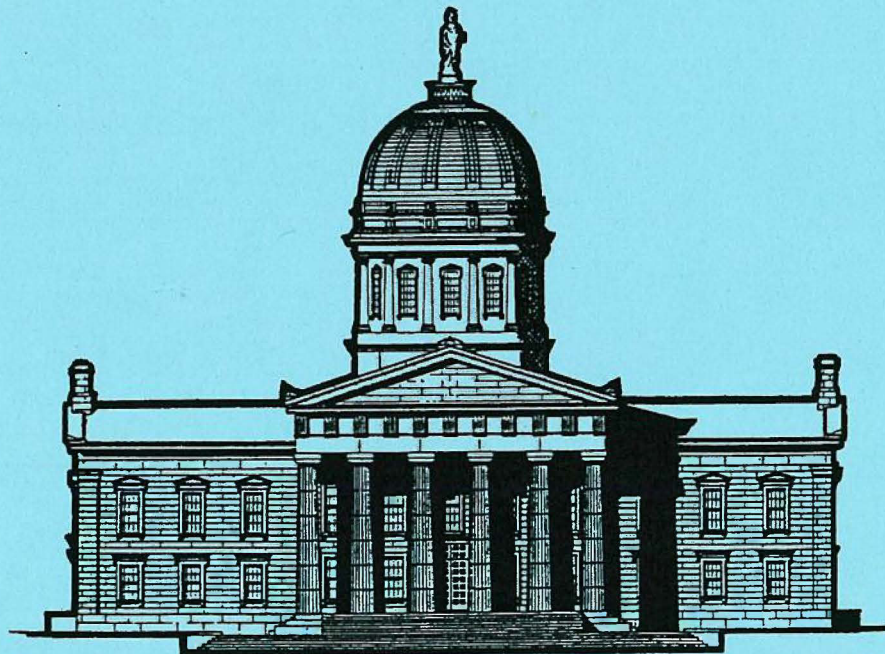

J.R.H. 2 Shall the resolution be adopted?

Rep. Burditt of West Rutland explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Sometime late in 1919 a baby was conceived behind a barn in West Rutland, VT. That child grew up to be my father. In 1978 my daughter was conceived out of wedlock by two ill-prepared young adults. As life would have it my daughter had a son 16 years ago September as a single mother. If history is any indicator one would think I would be 100% against this resolution. However, given my beliefs in one’s right to choose...I am split by my heart, my principles, my caucus and my constituents.

Even though I vote no it is more for the contentiousness this issue breeds between two different beliefs than it is the content.”

Rep. Myers of Essex explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes for this resolution. I have been pro-choice for many years, long before I entered this House. But it is now time to put an end to the yearly introduction of this resolution. Roe v. Wade is the law of the land and will not be repealed. At 50 years of age, Planned Parenthood is here to stay. We need to call an end to this yearly display that accentuates our disagreements and get on with the work on which, in many cases, we can agree.”

JRH 1 Shall the resolution be amended as offered by Representative Donahue of Northfield?

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Just before the vote I had the opportunity to ask the Rep. sponsoring the bill what his objection to the amendment was. In summary he agreed that it was ‘too neutral’. Here on the second roll call vote of a session in which we have many difficult challenges that face Vermonters like Education, Health Care and basic affordability. I would remind us all that Vermonters sent us here to work together to find the solution that we can all agree on. As a freshman legislator I came to this body optimistic - but perhaps I was just naive. I was hopeful that we could start our work this session on common ground where we can agree. We have already wasted 2 hours of the people's time on resolutions that do nothing to change what faces the average Vermonter - but has done much to instead divide and paint our own members along ideological and partisan lines that do not serve to unite us for the important work we have ahead of us. I hope that we can do more the rest of this session that will unite rather than divide. We are also told that anecdotally VT is not ‘business friendly’. I think that this body, which is legislative and not judicial, that has rejected an amendment that is ‘too neutral’ may be part of the problem, not the solution.”

JRH 1 Shall the resolution be adopted

Rep. Cole of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Telecom Services are Public Services that we should protect. Many Vermonters have been without reliable broadband and telephone that they have contracted for in Vermont.

My understanding is that the FairPoint administrators make more in compensation than they are willing to give to their other employees. It does not seem like they have been negotiating to help the majority of Vermonters. May VT speak loudly that Fair Point is not serving us as we expected.”

Rep. Davis of Washington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It’s no surprise that I voted in favor of this resolution. Today I ‘walk the walk’ in my support for working Vermonters. FairPoint workers are a skilled, dedicated work force with good, well-paying jobs and I urge FairPoint to settle a fair contract to workers.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no, not because I do not support our FairPoint workers, but because there are presently negotiations going on in Washington between the two parties. Both parties have agreed to certain legal stipulations during this process. My hope, and I am sure the hope of everyone in this body, is that we all want a timely and positive resolve that gets our FairPoint workers back to work. I do not believe that this resolution will be beneficial in helping to resolve this important issue.”

Rep. Ram of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Some here argued that this is not the right time to get involved. If not now, then when is the right time to stand up for restoring vital communications service to all Vermonters and ensuring workers can earn a decent living?”

Page 14

H. 82 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Johnson of South Hero?

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I very much appreciate the work of the member from Bennington, Representative Morrissey, whose substantial effort is the major content of this amendment.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am appreciative that the House Appropriations and Health Care Committees had the wisdom to copy and amend the intent of my amendment with a date certain for information from the Vermont Health Connect. My amendment was to have more oversight, transparency with checks and balances with accountability as we move forward in Health Care Reform.”

Page 15

H. 82 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no because this Budget Adjustment continues to contain the unsustainable contradictions of the original underlying FY15 budget. As in that budget, the Education Fund is burdened by state costs that are not education spending. The tax codes continue to allocate about \$1.3 billion to tax credits, deductions and expenditures that have not been cut and are not scrutinized like regular spending lines. And I don’t believe we can afford the pay increases awarded to state employees.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I appreciate that overall state spending has been reduced to a more sustainable level. However, I cannot support appropriating an additional \$9.3 million to Vermont Health Connect with no idea how much more the state is going to spend to complete the implementation of this very poorly managed program.”

Page 16

H. 184 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Branagan of Georgia explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Taxes are not fees. There are several examples of programs supported largely by the general fund in this bill. Vermonters can no longer support these services through the general fund.

When users are required to pick up the cost of the services they demand, the financial burden becomes fairer for all. The days of getting it for free are over.”

Rep. Dakin of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted ‘no’, Mr. Speaker, because the message I continue to hear is the cost of living and doing business in Vermont is increasingly unaffordable. This bill while accomplishing several positive goals, adds burdens in many instances to Vermonters’ ability to live, work and recreate.”

Rep. Huntley of Cavendish explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Politics...I voted yes to support the hard, detailed work of the committee. I could have voted no, feeling it would still pass. And I could probably look good (to some) at town meeting,

but as a 30 year investment analyst/advisor, I know that inflation regarding goods and services is inevitable and I feel they have provided prudent stewardship.”

