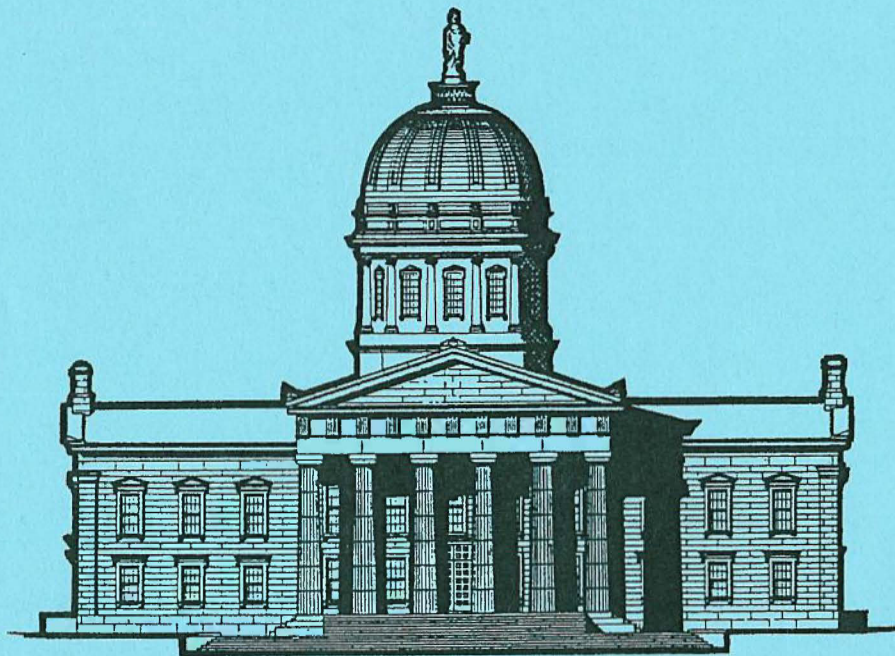

Appendix

Vote explanations (at the back of book)

The following are the House Rules governing voting in the House

**XI
OF VOTING**

69. The alphabetical roll call shall be called upon any question if demanded by five members

70. Explanations of votes will be allowed only after the roll call is complete and immediately before the result thereof is announced. Explanations shall be submitted immediately to the Clerk in writing. It is generally recommended that vote explanations should be infrequent and brief.

71. A division of the House shall be had upon order of the Speaker or upon demand of one member. Of the vote be taken by division, a voting member who is unable to stand need not rise to express his or her vote but shall indicate the vote in some other manner.

72. No member or other person may remain by the Clerk's desk when the roll is being called.

73. When a vote is taken, every member present shall vote unless excused by the House; but no member may be compelled to vote who was absent when the question was stated from the Chair.

74. At the conclusion of the call of the roll, the alphabetical roll of the absentees will be called and, subject to Rule 73, members who were absent when their names were first called and who are now present shall then vote. Members not present when their names were called the second time shall not be permitted to vote, except by leave of the House.

75. Member shall not be permitted to vote upon any question in which they are immediately or directly interested.

76. The Speaker shall not be permitted to vote except in cases of elections by ballot, or when the House is equally divided, or when the Speaker's vote, if given to the minority, will make the division equal. In case of an equal division, the question shall be lost.

I am proud to be part of Vermont’s history of protecting human rights.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

When a committee proposes a bill without even having read the full statute it is amending, or knowing the definitions within it, we have sunk to a new low in our process of enacting law. I would have liked to discuss this with the committee in advance. However, the information I requested Wednesday was only sent to me, by email, at 8:15 a.m. this morning. Thus, only at 8:25 a.m. did I learn that the committee never had the core information for decisionmaking before today.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

A recommittal without any opportunity to even respond to issues which have been raised does not serve to advance orderly business of this chamber, it merely delays it..”

Rep. Townsend of Randolph explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

One of the first rules I learned upon arrival in the Vermont House of Representatives is to have faith in the committee process. This is a classic example how the process was designed to work. I voted no.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote “yes” in order to give the committee an opportunity to continue their good work in making a good bill better while addressing the members concerns raised today.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

A resolution such as this expresses the sense of this body about a matter of national importance. Our moral compass does not cease to function at our state line and an injustice elsewhere never should be ignored here.”

Rep. Olsen of Jamaica explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermonters expect us to get our own fiscal house in order before we turn our attention to the affairs of another sovereign state.”

Rep. Buxton of Royalton explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The underlying function of unions is to protect middleclass workers from the tyranny of the rich and powerful. It’s easy to protect the vulnerable during flush economic times. I voted for this resolution to show my support and respect for all working Americans – at all times; not just when it is easy.

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I would have co-sponsored this resolution as a small symbolic action. I had planned to vote no if it created a long floor debate, as I do not believe we should be spending our constituent’s time on such symbolic actions. So – no long debate, but roll calls instead. What’s a person to do? I vote yes, but with disgruntlement.

Rep. Donovan of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It was a resolution passed by the Vermont House requesting the Virginia Legislature to prohibit development of a Wal-Mart on holy ground where Vermont soldiers died in the Civil War. They heard us and that ground will remain holy ground in perpetuity.

Rep. Fagan of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I disagree with the path Wisconsin has chosen. I am unaware of Wisconsin or any other state ever having told Vermont how to act. Let us do the business of Vermonters.

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If I were a member of the Wisconsin legislature, I would not support the bill now before that body. But I am not; rather, I am a member of the Vermont legislature. To the best of my knowledge Wisconsin has never tried to tell Vermont what to do; neither should we try to tell Wisconsin what to do. It would behoove us to solve our own problems and mind our own business.

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It is inappropriate for this body to inadvertently condone the actions of our colleagues in the Wisconsin legislature who have, and continue to disregard their obligations to the people and Constitution of the State of Wisconsin

Rep. Krebs of South Hero explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I find it distressing to have to choose to support our public servants and to recognize the importance of protecting workers rights. While accepting language that is unnecessarily severe and provocative and intrusive and with recent national efforts at more civility and cooperation it is also distressing that such an important issue has to become politicized.

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This resolution recognizes that the debate in Wisconsin, truly is national in scope. For us to express our views is both fit and proper.

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I can only ask Mr. Speaker, “Why is this body taking up another state’s labor issues?” I believe that our own State of Vermont has our own significant fiscal issues that we should be addressing and not spending wasteful time on a “feel good”, non-binding resolution..”

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Neither government action nor the generosity of corporations brought us a middle class. It has hard working Americans united together for collective bargaining – we have unions to thank.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I would like to thank the many Vermont labor unions that have realized the importance of helping our state climb out of the hole caused by this recession. Both parties came to the table in good faith and worked with the administration to renegotiate and contribute their share. Others should follow their example. Thank you.”

