes. On balance, the bill is far better than no bill as all, and I look forward to its becoming better still before it becomes law.”

**Rep. Wizowaty of Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes in support of the effort to reduce the property tax rate because the schools have worked so hard to keep their budgets in check. But I’m disappointed in some of the mechanisms we’ve used to accomplish this and I hope we can come up with some creative substitutions in the days to come.”

**Page 34**

**Rep. Dickinson of St. Albans Town** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I would like to thank the Appropriations committee for its hard work on this bill. I do feel great concern about the delay of the challenge for change report before we can vote on the appropriations bill. I vote for transparency before voting on this budget so we may better serve our constituents..”

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Information that was important to my ability to assess the appropriations bill was withheld from me today. Despite the good work of the committee, I have no idea how much might change after the “challenges” update is disclosed. This denies me the ability to make an informed vote and to represent the interests of my constituents. This vote was a test of government transparency. We failed the test.”

**Rep. Morrissey of Bennington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I would contend that in the time we took to debate the motion to postpone the appropriations bill we could have had a joint presentation of this body to have a challenge for change progress update. What a shame and waste of time. We could have been



debating the budget and voting on it, for that was what I came here to do today. Our constituents deserve better.”

**Rep. Sweaney of Windsor** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no on postponing the vote on the budget today. I have been a member of the Joint Legislative Accountability Committee and a member of the Steering Team who has worked on the Challenges for Change. These challenges are just that, a leap of faith on all our parts to continue to work with the administration in collaboration to make Vermont government more effective, efficient and accountable to the people of Vermont.”

**Rep. Townsend of Randolph** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. I’ll be a good soldier....today.”

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Upon further reflection and with some trepidation I am willing to trust the reporter of the bill in her comments that it will be the committee of conference position in the conference process to work to uphold the house positions re: possible statutory or budget changes suggested by the administration in Challenges for Change. For those that voted for challenges, you bought in at that time and the committee followed that process and direction.”

**Page 35**

**Rep. Olsen of Jamaica** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cannot vote for a budget without knowing how we will find \$38 million under the seat cushion.”

**Rep. O’Donnell of Vernon** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I thank the Appropriations Committee for all their hard work, but I can’t vote for a bill that has \$38 million missing. We don’t know what is going to be cut, or where it is going to come from. Do you think maybe there is a reason that the challenges for changes was not ready on the day it was statutorily due?”

**Rep. Donaghy of Poultney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe the Challenges for Change is integral to the overall budget. Information that was important to our ability to assess the Appropriations Bill was withheld from us today. Despite the good work of the Committee, I have no idea how much might be revised after the “Challenge for Change” report is disclosed. This denies us the ability to make an

informed vote and to represent the interests of our constituents. I vote we should send this bill back to the Appropriations Committee, to report back to us with specificity on the \$38 million of the created efficiencies.”

### **Page 36**

**Rep. Koch of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The evidence is clear. Vermonters are moving out of state to avoid the estate tax trap we have previously created for them. When they do that, we lose not only any estate taxes they may owe when they die, but also their income taxes while they are alive.”

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This amendment would have created a special exemption just for a person with an estate of over \$2 million. Doing so would have created a new \$3 million budget hole to be balanced on the backs of average Vermonters. How much more do the rich really need to take from the poor before they say “enough”?”

### **Page 38**

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. The tax rate claims are political smoke and mirrors. Tax bills continue to climb because we do not have the courage to address the real cost drivers. We should have repealed the capital gains increases we enacted last year. We should be attacking the false premises of Brigham, which through Acts 60 and 68, along with our other tax burdens are driving our most productive population, the 25-45 year olds, out of Vermont. They cannot continue, with their children, to survive here, much less flourish.

As a wise old Morgan farmer said to Marselis Parsons during Vermont’s Bi-Centennial, “Marselis, a cup of hot soup in February goes a lot further than the view!”

Our problem is many Vermonters no longer can afford the cup of hot soup while we keep raising the price. Shame, shame, shame on us!”

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill provides lower taxes for many average Vermonters. That it fails to provide special advantages for the capital gains and estates of high income Vermonters is a strength of this bill, not a weakness.”

### **Page 39**

**Rep. Reis of St. Johnsbury** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because I believe the amendment is too absolute. However, by making so called “loans.” that are really grants, the VHCB is deceiving both the Feds and the

taxpayers of Vermont. This is a clear case of the end justifying the means. Some of history's greatest injustices have been perpetrated because the end justified the means."

**Page 42**

**Rep. Klein of East Montpelier** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Under current law VY will absolutely close on March 2, 2012, less than two years from now. My yes vote for H. 589 is at least a very small step in the correct direction to protect Vermonters from paying the cost for cleaning up the mess that the out-of-state corporation that owns this plant will surely try to leave us with. H. 589 begins the process of making sure it is the corporation that owns this plant that must pay for its closure, shut down and complete clean up and Vermonters are not responsible for one penny of the clean up!."