Page 17

H. 184 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Dame of Essex?

Rep. Tate of Mendon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The name of the game is compromise. Currently in my district and all over this state there are many, too many, businesses that are teetering. Some are, frankly, week to week. While it would be my hope that no fees would rise, and that some would in fact go down, I am willing to compromise in the hopes that we might limit the damage and that this body might finally come together and circle the wagons around our beleaguered business community.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Not raising fees, forcing agencies to work within their means and reining in state spending is our top priority for this session. This could have been the first step in what likely will be a long journey over a number of years. Unfortunately, Vermonters will have to wait another day for this process to begin. Thank you.”

Page 18

H. 40 Shall the bill be amended as recommended by the committee on Natural Resources and Energy, as further amended by the committee on Ways and Means?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support the general goals of this bill. But I am not convinced that the full range of potential effects on rate payers has been independently analyzed. It is not wise to proceed with bold and innovative policies when the cost and financial impacts have not been fully developed. I thought this body had learned that lesson.”

Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Investing in energy efficiency and distributed generation saves our environment, ensures we will need fewer swaths of high transmission power lines crossing our beautiful landscape and, perhaps most importantly, saves Vermonters precious dollars on their energy bill. It’s a win-win-win for Vermont.”

Page 19

H. 40 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Turner of Milton?

Rep. Gamache of Swanton explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I appreciate the concerns expressed in this amendment, these issues have been addressed in the H.40 legislation.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This amendment resolves the \$50 million REC problem facing our utility companies and rate payers without taking on an expansive new program. Tier 3, a program that makes far too many assumptions, is counter-productive to our pursuit of efficiency and will likely increase the efficiency charges on rate payers’ electric bills for years to come. Increased usage at a fixed rate still equates to higher bills for our constituents. Thank you.”

Page 21

H. 40 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no because this well-intentioned bill is unbalanced. In launching an ambitious new project it fails to fully protect ratepayers from higher costs and higher rates in the pursuit of those ambitions. In requiring significant new renewable energy facilities it fails to protect the interests of towns and neighbors.”

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes on H.40, however I’m concerned with the constant increases with Efficiency Vermont budget. I’m also concerned with rate payers in Vermont paying higher electric bills. Most importantly, we must keep power cost low so companies like IBM/Global Foundries can continue to do business in Vermont”.

Page 22

H. 123 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Baser of Bristol explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support the concept of setting standards with consequences within mobile home parks. But I feel the language in the bill could have been more developed.”

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

More hypocrisy from Montpelier. If a private individual fails to maintain a private road, you see your fine increase tenfold and now face prosecution from the Attorney General’s office. If you are the state of Vermont, and don’t maintain a road, you just raise the gas tax and ask for patience. If we allow renters to withhold rent, will we allow homeowners to withhold their property taxes?”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We need to protect mobile home park tenants in effective ways that set clear standards that can lead to a rapid resolution rather than turning to more punitive remedies.”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill allows our Department of Housing and Community Development to work with mobile home park owners in a way that encourages them to keep the roads in their park accessible to emergency vehicles. Yes, even mobile home park residents should have access to public safety. This bill helps.”

Page 24

H. 488 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Transportation projects are the most direct way we can stimulate the economy. Given the tough economic times it is not a good idea to be cutting back.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I want to commend Chairman Brennan and the transportation committee for their work on this bill. This committee has shown that there is an alternative to increasing taxes when faced with less money than they would have preferred. Reprioritizing the Shumlin Administration transportation agency’s proposal, utilizing efficiencies and reducing spending is a valid approach to achieving goals without placing additional taxes on Vermonters.”

Page 26

H. 489 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. O’Sullivan of Burlington and others?

Rep. Krowinski of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I support a more progressive method of taxing income in Vermont, I think we need to give this proposal time and testimony to get it right. I hope we can work together to find long term solutions to support our state employees and our most vulnerable Vermonters.”

Rep. Patt of Worcester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I fully support H.489 as proposed by the Ways and Means Committee. I voted in favor of this amendment because I also believe that we should be raising a modest amount of additional revenue to avoid at least some of the most damaging budget cuts we are considering.”

Page 27

H. 489 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We have a spending problem! Raising taxes is not the solution to Vermont’s financial problems. When you spend more than your income stream generates year after year, it is impossible to repair this problem. Our caucus’ top priority this session is to put Vermont back

on a sound and sustainable financial path. We have a spending problem and not a revenue problem. - No new taxes. - ”

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I strongly supported both amendments this morning because I believe that from those to whom much is given, much is expected. It would be better to assess a relatively small burden on those that can afford it instead of a large burden on those who can't. However, a majority of this body disagreed, and we have to move forward with what is in front of us. For this reason, I voted to support this bill which reflects good, conscientious work by the Ways and Means.”

Page 28

H. 490 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote Yes. This legislature is faced with numerous fiscal challenges and I believe thanks are in order for the professional work accomplished by House Appropriations. Collectively they listened to all sectors, seeking best ideas from everyone in this tedious process. Our emergency services statewide were clearly heard as this budget bill reflects the concerns of not only first responders, fire, police and dispatch but citizens who needed assurance across Vermont that safety would be prioritized as #1. On behalf of Rutland County and city fire services and citizens, Thank You!”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Voters said loud and clear last election that it costs too much to live here in Vermont and that they want the state to start living within its means. Therefore, I cannot support passage of an appropriations bill that continues to spend over and above the state's natural growth in revenue. Revenue is projected to grow at 2.4% and spending in this budget proposal is growing in the general fund at 4.8%. This is not sustainable and continues to set VT up for projected budget gaps of \$40 – 50 million dollars in FY17/FY18. This bill spends an additional \$68 million in general fund dollars, a total of \$72 million in all funds in FY16 over what will be spent FY15. Furthermore, the bill requires \$33 million in new taxes of which \$13 million of those will be levied on the backs of hard working Vermonters making less than \$150,000 per year. Vermont has a spending problem that cannot be solved by raising additional taxes. The only solution to putting Vermont back on a sound and sustainable path is a reduction in spending, not raising taxes! Thank you!”

Page 29

H. 489 Shall the amendment offered by Rep. Dame of Essex be amended as offered by Rep. Wright of Burlington et. al.?

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This provision in the underlying bill raises 33 million dollars in new revenue. The amendment would have returned 5.9 million of tax increase to middle class Vermonters, and would have decreased the tax increase.”

Page 30

H. 489 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Dame of Essex?

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

”I guess that helping the poor only matters when we talk about state-run spending programs, but not when it comes to allowing some of the poorest Vermonters keep what they have rightfully earned.”

Rep. Willhoit of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted for this amendment because I, like many Vermonters, grew up in poverty. Taxing our working poor further is not the formula for financial sustainability. We must control spending.”

Page 31

H. 489 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Willhoit of St. Johnsbury?

Rep. Willhoit of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because, like fellow members of this body, I support the amazing work that VT non-profits do on the behalf of Vermonters. As we ask them to become more self-sufficient, however, we must not impact the gifts they need to survive.”

Page 32

H. 489 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Ancel of Calais explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Recurring budget gaps tell us that we have structural problems with both revenue and spending. The budget makes real progress in addressing structural spending problems. This bill does its part on the revenue side. It represents significant tax reform. These changes restructure the income tax code to make it more fair and more progressive, recognizing growing income inequality in this state. It is good tax policy that raises necessary revenue and it will position us well for the future.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Raising taxes is not the solution to Vermont’s financial problems. We have a spending problem. Please no more taxes.”