Rep. Weston of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The deputy attorney general of Indiana said that he advocates for the use of deadly force against the peaceful protesters in Wisconsin. Despite the fact that we are in Vermont, it is our duty to not mind our own business and to speak up to support the peaceful protester’s first amendment rights and freedom of assembly in Wisconsin. I vote yes.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My no vote has nothing to do with my opinion of the events in Wisconsin. But what would we think if another state decided to weigh in on any parts of Vermont’s labor laws and no worries in Vermont, labor organizations are very strong and often wield a great deal of influence in this building.”

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

H. 26 is about cleaning up Lake Champlain. Retailers and Vermonters will get a clear message through warnings at point of sale of fertilizer. With that warning they both will do the right thing. Enforcement is not necessary except for bad actors.”

Rep. Lawrence of Lyndon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support the clean up of Vermont lakes and rivers but feel this bill needs more process; we are making laws that make retailers liable for civil action, suits are unclear as to fertilizer application such as area and specifies no notification to retailers.”

I voted no. A half million in new money that appeared from no where? I, for one, want to know what we are trading off in our budget before deciding on priorities.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While this bill does extend the VEGI program and changes to the merchant banks are positive, this is not a jobs bill. Vermont small businesses have been pleading for meaningful initiatives that would help the private sector invest and grow jobs. Issues like lowering taxes ensuring low cost reliable energy and reforming our strict regulatory system. The number of private sector jobs that are expected to be created is unknown, while we again grow government jobs.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because there are a couple of important provisions in H. 287. However, in every campaign last year the biggest issue was jobs, jobs, jobs! This bill was called “job creation and economic development” but it does little to actually create jobs and it’s a tepid response at best in regards to economic development.”

Page 11

Rep. Consejo of Sheldon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We are finally sending a clear message to those that choose to drive while they are intoxicated. It is very sad that this effort would not bring us back all the innocent victims of drunk drivers. It will however, help in reducing the odds that any of us would have their life tragically altered in a senseless way. Nick Fournier, this new law is in your memory.”

Rep. Kitzmiller of Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

In 1981, my father was killed by a drunk driver. It was that driver’s third DUI wreck within a decade. The judge sentenced that driver to one night in jail, on the grounds that he had a family to feed.

I am proud to support this bill!”

Page 12

Rep. Buxton of Royalton explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support this bill because it protects workers from losing their job or risking their health because of unreasonable business practices. For the vast majority of Vermont employers and employees this bill will not apply. We should applaud those businesses for implementing workers rights policies – without waiting for the government to pass a law. But for the very few who might benefit from the protection this law provides – I’m proud to demonstrate my support.”

Rep. Degree of St. Albans City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

By putting a time limit on how long an employee has for breaks this bill inadvertently gives the employers the legal ability to deny reasonable requests for breaks which current law allow for. This bill is a step in the wrong direction and does exactly the opposite of what it tries to accomplish.”

Rep. Lewis of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I’m having a hard time accepting that this issue of breaks is a problem. When you gotta go you gotta go or the problem will be solved and probably will not happen again.”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While we celebrate and support our growing business world and try to give them the tools to create more jobs, we must remember that those jobs are filled by our neighbors and family. It is our role in a democracy to protect those with the quietest voices. This bill is a very small step in that direction and most businesses do the right thing.”

Rep. Webb of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I had initially planned to vote against this bill because I was concerned that this placed undue control over reasonable employers. I came to realize that only an unreasonable employer would restrict someone from using the bathroom for six hours.”

Page 15

Rep. French of Shrewsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It’s unfortunate that this bill became so politicized. The notion that the vast majority of businesses who would never run afoul of these provisions should view it as insulting or threatening is not compelling. When we make laws punishing drunk drivers, do the majority of sober drivers feel insulted? Laws are made to protect our citizens from minority offenders. The law abiding majority are not implicated. This bill is not anti-business, it is anti-bad business.”

Rep. Gilbert of Fairfax explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill recognition of intermittent breaks during the ebb and flow of the work day protects workers from abuse and employees from frivolous action. It allows flexibility in the work place for all involved.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

For the past two days we have heard every possible rationale and excuse defending the ability of a few bad employers to remain unfeeling enough to deny someone working for six hours a chance to even go to the bathroom. If Charles Dickens had been here for this debate and heard the arguments he would be happily sharpening his pen and buying paper by the ream.”

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because I believe there is already protection and recourse under existing federal and state laws for both employers and employees for the circumstances cited on the floor. We should enforce them.”

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because I have the freedom to take lunch and toilet breaks and I want the workers of this state to have the same freedoms of human dignity.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote “no” to this anti-business unnecessary law that was strongly opposed by many of our trade associations.”

Page 17

Rep. Peltz of Woodbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Raising income taxes on the wealthiest has now been brought forth. I support the intention of this amendment, but believe the implementation will have to wait.”

Rep. French of Shrewsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I agree in principle with this amendment and look forward to it being taken up later this year by the ways and means committee.”

Rep. Haas of Rochester explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

There is not question that we need more revenue budget cuts in the past three years have already reduced many services to unacceptable levels. Local police jail people too sick to understand what they are doing.

People in mental health crisis spend 30-60 hours in emergency rooms waiting for appropriate placement. Telephone service lines are so busy that people just give up.

We should be looking closely at the human cost of cuts we have already made. This revenue would help us correct some of those issues.”

Rep. Martin of Springfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no with the hope and expectation that this will be taken up in the context that has been suggested as the more appropriate one.”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no on this amendment, not because I don’t believe in it, I do, but because I think it needs to be discussed fully in context of a discussion on readjusting our income tax system. It is fair to ask those who have benefited most from the Bush Era tax cuts to acknowledge the inequity between the gift made to them and the harsh reality of our human service cuts.”

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because I believe it is a moral obligation to protect and help those who need help the most and that asking the most well-off to contribute a little more is not too much to ask. This may not be the right bill or strategically the right time in a political sense, but the right time ethically, is when the help is needed and that time is as soon as possible.”

Rep. Spengler of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It has been perplexing to me that the Vermont legislature has chosen to decrease Vermont income taxes in 2009 and 2010 instead of asking those who can afford to help out and pay more to do so.”

Page 18

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote "no" because my school district should not be penalized for meeting the legislative goal. This action removes the only incentive that would have recognized school districts for complying with the legislatures' request and meeting the voluntary challenge for change goal. Thank you.”

Rep. Waite-Simpson of Essex explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The 87 cent base rate is one cent higher than it should be because the total education spending in the state is 2% higher than we projected last year. To ask school districts that met the 2% reduction to further subsidize the districts that did not meet the challenge is just not right.”