**Rep. Turner of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes on this bill to add another layer of financial protection for our taxpayers. I hope that this action is the start of a new round of dialogue as we continue to consider the future of this important resource to the future of the economy of our state."

**Page 43**

**Rep. Clark of Vergennes** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I am disappointed with the loss of grants from the original bill which would have helped some of the hard hit businesses in my area recover from the loss of the Champlain bridge. I hope the remainder of the bill does what is intended... to stimulate the Vermont economy and create sustainable jobs."

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. I believe I support every part of this bill. Unfortunately, I ran out of time to read and fully review the Senate changes. I wonder now, for instance, why we want to make an exception to federal guidelines and allow persons with felony convictions to be certified for emergency medical care."

**Page 45**

**Rep. Weston of Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I vote no out of concern that this body is attempting to geographically limit a population that it may deem undesirable. This is one step down a very slippery slope."

**Rep. Deen of Westminster** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

After this debate I am reminded of a song of my era. The words are: “Orangutans are skeptical of changes in the cages.” We are all skeptical of change but change we must in order to keep Vermont solvent and still serve Vermonters and protect our environment. It can work with enough good will and imagination and I for one am willing to try change and I am glad H792 has passed on to 3rd reading.”

**Rep. Donaghy of Poultney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no! Doing things in a better and more efficient way is always a good thing. At first blush, Challenges for Change presented a good case to help our little state to become more efficient. As is turned, it became a bogus tool designed to bail out this legislature’s lack of will to make very tough but necessary choices. We paid over ¼ million dollars to have some out of state consulting firm make those choices, albeit very cloudy ones, for us.”

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

A budget is a budget is a budget. We can pass this today, and pretend it isn’t part of the whole, but that does not change the facts- nor does it change the fact of our abdication of responsibility to be accountable to our constituents for a complete budget.”

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Yes, solely in order to advance H.792 to third reading to see if we will give local school boards and the taxpayers the tools to address the runaway costs of education and the terrifying demographics of the intensifying decline of student enrollments and the population cohort of 25 to 45 year old citizens who are fleeing Vermont to other states. This decline started in 1998 long before our national economic crisis and will continue to intensify for the next 3 to 5 years.”

**Rep. Komline of Dorset** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I thank the majority for supporting the Republicans effort to meet our challenges in a more responsible manner. While I am voting no at this time I absolutely support efforts to make our government more efficient and streamline state services. There are a few good changes in this bill that will do just that. But still, with a gaping hole of \$21M I, personally, can’t support voting for this now. I look forward to July’s report and hope that, at that time, I will have all the information necessary to make a responsible decision.”

**Rep. Lewis of Derby** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Although at times I have had my fair share of beating a dead horse so to speak, I voted no because this challenge is like entering that dead horse in the Kentucky Derby.”

**Rep. Minter of Waterbury** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to address the changing needs of the 21st century and to facing our economic crisis with a new way of doing things.

I vote yes to working collaboratively with state employees and their leadership.

I vote yes knowing that in a relatively short time some areas of state government have come up with very creative ideas and very real savings which have protected us from deep cuts to the services that are so critical to our neighbors.

I vote yes with the hope that we can achieve the challenges before us.”

**Rep. Mrowicki of Putney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I recognize the hard work of so many. We are in unprecedented economic times brought on us when the greed of Wall Street has flooded the MainStreet's of Vermont. The challenge process is also unprecedented. From the beginning of the process that sought new ideas, the only limit was, “you can't just say No”. In Washington, when a solution to the mess of health care was offered, the only response was No. When a solution is offered to regulate the greed of Wall street – the only alternative offered in response has been No.

Now, in Vermont a plan to move Vermont forward is offered. It's time to move past just saying No. It's time to act and I say yes..”

**Rep. Myers of Essex** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted for this bill because it is a step, albeit a baby step, in the right direction. But I am disappointed this body could not come up with definitive and substantial plans to realize the proposed \$38 million in total savings. Hard choices should have been made so savings could have been realized. But, people in this House chose not to make the hard choices. It is too bad we wasted a golden opportunity.”

**Rep. O'Brien of Richmond** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes. This bill begins to change the landscape for state budgeting. It redirects our focus to outcome in state government and that is what will benefit Vermonters in the long run.”

**Rep. Savage of Swanton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Although I certainly agree with the concept that Challenges for change represents in the form of a more efficient, cost effective state government, I voted NO for this bill as it is the method with which the end result is to be achieved.

By not making all of the hard choices that are needed to be made, the legislature is abdicating it’s constitutional obligation to provide a budget o the administration and have made the entire Challenges for Change nothing more than a political sham.

I have publically stated to my constituents a couple of weeks ago that I did not vote for the budget on March 25th as the legislature failed to comply with the law mandating that we receive a report on the Challenges for change by the date that was required. We violated the law then and now are ignoring the constitution. I will have no part of this.”