H. 490 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Poirier of Barre City?

Rep. Beck of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

While I am sympathetic to families that truly struggle with keeping their homes warm, I am concerned with the use of state and federal heating funds by individuals that are not in need. Before spending more state dollars on this program, we need to have a more careful vetting of those that qualify.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We have yet to debate the budget as a whole this afternoon. When it comes to investing in programs that directly help people, balanced against areas of questionable government growth, this money is well spent.”

Rep. Gage of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This cut in LIHEAP is important to many people. I would love to support it. But we must make tough cuts in order to keep our state solvent. How I wish I could support this initiative.”

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I proudly voted yes. I view this amendment as a small step to correct some injustices that have been made to the elderly Vermonters who have counted on this program. I will be anxiously awaiting the work that you believe the Emergency Board will deliver. We will have another opportunity next January to rectify this injustice when we do the budget adjustment.”

Rep. Rachelson of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I strongly support LIHEAP. It's crucial that we help Vermonters in need stay warm next winter. But, we need to make sure we fund it adequately and that we find a way to pay for it without voting for a deficit budget.”

Rep. Young of Glover explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I thought we had a spending problem. I may be a tax and spend liberal but I find this new brand of don't tax and spend anyway very curious.”

H. 490 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Burditt of West Rutland?

Rep. Burditt of West Rutland explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If we are truly committed to these 5 items why are we not passing this amendment to give us a harder push down the path we intend to go.”

Page 35

H. 361 Shall the amendment offered by Rep. Christie of Hartford be amended as offered by Rep. Browning of Arlington?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to remove the unjustified state mandate for all school districts to re-organize. We should target our attention on schools and districts that are struggling rather than imposing this on all districts. This amendment keeps in place all incentives for voluntary mergers, but allows school districts to decide for themselves if they want to instead continue as they are.”

Page 36

H. 361 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Konline of Dorset and others?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support this amendment, but it is too little, too late – the state has already imposed millions of dollars of costs in unfunded mandates on school districts and supervisory unions that have already driven up property tax rates, for which this amendment does not require the state to take responsibility.”

Rep. Hooper of Montpelier explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If we don’t like unfunded mandates, let’s fund them. Let’s not go through contortions and put off the funding till a future time.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes because this amendment will help our local school boards and while we may impose caps on a temporary basis, we will stop adding costs to our over-burdened taxpayers. This is one of the ways that we show that we heard the message last November.”

Page 37

H. 361 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes to help move our education governance structures from the 19th to the 21st century, and to slow the growth of property tax increases to a sustainable level. I want to thank all those members who joined together to make this a true bi-partisan effort.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. Doing nothing is not an option. Change is hard. Hopefully this is the beginning of change. Property tax payers should see the steep rise in property taxes begin to level off. This is the key reason I supported the bill.”

Rep. Scheuermann of Stowe explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is not what Vermonters have been clamoring for. This is not what they sent us here to do.”

Rep. Sibilia of Dover explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted in favor of this bill even though I am concerned about the aggressive and inadequately supported consolidation implementation plan outlined as well as the underlying presumption that consolidation will save money. Vermont per pupil spending data very clearly indicates this is not the case. However, I see this bill as the beginning of a process to rectify the educational inequities students throughout Vermont suffer as a result of the current structurally flawed funding mechanism. I intend to both closely monitor and contribute to this ongoing process.”

Rep. Strong of Albany explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no as my small schools are the heart and center of community activity. I believe that we should be expanding school choice in our state which would empower parents and students to find the best fit for their needs, give teachers, principals and school boards more control of their education, and lower costs over time. Other states are moving in the direction of offering school choice to reform their education systems, and Vermont could be a leader in this exciting type of education reform.”

Page 38

H. 35 Shall the House amend the bill as recommended by the Committee on Fish, Wildlife and Water Resources in the first instances of amendment (sections 1-6, 8, 12, 14-37, 43-51)?

Rep. Deen of Westminster explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We, all of us, just did the easy vote. Now it is time for us to put our money where our mouth is. We say we want clean water – are we willing to pay for it?”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

”Mr. Speaker:

Cleaning up VT’s waters is a priority for everyone. However, we have different ideas on how and who should pay for it. Thank you.”

Page 39

H. 35 Shall the amendment offered by Rep. Dickinson of St. Albans Town and others be substituted for the second instance of amendment (Committee Report of Fish, Wildlife and Water Resources in Sections 7, 9, 10, 11, 13, 38-42)?

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Yes, sometime votes are only symbolic. Some options may realistically have been closed off before this particular vote. But to the combination of \$33 million in new taxes last week, \$8 million in new taxes and fees pending in this bill, and the \$20 million next week, I vote no.”

Rep. Johnson of South Hero explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This amendment poses as a solution, but in reality it spends money that doesn't exist. It makes a nice soundbite, but puts a \$13.6 million hole in the budget we balanced last week. Doing right by water quality means making tough votes.”

Rep. Parent of St. Albans City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We heard the all for cleaner waters across Vermont and the challenge for a better way of funding. This is my preferred way to pay for water quality. It was affordable, it was sustainable, and it was a long term solution.”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Taking money from the VT housing and Conservation Trust Fund is bad public policy. Taking money that attracts seven times the investment and turning it into single dollars is a technique no business person would think wise. This water product wouldn't be started without VHCB's commitment. Let's keep our investments in the right place, and trust the committees of jurisdiction.”

Page 40

H. 35 Shall the bill be amended in the second instance of amendment as recommended by the Committee Report of Fish, Wildlife and Water Resources in Sections 7,9,10,11,13,38,39,40,41,42?

Rep. Connor of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Thank you for supporting H.35. For the last year and a half Vermonters have asked the agricultural community and specifically dairy producers to be a part of the solution and to invest money in the solution. Tonight the dairy community is one of the first partners to truly be “All In.”

Rep. McCullough of Williston explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This vote makes H.35 whole. I voted for H.35, an act relating to improving the quality of state waters. I did so because VT's water is a public trust. It is our legislative responsibility to care for our water for its intrinsic self and for the public's use. The Lung Association of VT says, “If you can't breathe, nothing else matters.” This legislator adds, “Without potable water, nothing else matters.”

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

When it comes to water quality we can pay now or we can pay later. And payment doesn't just show up in taxes and fees. With this vote we are investing in our waterways knowing we will pay our economy back many times over.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support cleaning up the waters of Vermont. I just don't agree that raising additional taxes and fees, in addition to the \$35 million in new taxes and fees raised to date by this body, is the only solution.”

Page 42

H. 35 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support many of the goals and policies in H.35. However, I cannot support increasing taxes and fees when there are viable alternative funding sources such as bonding or reprioritizing existing revenue streams to fund this essential program. Thank you.”

Page 43

H. 492 Shall the bill be amended as offered by Rep. Browning of Arlington?

Rep. Berry of Manchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

A construction worker friend of mine in Lamoille County has been forced to leave Vermont for better paying jobs in New York and Massachusetts. He laments he has to go away for 5 days per week. The provision I am supporting in the capital bill helps to keep this 4th generation Vermonter at home. We have seen jobs eliminated for Vermont State Employees which is a huge mistake. Two wrongs don't make a right.”