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Every school district worked hard to keep their budgets low and were rewarded by keeping down their tax rates.”

Page 19

Rep. Webb of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I would have supported this amendment, however I have decided to wait for the more thoughtful solution to this problem that the Ways and Means Committee has just promised to address.”

Page 20

Rep. Bouchard of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted for this bill because of section 15, the Colchester TIF, was too important for our town for me to vote against.”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill increases taxes and I vote no to support our governor's position that we have no more taxing capacity in this state. We can do better.”

Page 21

Rep. Higley of Lowell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

In his inaugural address, the Governor told this body "we must not and cannot succumb to the idea that Vermonters have the capacity to pay higher taxes..." This amendment is offered in the spirit of that statement.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

No one likes taxes but we all like balanced budgets. Unfortunately, in this difficult year if we are to attain a balanced budget we cannot do it through cuts alone. This bill thoughtfully dealt with that by limited and carefully structured proposals which avoided further harming the most vulnerable among us. It deserves all of our support if we plan to claim credit for a balanced budget when we go home, not to be undercut by this amendment.”

Page 22

Rep. Campion of Bennington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I stand with the Representative from Burlington, who spoke earlier today, and vote no in honor and out of respect for the youth of Bennington and young Vermonters throughout the state who may be deterred by the cost of cigarettes from starting this devastating habit”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

In his inaugural address, the Governor told this body, "we must not and cannot succumb to the idea that Vermonters have the capacity to pay higher taxes..." This amendment is offered in the spirit of that statement and the understanding that Vermonters need more from their elected officials than empty promises.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Suddenly eliminating a tax which has existed since 1959 by a floor amendment without providing a fiscal note revealing the multi-million dollar hole it would blow in our state finances simply is no way to make good policy.”

Rep. Howrigan of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Regarding H. 436 amendment to Sec. 27a before the budget this oversight must be corrected!”

Page 23

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I understand as we've heard, that Governor Shumlin stated that Vermonters do not have any additional tax capacity. However, we have to balance the budget and I do not believe that we can do that by cutting any more from social services, infrastructure maintenance, education, children and family services, corrections, or any of the many other responsibilities of state government. Sufficient tax revenue is necessary to fulfill these responsibilities.”

Page 24

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes to provide immediate assistance to Vermonters struggling with the costs of health care and immediate reductions in administration costs”

Page 25

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes to try to ensure that health reform is undertaken in a careful and sustainable way.”

Page 26

Rep. Marcotte of Coventry explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We have heard that we need to be concerned about the constitutionality of this amendment. We likewise heard the strong concerns of our business community. It would be wise for us all to share their concerns.”

Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

There has been a great deal of talk about jobs in this body over the last week. This was an opportunity to actually do something for jobs in Vermont; an opportunity to give some amount of certainty to our employers throughout the state. Their angst around the financing of a new health care system is palpable. Unfortunately we just ignored that.”

Page 28

Rep. O'Brien of Richmond explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is a historic vote. This bill puts us on the path to control health care costs and provide health coverage for all Vermonters.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to at last, take a solid step towards controlling soaring health care costs and promote better health outcomes through universal access. I applaud the body for the helpful and civil debate tonight and the health care committee for their steadfast and comprehensive work.”

Rep. Font-Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes as I am convinced this is the right direction for Vermonters future and the economic stability of the Green Mountain State. I applaud the chair of our health care committee - Member from Burlington – who it explained well. This is a new beginning for Vermont.”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

These same explanations were lauded when we passed catamount health care, which is now bankrupt.”

Page 31

Rep. Batchelor of Derby explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe this Health Care bill, H.202, as written is not good for all Vermonters.”

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I’ve listened to debate on this question for most of the last 2 days. We’re giving up tremendous power and authority to an unelected board accountable to no one. A complete fiscal note is missing. This is our health care system. These changes effect every Vermonter. Hopefully the Senate will correct our errors.”

Rep. Campion of Bennington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe this is the first step in long-range strategic economic planning for Vermont. This bill, I hope, ends the short-term thinking that has dictated so much of our economic policy.”

Rep. Canfield of Fair Haven explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We need all our available tools to make quality healthcare accessible to all. The Hsaio report identified the risks and benefits of creating a statewide single payer system. This bill makes a commitment to a universal system, but ignores risks identified in the Hsaio report and creates a new infrastructure without identifying how to pay for it.

Rep. Clarkson of Woodstock explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill is like an architect’s plan to fix a house badly in need of renovation. Our next step will be to review the bids for the cost of the work which lies ahead.”

Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes today with a clear understanding of the hard work we have ahead. I voted today to trade in certain crippling cost increases and unfair distribution of health care. I know we trade that certainty for a number of uncertainties and some years of very hard work. I have confidence in the strength of Vermonters who will come together to sort through these changes to create a health care system that works for all of Vermont.”

Rep. Dakin of Chester explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

When I arrived in Montpelier in January and learned I would work on the Health Care Committee, I felt I had taken a large step in the direction of continuing my life’s work. I

have spent the last 40 years working with all sectors as a nurse, in the hospital, as a VNA and Hospice Nurse and most recently as a school nurse. I am proud that we now have a path. Now we can live better and live healthier.

I look forward to the work ahead. I hope you will stand with me as we move forward. Help us to continue the work we have done. I am very proud to work for all of you and thank every one of us on the Committee for the work we have done and still have to do as we move forward.

Thank you.”

Rep. Degree of St. Albans City explained his vote as follows:

As a young Vermonter who has watched my generation disappear from our home state in search of a more competitive job market and more affordable costs of living, I cannot blindly follow those members of this body who assure me that, even without answers to many important questions, or any evidence to support their claim, that his bill will somehow improve our health care system. We need to make Vermont more affordable and support our businesses. This bill does neither.”

Rep. Dickinson of St. Albans City explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is a bill that will affect every family, every business and every business and every provider in the state. There are too many unanswered questions and the process for this bill has not been thoughtful and complete enough to answer these important questions.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My jaw dropped when I heard our governor say that we must “resist the temptation to talk about how we pay for it, because I think if we make that mistake, we lose sight of the prize.” To not talk about how we pay for it, and yet to burn our bridges for other alternatives to our current system, is the height of irresponsibility. We lose sight of the prize when we lose sight of the needs of Vermonters for a sustainable system through placing all out eggs in one basket. A no vote on a bill that locks us in to one path alone, this early in a process, is the only vote I can consider to be responsible.”

