3 Subject: Motor vehicles; registration; Boy Scouts; commemorative plate

4 Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to authorize the Green Mountain

5 Council of the Boy Scouts of America to manage the design, production,

6 purchase, distribution, and sale of commemorative plates celebrating the 100th

7 anniversary of Boy Scouting in Vermont.

8 An act relating to commemorative Boy Scout motor vehicle plates

9 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

10 Sec. 1. ONE HUNDREDTH ANNIVERSARY OF BOY SCOUTING

11 IN VERMONT

12 (a) Legislative intent. It is the intent of the general assembly to
13 commemorate the 100-year anniversary of Boy Scouting in Vermont. To
14 provide an appropriate tribute to this anniversary, it is the purpose of this act to
15 authorize, and to provide for the generation of revenue to underwrite, the
16 design, purchase, sale, and display of commemorative motor vehicle plates.

17 (b) Authority. The Green Mountain Council of the Boy Scouts of America
18 is authorized to manage the design, production, purchase, distribution, and sale
19 of commemorative motor vehicle plates as described in subsection (a) of this

1 section. The commissioner of motor vehicles must approve the design of the
2 plates prior to their sale.

3 (c) Use. Residents of the state of Vermont may display an approved
4 commemorative plate on the front of a motor vehicle registered as a pleasure
5 car and on motor trucks registered for less than 26,001 pounds and excluding
6 vehicles registered under the International Registration Plan by covering the
7 front registration plate with the commemorative plate from July 1, 2011, until
8 June 30, 2013. The regular front registration plate shall not be removed. The
9 regular rear registration plate shall be in place and clearly visible at all times.

10 (d) Price. The retail price shall be established by the Green Mountain
11 Council but shall not exceed \$100.00 for plates numbered 1–99 and shall not
12 exceed \$25.00 for all other plates.

14 This act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