**Rep. Till of Jericho** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe the Challenges for change is a worthwhile effort. I believe in outcome based budgeting. But given that we have only been able in this body to realize one-half of the challenge I don’t believe we can reach the goal in the time frame. With no plan B on the table I’m unable to vote for this bill at this time.”

**Page 47**

**Rep. Donaghy of Poultney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because municipal appeals will continue to still remain in the superior court. I still have concerns regarding the impact of Secs. 15, 16 and 17. Hopefully, they can be addressed in a committee of conference.”

**Page 48**

**Rep. Branagan of Georgia** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It is always better when local communities local school boards and parents make decisions for their own children. No one at the Dept. of Education, no state government official and no legislator knows what is best for my child’s educational placement. I do.”

**Rep. Waite-Simpson of Essex** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Although I support the underlying premise in this amendment, I also respect and support the committee process which, at this time, is unfinished.”

**Page 49**

**Rep. Lewis of Derby** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am probably the biggest supporter of law enforcement. However, I vote no on this amendment because it has potential to break the bank with the number of agencies that could be eligible for money.”

**Page 50**

**Rep. Mrowicki of Putney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to help Vermont continue to lead the country towards a better health care future for all. In an environment where health insurance costs have risen 90% in the last 10 years, cost containment must be addressed alongside improving health outcomes. If anything is scary, it would be allowing the status quo. We must continue to move ahead matching our ideals of equality with principle, common sense and sound economics.”

**Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Make no mistake, this statewide expansion of the blueprint for health will increase insurance premiums by over \$11 million dollars. I vote today against increasing the burden on our state’s families, businesses and farmers.”

**Page 51**

**Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We all recognize the value of drug samples that patients use to try out a new medicine. By asking the federal government to share their information with us will have no impact on the doctor-patient relationship. We have taken great pains to be sure that Vermont doctors see no change in the way they practice as a result of our bill.”

**Rep. Komline of Dorset** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We start down a dangerous road when we, as a body, become so overconfident that we ignore the voice of the very people we represent. Make no mistake, that is just what you are doing here. Doctors, medical health advocates and patients were not served well today.”

**Rep. Till of Jericho** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. I vote not to pharma’s misinformation campaign. This provision in the underlying bill does not restrict acceptance of samples by health care providers. It does not restrict the physician’s ability to provide samples to patients. The section of S. 88 this amendments removes simply says that if the same information reportable to the

federal government as of 1/1/2001 is not given to Vermont in a form we can analyze by the federal government. The pharmaceutical companies need to provide it directly to Vermont.

The decision to collect information about pharmaceutical marketing in the Vermont AG's office was made nearly a decade ago. Presently, each prescriber is already listed in the A.G.'s office with a dollar amount for all the gifts received from pharmaceutical companies. The S. 88 does not include a value or dollar amount and has very specific language which protects the identity of physicians or other prescribers who accept samples. There will be no public reporting or searchable website for samples as there is for gifts presently. Information given to researchers is required in S. 88 to be deidentified. I vote against this amendment and the campaign of misinformation which has accompanied it."

**Rep. Townsend of Randolph** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

If five wolves and 1 lamb are deciding what to have for dinner; I think I know what the outcome will be sometimes the majority isn't right."

**Page 53**

**Rep. Koch of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Health insurance brokers serve a valid purpose. They help individuals and employers to assess their needs, review the various health insurance policies and programs on the market, and choose the insurance product that best fits their needs. To target broker commissions for reductions runs the risk of driving brokers out of Vermont and further limiting the few choices we have in selecting health care coverage. A Yes vote on this amendment is in no way a vote to increase premiums as one member has suggested, but a vote to preserve choice for Vermonters."

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

If we ever are going to control spiraling health care costs, we need to scrutinize all of those costs, not just some of them. This amendment would have protected some interests from real scrutiny at the ultimate expense of all Vermonters. If that wasn't the message, why adopt it? We just can't afford to keep on giving that sort of special treatment anymore."

**Page 54**

**Rep. Ainsworth of Royalton** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

When the former head of the Vermont hospital Association, the CEO of Gifford Hospital and his CFO both tell me they are concerned about the actions taken within this bill as it will not reduce cost and only add more regulator burden. The CEO and CFO of a hospital which has stayed within their proposed budget the past 10 years. The only



hospital which accepted the challenge of submitting a 2 year budget to the State for approval this past year. I can't vote in the affirmative."

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

If we are serious about reform, we should begin by making our existing government-run plans – Medicaid and Catamount – sustainable. We started Catamount as a self-sustaining plan with unknown long-term funding only a few years ago, and it required \$7 million in general funds to bolster it this year.

A massive expansion of the blueprint for health going beyond its focus on chronic conditions and into the realm of government-regulated regional global budget for all of health care is once again without any assurance of the capacity to pay for it. If the health care system participants are so enamored of this venture, we shouldn't need legislation to mandate it. Make no mistake, this will be a costly venture into uncharted waters, which we ignore our onongoing sinking ships. This is not what is meant by reform."