Rep. Fagan of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Change is un-nerving and full of angst. The people of Vermont have questions that if answered would ease those uncertain feelings. Last night we tried to answer all those questions, we did not. Not having answers to all of our questions thus leaving unanswered the concerns of Vermonters is not what I had envisioned for the most important bill to perhaps ever to pass this body. I would have liked to support this bill but I am unable to support it because we do not have the entire process, relevant methodologies, costs and taxes that this bill will use to affect Vermonters which would enable Vermonter’s questions to have been answered.

Rep. French of Shrewsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I would like to personally thank the committee on Health Care for their tremendous thoughtful work on this important legislation. I would particularly thank the chair for his remarkable, informative, measured responses to many questions. We have been told this bill goes too fast, too slow, it does too much or not enough. Sounds like it might be close to the mark. What it does do is lay a groundwork to replace what is clearly an unsustainable system.”

Rep. Gilbert of Fairfax explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes. This bill is a cautious step in the attempt to reduce health care costs. The multi-year process will be very transparent to the public. There are multiple check points and legislative action would be required before each succeeding step could be taken. It is this body that will ask and answer the necessary questions before a next step could be possible. I trust this body.”

Rep. Hebert of Vernon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I do acknowledge the need to reform the financing of health care. However, I voted no because I was asked to vote on a health care bill that will impact the lives of every man, woman, and child in Vermont. Without knowing what it will cost. Without knowing how it will be paid for. Without knowing how it will work. Who will or will not be covered. To much uncertainty. The passage of this bill bring to mind those scary words: I’m from the government and I’m here to help.”

Rep. Hubert of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. The 5-person Health Reform Board would be appointed by the Governor and would control the entire \$5 billion health care system. The system of this group is beyond anything VT has seen because it is essentially in command of 20% of the states economy.”

Rep. Kitzmiller of Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Today I vote my hopes, not my fears.”

Rep. Lanpher of Vergennes explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermont businesses deserve a more predictable system of making sure their employees have good quality health care. I am proud to vote for H. 202 to provide that predictability.”

Rep. Lawrence of Lyndon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Why should this body pass a bill with such huge implications without a funding mechanism in place? Many of our large employers are already on record saying they

would not jump in the pool, thus one of the foundations of the house of cards is already threatened.”

Rep. Lewis of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no! I have a number of unanswered questions and to many concerns with this bill. If I want to gamble, I’ll go to Vegas.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

There always will be those who, when standing on the railroad track with a train bearing down on them, will worry more about the danger of jumping off the track than about the train. With approval of this health care bill we have made the prudent decision to get off the current track before health care costs run us over. When completed it will save all Vermonters the billions they otherwise would be condemned to pay and protect every one of them.”

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I don’t have major problem with the principles set for in this bill; but I vote no because I feel the bill falls short in the area of cost containment. The residents and employers of Vermont asked for relief now from the escalating costs of health care – and in fact have been asking that for years. Employers “last time I checked” wanted to get out of the health care business.

What we have done with this bill is (1) set up another bureaucratic structure with five highly paid executives, something we have found fault with, in Insurance companies and hospitals. (2) Set up a road map to get somewhere in health care reform to be determined by this five member board, (that will hopefully contain costs, among other things). We didn’t do much for residents and employers that were asking for relief now. We have studied this subject for decades, we know if we take certain steps we can, in fact, provide cost containment relief now. We didn’t do it. So residents and employers are still saddled with the escalating costs of health care, delivered through a fractured system with reams of paper work for the three or four years, while the five member board decides what to do about cost containment – the main request of residents and employers.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cannot support H. 202, at this time, based upon our total disregard to one of our very own Health Care Reform Principles, which I feel is critical to the success for any reform. The principle that I am referring to is that – “The Health Care System” must be transparent in design, efficient in operation and accountable to the people it serves. The state must ensure public participation in the design, implementation, evaluation and accountability mechanisms of the health care system

We are seriously lacking on all accounts.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The debate has been many things and especially proof of that old adage of this body that everything has been said and everyone has had a chance to say it. I vote yes to support my value that people come before profit. The current system is a dinosaur that has a stranglehold on our health dollars and health outcomes. It’s time to act and this is the time and plan to move us into a better future for all .”

Rep. Nuovo of Middlebury explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker: I am proud of this great state for standing up to special interests and moving toward a better health care system for all Vermonters.”

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

21 years ago we hit our first billion for total health care spending in Vermont. Last year we hit \$5 billion – almost 20% of our state’s economy. Today we have taken a critical step to get rampant costs under control. We’ve also moved to end the cost-shift, end personal bankruptcy from medical costs and cover everyone including the un and under-insured. I am proud of my state and my colleagues.”

Rep. Peaslee of Guildhall explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

How will this reform be financed and why is the financing proposal being delayed 2 years? What will happen if Vermonters get care outside the state – will it be covered and what will people have to pay for it? How will border issues be addressed if a New Hampshire employer has employees who live in Vermont or vice versa? What level of care will be standard for all residents? Will college students be considered residents and be covered? These are just a few unanswered questions that need answers before I could vote for this bill. Haste makes waste. Slow it down Mr. Speaker. Slow it down. Remember Act 60.”

Rep. Peltz of Woodbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The United States is the only country amongst the advanced global nations that does not start with the basic assumption that everyone should be provided health care. Many different models for providing coverage exist. Once again, I am proud that Vermont leads the way. Our well-being and prosperity will be advanced .”

Rep. Perley of Enosburgh explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The Governor has said this bill isn’t about access – we already insure 93%, and half of the remaining 7% are eligible for current programs. Putting five highly paid bureaucrats in charge of our entire health care system isn’t cost containment – it’s government-run health care. And last I checked, our current government system, Medicaid, is in the red.”

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As I am not a communist nor a socialist, I voted for H. 202 because it will give all Vermonters comprehensive coverage and do away with HSA and high deductibles. This is a good day for Vermont.”

Rep. Ram of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Young people are the least likely to be insured and the most likely to have employment that does not offer health insurance. At the same time it is estimated that one in every six young people had a chronic illness and trouble paying their medical bills. I vote yes for Vermont’s next generation and the future prosperity of our state.”

Rep. Reis of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I agree wholeheartedly with the intent of this bill and with many of its provisions. However, the requirement that employers who are already providing benefits equal to, or better than, Green Mountain Care, (often in self funded programs) must also pay for Green Mountain Care, is a poison pill. It will discourage businesses from coming to or expanding in Vermont.”

Rep. Savage of Swanton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Our pilot program should be to fix Medicaid first – the existing Vermont run system with a budget that we have never been able to balance. Let’s establish how we can control it’s costs and pay for it before we embark on a new state-wide effort that will transfer several billions of dollars of spending onto the state budget, tied to an entitlement to health care beginning in 2015.”