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows”

“Mr. Speaker:

I support this amendment in order to protect the purchasing power of the Capital Bill and insure that Vermonters get their money's worth at this time of tight budgets. The provisions that this amendment deletes allocate millions of bonded dollars to increase wages of unknown workers, who may not all be Vermonters at a time when the state may not all be Vermonters at a time when the state may have to reduce the compensation of state workers. This does not make sense.”

Rep. Dakin of Chester explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We spend a great deal of time here in Montpelier and in our communities working to increase educational opportunities for our young people so they can learn the skills to have good

jobs and a living wage and be able to stay in Vermont. That is why I do not support this amendment.”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows;

“Mr. Speaker:

The debate on this issue points out to me the inherent tension when we discuss jobs – jobs are filled by employees. Public projects funded by the state are, by nature, economic development projects, benefitting us all. There is no reason to continue the policy of telling workers who build our projects that they are not worth our tax dollars or our respect.”

Page 44

H. 492 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Borrowing and bonding is the only time in state government we can tax our children and future Vermonters. I cannot support this bill when we choose to borrow and spend more than is absolutely necessary.”

Page 45

H.R. 8 Shall the resolution be adopted as amended?

Rep. Fagan of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes and want to ensure my name is added as a sponsor. I requested yesterday to be so added but was inadvertently left off.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This all began as response to Indiana’s Religious Freedom Restoration Act. There are 2 significant differences between the original Indiana law and the Federal law which is why there has been the national uproar. They are not the same law. I support adding our voices to the chorus of support for our LGBT family and friends – especially on a day when we welcome LGBT youth to the State House.”

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermont has a long-standing tradition of inclusion. We are proudly known for our diversity.

As a gay man who chose to move here, first returning member of my family since 1816, I considered this place a natural choice.

I reaffirm our motto ‘Freedom and Unity’ by joining all LGBT Vermonters in voting yes for this resolution on this Good Friday.”

Rep. Tate of Mendon explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

On Good Friday when Christians all over the globe are commemorating the crucifixion of Jesus Christ I think it is apropos that we are making this act of love – inclusion and support for peoples of all personal persuasion to, as the Lord Himself said, ‘Come whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely.’ As a member of our nation’s most diverse military in history I applaud any condemnation of discrimination...be it for someone’s sexual orientation or be it the persecution and slaughter of my fellow believers all over the world.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I want to thank the original sponsors for working with our caucus team to find the right balance, which addresses the initial concern in a manner that could be accepted by many. Thank you.”

Page 46

H. 76 Shall the report of the Committee on Education be amended as offered by Rep. Lalonde of South Burlington and others?

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It was said today that in 40 years we've only had 20 strikes - that's an average of one every two years. With a strike in South Burlington last year, statistically we can expect another one next year. Wherever it happens those who joined me in voting yes can face our communities knowing that we did our best to make sure it didn't happen in ours, or any community in our state.”

Rep. Rachelson of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Ronald Reagan said ‘Where free unions and collective bargaining are forbidden, freedom is lost.’ The right to strike is an essential part of the collective bargaining process; otherwise, it is considered collective begging.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support this amendment because it eliminates divisive and disruptive strikes that tear at the fabric of every community. It means neither side can take drastic unilateral action, it removes the ‘nuclear option’ for both sides and that’s fair.”

H. 76 Shall the report of the Committee on Education be amended as offered by Rep. Jewett of Ripton?

Rep. Conquest of Newbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted for this amendment to move us forward. I voted for the previous amendment after a full, civil and informative debate. That amendment was defeated. We ought to honor the

vote of the body and move on. Reconsideration, while within the rules, is not a strategy we should make a habit of.”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We hear a lot about the importance of process here. That said, it was disappointing that the Ed Committee never considered this amendment. Disappointing, but mostly concerning.”

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote ‘no’ because I believe we should leave the collective bargaining process as is completely because it works.”

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted ‘no’ because this was a bad legislation from the start and no amendment can make this palatable. I hope, Mr. Speaker, that we use the next vote on this bill to defeat it. Period.”

H. 76 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The narrative of our votes here today shows that there is not a clear consensus on whether or how to change the way labor disputes are settled here in VT. It is clear that there is deep respect for our teachers and their right to collectively bargain – as well as for the diligent work done on our behalf by the men and women who serve on our local school boards. I trust they can answer future questions of whether and how to change how they settle disputes.”

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

In a speech on Labor Day in 1980, Ronald Reagan said, when referring to the brave workers in Poland ‘where free unions and collective bargaining are forbidden freedom is lost.’ I vote ‘no’ on this bill to ensure that we leave the collective bargaining process alone to let local people work out their differences. It works now and will work in the future.”

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This vote demonstrates that people working together can quickly digest information and make reasonable decisions. It is an example of reactions to new information and is why this bill is necessary.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

Now that banning teacher strikes and prohibition of school board imposed contracts has been removed from this bill, all we are left with is another study committee/task force that delivers false hope for change and costs state dollars. Vermont students, parents, teachers and school board officials will continue to fear that their community will be the next to suffer the consequences of a teacher strike. Thank you!”

J.R.H. 8 Shall the resolution be read a third time?

Rep. Troiano of Stannard explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My heart is heavy with the member from Barre’s story. For 30 years I was treated for and fought without shame against combat related post-traumatic stress disorder. It is a long and difficult fight which goes on and on. I am fortunate to have overcome the trauma. I was lucky to have kept in mind that I fought too hard for my life to end my own life.”

S. 141 Shall the bill be committed to the committee on Human Services?

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Proper legislative process was not followed in this case. Why? What is being hidden from Vermonters?”

S. 141 Shall the report of the Committee on Judiciary be adopted in the first instance (Sections 1 and 3) of amendment?

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no because I don’t believe it is necessary for the State of Vermont to create a new misdemeanor crime for a person convicted of a violent crime possessing a firearm when we already have a federal felony crime for a person who has been convicted of a violent crime, for possessing a firearm.”

Rep. Shaw of Pittsford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Do we really need a new law that mirrors Federal law? The federal government needs to step up and do the job they are authorized to do! I vote no.”

S. 141 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Grad of Moretown explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My yes vote is for the victims and families who have suffered losses due to firearm related domestic violence and suicide; to give law enforcement the tools they are asking for to enhance the public safety of the changing culture of Vermont; and to put Vermont on a strong constitutional footing for those who seek to restore their 2nd amendment rights.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

‘The people have a right to bear arms for the defense of themselves and the state’ are words Vermonters have lived by since July 8, 1777. Now nearly two and a half centuries later, this founding principle is being challenged by this bill, S.141. By voting no, I stand for nearly 250 years of tradition and protecting the right to bear arms for future generations. Thank you.”

Rep. Webb of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is a bill that both respects the second amendment and protects public safety. Vermont has a strong culture of gun responsibility but giving easy access to violent felons has never been part of that. Federal law already prohibits dangerous people from possessing weapons, but right now aspects of this law can’t be enforced at the state level. We want our state to be a place where a violent felon knows that if he or she has a gun they will be prosecuted. We want the family members of those who have recently been adjudicated as a danger to themselves to know that if their loved one tries to buy a gun at a gun shop, the background check will stop them. We want to be clear that people can recover from mental illness, and that if someone who has been previously adjudicated gets better, there is a process in place so that they can get their rights restored. The bill does all of this, while carefully protecting the right to bear arms.”