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I vote "no". This is another torpedo below the waterline of the Vermont ship of state. We are already sinking rapidly. All this does is increase our race to the bottom of the economic ocean, while chaining us to the bunks in our staterooms. Drowning is not my choice of suicide."

**Rep. Lanpher of Vergennes** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I was sent to Montpelier to make a difference! Voting "yes" today makes a difference. The passage of S 88 advances our commitment to Vermonters to lead the way in health care reform

The actions in S88 move Vermont forward in realizing our vision of affordable, quality health care for all Vermonters."

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

This was a good bill two days ago and it continues to be a good bill today. For those who advocate clean and careful process, it provides exactly that. For those who seek immediate action, it provides it. For those who want drug samples, it delivers them with greater transparency. For those who value bipartisanship, it delivers it with the administration's support. All Vermonters have reason to be thankful that we have approved it today."

**Rep. McFaun of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I vote No because again this year we have brought a bill to the floor that does not adequately control the out of control costs of health care. Which is a subject of extreme

intense concern to the people I represent in Barre Town.”

**Rep. Till of Jericho** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

S 88 works to reduce costs of health care at multiple levels:

At the level of primary care, chronic disease management and prevention with the Vermont blueprint for health statewide rollout.

At the level of the hospital with limits on revenue growth – the best figure for health care spending at the hospital level.

At the level of specialty care, and variations in health care usage with community health system. It looks for an overall payment design that might be more efficient than what we have presently. It allows the consultant to design a system with Federal Health Care Reform in mind.”

**Rep. Webb of Shelburne** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Grandma always said an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. In addition to the 289 people who provided testimony, it looks like the committee also heard from grandma. This bill strengthens primary and preventive care, builds community and keeps our health care dollars in Vermont.”

**Rep. Wizowaty of Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As a result of this bill, two important things will happen. First, Vermonters will have three fully designed options for an integrated health care system, complete with benefits and costs spelled out, to examine and choose from if they wish. Second, at the same time, the much advanced health care reforms we have been implementing in Vermont in for several years – the blueprint for health and others – will be strengthened and expanded. Together these two parts of the bill – not mutually exclusive but highly complementary – will address how health care is delivered and how it is paid for. I believe the bill as is will improve health care for Vermonters. Thank you .”

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My no vote reflects my belief that any potential benefits that this bill may have are overshadowed by the harm it inflicts. Harm to low and moderate income Vermonters, Seniors and the under and un insured. The concerns were real, and I am always disappointed when real concerns are dubbed misinformation, as they were mischaracterized on the House floor today.”

**Page 55**

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. This bill aggressively confronts those who might consider driving under the influence in Vermont after having been caught doing so before. Our current ways of dealing with that problem clearly are inadequate, as any Vermonter can confirm. This bill does not create a “break” for offenders by putting them on an interlock, it saves innocent Vermonters’ lives by doing so. It also retains all our existing penalties for those who refuse an interlock.”

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes with reservations. I support the interlock devices legislation, but I am concerned about the message we send out by reducing license suspensions for DUI.”

**Page 57**

**Rep. Branagan of Georgia** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes only to allow this bill to come back before this body at third reading to be amended into a form that might possibly stand a chance of becoming Vermont law.”

**Rep. Consejo of Sheldon** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I could not support the bill as it is written, but I agree with the body in allowing the process to move forward in the hope that a compromise with the members of the alliance can be reached. And that the new language would allow us to go to the Senate committee and hopefully provide our Abenaki with a process acceptable to all of them.”

**Page 58**

**Rep. Lorber of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. The Vermont Benefit Corporations Act will strengthen Vermont’s business environment. It bolsters the Vermont brand. It legally supports businesses subscribing to a bottom-line that includes societal benefits. And, it increases transparency and social accountability.”

**Page 59**

**Rep. Donaghy of Poultney** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. This bill represents a very dangerous and risky public policy change in the way the state of Vermont deals with criminal offenders. Providing protection to its citizens is the single most important and fundamental reason for the existence of

government. Saving money should never be reason to put our residents at risk by the very certain unintended consequences that will occur as a result..”

**Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. Our #1 job as a government is to protect our citizens. Without laws and boundaries we become a lawless society. How are judges and law enforcement able to uphold the law when we keep changing the rules? I remember a few years back when two nonviolent criminals on a work detail escaped and brutally murdered a woman in Newfane. When things happen because of the laws we enact, we are responsible. Isn't the value of the safety of our citizens worth more than a few million dollars?”

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. Creating fear is easy and saying “no” also is easy. This bill, however, addressed a huge problem responsibly and it deserved the “yes” vote it just received. By thoughtfully doing as the administration requested, we are both keeping Vermont one of our safest states. We also are starting to reign in our uncontrolled spending on corrections. Both the federal government and other states already do much of what this bill calls for. It's about time we followed their lead and combined strong public safety with fiscal sanity.”