Rep. Shaw of Pittsford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. Not because I don’t believe in health care coverage ,but because I was denied the financial information I felt I needed to support this effort.”

Rep. Spengler of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Unifying our health care system is the necessary basis of controlling our health care costs, ensuring all Vermonters access to care and providing quality care. This is the road map toward this realization.”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes on H. 202 because it begins to acknowledge that health care is a human right and that health care reform is for good business. For our employers, our taxpayers and our state. My thanks to the Health Care committee for having the courage to move forward in such a thoughtful and sensitive way. I love Vermont.”

Rep. Stuart of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker”

Change takes courage and conviction. Today, Vermont’s House of Representatives showed America out small state has both the courage and conviction to lead the way – nationwide – on the creation of a universal health system. I thank the members of the Houses’ Health care Committee, from the bottom of my heart, for all their hard work on this piece of legislation.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote “no” on this bill, the creation of a single payer of a universal health care system. After many, many hours of interrogation I still do not believe that we fully understand what the cost of this program is going forth, who and how these costs will be paid, what the benefit package will be, how it will impact the existing health care coverage of our family and friends and how the uncertainty of this proposal will impact the professionals in the health care field is of utmost concern. Creating a new healthcare delivery system based on a theory and campaign promises is not good policy. Everyone supports containing costs in our health care system!”

Page 32

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

Once again we choose to conserve land over holding our healthcare providers whole from a tax that this body imposed two days ago.”

Page 33

Rep. Conquest of Newbury explained his vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

I voted against this amendment because I hesitate to make apparently complex policy decisions on the floor. But I support the idea that “notwithstanding” is almost as bad an idea. I look forward to, and will work to assure, that we get quickly to the business of comprehensive review, followed by action.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes because I can’t support an advance change for FY 13 that hasn’t been vetted for its impact on what we will need to set for the FY 13 tax rate.”

Page 34

Rep. Atkins of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The only reason I am not supporting this amendment is that I am reluctant to draft legislation on the House floor.”

Rep. Bartholomew of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I desperately want to restore full funding to the programs outlined in this amendment, I cannot disregard the fiscal health of the state. I sincerely hope that all who are passionate about funding these important programs will convey their concerns to everyone they know in Washington.”

Rep. Burke of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

I have enormous admiration for the appropriations committee, the committee chair, and the committee process. At the same time there are many people in my Brattleboro district with multiple problems compounded by poverty. In voting for this amendment I hope to give some voice to their plight.”

Rep. Campion of Bennington explained his vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

I believe it would have been fiscally irresponsible at this point to have supported this amendment. I commend our appropriations committee for the work they’ve done.”

Rep. French of Shrewsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

While it would be a pleasure to make many important programs whole, in this economy we don’t have that luxury. Our appropriations committee has done the monumentally difficult and often heartbreaking task of weighing and measuring what Vermonters need against what we can afford. As always there are winners and losers. I am convinced that this budget is a product of great thoughtfulness and deliberation and I support it.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

For me, this is a vote, plain and simple, to express some of my priorities for spending the limited funds that are available.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is a fine example of what the next few years are going to look like through the “Budget Process” to fund a new sustainable 4 to 5 billion dollar Health Care Reform. I believe it will be extremely hard to fulfill all of our promises that are written in the very principles of H. 202.”

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I want to thank my colleagues in the progressive, republican and democratic caucuses for their support of this amendment. Shame on the democratic party for their ignorance of the hidden faces of Vermonters who do not have a presence in this chamber. I voted yes and I am proud of it.”

Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe explained her vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

Despite the implications that those who voted in favor of this amendment should, or should have, supported increasing taxes to pay for this, the amendment offered a way to fund these services within the existing revenues. I applaud the member for his diligence and am happy to support those most vulnerable in our state.”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

Being asked to participate in a race to the bottom goes against everything I would like to believe I believe in. I vote no for two reasons, I expect the threats of cuts on the federal front to materialize, and I expect the Ways and Means committee to examine H. 401 more closely in the weeks to come. We’ve been told the most comfortable among us have received a \$190 million gift with an extension of the Bush tax cuts – not just this year and next, but for last year, the year before and the year before that. Somewhere in there is a certain capacity that most of us don’t have.”

Rep. Wizowaty of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

I wholeheartedly support the spirit behind this amendment. We do need to restore fully the cuts to social services, especially choices for care, mental health, student assistance programs, Reach Up and the like. But we need to do this not by using the stabilization reserve funds for the tobacco trust fund, but by raising additional revenue. I still hope we will accomplish this year..”

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

It was with great reluctance and pangs of conscience that I voted against this amendment. I agree with the presenter of the amendment that the cuts to these programs have been too deep. However, I also know that most of the members of the Appropriations committee share our feelings, and that they have worked hard to find a balance that would minimize the pain these cuts will inflict while keeping Vermont’s fiscal health intact. Furthermore, I hope that before this bill is signed into law additional revenues will be enacted to allow these services to be restored as proposed by this amendment.”

Page 35

Rep. Andrews of Rutland City explained her vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I voted no because I believe we need all the help we can get to reduce our energy use whenever we can. I am confident that, if the need is there next year, we will make sure the people in our communities are warm. The future of Federal LIHEAP funds is not certain.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Madam Speaker:

I was delighted to hear the proponent of this amendment say he already had the energy efficiency program helping him on his farm. I want others to be able to enjoy that same benefit. That is why I voted against his proposal to now strip the energy efficiency program of its funding.”

Page 36

Rep. Font-Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Madam. Speaker:

In light of the present political and budgetary impasse in Congress and the affect this process will have on Vermont in up-coming budget years, I respectfully and responsibly vote yes!”

Page 38

Rep. Till of Jericho explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Presently the law is silent on the issue of how quickly a sign may change messages. The Legislature should decide this issue and put it in the statutes. Whether that interval is 15 minutes, 5 minutes or any other interval instead of relying on a three decades old A.G. opinion which is quite vague saying only that changing every 15 minutes would not likely violate the statute that exists.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We live in the era of technology and we hear time after time that we need to update our laws to stay up with this changing world. However, in this case we choose to leave the determination up to an out-dated Attorney General opinion of what is a legal sign. Thank you.”

Rep. Howard of Cambridge explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

How many more of our citizen’s first amendment rights will we continue let slip away by subverting the committee process? It is my hope that the Natural Resources Committee will take on this vague and out-dated law that can both retain the Vermont landscape we all love and allow our residents the same rights that other Americans enjoy?”

Page 39

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support the basic goals and provisions of this legislation. But, I cannot support imposing anything that functions like a tax increase on Vermonters during times that are still hard for many workers and businesses, however worthy the intended purpose.”