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Fear!

We’ve heard comments today that reflect a fear that any bill we pass dealing with guns in any capacity will lead to no one being able to own a gun.

This is an irrational fear. It implies that if we move away from one extreme - an absence of regulation - that it will inevitably project us to the other extreme - a total outright ban of all gun ownership.

We are smarter than that. The character of democracy is to hear opinions from all sides and find a middle ground.

We cannot allow convicted violent felons, people who have already shown a propensity for ignoring the basic rights of you, me, our neighbors, to possess deadly weapons.

As far as reporting persons who have been judged in a court of law to be a danger to themselves or others as a result of mental illness, the Executive Vice President of the NRA suggested in 2012 after the Sandy Hook elementary school shooting that the dangerously mentally ill should be reported to “an active national database of the mentally ill.” This is what we are doing.

Let us not fear the measures we take to protect ourselves by keeping guns out of the hands of criminals and of those who have been demonstrated to be violently dangerous, so that we can make our communities safer.”

S. 141 Shall the bill pass in concurrence with proposal of amendment?

Rep. Batchelor of Derby explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

‘The people have a right to bear arms for the defense of themselves and the State’ are words Vermonters have lived by since July 8, 1977. Now, nearly two and a half centuries later, this founding principle is being challenged by S.141.

Vermonters, first in our own state constitution, and later in the American Bill of Rights, have always understood and preserved our right to protect ourselves without infringement from Government – be it local, state or federal.

I vote “NO” to stand up for nearly 250 years of tradition and to protect the right to bear arms for future generations of Vermonters.

Thank you!”

Rep. Beck of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no on this bill for two reasons. I am skeptical of the undue out of state influence that several groups have imposed on the discussion over what is an appropriate gun control policy in Vermont. I also vote no because I feel that the ultimate goal of these groups is the deterioration of our 2nd Amendment rights. S.141, I believe, is a first step toward this unfortunate end.”

Rep. Berry of Manchester explained his vote as follows:

On the fence, for all the wrong reasons – I respect my responsibility as an elected official – but after a dunning email (which I will not read) demanding me to vote no...or else, I chose to support this ‘as he said “Nothing Burger”’, as I do not respond well to bullying.”

Rep. Jerman of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes on behalf of all the victims of gun violence in my community. This bill begins an important dialog on gun suicide, and it helps to protect the public from convicted felons and those with serious mental health issues while protecting their constitutional rights.”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am proud that we, Vermonters, took up this challenging issue and found a way to keep guns out of the wrong hands while protecting the rights of law-abiding citizens. Contrary to comments made, our Veterans and others needing counseling will still be able to get their support services while keeping their guns. No ‘outside’ money or out-of-state-special interests ever influence my vote. I feel privileged to support this bill. The time for this law is long overdue.”

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The Green Mountain Boys would have been declared insane to take up arms against the crown of England.

Rep. Shaw of Pittsford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

‘The people have a right to bear arms for the defense of themselves and the State’ are words Vermonters have lived by since July 8, 1777. Now, nearly two and a half centuries later, this founding principle is being challenged by S.141.

I vote “NO” to stand up for nearly 250 years of tradition and to protect the right to bear arms for future generations of Vermonters. Thank you!”

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes to give our public safety officers the tools to keep guns from convicted felons and those who have been judged to be a danger to themselves or others. Our responsibility is to pass law that balances the interests and safety of all Vermonters. This bill does that. As Justice Scalia wrote, the rights under the 2nd Amendment are not unlimited, and it should not be taken to cast doubt on longstanding prohibitions on the possession of firearms by felons and the mentally ill.”

Rep. Terenzini of Rutland Town explained his vote as follows:

‘The people have a right to bear arms for the defense of themselves and the State’ are words Vermonters have lived by since July 8, 1977. Now, nearly two and a half centuries later, this founding principle is being challenged by S.141.

Vermonters, first in our own state constitution, and later in the American Bill of Rights, have always understood and preserved our right to protect ourselves without infringement from Government – local, state or federal.

I vote “NO” to stand up for nearly 250 years of tradition and to protect the right to bear arms for future generations of Vermonters.

Thank you!”

Rep. Till of Jericho explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes. When one actually looks at the facts about gun deaths in Vermont, the statistics reveal a disturbing fact: Vermont has a much higher gun death rate than most people believe.

For 2013 Vermont had a gun death rate of 9.2/100,000, only a bit below the national average of 10.4/100,000. Vermont consistently has a higher gun death rate than New York, New Jersey and most of the New England states. Vermont’s firearm death rate is double the rate in New York and almost 3 times the rate in Massachusetts.

Ninety percent of Vermont gun deaths are by suicide. We have the highest teen suicide rate in New England. S.141 takes a small step in the right direction. It is not enough but it is a step.

We do, in fact, have a gun problem in Vermont – that problem, today, is suicide. Both the mental health provision and the Vermont gun shop project are steps on the path to reducing the public health scourge of the impulsive act of suicide by firearm – which claims on average 60 Vermonters per year.”

Rep. Toleno of Brattleboro explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Two essential truths of this bill shaped my yes vote: judged strictly on what the bill itself actually does, it is narrow in scope, rational and appropriate. Beyond that, the bill fixes a gap in the current system by establishing a fair process to restore rights.”

Rep. Troiano of Stannard explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes. I am a gun owner. For the past 30+ years as an investigator in the Public Defender system I have worked on hundreds of cases to keep Vermonters from losing their rights to possess firearms. I voted for this because it makes sense. It strongly represents states' rights, it represents the wishes of a majority of Vermonters. This is not a gun control bill. This is not a background check bill. U.S. Attorney's offices often do not prosecute firearm case due to lack of resources. This bill makes sense."

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker"

I respect differing opinions on this issue, and I respect and understand concerns expressed that this will be just a 'first step'.

However, I support this legislation because it is a recognition that there are times that people should not have access to guns, even if only temporarily.

I have the utmost respect for veterans, including those that served this country in Iraq. But we need to be clear that any veteran that needs help after returning home and is in need of treatment has nothing to fear from this bill. But IF a veteran, or anyone, has developed mental health issues such that they are a 'danger to themselves or others' then I would want that person's name on the National Data Base. I only wish that the individual that shot and killed Chris Kyle and his friend had been on that list."

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes for this bill. Why?

It was not money from Michael Bloomberg (I didn't get any). I certainly didn't get any from the NRA or the Vermont Sportsmen's Federation. What had the most influence on me was the murder of 20 second graders and 6 of their teachers by a demented individual in Newtown, CT. We cannot forget them."

Page 55

H. 187 Shall the bill be committed to the committee on Commerce and Economic Development?

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Committees of jurisdiction should be allowed to thoroughly review and offer formal input on all bills. When the economy is struggling we should be extremely sensitive to what are essentially 'unfunded mandates' to business; we choose to ignore the legislative process and bypass the most critical committee. What is being hidden from Vermonters? Thank you."

Page 56

H. 187 Shall the bill be committed to the committee on Health Care?

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

I voted NO because matters of Public Health are usually dealt within the Human Services Committee."