**Page 60**

**Rep. Ancel of Calais** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill sets the table for school districts to make their own decisions whether consolidation will create better opportunities for their students and improve cost efficiencies. The incentives it offers are modest but meaningful. Furthermore, the bill has no effect on those districts that currently offer school choice. It is a needed step forward.”

**Rep. Donovan of Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes on H. 782 because it offers opportunities for school districts to continue to offer quality educational programs for Vermont school children at an affordable price. The school choice that exists in Vermont today will continue to exist the day after this bill is enacted into law.”

**Rep. Gilbert of Fairfax** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support H. 782. The key point is that the bill, as written, has the intent of removing barriers to merger for those districts and their voters who have determined that it is in their best interest to merge. The bill recognizes that communities differ and gives local boards and voters the chance to determine what is best for them. The only requirement is that districts have a discussion with their neighbors to determine if it is something that they

want to explore. Those districts that find it is in their best interests present the entire plan to their voters for approval. Those districts that do not find it in their best interests will continue to operate as they already do. It's a shame we can't let our voters make their own decisions."

**Rep. Konline of Dorset** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

This bill does absolutely nothing to address school funding reform which Vermonters have repeatedly asked for."

**Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because Vermonters have been clamoring for education and education funding reform. In their defense of this bill, proponents have argued it is innocuous and a do-nothing bill. I couldn't agree more."

**Rep. Till of Jericho** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I support this amendment. It requires only that school boards consider the possibility of merger. It allows the local boards to make a decision that they believe is best for their district. It provides temporary incentives to the towns whose taxes would go up as a result of the merger removing one large roadblock to merger in my S.U. for a long time. Most importantly it does not mandate consolidation from the top down. No district is required to change anything they're doing. Only to consider the implications of merger."

**Rep. Waite-Simpson of Essex** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Your House Education committee has heard from many people on the governance issue. We have a number of bills on our wall mandating consolidation of school districts which would effectively eliminate school choice in this state. Your committee decided to respect local decision-making and offer tools for school districts to use should they so decide."

**Rep. Zenie of Colchester** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

280 school districts each with their own personality. One size does not fit all. Only the voters know what is good for their district. H. 782 respects their decisions."

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

The school spending slope is going down already. Now we can claim it is because of us. Local boards can already talk with neighbors and constituents. We presume they are not doing their job. One size does not fit all."

## Page 61

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. So many times we go just a few steps too far, turning a rational protection into an irrational result. This is one such time..”

**Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because we all have concerns about BPA. But, I still have a huge concern about our WIC program, and the availability of formula to our lowest income families.”

**Rep. McFaun of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

After voting no in committee, I voted yes today because of the additional information I got from the floor debate convincing me it was the right thing to do at this time.”

## Page 64

**Rep. Geier of South Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Our founding fathers have been credited with being very wise when they wrote a constitution that separated church and state. They recommended that everyone have church choice, if free choice is best for religion, why is not free choice also good for education? I would ask members if one shoe fits all, then why do we have so many shoe stores?”

**Rep. Marek of Newfane** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Choice without equal funding and services is only an illusion of choice.”

**Rep. Olsen of Jamaica** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Everyone in Vermont has school choice, unless you are poor and happen to live in one of the approximately 151 communities that do not offer school choice.”

## Page 65

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This legislation is significant for current and future unemployed workers. It is also important for employers. The public ought to get at least one day to try to understand the changes that are being proposed before we take action that will affect so many.”

**Rep. Davis of Washington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My vote today is for all laborers; workers who we represent.”

**Rep. Howard of Rutland City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermonters are already paying too great a price for the failed economic policies of the last eight years. Policies that promised jobs, then affordability instead they made the wealthiest wealthier and forced the rest of us to do more with less. Vermonters are already sharing the pain of the corruption and greed of Wall Street. I cannot ask my unemployed neighbors to pay a greater price for these failures.”

**Rep. Kitzmiller of Montpelier** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

When we started working on this issue, I said we were “wading into the tar pits”. Now, 16 months later, we emerge pretty well covered with tar, that is, a compromise that none of us likes, but with a solution that will return this critical program to solvency. I am convinced that this is the right thing to do, and I’m willing to accept the tar.”

**Rep. Koch of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It has been said that there is something in this bill for everyone to hate. One part that I hate is the re-imposition of the one-week waiting period, which I worked diligently to repeal a decade ago. This provision has a particularly adverse effect on the granite industry workers whom I represent.

I appreciate the fact that this provision is not permanent, but has a sunset. I just hope that when 2017 comes, the sunset is not extended. That said, it is absolutely necessary that we fix our UI fund, and my yes vote recognizes the good work of those who did the hard negotiating to craft this compromise bill.”

**Rep. Poirier of Barre City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because this is just another example of corporate welfare at the expense of Vermonters who have lost their jobs due to no fault of their own. I hope the next Legislature will remember the plight of the working families of Vermont.”