Rep. Cheney of Norwich explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

More than almost any bill this year, a yes vote on this energy bill is a vote for real jobs. It’s a vote for Vermont businesses. Beyond its clear energy benefits, it’s a vote for one of the best economic development programs this state has seen, just when we need it most.”

Rep. Reis of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We’ve listened to many claims that various additional costs will be minimal or inconsequential. I guess a few extra kernels from the rate payers perspective don’t matter much when you’re being stoned to death with popcorn.”

Rep. Taylor of Barre City explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My hope is that between now and third reading we will find a way to fund the clean energy program in a way that recognizes the vast divide of people’s ability to pay.”

Page 40

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The protection of our local town officials is important, especially the insuring of their privacy, safety and their rights as citizens of the town. I’m concerned about malicious actions by townspeople or by anyone, as these actions are exactly the kind of thing this bill is designed to prevent. I look forward to an amendment on third reading.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote “no”. This bill is going to intimidate public officials in dishonoring exemptions. It denies public employees privacy, it increases the risks of cunning and abusive litigators which will drive public officials from office and make innocent taxpayers pay for abuse by their fellow citizens or people from away who have no legitimate interest or connections with a particular town. It is a lawyer’s dream come true. It says “Give them anything they want or we will be paying our lawyers and theirs.”

Rep. Lewis of Berlin explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe we need revisions regarding transparencies, however, as Rep. Kilmartin explained, this could place due financial liability on the municipality. I commend the Government Operations committee for their thoughtful work on this bill.”

Rep. Lewis of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes, although I have concerns about issues that have been raised, I more firmly believe in open transparency.”

Page 41

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The 55 cent charge to fill the clean energy development fund was never popular, but it was a compromise supported by the administration. Perhaps a better idea will emerge. Today at the 11th hour the Governor abandoned a proposal he had supported, totally disrespecting the work of two committees in the process. The onus is on him to come up with a proposal now, that everyone supports.”

Page 42

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We are grateful that the committees and the Governor recognized our concern with the new fee on rate payers and eliminated it as we had proposed to do in the Savage amendment listed on page 1128 of today’s Calendar.”

Page 44

Rep. Consejo of Sheldon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This amendment would have forced some people to travel considerable distances, at considerable expenses. Not all of us have the resources necessary to support our right to know. I am glad I voted no.”

Page 46

Rep. Hebert of Vernon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We must do all we can to prevent special interest groups from having the ability to influence enforcement of our state’s rules and regulations when in fact, that special interest group has no standing in the matter.”

Page 49

Rep. Bartholomew of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

One of the basic tenets of a democracy is that each voter gets one vote – no one’s vote counts more than another’s. The existing system we use to elect the President and Vice-President is not consistent with this principle. This bill is an attempt on the part of Vermont to correct this problem and abolish an outdated voting system. That is the reason I am compelled to vote for this bill.”

Rep. Buxton of Royalton explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Having won this seat by only one vote, I emphatically support the principle that every vote matters. I voted against this bill because I believe it violates the U.S. Constitution and does nothing to promote a stronger political dialogue in our nation. Vermont will

lose its precious little power and influence in the presidential election system under NPV.”

Rep. Christie of Hartford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Fellow House members, this has been one of the most difficult decisions I have had to make in my short tenure here. There was just something that did not feel right. I would hope you understand. Thank you..”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Whether it is for Mayor of Burlington or President of the United States, the person with the most votes should win.”

Page 50

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes to upgrade and modernize this elective process. And my daughters would be sure to remind me this isn’t just about one man, one vote, - but also since suffrage was passed, it is also about one woman, one vote.”

Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Yesterday I asked a rhetorical question pertaining to this bill. Does this body want to diminish by one-half the value of Vermonters’ votes? Today the answer came on the floor when a supporter made it clear. Yes, a Vermonter’s vote will be worth less with the passage of this bill and yes, that is exactly what we should do. As a Vermonter, I completely disagree..”

Page 51

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I’m glad to see so many people here – it was a nice morning for a walk.”

Page 53

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. This bill is not ready for prime time! This bill does not achieve the purposes claimed for it, and the money cost is vastly underestimated. As we sit here, covert organizations, including the federal government, have the means to use this new very “insecure” system to create false but “authentic” Vermont identities for covert operators and person in the witness protection program. The system proposed makes us more exposed than the current system to identity theft and the use of Vermont identities for terroristic activities. This bill makes me and every Vermonter very insecure.”

Page 54

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Given our grave fiscal crisis, we have made significant cuts to important programs like High School counseling for drug, alcohol and tobacco abuse. Yet we have just voted to dramatically increase expenses for this program. Even worse, there has been no reporting as to the effectiveness of this particular program to date. If it feels good - do it - not a responsible way to govern.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Mention was made in our debate on the low education level of our Greatest Generation and how they nonetheless built us a better world. The reason they did so, however, was not because of their lack of education, but because the G. I. Bill later made our best educated generation. This bill does for our youngest Vermonters what that bill did for our veterans - send them on a journey to educational success in their lives with all the benefits that will bring for all of us.”

Page 55

Rep. Acinapura of Brandon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted "yes" on removing the cap on pre-k enrollment because of the future benefit to my school district and therefore the taxpayers of my community. Nonetheless, I urge the General Assembly, if we hold true to the principle of local control, to simplify the funding formula for education such that if a community wants a service from the school that community would pay for the service.”

Rep. Clarkson of Woodstock explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Investments in pre-k pay huge dividends in the long run. Its one of the best ways we can reduce future costs in special education and corrections. Money well spent to develop an even better educated and prepared work force - one of our top economic development priorities.”

Rep. Degree of St. Albans City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

On Monday, a high school student asked the Franklin county legislative delegation what we were doing to make it easier and more affordable for her to go to college and find a good paying job here in Vermont. Surprisingly, "raising property taxes" wasn't mentioned.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill is supposed to be about our children. Yet it will enable access only for those in towns that choose to offer pre-kindergarten. All towns will pay in. I believe we were once sued for allowing inequitable access to educational opportunities for children in

different towns in our state. This recreates educational inequity, contrary to our state's constitution.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes despite my fear that we are moving ever-closer to a society that removes a child from his or her parents in the maternity ward and returns the child at age 18.”

Rep. Lewis of Derby explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. When we were small children our parents made sure we were ready for school. Maybe we should mandate how to be a parent and parental responsibility.”

Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This body just voted yet again to increase education spending, possibly by millions of dollars in the out years. This when we can't afford the education we have. At a time of decreasing general fund dollars going into the education fund. This will all be borne by our state property taxpayers. Not only is this unwise but utterly irresponsible.”