Rep. Pearson of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Sometimes we debate bills that impact businesses which may contain public health questions. This is appropriate and needs to be debated today.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

You just said this was a healthcare bill. If so, why wasn't it sent to the healthcare committee? What are we hiding from Vermonters? What has happened to Government transparency? Thank you.”

Page 57

H. 187 Shall the report of the committee on General, Housing, and Military Affairs, as amended, be adopted?

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

May I explain my vote: #Hashtag, another Nanny State mandate that will hurt small business and result in job loss.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We are not an island nation. No matter how beneficial an initiative may be, it must be considered in terms of the cumulative impact of requirements we place on our businesses, contrasted with those of other states. We already struggle to compete. I do not want to jeopardize jobs by reducing the flexibility that our small businesses need.”

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Although I have not supported earlier versions, due to concerns over statewide economic vitality and pressures on small businesses, I vote yes on H.187. I was fortunate for years at American Airlines, having won the right to flexibly use my personal days as I saw fit. So many of my neighbors and constituents in Rutland do not have this flexibility for themselves or their loved ones. These individuals are working Vermonters not asking for a hand out, simply a lift in quality of life.

Our Vermont economy is on the mend and will only become stronger as we strengthen the fabric of our families. As one of my hard working young constituents expressed to me recently, ‘Make Vermont Strong.’”

Rep. Van Wyck of Ferrisburgh explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted ‘No’. The bill is another nail in Vermont’s economy’s coffin.”

Page 58

H. 187 Shall the bill pass?

Rep. Berry of Manchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermont prides itself on being a healthy place to live. Healthy lifestyles is part of the Vermont brand. Many businesses across this state are in support of this bill because they know it is good for business to have healthy workers and a healthy workplace. I changed my mind and voted for this bill because all business owners that I have spoken with are already in compliance. H.187 offers flexible time off that supports health in our Vermont communities and supports our values as people who care. This law is passed so that business owners who do not offer earned time for leave will now join the ranks of socially responsible business owners.”

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no because this bill is likely to hurt small businesses and to hurt the very workers it is intended to help. The costs of paying sick workers and their replacements will be difficult to meet. There may be reductions in wages, in hours, and in hiring as a result. It would be better to develop an insurance program to share the cost of risks the workers face rather than to put the entire burden on businesses. The state bears greater responsibility for poor business conditions and lack of economic development than small businesses do.”

Rep. Burditt of West Rutland explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If this passes we will hear a simultaneous cheer from New York and New Hampshire...It will be a cheer of support for our anti-business bills that continue to be a major factor in business growth...in their states...along our common borders.”

Rep. Clarkson of Woodstock explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As tax payers we are subsidizing minimum wage employers by helping their employees provide food, heat, health care and housing for their families.

Earned sick days is a fair and healthy benefit for employees in need.”

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I'm uncomfortable with the bill. With the hasty amendments made late after third reading we now have a bill that gives employers with a 30 week job, an incentive to hire foreign guest workers - who are exempt - instead of giving the job to a Vermonter. It also gives the State an incentive to hire temporary workers instead of full time workers.”

Rep. Davis of Washington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes today because I believe working people shouldn't have to choose between a pay check and their health, and this bill represents a step in the right direction. I hope that in the future this body will continue to work to include temporary workers in both the public and private sector. Thank you.”

Rep. Hubert of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no today as this body would not let an amendment go forth that would have made the state pay sick pay to part time workers but have moved to do so on small businesses.”

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no today after voting yes yesterday because I cannot support this bill as it discriminates against state employees who are being used by the State of Vermont. I had a chance to vote to end this discrimination, but a majority of members chose to continue this practice. I have many state employees affected by this in my district. Mr. Speaker, we voted to address the immigrant problem, but failed to help the roughly 800 temporary state employees and I cannot support any bill that exempts the State from a mandate, but passes it on to our local businesses.”

Rep. Rachelson of Burlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The states and cities that have enacted these laws, despite having the same fans ahead of time, have been pleasantly surprised. Implementation was easier, morale and productivity has improved, the impact on the bottom line was minimal. Businesses have not had to close, many businesses have been boosted and more businesses started. And the CDC is clear, people with paid sick leave access medical care more appropriately, including vital cancer screenings, saving money and lives. The people of Vermont deserve all this and we want to continue to attract families and businesses to our state. As our neighboring states have or enact these laws we must stay competitive.”

Rep. Troiano of Stannard explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes for this bill; we all want businesses to thrive in Vermont. We also know business does not thrive on its own they need good employees to succeed. A content employee is a good employee. They deserve this benefit.”

Rep. Webb of Shelburne explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

School staff will breathe a sigh of relief knowing that more parents will be able to care for their sick children rather than leaving this care to school staff. How many education tax dollars are used to fund substitutes who cover for staff who succumb to illness from this exact situation?”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We exempted several different categories from this bill yet we refused to even allow an amendment dealing with an exemption on temporary state workers. Why? Presumably because the State cannot afford to pay for this benefit. Yet we think it is ok for small business to pay. I voted no because the one group that should have been exempted was not. Small business, the backbone of our state. We continue to make it more difficult for them to thrive.”

Page 59

S. 108 Shall the report of the Committee on Human Services be amended as offered by Rep. Poirier of Barre City?

Rep. Martel of Waterford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As a first year legislator I am truly amazed how much we rule and mandate our fellow Vermonters. One week we want to prevent suicide – two weeks later we want to promote suicide. Yes, people should have the right to do as they choose – just keep that in mind the next time we vote to take a choice away.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted against this amendment to prevent government intrusion into this very private decision and to affirm the right of patient choice at end of life.”

Rep. Willhoit of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted to repeal Act 39 because we are left with too many unanswered questions, and still too little protections for Vermont’s most vulnerable.”

Page 60

S. 108 Shall the House permit consideration of a non-germane amendment?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to allow the House to consider adding provisions to protect Vermonters – provisions approved of by the current Human Services Committee and also adopted by the House itself two years ago. I believe that this non-germane ruling disrespects the Committee and prevents us from fully considering how to best serve Vermonters, which is the goal of our legislative process.”

Rep. Komline of Dorset explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My vote wasn’t cast to challenge the Speaker. My vote was in support of allowing an amendment to be considered by this body; an amendment that had the support of the majority of the committee.

When we can work together to make a controversial bill a bit less so, we all benefit.”

Rep. McFaun of Barre Town explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes on this amendment in support of the committee process – the committee on Human Services voted to find this amendment favorable – this morning – after hearing testimony from Rep. Willhoit and committee discussion.”

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I stand with the Speaker. I vote no.”

Rep. Willhoit of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I drafted and voted for this amendment as it restores this vital protection that this body passed out when S.77 was considered two years ago. Our constituents deserve this protection.”

Page 61

S. 108 Shall the House permit consideration of a non-germane amendment?

Rep. Bartholomew of Hartland explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The rules of the House are designed to move this body forward in its deliberations. Consideration of an amendment that is not germane impedes the work of the House.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Refusing to consider this amendment is a blow to reconsideration of deep flaws in what this law purports to protect. It went to the heart of whether clinician participation is voluntary and whether we want to protect Vermonters from the perception that pressure is being placed on them.”