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

With the average unemployed Vermonter going back to work in 14 weeks we have just sustained the 7% cut in the underlying bill.”

**Page 70**

**Rep. Minter of Waterbury** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I dedicate this no vote to the devastated families of three teens from this county who have recently lost their children to auto crashes. May this be the beginning of our ongoing efforts to improve highway safety and save lives.”

**Rep. Rodgers of Glover** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

People should only be pulled over for driving dangerously. All drivers are not created equal.”

**Page 71**

**Rep. Baker of West Rutland** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If we believe that primary enforcement of seatbelts and banning handheld electronic devices will save our lives then we should pass a bill that doesn't just target one class of citizens.”

**Rep. Bray of New Haven** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to help save lives - lives of all ages, because the error of our junior operators can take the life of other individuals, including those in other vehicles. But my yes vote comes at the cost of a certain hypocrisy: we are willing to require of young drivers safety measures that we are unwilling to adopt for ourselves. How much better today's vote would have been if we had led by example rather by fiat.”

**Rep. Consejo of Sheldon** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I fully supported this bill as passed by the House. It is very unfortunate that the final version proposed and agreed upon, has such a bias against our junior operators. This itself was enough to convince me to vote against it.”

**Rep. Gilbert of Fairfax** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Sec. 5 which requires the commissioner of motor vehicles, in consultation with the commissioner of education to formulate a plan to educate operators as to the dangers of operating while texting and the penalties that may be imposed illustrates the importance of the educational components of quality driver education programs as they exist in our schools today.”



**Rep. Lewis of Derby** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

During my law enforcement career I pulled my fair share of dead kids and others from mangled vehicles and the go through the hell of death notification. If this saves one life on the anguish to the family and the officers we have done the right thing.”

**Page 73**

**Rep. Geier of South Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As I won't be in this body next year to fix this law, I am depending on all of you here today to make a bad bill better. I am afraid that this will become more burden on the small businesses owner in Vermont whom we all want to succeed. Will this be one more bill, even though well intentioned, that will drive business from Vermont?”

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. This bill will provide no protection for minors and vulnerable adults, but will confuse, chill, delay, and in many cases, prevent hiring of qualified persons because of a fear of litigation. It authorizes, and in fact requires, a witch hunt, but contains no requirement that the “witch” be turned over for trial. The real result is the “witch” will be banished from the economy, and from gainful employment.”

**Rep. Peltz of Woodbury** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is a very troubling issue with no easy solution. But, we would be remiss to not better protect our youth and most vulnerable.”

**Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My yes vote today is to ensure that schools and other employers share critical information regarding an employees' conduct that jeopardizes the safety and well-being of our children. Vermonters are appalled at confidential separation agreements and actions that just “pass the trash”. This bill says we are too and we won't accept or tolerate it anymore.”

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill is an important step that will make it more likely that critical information is shared between school districts and other employers when children and vulnerable adults are involved. Protection of our most vulnerable, trumps all other issues, and that is the message we send out with this vote. I am proud of this first critical step we took today.”

**Page 74**

**Rep. Mook of Bennington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While this bill is hugely important for families with children on the autism spectrum, it is the first step. It is equally important that we as a state remember that the young children with autism that are presently in our education systems mature. Autism does not go away at 18. We need to be diligent in establishing and maintaining appropriate services for those individuals with autism that live within our communities.”

**Rep. Moran of Wardsboro** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Responding to autism spectrum disorder belongs rightfully in the realm of medicine. Early detection, diagnosis and treatment is not only the right thing to do, it also reduces pressures on our education system.”

**Rep. O'Brien of Richmond** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill is the work of hundreds of Vermonters. I am confident that outcomes for children will be extraordinary and that significant savings can be achieved.”

**Page 77**

**Rep. Atkins of Winooski** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support the F35 resolution wholeheartedly, but I vote no because of process. I would hope that the committee would have time to discuss it in the future and bring it to a vote.”

**Rep. Deen of Westminster** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Despite any other statements made here tonight, one has to ask how we can vote on this issue when the committee has not had time to review the resolution and inform the body of its contents and any impact on Vermonters.

This motion is showboating at its worst.”

**Rep. Moran of Wardsboro** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Your committee on General, Housing and Military Affairs continues to work closely with our National Guard. No one supports more our National Guard than your committee on General, Housing and Military Affairs.”

**Rep. Poirier of Barre City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because the committee of jurisdiction only got this resolution yesterday. I expect the committee of jurisdiction to take this resolution seriously and bring it to the full House before we adjourn.”

**Rep. Turner of Milton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We can take time in committee and on the House floor to debate religious freedom in Turkey, but we won't take the time or put forth the effort to send a positive message to the federal government that may help save 400 jobs and \$400 to \$500 million in economic impact to our state. Thank you.”