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermont's education system is exceling helping our children succeed in the 21st century. We need to continue to support our children.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I believe that everyone supports educating Vermont's children. However, we cannot afford to continue throwing money at a broken system. Both financially and academically Vermont's education system appears to be failing. The test scores and performance levels are falling while the cost per pupil ratio of adults to students and other educational cost services continue to rise. This bill has the potential of increasing the cost to the education fund from \$16 million to more than \$33 million annually. Further, I believe that our education fund and associated property taxes are already growing at unsustainable rates. Vermonters have no more capacity to pay property taxes.”

Page 56

Rep. Gilbert of Fairfax explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The responsibility of House conferees is to defend the position of the House in negotiations with the Senate. Individual members who supported the will of the House are the ones to best represent the House in conference. In this instance, majority and minority represents position on a bill, not party affiliation.”

Rep. Greshin of Warren explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The health care bill will be one of the most important bills we debate this session. To appoint a conference committee of three like-minded members, regardless of the legality, makes a mockery of the deliberative process in this body.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This vote sustained a decision of the Speaker which was based on the long-standing practice in this chamber over many years under the leadership of both parties. To have abandoned that practice for partisan purposes today would have undercut the consistency which is the very essence of ensuing fairness for all our members.”

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

When we’re assembling a team to defend a position of the House we ought to continue the tradition of naming a team that will defend the body’s position without reservation.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It is disappointing, given the importance of this bill that the rules of the House were disregarded in order to silence the voice of the minority.”

Page 57

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote in favor of this amendment. This amendment was a vote to protect property taxpayers who are already struggling with ever increasing costs.”

Page 58

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes to stand with the sponsor’s endorsement of the value of PreK education. We haven’t moved very far since 2007, but perhaps this protest vote will focus attention on the need to do so.”

Rep. Marcotte of Coventry explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If we were going to spend the money, I choose to spend it in a way that it is equitable to all.”

Rep. Waite-Simpson of Essex explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The one lingering issue with PreK in my district is that we can’t provide it for every child. We just missed an opportunity to do just that.”

Page 59

Rep. Lorber of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Incarceration as a simplistic one-size fits all approach doesn't work. It is often counter-productive and ironically leads to more crime. The approach on this bill aims to create safer communities and to save taxpayer dollars.”

Page 61

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I sit stunned today, to imagine that we would vote to abolish the right of the people of Vermont to exercise their right to vote on a matter related to their local school budgets.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes. Voting no allows sweetheart deals that could total well over \$100 million of school district debt stolen from the taxpayers without their consent. Reason and logic have taken flight here.... It must be something in the water or air... regardless, it is a breach of a most fundamental Constitutional trust and duty of ‘NO TAXATION WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE GOVERNED’.”

Rep. Marek of Newfane explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

School energy efficiency is a sure way to reduce property taxes. We should be encouraging it, not further burdening Vermont taxpayers by trying to eliminate it.”

Page 62

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill is heavy handed and unnecessary. It took me five minutes on the internet to find air fresheners that are not only 100% green but that protect young lungs from pollen and smoke particles, as well as odors.”

Rep. Reis of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Apparently, local control means local control as long as the locals do what Montpelier tells them to do.”

Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Those who argue amongst education funding reform do so in the name of local control. Ironically the same people on this vote proved, once again, that there is no such thing. Maybe all will finally admit that the concept of local control of our education is merely an illusion.”

Page 63

Rep. Atkins of Winooski explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes.

A Minor Bird, by Robert Frost

I have wished a bird would fly away, and not sing by my door all day.

Have clapped at him from the door, when it seemed I could take no more.

The fault lies primarily with me. The bird is not to blame for his key.

But there must be something very wrong in trying to silence any song..”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to extend a simple courtesy to a member who is not known for abusing his privileges in this chamber.”

Page 64

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. The administration can propose, and the legislature can adopt, appropriate reimbursement changes at any time. This bill pre-emptively declares that this segment of our budget is more important than any other single state funded service. This is simply inappropriate.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes. This is one small step for our child care providers. One giant step for all Vermonter’s children.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The children of today will be reading our blood pressure tomorrow. I vote yes to support their early education – the foundation for their later abilities – like accurately reading our blood pressure.”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This legislation allows a particular class of people, home care providers, who are scattered across our villages, towns and cities, isolated and unconnected, a voice at the table when decisions are being made about their work. To give people a voice is always a good thing.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

H. 97 does nothing to improve the quality of child care and will likely, in fact, harm it. It will undermine the very important stars program as well as politically dividing the child care community. The good intentions of this bill are not matched by reality.”

Page 65

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I have never opposed, I voted yes because the money spent on solar energy comes at a time when we ignore the needs of the working poor and the needs of people with disabilities to keep their independent living.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill creates a sweetheart deal for one of the Governor’s largest campaign contributors, while being sold to the public as a way to expand funding for renewable energy projects. This amendment would have restored the integrity of this successful program.”

Page 68

Rep. Degree of St. Albans City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I share the concerns of how the federal government will, or will not, enforce statute to the contrary, I vote yes to ensure that those who by action of this body have been granted permission to use marijuana under the strict guidelines of our current law, can obtain it legally and safely.”

Rep. Donovan of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

When asked by my grandchildren what I did in Montpelier - I will proudly reply – I worked to ease the burdens of my neighbors. S. 17 accomplishes this.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have three grandchildren, ages 7, 5 and almost 3 years of age. They know the difference between right and wrong. I have explained to them what I do as an elected Representative. I have told them I am a “lawmaker”. They know that papa is not perfect, but they already sense that we are all called to rise to the standards of particular callings. I want them and the young people of Vermont to remember that I and my colleagues in the Vermont House, are LAWMAKERS, NOT lawbreakers. Also, I cannot consent to licensing our Governor the unparalleled authority to suspend the operation of any law, but especially one which encourages criminal activity.”

Rep. Koch of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

For me, the bottom line is that this bill, well-intentioned as it is, violates federal law and teaches young people that it is acceptable to flaunt the law.”

Rep. Fagan of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no. Reflecting upon 30 years of military service, acknowledging that in accordance with federal law marijuana is illegal, realizing that a positive vote would violate my oath of office as a Vermont legislator, and not wanting to risk negatively influencing the children of Rutland and the children of Vermont, I can not and will not support this law..”

Rep. Lorber of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We have a choice. We can support arcane drug laws that do not work, or we can deliver compassion. I vote yes for safe, legal access to relief for people in pain.”

Rep. Savage of Swanton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no on this bill, not because I do not have compassion for those who suffer from painful diseases that this bill aims to relieve their suffering. I voted no on this bill because I will never vote to legislation that is in violation of federal law, the laws that I have taken an oath to uphold.”