Rep. Gage of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

There are allegations of known abuse of elder within this legislation. Don't we owe it to our elderly to legislate a fix to this kind of abuse?”

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The proponents argue that this is a patient choice, so why make it mandatory on doctors who may have religious or philosophical opposition to physician-assisted suicide. The slippery slope is getting more slippery for not allowing a discussion on the rights of physicians in Vermont..”

Page 62

S. 108 Shall the amendment offered by Rep. Parent of St. Albans City be substituted for the amendment offered by Rep. Dickinson of St. Albans Town, in the first instance of amendment (Sec. 3 of the substitute amendment)?

Rep. Christie of Hartford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes on this amendment in order to be consistent with my position on the underlying bill. My vote was not intended to be disrespectful of our process.”

Rep. Russell of Rutland City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted to ‘repeal’ yesterday. We need not kick this issue down the road. My constituents, on both sides of this issue, deserve clarity by this legislature today.

I vote no.”

Page 63

S. 108 Shall the amendment offered by Rep. Parent of St. Albans City be substituted for the amendment offered by Rep. Dickinson of St. Albans Town in the second instance of amendment (Secs. 2 and 4 of the substitute amendment)?

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes for more data, but unfortunately the proponents are afraid of real data. What are they afraid of? The slippery slope is now an ice slope. Who needs good data as it only gets in the way.”

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted yes to use extreme caution and repeal this law that makes the state part of ending a precious life.”

Page 64

S. 139 Shall the report of the Committee on Health Care be amended as recommended by the Committee on Ways and Means?

Rep. Hubert of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

When do the taxes stop? Most Vermonters are taxed to the max. I vote no.”

Page 65

S. 139 Shall the report of the Committee on Health Care, as amended, be further amended as recommended by the Committee on Appropriations?

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This action is well overdue. It’s time for the legislature to acknowledge that VHC may never work as promised. Thank you.”

Page 66

S. 139 Shall the report of the Committee on Health Care be amended as offered by Rep. Browning of Arlington?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to allow greater choice of insurance plans outside of Vermont Health Connect for those who do not qualify for subsidies within it. To vote no is to needlessly restrict their ability to obtain a plan that best suits their needs and their resources. And it imposes a burden on thousands of Vermonters.”

Page 67

S. 139 Shall the report of the Committee on Health Care, as amended, be further amended as offered by Rep. Morrissey and others?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to protect Medicare services from unwarranted experimentation. Vermont seniors need reliable health services that cannot be ‘reformed’ in uncertain and risky ways.”

Page 69

S. 139 Shall the report of the Committee on Health Care be adopted in the third instance (Secs. 7-14, 16-20, 29-31)?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no because the several worthy spending proposals within these sections of the bill should have been incorporated into the regular budget rather than financed through narrowly targeted additional increased taxes that are unlikely to be able to cover their costs. In fact, they should have been dealt with in previous years and might have been if the majority had not been chasing single payer mirages and misspecifying and mismanaging the construction of a website. If these are so important find room for them in the existing budget and revenue stream.”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This bill increases the budget and raises taxes in addition to the budget and tax bills already passed by this body. The critical budget items in it were derailed when we excised them from our overall budget. This divide and conquer process was a disingenuous way of significantly increasing our total state budget.”

Rep. Olsen of Londonderry explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We are spending Medicaid dollars to pay for services that have such questionable medical value that they are not even eligible for reimbursement under Medicare or Medicaid programs in 48 other states. We cannot afford to increase taxes any further until we take a hard look at how we are spending our limited resources. At the very least, we need to listen to what the science tells us.”

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I cannot support S-139 as amended by the Ways and Means Committee. The funding source is as regressive as it gets and for that reason I voted no.”

Page 70

S. 139 Shall the bill be read a third time?

Rep. Davis of Washington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted in support of S.139 because it is a baby step forward. I hope in the next half of the biennium House Health Care will continue moving ahead by taking up a bill I introduced with guiding principles to put us on a path to financing affordable, high quality health care as a public good. I look forward to continuing the conversation of universal healthcare for all. Thank you.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

My ‘no’ vote is in opposition to expanding programs at a time when Vermonters are saying enough is enough both on taxes and on VT Health Connect. This bill raises nearly \$45 million dollars of new taxes cumulative over the next three years. While a large amount, it is not even enough to cover all estimated costs associated with programs created by this bill. Poor management of the VT Health Connect operations has cost millions and continues to cause thousands of Vermonters heartache and discontent annually. It’s time for this legislature to listen to Vermonters’ wishes, abandon the failed VT Health Connect and stop raising taxes.”

Rep. Purvis of Colchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted ‘no’ because we can’t expect to add more new taxes for Vermonters on a failed system and expect them to feel good.”

Page 71

S. 9 Shall the bill pass in concurrence with proposal of amendment?

Rep Berry of Manchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This is an excellent bill. May we use our Evidence Informed Models to prevent child abuse and neglect. Compelling data on Adverse Childhood Experiences underscores our need to devote ourselves toward approaches that zero in on prevention plans.”

Rep. Higley of Lowell explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I supported S.9 even though a critical piece is missing. That piece is a child protection Advocate. Hopefully this can be added next year.”

Rep. Hubert of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes for the memory of Jordan Preavy and all the unnamed victims with the hope this never happens again.”

Rep. Martel of Waterford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If we arrest someone and fine them \$2000 (that they will never be able to pay) and a year in jail for not reporting a situation that they themselves are caught up in and not given a chance because they are trying to protect their child. This is unfair – get them help instead of sending the child off to someone they don’t know.”

Rep. Strong of Albany explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

In our efforts to protect our precious vulnerable children I would like to see us strengthen the resources young parents need to succeed – resources such as mentoring, drug treatment, and affordable housing.”

Page 72

S. 139 Shall the House proposal of amendment be amended as offered by Rep. Browning of Arlington?

Rep. Browning of Arlington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes to protect Vermonters’ right to choose their doctors by protecting the right of independent physicians to run their practices as they see fit, without interference from the Green Mountain Care Board. Such interference in the setting of rates or location of practices may tend to make these small businesses less viable, in which case Vermonters have less choice and less availability of health care.”

Page 73

S. 139 Shall the amendment offered by Rep. Helm of Fair Haven be substituted for the amendment offered by Rep. Jewett of Ripton and others?

Rep. Stevens of Waterbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Nationwide, sales of e-cigarettes have grown to nearly \$2 billion. They are widely advertised, sold to children and contain nicotine and, at certain temperatures, formaldehyde. Tobacco companies claimed for decades that their product was not addictive or dangerous and we believed them. Why would we now? The jury is still out on them – exactly why they should be regulated.”

Page 75

S. 139 Shall the amendment offered by Rep. Hubert of Milton be substituted for the amendment offered by Rep. Devereux of Mt. Holly?

Rep. Christie of Hartford explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no on this amendment knowing of the work within the jurisdiction of our committee with regard to this topic and other alternatives.”

Rep. Graham of Williamstown explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

It is a form of discrimination to believe State workers and education workers are above the rest of us and should be treated differently.”

Rep. Morrissey of Bennington explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no today so that this can be fully vetted and brought back to this body for a full debate.”