**Page 78**

**Rep. Andrews of Rutland City** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As we look for ways to cut state expenses while improving outcomes, we must make sure that we are not transferring costs to local towns, whether direct financial costs or stresses to the fabric of a community.”

**Page 79**

**Rep. Condon of Colchester** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The noise emitted by the F-16 and F-35 aircraft is the sound of Freedom. We would be honored to have the F-35's in Vermont.”

**Rep. Fisher of Lincoln** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have spent years orating arguments in support of our Vermont National Guard, but in opposition to military policy that I find to be not advisable and wasteful of public monies. The F-35 cost estimates are as high as \$160 million a piece and \$323 billion for the whole program. I don't know how much more efficiently they will do their job, but I can not support such an expenditure.”

**Rep. Wright of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The message this resolution sends is that the legislature supports our National Guard and understands the importance of winning the assignment of the F-35 aircraft at the Vermont Air Guard base at Burlington International airport and realizes the critical economic benefit it will provide.”

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It’s a sad day when our economy is based on military operations. Just think our whole budget problem, or our U.I. problem, could be solved with the money spent to build just one of these planes. When will we shift our budget priorities?.”

**Page 81**

**Rep. Andrews of Rutland City** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because I want to make very, very certain that we maintain our state’s longstanding and statutory commitment to parity of treatment for mental health.”

**Page 82**

**Rep. Poirier of Barre City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because it is obvious that the language proposed by the Senate is outdated and insulting to people who suffer from mental illness. Thank God there was a much more progressive thinking legislature in 1997 when the state adopted the most comprehensive mental health parity law in the country.”

**Page 83**

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This body has now stated as public policy in the state of Vermont under the Challenges for Change that a restatement of previously stated outcomes now omits the outcome of engagement in and contribution to the community’s decisions and activities, only for those with disabilities. This is not parity. As a person living with a mental health disability, it is personally hurtful.”

**Rep. Geier of South Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes for two reasons. First, because I like representing things twice in different ways, sometimes people don’t get it the first time. Second, I am worried about the process being too fast. And maybe in some peoples minds, unfair. That is why I voted yes in favor of the bill.”

**Page 85**

**Rep. Botzow of Pownal** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Change is hard to do, but we are changing. Not too much, not too little, but thoughtful, determined and necessary change to meet the conditions of our times and our responsibility to point us towards a better future.”

**Rep. Browning of Arlington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no because in bringing an incomplete challenges bill to the floor we did not, in fact, rise to the challenge before us. Nor did we fulfill our responsibility to our constituents. This bill should have been combined with the budget so that we could see clearly how any additional spending cuts would be made, and how the necessary investments will be financed.”

**Rep. Deen of Westminster** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We were asked to think about government in a new way under Challenges for Change. Those who have committed to working within this new approach may bring us to more appropriate, less expensive and more imaginative ways to meet our responsibilities to Vermonters. I hope so and I remain committed to doing my part to keep all members informed about progress. I hope all of you will join me.”

**Rep. Donahue of Northfield** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no.

I vote no for every time this session that we chipped away at the processes that protect the citizens of this state from the further erosion of a representative democracy.

I vote no to a few individuals appointing themselves with the authority to defeat the checks and balances of a bi-cameral body and of the separation of powers, and then expecting members to follow orders to implement those decisions.

I vote no for a process that ignores full responsibility for the state budget. I vote no to having information withheld before having to vote for bills.

I vote no to pretending we are restructuring services when much of the restructuring will be cuts to direct services.

I vote no to “token” sessions where new bills are introduced even when they do not exist yet as finished bills available to members.

I vote no to committee meetings closed to the public while making decisions on the business of the public.

I vote no to the contempt shown to every citizen who does not have a computer or computer skills, by making those the only avenue for accessing the public process - for public notices, the bills we introduce, the schedule of pending actions, and our journals. It strikes a blow to a vital core of our democracy: the right of our citizens to participate in their government.

I vote no to telling our citizens that a life without college is a life of lesser value to our state.

I vote no for the outrage of having to call it a victory when legislators force leadership to allow 24 hours instead of three days to read and review major legislation before final

votes, though I am grateful to the Republican leadership for forcing that 24-hour window instead of voting on bills still warm from the printer.

I vote no to being told I must make the time to read a 90+ page appropriations bill as we simultaneously address the capital bill, the education bill, the current use bill, the tax bill, and others.

I vote no to being required to choose between my constitutional obligation to be on this House floor when it is in session, or to participate in committee discussions, testimony, and the drafting of key legislative language regarding this bill.

Usurping the democratic process in government does not develop overnight. It happens through gradual erosion, when those in power begin to believe that they can make decisions better than the legislative body as a whole, and do so in processes outside of the public eye. I have watched that erosion over the past eight years. Democracy is not a tidy method for lawmaking. When we opt for expediency, we damage the core protections embedded in our constitution.

I object. I vote no.”

