15                  Subject: Highways; Vermont Route 30; bridge naming

16                  Statement of purpose: This bill proposes to name bridge #30 in Jamaica for  
17                  former representative Richard W. Hube Jr. upon the reopening of the bridge.

18                  An act relating to the Richard W. Hube Jr. memorial bridge in Jamaica

19                  It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

1       Sec. 1. VERMONT ROUTE 30 BRIDGE NAMING

2           Bridge #30 on Vermont Route 30 in the town of Jamaica shall be named the

3           “Richard W. Hube Jr. Memorial Bridge” upon the reopening of the bridge.

4           The agency of transportation shall place a commemorative plaque or erect a

5           sign on or near the bridge to reflect its naming. This plaque or sign shall

6           conform to the Federal Highway Administration’s Manual on Uniform Traffic

7           Control Devices.

8       Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE

9           This act shall take effect on passage.