Rep. Myers of Essex explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. There is a time and a place for this discussion. But today is not that time. I look forward to this discussion in the not too distant future.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Understanding that the Cadillac tax will cost the state and its municipalities and school district millions of dollars, I vote yes for fairness. Why should state, school and municipal employees have access to better health insurance plans than the Vermonters paying the bill? Thank you.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote no today, but make no mistake, this issue will have to be addressed in the very near future.”

Page 77

S. 73 Shall the report of the Committee on Commerce and Economic Development, as amended, be adopted?

Rep. Willhoit of St. Johnsbury explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no because capping the price a business can charge to twice what the business paid for an item sets a bad precedent for our rural Vermont businesses trying to compete.”

Page 78

S. 138 Shall the report of the Committee on Commerce and Economic Development, as amended, be further amended as offered by Rep. Stevens of Waterbury?

Rep. Poirier of Barre City explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no on this amendment because I am opposed to privatization of liquor services. We have a very dedicated workforce at the Department of Liquor Control. This amendment sends a continued message to our state employees that their work is not held in high regard.”

Rep. Toll of Danville explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I support the amendment proposed by the member from Waterbury to not only consider the effectiveness of the current system, but, more importantly, to Vermonters on the Connecticut River border, to examine and make possible recommendations to address the great price variation in liquor that negatively impacts Vermont establishments and drives much business out of Vermont and into New Hampshire.”

Page 79

S. 29 Shall the report of the Committee on Government Operations be adopted?

Rep. Dakin of Colchester explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I love Town clerks and have every confidence that they’ll do their finest work towards enabling all citizens the easiest path to exercise their constitutional right and responsibility to vote.”

Rep. Klein of East Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The right to vote is sacred access to democracy. Remove all barriers, more people vote, the stronger the democracy. That is why I voted yes.”

Page 82

H. 98 Shall the House propose to the Senate to amend the bill as offered by Rep. Poirier of Barre City, as amended, in the Second instance of amendment (Secs. 4, 6, 12(b))?

Rep. Berry of Manchester explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. We live in a culture where we give over our power to experts. We trust experts in finance and banking, with religion with education, with food production, and on and on. We have just given away our power again, trusting the medical establishment and their “experts” to make our choices.”

Rep. Copeland-Hanzas of Bradford explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

The debate we have had here today has centered around increasing our vaccination rates. We all want to improve our vaccination rates for the good of all Vermonters.

We narrowly missed the finest and best opportunity we would have to do that and have instead chosen the blunt instrument of eliminating the philosophical exemption.

Current law allows doctors and school nurses an annual check in with fearful or misinformed parents and allows for education and understanding to bring more children towards full vaccination.

Isolating fearful parents into home schooling or choosing the religious exemption does nothing to protect an unvaccinated person.”

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

If the final barrier between me and the government is not this thin layer of skin - then what is?”

Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Three years ago I voted yes, because we very much need to protect our children by maximizing our immunization levels. This year I realized that there was a better way to achieve this critical goal. We should not be taking this more heavy-handed method unnecessarily and in haste.”

Rep. Kitzmiller of Montpelier explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have listened carefully to the voices of my constituents, who seem to be split nearly evenly on the philosophical exemption. If I were in a debate contest, I could argue either position equally well.

There is something deep in the core of my being, though, and it simply will not allow me to vote to remove a parent’s right to make this serious decision on what is in the best interest of their child.

Thus, I must vote ‘No’.”

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no to maintain the right to judiciously choose and because for many, like me, the philosophical is no different from a religious choice and deserves commensurate respect.”

Rep. Strong of Albany explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

As my constituent said, ‘Where there is risk there must be choice. In a body that prides itself on choice, we just took away this precious option of choice from concerned parents who are seeking the best interests of their children.’”

Rep. Till of Jericho explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I vote yes. Nothing in this amendment forces a parent to vaccinate their child. I vote to protect children and adults in our schools who are especially vulnerable to these dangerous vaccine preventable diseases as well as to protect younger siblings at home who are too young to be vaccinated and who are at extreme risk from these diseases.”

Rep. Troiano of Stannard explained his vote as follows:

”Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. Virtually all of the people who contacted me were in favor of protection choice. These were people I know for years, friends. They wanted choice. I voted no.”

Rep. Wright of Burlington explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I voted no. Vaccination rates do need to come up. But elimination of the philosophical exemption does not guarantee that. Many Vermont schools’ immunization rates are where we need them to be, including most Burlington schools. We needed to focus our efforts on the schools’ rates that are too low. We also needed to listen to all voices and concerns. We failed at that today.”

Rep. Yantachka of Charlotte explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I have been torn to the very last second on how to vote. But we had an opportunity to chart a middle course but rejected it narrowly. I vote no because I feel like I need to support those parents whose children have had adverse reactions but have not been sufficiently heard in terms of medical exemptions.”

Page 83

H. 98 Shall the House reconsider its vote yesterday on Rep. Poirier of Barre City in the second instance of proposal of amendment (Secs. 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, and 12)?

Rep. Burditt of West Rutland explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Parental rights! The second class citizen to abortion – civil unions – gay marriage – death with dignity and gun control.

A ‘complete’ debate should not be feared.”

Page 86

H. 489 Shall the House adopt the report of the Committee of Conference?

Rep. Mrowicki of Putney explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

In this tough budget year, there were tough choices to be made. I vote to support those tough choices that were made in a way that was both fair and progressive.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We have a spending problem and to simply tax our way out of a structural spending problem we’ve seen coming for years is irresponsible fiscal policy.”

Page 87

H. 490 Shall the House adopt the report of the Committee of Conference?

Rep. Connor of Fairfield explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Thank you for your integrity and compassion in helping this legislative body to realize our potential as caretakers for our landscape and Vermonters. I am so proud of the challenging work that our Appropriations and Ways and Means Committees did taking into consideration the

incredibly challenging and difficult work of individual members. I am particularly proud of the passage of H.35.”

Rep. Dame of Essex explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Yesterday we passed an education bill that defined local cost containment at around 2%. Yet this budget has an increase in general fund spending at nearly double that. By this body's own definition we do not have our costs under control.”

Rep. Hooper of Montpelier explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

Vermonters’ access to justice is protected in this budget. The Judiciary is receiving a \$2 million increase which will ensure – unlike 6 years ago – our courts will be open every day.”

Rep. Johnson of South Hero explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

This budget represents a tremendous compromise while charting a course towards sustainability.

I’m proud to support a budget with a 1% growth rate and compassion for our common future.”

Rep. Miller of Shaftsbury explained her vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I want to personally thank the Appropriations Committees for their support of the Veterans’ Home in Bennington. Not only does the Veterans’ Home provide services to our brave retired military, it provides 218 jobs and is an important and vital part of the Bennington area economy.”

Rep. Turner of Milton explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

We have a spending problem and to simply tax our way out of a structured spending problem we’ve seen coming for years is irresponsible fiscal policy. General fund spending increasing at 4.1% with revenue growing at 2.4% is irresponsible fiscal policy. Thank you.”

Rep. Young of Glover explained his vote as follows:

“Mr. Speaker:

I am very appreciative of the work the appropriations did to provide funding for dispatch services in the Northeast Kingdom and create options for the local community to retain those services into the future.”