**Rep. Geier of South Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As a proud father of a new baby, I will be giving out cigars tomorrow to those who give me a business card and for others a piece of candy. For those who were not here for my explanation of my vote the first time I will send it out via email, maybe with some additions and corrections.”

**Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote “no”. Ditto to the explanation of the representative from Northfield. She said it all!”

**Rep. Lewis of Derby** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no even though the concept is good. I am concerned with the reality that we are putting a band aid on a wound that needs a tourniquet.”

**Rep. Masland of Thetford** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It is said that, “If you always do what you always did, you’ll always get what you always got.” This bill begins to change that paradigm, by moving us forward in through new process that we hope will provide better outcomes for Vermonters. In voting yes, I recognize that the bill is a reflection of both our best abilities and our foibles, and that it is not perfect. Like our process here, the bill has its wants. There are sections I do not like but we are engaged in elements of discovery here. We will not make progress if we do not try..”

**Rep. O'Brien of Richmond** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes. There is a huge gap between revenues and projected expenditures in the way we currently offer services. This is a long needed shift toward outcomes and performance based appropriations in our state government.

The challenge is to change the way work gets done, to increase efficiencies and most importantly, focus on results.”

**Rep. O'Donnell of Vernon** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Our government was set up with three branches for a reason. If we don't have the courage to do the right thing for the people we represent, we should just go home. That would save the taxpayers millions. After months of being promised we would be involved in the Challenge process, we find out that the appropriations bill has language that takes away all our involvement. Today we learned a lesson that words are powerful, promises from this building are empty without honesty and transparency. We don't have a democracy. This bill is not about change but about cuts.”

**Rep. Savage of Swanton** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support the concept of Challenges for Change but voted no as there appears to be too many questions and too few acceptable answers.”

**Rep. Sweaney of Windsor** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes today on the Challenges for Change bill. This is a monumental initiative for Vermont government. When we began this discussion in the Government Accountability Committee last June, we knew it would be a hard road to travel. I sincerely thank all legislators as well as the administration for all the hard work to make this monumental challenge of creative innovative, more efficient and effective government move forward to all Vermont .”

**Rep. Till of Jericho** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As chair of a school board finance committee, I can not vote for H. 792 which requests a 2% cut and prescribes these savings must come from structural and administrative savings. We should have left it to the localschool boards to decide how to achieve the savings.”

**Rep. Branagan of Georgia** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes knowing this is a difficult time for anyone responsible for budget preparation.

In spite of our difficulties all session long, this budget improves human services for our most vulnerable Vermonters, improves general government, education for our children, natural resource and environmental protective services and other important government tasks. It's a much better budget than I hoped."

**Rep. McFaun of Barre Town** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted no on the budget bill H. 789 because as was stated on this floor, teachers, state employees, school systems and Vermonters in general made sacrifices and will continue to make sacrifices. I can't vote for a budget that increased by more than 120 million dollars, while everyone else made sacrifices and will continue to make sacrifices."

**Rep. Zuckerman of Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I have voted no because this is not the budget that I believe would best serve Vermont. However, I would like to state for the record that it is far better than the one proposed by Governor Douglas. It is fiscally responsible but falls short of the obligations I believe Vermonters expect of us. The original proposal of the Governor was neither responsible nor honest. I am pleased that this will be the last time this body will need to address his smoke and mirrors feigning to look out for vulnerable Vermonters while cutting their programs."

**Rep. Geier of South Burlington** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because my father always said do your best and then more on. I want to assure this body and the people of Vermont the Education committee tried its best, we listened to a lot of testimony. It is now time to move on. That is why I voted yes."

**Rep. Peltz of Woodbury** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Vermont's long history of providing public education to its students has benefited from local oversight and support. We will continue to do so and abide by the adage – "If you ask Vermonters to do something, they'll do it. If you tell them to do it, they won't."

**Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I vote no on this bill. While I support the provision allowing students with disabilities to participate in graduation ceremonies, the remainder of this bill is a whole lot of nothing disguised as education reform. This bill does nothing to meaningfully reform education or education funding as Vermonters have been clamoring for. In fact, just as the original House version, the only thing this bill does to is violate the often-heralded Brigham decision."



**Rep. Poirier of Barre City** explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because we have our priorities backwards in this institution as we cut benefits to unemployed Vermonters and middle class workers. I ask what has happened to the Democratic party?”

**Rep. Wizowaty of Burlington** explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

In the last few days of talking to people about the question of taxing nonprofit ticket sales, I’ve discovered some interesting things — a misunderstanding of how ticket pricing works for non-profit organizations, a bias against larger organizations, mistaken assumptions about who attends the performing arts, and a lack of consensus about the role of govt. in supporting the arts—and I am disappointed that the conference committee has agreed on an April 1 implementation date, rather than July 1, which would have allowed the legislature to address a host of questions before making a significant policy change. Nonetheless, in spite of this speeded up timeline, I hope that next year’s legislature will give these questions a fair and thorough hearing.