Rep. Shaw of Pittsford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My no vote does not reflect a lack of compassion for my fellow Vermonters but it does express my real concern with the potential action of the U.S. Department of Justice on the citizens of the State of Vermont.”

Rep. Smith of New Haven explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I had intended to vote yes on this bill but there were many legal and constitutional questions raised that we need more time to address before it is ready for prime time and my support.”

Reps. Wright of Burlington, explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cast a reluctant “no” on S. 17 because we have in our possession a clear message from the U.S. Department of Justice, stating their concerns regarding this legislation. The “fix” is done backwards. Our understandable desire to help people has caused us to pass a bill that is not ready and sets us on a collision course with the federal government.”

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Sometimes being right means taking a risk. While it would be better if the FDA would conduct tests on the medicinal benefits of marijuana, it seems unable to do so because of political correctness. By passing this bill, we in Vermont will be making a statement, as Vermont has done so many times in the past, that the status quo is unacceptable and should be changed.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Despite my no vote and my doubts about the potential for success, now that this bill will become law, I commit to collaboration in helping it achieve the most positive outcomes that may be possible.”

Rep. Font-Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I proudly vote yes for the future financial health of health care in the Green Mountain State. In the end Vermonters will benefit greatly from our actions and passage today. Thanks to the difficult work of committees.”

Rep. Hubert of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no as I will not vote for a bill without knowing the cost.”

Rep. Lewis of Berlin explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no today, not because I don't believe health care is a human right, but because I don't believe this bill is necessarily the answer. I can not support a bill of this magnitude, when there is no true answer to how much this plan will cost. Our state is simply too small to finance this plan. We are all responsible for taking care of ourselves, and making healthy choices. Routine health care should be an important part of every person's budget, just as housing, food and utilities. I understand there are many vulnerable people and I truly recognize our responsibility to take care of them, but this bill does nothing to take care of these people for years to come. This is like taking a proto-type plane for its first flight.”

Rep. Martin of Springfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Two years ago, I, along with over ninety members of this body, sponsored a resolution which outlined the inadequacies of our current health care system. The final “Whereas” states “while the pros and cons of the different options can be evaluated and debated in congress, it is far past time that our nation commit itself to implementing, at the earliest possible moment, a comprehensive system of affordable universal health insurance that is available to every Vermonter and American.”

The Resolve that follows is that “this legislative body urge Congress to adopt a system of universal health insurance for implementation no later than the beginning of federal fiscal year 2011. Interestingly enough, Mr. Speaker, within days of sending this off to the President and our Congressional delegation, the President called to precisely this action, and interestingly enough, just recently legislation to that end was passed. While I still believe this is a matter that must be addressed nationally, if Vermont chooses to lead the way, certainly I support that effort and vote yes today with pride and great pleasure.”

Rep. Sharpe of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have waited nine years to cast this vote for a universal unified health care system. I am grateful to our Health Care committee, and our leadership for their work.”

Rep. Stuart of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

H. 202 bring to mind the words of our nation’s founders articulated in the Declaration of Independence: “We hold these truths to be self-evident that all men are created equal.” H. 202 bring to life those words, which have echoed in Americans’ hearts and minds for centuries. H. 202 is a bold first step toward ensuring all Vermonters will be treated equally by one of our society’s most vital institutions, our health care system, which helps ensure all human being’s right to a high quality of life and longevity.”

Rep. Till of Jericho explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

1.) I have no illusions that this is a perfect bill: The problems include

a. We should know the costs up front and we will not have more information on cost savings by 2013 than we have now.

b. We should have developed a financing plan, tested assumptions and then refined the plan as a first step.

c. H. 202 does not accelerate or broaden payment reform pilots or the statewide rollout of the Vermont Blueprint for Health

d. H. 202 does not confront actual cost drivers of health care costs.

2.) Yet I voted for the bill. Why?

a. Despite the rhetoric this is not in fact a single-payer plan. The conference committee report makes this clear by requiring multiple payers within the exchange.

b. Financial analysis by JFO released 4/21/11 is not exhaustive but shows that despite the misfocus of H. 202 on administrative savings, reforms we have already put in place such as the Vermont Blueprint for Health and our All Payer Claims Database will provide the savings to proceed.

c. Most importantly, we can, and we must, provide coverage for, and access to, health care for all Vermonters. H. 202 makes this possible.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Now that this bill has reached its end here in the Legislature without a single House Republican supporting it and being locked out of the final stage of the process, we now call upon the Governor to ensure that the minority position concerns are addressed as the state proceeds down this path to Green Mountain Health Care. All Vermonters deserve to be heard and their questions answered Now, not after the next election cycle. Vermonters deserve better.”

Rep. Consejo of Sheldon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It is a great dream to think about having fiber optics to each home and business. However, losing your connection on your cell phone multiple times while traveling our interstates, is not acceptable, it is a disgrace to our state not to be able to provide our businesses and citizens with one of the most basic need of the twenty-first century. I hope we will solve this great problem first. Sometimes, perfect, is the enemy of good.”

Rep. Bohi of Hartford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cannot vote for a tax increase that makes it hard for merchants in my town to compete with their counterparts across the river.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I will never support any increase in the cigarette tax unless we proportionately increase funding for the specialized smoking cessation treatment needed for those who pay 50% of that tax – persons with serious mental illnesses. When we plunder the sick to balance our budget and use none of that money for their addiction treatment, we commit a great wrong.”

Rep. Edwards of Brattleboro explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I thank the committee on Ways and Means for their work, but for my district I vote no. I think it is time we take a deeper look at our tax policy with regard to levels of income. I hope to vote yes next session.”

Rep. Kilmartin of Newport City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

No. I have never voted for a tax increase to the best of my memory, except last week when I proposed a special tax for enriched early childhood development experiences in daycare known as pre-K services. That special tax would have brought reality to the hope of school readiness, reduced the education tax by \$16 million, and stabilized the finances of daycare and early childhood development providers. The tax increases in this bill will do nothing but bring additional misery and unbearable burdens to Vermonters. Shame on us for our disingenuousness.”

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This year we had the chance to help working families of Vermont. And we had 70% of Vermonters at our backs calling for an increase of taxes for those at the top. Despite the promises, we did not seriously consider this proposal. Now I am left hoping we will address tax fairness during an election year.”

Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My no vote on this bill reflects my ongoing concern about the overall tax burden that is borne by Vermonters. Not only are we increasing health care costs with these increased taxes, at the same time we express our dismay over the high cost of health care, I must add, but we are also increasing the statewide property tax. I know my constituents can't afford any more.”
